Stanford Head Coach John Vargas

General comments on the game:

"Every year, we have the same goals. We want to be the best student-athletes in the country, and that means the best in the classroom, and the best in the pool. Unfortunately, we came up short yesterday by a goal, and so that's a little disappointing. But you'll see, in maybe a couple of weeks when they come out with the (national academic awards), we'll probably have 12 or 14 (honored). Our team GPA is going to be somewhere around 3.4, 3.5, probably the top in the country, and so we've got it on that side. Coming up a goal short yesterday was kind of disappointing, but I'm proud that these guys came back and were ready to play today and compete, because at the end of the day, that's what it's all about. Both of these guys (Bret Bonanni and Alex Bowen in the press conference) did a great job today. I'm really proud of them."

On his three seniors, Conner Cleary, Nick Hoversten and Alex Bowen:

"I've been really fortunate to have been able to coach someone as talented as Alex (Bowen). We'll really be looking forward to watching him play in multiple Olympics. I mean we all will. He's just a phenomenal player. (I've been) really happy to be able to coach someone like Conner Cleary, who's developed so much over his four years and a quarter at Stanford. I mean, that was a kid that wasn't recruited by anyone, and he came in and played a significant role on our team and made a huge impact. He also has somehow worked his way onto the national team, because it is really work that he's put in, and I'm super proud of him. Nick Hoversten has had many trials and tribulations in his last five years, and if you guys knew his story, you would be really impressed by what he's gone through. I certainly am. With all three of those guys, I always tell them, we'll be connected for the rest of our lives. As I get older, those connections seem to be a little more important. So really, really honored and happy to have been able to coach them in this period of time."

General comments on the game:
