BEAVERS VISIT MAPLES IN LONE MEETING OF THE SEASON

Stanford hosts Oregon State Thursday at Maples Pavilion in the lone meeting between the two schools this season. Due to Pac-12 scheduling, the Cardinal will not make the trip to Corvallis this season. Thursday's game is Stanford's first in four contests against an opponent outside of the top-four in the conference standings. The Cardinal's last game at fourth-place UCLA concluded a three-game stretch that included Pac-12 leader Arizona and second-place USC.

AT THE TURN

At 5-4, Stanford is fifth in the Pac-12 standings at the midway point of the conference slate. The Cardinal has won at least five of its first nine conference games in five of the past seven seasons. Stanford opened the league slate with a 5-1 mark for just the second time in the last 14 seasons. In January, the Cardinal won five consecutive conference games for the first time in 10 seasons and posted its first conference road sweep in eight seasons.

TRAVIS AMONG NATION'S BEST POST PLAYERS

Junior Reid Travis, a preseason All-American and candidate for several national player of the year awards, is second in the Pac-12 in scoring at 19.4 ppg. The forward ranks in the top-five in the Pac-12 in eight categories overall. He matched his career-high with 29 points in wins over USC and San Francisco this season. The junior became the 45th member of Stanford's 1,000-point club earlier this year and enters the Oregon State game with 1,172 points and 620 rebounds in his 85-game career so far. He ranks eighth in the Pac-12 in rebounding (7.6 rpg).

THE CAPTAINS IMPACT

Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey were each voted captains this season. The three take on the role of the Peter Sauer Captainship, honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. The Cardinal's three captains account for 60.5 percent of Stanford's scoring average (45.4 out of 75.0 ppg) and 50.2 percent (19.3 out of 38.4 rpg) of the Cardinal's rebounding average.

POST PLAY

Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey have helped Stanford win the rebounding battle in 17 of 22 games this year, including 13 of the last 15 contests. The Cardinal is second in the conference in rebounding at 38.4 rpg. Last week, USC's Chimezie Metu (12 pts, 10 rebs.) became the first Cardinal opponent to record a double-double since Cal's Ivan Rabb on Feb. 17 of last season.

AGAINST OREGON STATE

Thursday marks the 146th all-time meeting between Stanford and Oregon State. The Beavers lead the series, 75-70, but the Cardinal has won eight of the last 10 meetings. Stanford has won 21 of the last 23 games against Oregon State at Maples Pavilion. The Cardinal swept its two games against the Beavers last season, with a 62-46 win in Corvallis and a 79-66 victory at home. The two schools will meet just once each this year and next year due to Pac-12 scheduling. Stanford will not travel to Corvallis this season.

CARDINAL PLAYERS AGAINST OREGON STATE

Six active Stanford players have played against Oregon State. Seniors Michael Humphrey and Dorian Pickens are averaging 10.6 ppg and 9.2 ppg, respectively, in five games against the Beavers. With Reid Travis missing the 2015-16 season and one of the two meetings with Oregon State last season, the fourth-year junior has faced the Beavers just twice in his Cardinal career.

THE LAST MEETING WITH THE BEAVERS

Reid Travis had 17 points and eight rebounds to lead four players in double figures and Stanford beat Oregon State 79-66 on Feb. 22, 2017. Marcus Allen also scored 17, Dorian Pickens added 15 and Robert Cartwright had 10 as the Cardinal beat the Beavers for the 21st time in the last 23 games between the two teams at Maples Pavilion. Stanford led by as many as 25 in the contest.

PICKENS CLOSES IN ON 1K

Since returning from injury nine games ago at the beginning of Pac-12 play, Dorian Pickens leads the team in three pointers (27) and is second on the team in scoring during conference games (15.6). He ranks 12th in the Pac-12 in scoring during conference action and is third in the league in three pointers per game (3.0). The senior matched his career-high with seven threes (7-for-10) in the win at Washington State. Pickens owns 157 career three pointers, which ranks 12th in school history. With 984 career points, the senior is about to become Stanford's 46th member of the 1,000-point club.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

One of the top recruiting classes in school history has played a big role in its first season on The Farm. Each of the Cardinal's four freshmen have started at least one game and three - Daejon Davis, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White - started together in six games. At least two freshmen have started in 20 of Stanford's 22 contests. At least one freshman has started in all 22 games.

All four average more than 21 minutes per game. Davis leads the Cardinal in assists (4.6 apg), White leads the Cardinal in three pointers (33) and da Silva leads the Cardinal in blocks (21). KZ Okpala, who made his collegiate debut 10 games ago, is averaging 9.0 ppg in 28.1 mpg.

In the win over Arizona State, Stanford's final 16 points were scored by freshmen. In the victory at Washington State, Stanford's four freshmen scored the first 23 points of the second half during the Cardinal's 21-3 run to erase its deficit en route to the road win.

Prior to this season, Stanford last started three freshmen on January 27, 1983 (at Washington) with Keith Ramee, Andy Fischer and Earl Koberlein earned the starting nod in that contest.

DAVIS CONTROLS THE POINT

Freshman Daejon Davis has started all 20 games he has played in. He averaged 15.0 points, 6.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds during Stanford's recent five-game winning streak. After averaging 7.0 ppg in his first five games, he is averaging 11.5 points in his last 15 contests.

Highlighting his play during conference action is the 50-foot heave to win the game at the buzzer against USC. The freshman registered career-highs in points (23) and assists (10) last time out against UCLA. He has totaled 45 points and 17 assists in the two games against the Bruins this season. Davis has posted two double-doubles this season with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the win at Washington and the 23-point, 10-assist performance last time out against UCLA.

DAVIS FOURTH FRESHMAN ALL-TIME TO WIN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Freshman Daejon Davis, who averaged 15.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists to lead Stanford to road wins at Washington State and Washington, was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week Jan. 15. Davis was the fourth Stanford freshman to win conference Player of the Week honors in school history and the first since Jan. 29, 2007, joining Brook Lopez, Jason Collins and Howard Wright. Davis posted his first career double-double with 16 points and a career-high 10 rebounds at Washington. Against WSU, Davis scored 11 of his 15 points in the second half, including eight during a pivotal 24-5 Cardinal run that turned a nine-point second-half deficit into a 10-point lead.

POST PRESENCE

Stanford's starting post players, Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey, have combined to average 30.8 points and 15.5 rebounds per game. The duo is second in the conference among starting post players in both combined scoring and rebounding. Stanford and Arizona represent the only starting post duo to rank in the top-four in both categories. Travis is third in the Pac-12 in scoring at 19.4 ppg and is eighth in rebounding at 7.6 rpg. Humphrey is fourth in the conference in rebounding at 7.9 rpg.

HUMPHREY CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Michael Humphrey, who was among the Pac-12 leaders in rebounding last season, ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in rebounding with an average of 7.9 rpg. The forward ranks fourth in the conference in defensive rebounds per game (6.1 drpg). He posted a career-high 18 rebounds against Pacific on Nov. 12. The senior, who is averaging 11.4 ppg, has four double-doubles this year.

LAST TIME OUT

Despite a career-high 23 points from freshman Daejon Davis, Stanford could not overcome a hot-shooting UCLA team in an 89-73 defeat to the Bruins Saturday night at Pauley Pavilion. UCLA shot 52.8 percent from the floor for the game, including 52.6 percent from beyond the arc. The Bruins connected on seven of 11 three pointers in the first half. The Cardinal fell behind early, before using a 9-0 run to take a 15-14 lead midway through the first half. The Bruins responded with a 14-0 run to surge ahead, 38-27. They took a 49-36 advantage into the half. UCLA has won 12 consecutive home games against Stanford.

OKPALA MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Freshman KZ Okpala made his collegiate debut 10 games ago and has made an immediate impact. The forward is fifth on the team in scoring at 9.0 ppg. He is also averaging 3.3 rebounds in 28.1 minutes per game. Okpala, who has started eight of the 10 games he has played in, scored a career-best 21 points at Washington State.

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the second season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

DAVIS' BUZZER-BEATER WAS FIRST IN 14 SEASONS

Daejon Davis' 50-foot shot to defeat USC at the buzzer Jan. 7 was the first game-winning buzzer-beater for the Cardinal in 14 seasons. On March 3, 2004, Matt Lottich hit a desperation three-pointer as time expired to give No. 1 and undefeated Stanford a 63-61 victory over Washington State at Beasley Coliseum. Davis' buzzer-beater was the first for the Cardinal at Maples Pavilion since Nick Robinson connected on a 35-foot running jumper at the buzzer to give No. 2 Stanford an 80-77 victory over No. 12 Arizona on Feb. 7, 2004.

- Consensus preseason First Team All-Pac-12 selection

MOST POWER FIVE OPPONENTS IN FIVE YEARS

Stanford's challenging nonconference schedule included four opponents from power five conferences. The Cardinal played North Carolina (ACC), Florida (SEC), Ohio State (Big Ten) and Kansas (Big 12), with all but the UNC contest taking place away from Maples Pavilion. It's the most power five conference opponents in five years, since the Cardinal faced Missouri (SEC), Minnesota (Big Ten), NC State (ACC) and Northwestern (Big Ten) during its 2012 slate. Stanford went 1-3 in those games, defeating Northwestern (70-68) on the road.

WIN NO. 100 FOR HAASE

The Dec. 17 victory over San Francisco was head coach Jerod Haase's 100th career coaching victory. He is in his sixth season as a head coach and second with Stanford, following four successful seasons at UAB. He is 25-26 in his second season as head coach of the Cardinal.

WHITE POSTS BEST DEBUT MARK SINCE 1977

Freshman Isaac White's 17-point performance against Cal Poly in the season opener on Nov. 10 was the second-most points by a true freshman in his collegiate debut in the 103-year history of the program. White ranks sixth on the team in scoring at 7.4 ppg.

PETER SAUER CAPTAINSHIP

Jerod Haase announced the establishment of the Peter Sauer Captainship this season, naming Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey captains. The three wear patches on their uniforms honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. Stanford will celebrate the 20-year anniversary of the 1998 Final Four team Feb. 24 vs. Washington State.

THE FOURTH-YEAR CLASS

The four members of Stanford's fourth-year class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - accounted for 62.6 percent of the team's scoring and 55.4 percent of the team's rebounding last season. Pickens and Humphrey are true seniors, while Travis and Cartwright have each had their medical hardship waivers granted and are redshirt juniors with another year of eligibility remaining after this season. Cartwright missed the entire 2015-16 season with a compound fracture of his right forearm sustained in preseason practice on Nov. 2, 2015. Travis was forced to miss the final 22 games of the 2015-16 season with a right leg injury.

TOP-TIER RECRUITING CLASS

After signing a consensus top-25 national recruiting class last season, the Cardinal once again inked one of the nation's top classes for 2018. On Nov. 8, Stanford announced the signing of 6-5 guard Cormac Ryan from New York, New York, and 7-0 forward Keenan Fitzmorris of Overland Park, Kansas. Fitzmorris is the younger brother of Stanford women's volleyball All-American Audriana Fitzmorris.

SEEING DOUBLE

Stanford individuals have totaled 15 double-doubles in the first 22 games, with seven from Reid Travis, four Michael Humphrey, two from Daejon Davis and one each from Dorian Pickens and Oscar da Silva.

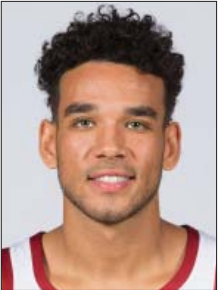

After being introduced as the Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016, Jerod Haase developed a strong relationship with his program and instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude among his student-athletes.

In his first year at the helm of the Cardinal program, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Redshirt sophomore Reid Travis earned First Team All-Pac-12 and NABC All-District honors, developing into one of the top players in the conference on both ends of the court. His program finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs nationally in the classroom as well.

Haase and his staff signed a top-tier recruiting class that is rated as high as No. 10 nationally in the 2017 rankings, welcoming the four-member class to The Farm for the 2017-18 season.

Haase arrived on The Farm prior to the 2016-17 season after completing his fourth season as the head coach at UAB, where he led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (11), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
