No. 7 Stanford (13-2-4, 6-2-2 Pac-12)

vs. No. 23 Virginia Tech (10-5-3, 2-4-2 ACC) | Sunday, Dec. 1 • 5 p.m. | Stream: GoStanford.com

LOOKING AHEAD » No. 7 Stanford (13-2-4, 6-2-2 Pac-12) hosts a third-round NCAA match for the fourth time in five years when No. 23 Virginia Tech (10-5-3, 2-4-2 ACC) comes to The Farm on Sunday, Dec. 1 at 5 p.m. Troy Clardy and Joaquin Wallace have the call on GoStanford.com's live stream.

HOW WE GOT HERE » Sunday's match will be the first meeting between the seventh-seeded Cardinal and 10th-seeded Hokies. Stanford and Seattle U played to a 1-1 draw last Sunday and the Cardinal advanced on penalty kicks, 2-1. Andrew Thomas made four saves in the shootout. Also on Sunday, Virginia Tech beat New Hampshire, 4-1, to advance to the Round of 16 for the fourth time in program history.

TOURNAMENT HISTORY » The Cardinal is 28-13-8 all-time in the NCAA tournament and 15-3-5 at home, advancing on penalty kicks in four out of those five draws. Its stretch of seven consecutive postseason berths is the longest in Stanford history, besting a six-year run from 1997 to 2002.

PREVAILING IN PENALTIES » Stanford has played six draws over the last five postseasons and prevailed in penalties each time, including against Seattle U on Sunday. The Cardinal has come out on top in eight consecutive postseason shootouts dating back to 2002. Says Jeremy Gunn of penalties: "I don't want to praise it too much because you never know when you're going to take them. It's part of a knockout tournament and we prepare for everything. When you prepare in a deliberate way it makes you better, it builds your confidence and it gives you a better chance. It's as simple as that."

HALF DECADE OF DOMINANCE » The nation's most successful collegiate men's soccer program over the last five seasons, Stanford has won three of the last four NCAA titles, five of the past six Pac-12 championships and posted an 90-16-22 (.789) overall record since 2014.

CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE » Stanford is one of just two programs to win three straight NCAA titles (2015-17). Virginia won four in a row from 1991-94. It is also one of seven to win at least three national championships along with Saint Louis (10), Indiana (8), Virginia (7), San Francisco (4), UCLA (4) and Maryland (4). Stanford went 52-7-10 (.826) during its three-year championship run.

NOT SIX » Stanford did not finish at the top of the Pac-12 table this season for the first time since 2013. The Cardinal had won a league-record five consecutive conference championships from 2014-18. Stanford's league record since 2014 is 43-7-10 (.800). Jeremy Gunn is the only coach in league history to win more than two consecutive Pac-12 titles.

LEADING THE PAC » Ousseni Bouda was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year to headline Stanford's eight honorees when the league announced its all-conference awards on Wednesday. Bouda is the third Cardinal to receive recognition as Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, joining Aaron Kovar (2012) and Bobby Warshaw (2007). The first-year player from Burkina Faso leads Stanford with 15 points this season, is third in goals (5) and fourth in assists (5), all numbers that are in the top 10 in the league.

ALL-PAC-12 » Bouda was joined on the All-Pac-12 first team by redshirt sophomore goalkeeper Andrew Thomas and senior midfielder Derek Waldeck on that first XI. Redshirt senior center back Tanner Beason, senior midfielder Jared Gilbey and junior defender Logan Panchot landed on the All-Pac-12 second team and redshirt sophomore forward Zach Ryan and junior midfielder Charlie Wehan earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention accolades. Stanford's eight All-Pac-12 selections were its most since 2015.

GREAT UNDER GUNN » One of four coaches to win NCAA titles in both Division I and Division II, head coach Jeremy Gunn has led a team to the College Cup final four times in the past eight seasons. He and Virginia's Bruce Arena (1991-94) are the only coaches to win three consecutive NCAA men's soccer championships. His teams are 109-31-27 (.734) in his seven-plus seasons on The Farm and he owns a career record of 296-92-58 (.729) in 20-plus seasons, a mark which makes him the fourth winningest active coach at the Division I level (by percentage).

CONFINES OF CAGAN » Stanford has a 51-8-12 (.803) record at Cagan Stadium since 2014 with a goals against average of 0.54. The Cardinal has allowed just 40 goals in its last 6,688:18 at home.

AGAINST RANKED » The Cardinal is 31-16-11 all-time against ranked opponents under Jeremy Gunn, including 24-4-7 in its last 35, and is 7-1-3 in its last 11 against top-10 teams, with that only loss coming earlier this season to No. 7 Washington. Stanford is 3-1-1 against the nation's No. 1 team since Gunn arrived in 2012, with all of those games coming on the road. The Cardinal lost to No. 1 Cal on Oct. 20, 2013 (1-0), tied No. 1 UCLA on Oct. 30, 2014 (2-2) and had quarterfinal triumphs at No. 1 Wake Forest in both 2015 (2-1) and 2017 (2-0) and won at No. 1 Washington (1-0) two weeks ago on Nov. 10.

NCAA RANKS » Stanford is sixth in the country in goals against average (0.599) and has finished in the top 10 in that category each of the past four years. The Cardinal is also 53rd in scoring offense (1.70). Individually, Andrew Thomas is ninth nationally in goals against average (0.636) and 15th in solo shutouts (8).

OUT FOR EIGHT » After starting the first 76 matches of his career, redshirt senior Tanner Beason missed his first game at Stanford on Oct. 6 against Oregon State following a second-half injury sustained against Washington three days prior. He missed the next eight games before returning to the starting lineup in the regular-season finale against Cal. Beason, a first-team All-American last season, was also a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy and because the first person on conference history to sweep both Pac-12 Player and Defensive Player of the Year awards. Beason scored Stanford's goal in regulation in the second round against Seattle U, his first goal since Sept. 13, 2019 against Denver and his first non-PK goal since Oct. 21, 2018 against Washington.

U-23 MNT » Redshirt sophomore goalkeeper Andrew Thomas missed Stanford's match against UC Irvine on Monday, Sept. 9 while he was with the U.S. Under-23 Men's National Team for training camp outside of San Diego. This summer, he was called for a combined preparation camp with players from the United States' Senior and U-23 Men's National Teams from May 26-June 2 in Annapolis, Md. and also participated in a U-23 training camp in Herriman, Utah from June 9-16. An engineering physics major raised in London, he was born in Moscow and holds triple citizenship (United Kingdom, United States, Russia). In two years as a starter, Thomas has already put together 19 clean sheets, good for fourth in school history. His 0.842 career save percentage leads all active players and his 0.631 career goals against average is second.

NEW FACES UP TOP » Stanford welcomes in the nation's third-ranked recruiting class according to Top Drawer Soccer. Among the new faces is Ousseni Bouda, who is on the publication's Preseason Freshman Best XI. The 2018-19 USA TODAY ALL-USA Boys Soccer Player of the Year and 2017-18 Gatorade National Boys Soccer Player of the Year, Bouda is from Burkina Faso and spent four years at the Right to Dream Academy in Ghana before enrolling at Millbrook School in New York. He speaks four languages - French, English, Mossi (Burkina Faso) and Twi (Ghana) - and learned English in three months. Bouda (five goals; five assists; 15 points) and fellow freshman Gabe Segal (six goals; 12 points) are first and third on the team in points and goals scored.

NEW FACES IN BACK » Freshman Keegan Hughes has started all 18 matches in which he has played at center back and has single-handedly saved two goals. He made a sliding stop to cut down David Egbo's shot on an empty net in the 71st minute at then-No. 3 Akron on Sept. 2 and made a kick save off the line in the 106th minute against Oregon State to preserve the 1-1 draw. Freshman Keegan Tingey made his first career start at left back against the Beavers on Oct. 6 and has been in the lineup since.

WEHAN AND WALDECK » Junior Charlie Wehan, who had three goals in his first two seasons at Stanford, already has that many this season after scoring the winner at UCLA on Oct. 10. As a freshman in 2017, two of his 11 shots were on target (.182) and last season it was seven of 24 (.292). This year, 13 of Wehan's 25 attempts have been on frame, or 52.0 percent. Senior midfielder Derek Waldeck, who wore a captain's armband in Beason's absence and is now one of the team's tri-captains along with Beason and Logan Pancho, is also having a career year with personal bests in goals (3), assists (6) and points (12) in his final season in a Stanford uniform.

ALL-TIME RANKINGS » Waldeck's 20 career assists are currently 10th in program history just behind Corey Woolfolk (21; 1997-2000) and Walter Kingson (22; 1980-83) and Jared Gilbey's 17 career assists are 13th behind Matt Moses (18; 1998 and 2000-01). Waldeck is tied for 14th among active NCAA players in assists. Andrew Thomas' 19 solo shutouts are already fourth in school history. The record is 46 by Adam Zapala from 1997-2000. Tanner Beason's 78 career starts are fifth, Derek Waldeck's 86 career games played are tied for fifth and Jared Gilbey's 85 games played are tied for eighth.

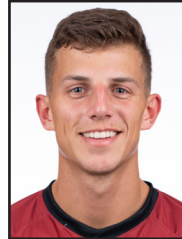

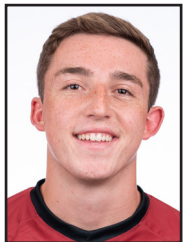
