THE OPENING KICKOFF

- Stanford football returns home to Stanford Stadium on Homecoming Reunion Weekend for a Pac-12 battle with the UCLA Bruins at 7:30 pm on ESPN.
- The Cardinal pulled off the greatest comeback win in school history last week, beating Colorado 46-43 in double overtime after trailing by 29 points at halftime.
- Not only was the comeback at Colorado the largest in Stanford history, but it made a mark in the Pac-12 record book as well as the fourth largest comeback win in the 107-year history of the conference.
- In the second half, Stanford scored on all eight of its drives, including touchdowns on its first five possessions. The 46 points scored by the Cardinal after halftime are the most Stanford has scored in a half in program history.
- The comeback win would not have been possible without the historic performance from wide receiver Elic Ayomanor. The sophomore out of Medicine Hat, Alberta, Canada caught 13 passes for 294 yards in the second half alone, setting the Stanford football record for most receiving yards in a single game.

- Ayomanor also scored three touchdowns, including a 97-yard catch-and-run in the third guarter. That touchdown is the second longest in Stanford history, behind only a 98-yard touchdown reception from Troy Walters on September 25, 1999.
- · Ashton Daniels did not make the start against the Buffaloes, but wound up having a career night in Boulder. Daniels threw for 396 yards and four touchdowns in the Stanford win, the most passing yards in a game by a Cardinal quarterback since Davis
- Stanford's win over Colorado snapped a seven-game losing streak in Pac-12 play for the Cardinal and is the team's first road conference win since September 11, 2021 at USC.
- Stanford improves to 11-4 after the bye week since 2008, and last week's win was the first following a bye week since 2018.
- · UCLA enters this matchup against Stanford after dropping its Week 7 game to No. 15 Oregon State 36-24. After a 3-0 start to the season, the Bruins have lost two of their first three games in Pac-12 play.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.

2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the

host institution.

3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.

4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.

2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate

will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.

3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines

regardless of credential.

4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone)

5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.

6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

THE MATCHUP

- Stanford and UCLA meet for the 95th time on Saturday night.
- The Bruins have won three of the last four matchups, including the last two games at Stanford Stadium.
- · Stanford owned the 2010s against UCLA, winning 11-straight games against the Bruins from 2009-18.
- The Cardinal and Bruins have played three previous times on October 21, with the Bruins winning all three
- Both teams have historic lopsided wins against one another. The Cardinal beat the Bruins 82-0 in the first-ever matchup between the two teams in 1925, matching the largest victory in Stanford history. In 1954, UCLA beat Stanford 72-0 in what is the largest defeat in Stanford history.

THIS DATE IN STANFORD HISTORY...

...the Cardinal stunned USC in 2000, with a gamewinning touchdown as time expired to down the Trojans 32-30 inside Stanford Stadium. Chris Lewis found Jamien McCullum for a 20-yard touchdown as time expired to steal a win from USC.

By beating USC, Stanford dropped USC to 0-4 in conference play for the first time in program history. That particular USC team was led by quarterback Carson Palmer, who would go on to win the Heisman Trophy in 2002 before being drafted No. 1 overall by the Cincinnati Bengals.

HEAD COACH TROY TAYLOR

Troy Taylor enters his first season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2023.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 vpg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor took over a Stanford program that has won 108 games since the start of the 2010 season - a total that ranks among the nation's top-20 - with 31 of those wins coming against top-25 opponents, tied for the eighthbest mark in the country in that span.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch.

Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

END OF AN ERA

David Shaw announced his resignation from the program the morning after the 2022 season finale against BYU. The winningest coach in program history, Shaw finished his 12 seasons with a 96-54 record. Shaw was honored with the 2017 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year award and led Stanford to three Pac-12 titles and two Rose Bowl victories during his tenure.

In addition to guiding Stanford to three Rose Bowl Game appearances, Shaw is the only four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year, having led the Cardinal to three conference titles. Shaw's 96 overall wins rank ninth in Pac-12 history while his 65 conference victories rank fifth. Stanford achieved 29 wins against top-25 opponents (ranking eighth nationally since 2011), 11 against top-10 programs and five against top-5 foes. Additionally, the Cardinal had 43 players drafted, a total ranking tied for 13th nationally and tied for the most in the Pac-12.

The Cardinal was equally accomplished in the classroom during Shaw's tenure, boasting a nation-leading 15 Academic All-Americans since 2010, five more than any other program and 10 more than any Pac-12 school in that span, including Andrew Luck (2011) and Christian McCaffrey (2015) as Academic All-Americans of the Year.

RECENT DRAFT SUCCESS

The Cardinal has had 55 draft picks since 2010, second-most in the Pac-12 behind only USC. Stanford is tied for eighth nationally with 11 consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 19 Academic All-Americans in that span is eight more than any other school nationally.

Since 2012, the number of draft picks to come out of Stanford is tops in the Pac-12 with 48, one more than USC (47). In the 2023 NFL Draft, the Cardinal had five players taken: Michael Wilson (3rd round, AZ), Kyu Blu Kelly (6th round, BAL), Tanner McKee (6th round, PHI), Elijah Higgins (6th round, MIA), and Kendall Williamson (7th round, CHI).

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

THE COMEBACK AT COLORADO

Stanford turned in a comeback for the ages during its road game against the Colorado Buffaloes on October 13. Down 29-0 at halftime, the Cardinal came roaring back to win 46-43 in double overtime.

Some notable facts about the historic road win by the

- Largest comeback win in Stanford football history.
- Biggest blown lead in Colorado football history.
- Largest halftime deficit overcome in a victory in Pac-
- Second-largest road comeback win in Pac-12 history.
- Fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history.

MIND YOUR (AYO)MANOR

No player had a more significant role in Stanford's dramatic come-from-behind win at Colorado on October 13 than sophomore wide receiver Elic Ayomanor. His performance was one for the record books, and it received a lot of attention on social media.

Ayomanor was held without a catch in the first half, but finished the game with 13 receptions for 294 yards and three touchdowns. All of those numbers were careerbests, and it lands Ayomanor at or near the top of the record book in several single-game categories:

- · Most receiving yards in a game in Stanford history, surpassing the previous mark of 278 yards by Troy Walters on September 25, 1999.
- Tied for the second-most receptions in a game by a Cardinal receiver, trailing only Simi Fehoko's 16 catches on December 19, 2020.
- First game with three receiving touchdowns by a Card since Simi Fehoko on December 19, 2020, one shy of tying the Stanford single-game record.

Following the performance, Ayomanor received props on social media from Terrell Owens, Skip Bayless, ESPN, Bleacher Report, and many more.

ELIC'S ELITE SPEED

Elic Ayomanor got to 294 receiving yards with several big plays that changed the complexion of Stanford's road game against Colorado.

His first big play game on a 97-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. He took a quick slant

: pass from quarterback Ashton Daniels and out-ran defenders to score. It was the longest play of the season by the Stanford offense, and the second-longest reception in Cardinal history, behind only Troy Walters and his 98-yard touchdown on September 25, 1999.

Ayomanor then scored a 60-yard touchdown later in the third guarter for his second touchdown of the game. By scoring multiple touchdowns of 60-yards or longer, Ayomanor became the first player in the Pac-12 to do so since Washington's John Ross III on November

In the first overtime, with Stanford trailing by seven, Ayomanor caught a 30-yard touchdown that was featured on SportsCenter's Top 10 later that night. He reached around Colorado cornerback Travis Hunter and pinned the ball against the backside of his helmet before pulling it over Hunter to secure the catch.

AWARD SEASON

Following Week 7 action around the country, Stanford received a host of awards for both individual, and team performances from the win over Colorado.

The Cardinal were named the Cheez-It National Team of the Week for overcoming a 29-point deficit to beat Colorado on the road in double overtime during Week 7. This is the seventh time Stanford has earned this honor since its inception in 2002.

Elic Ayomanor received well-earned recognition for his record-setting performance in the win, landing Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week honors. He became the first Cardinal to win the award since Colby Parkinson in 2018. Ayomanor also was named the Walter Camp National FBS Offensive Player of the Week, the first Cardinal to do so since Bryce Love in 2017. Ayomanor was joined by Joshua Karty, who was named the Pac-12's Special Teams Player of the Week after hitting the game-tying and game-winning field goals.

Ashton Daniels was selected to a pair of "Best Of" lists: the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 List and the Manning Award Star of the Week. This comes after he helped engineer the comeback for the Cardinal by throwing for a career-best 396 yards and four touchdowns in the double-overtime win.

ISN'T OVER IN OVERTIME

Stanford's win against Colorado in double overtime has become a bit expected for the Card when it reaches overtime. Stanford has won its last four overtime games, and the Cardinal are now 7-5 all-time in overtime.

CUTTING IT LOOSE

After the team's bye week, the Stanford offense found some rhythm against Colorado, turning in the team's best offensive performance of the season.

Stanford piled up 523 total yards of offense against Colorado, the most put up by the Cardinal in a single game since December 19, 2020 at UCLA.

The offense was particularly strong in the second half and the overtime periods, where the team scored all 46 of its points. Those 46 points after halftime are the most scored in a single half in Stanford history, and the most points in a single game since the previously mentioned UCLA game in 2020.

CONFERENCE WINS FOR THE CARD

By coming back to beat the Buffaloes on the road, the Cardinal earned its first Pac-12 win of the season. It snapped a seven-game losing streak by Stanford in Pac-12 play, with its most recent win coming against Arizona State on October 22, 2022. It also was the first win by the Cardinal in a road conference game since September 11, 2021 at USC.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

There has been a lot to celebrate so far in 2023 when it comes to Stanford alumni in the NFL. Christian McCaffrey is the league's leading rusher on one of two undefeated teams left, Michael Wilson scored his first professional touchdowns and Zach Ertz joined the 700-reception club, to name a few.

McCaffrey was traded to the San Francisco 49ers midway through the 2022 campaign and has been one of the best players in the league. In 17 regular season games since the trade, McCaffrey has compiled 1,940 scrimmage yards with 19 total touchdowns. He also has scored in 15-straight games, the second longest streak in NFL history.

In the 49ers' Week 3 win over the New York Giants, McCaffrey eclipsed 5,000 rushing yards for his career and became just the fourth player in NFL history with over 5,000 rushing yards and 450 receptions in his first seven seasons. The other three are LaDainian Tomlinson, Marshall Faulk, and Roger Craig.

Speaking of that Week 4 game with Arizona, Michael Wilson had a breakout game for the Cardinals in the Bay Area. Wilson recorded seven catches for 76 yards and a pair of touchdowns, his first in the NFL.

With six touchdowns between McCaffrey and Wilson in Week 4, it marked just the third time since the AFL-NFL merger where one college had at least six touchdowns scored by former players in the same game (Saints vs. Vikings - 12/25/2020 and Patriots vs. Bills - 11/23/1975).

In the same game, tight end Zach Ertz became just the eighth tight end in NFL history to record 700 career receptions. Ertz joined Jason Witten, Tony Gonzalez, Travis Kelce, and Antonio Gates as the only ones to do so in their first 11 NFL seasons.

Through five weeks of the 2023 NFL season, 25 former Cardinal have appeared in a game.

BRYCE FARRELL, THE RUSHER

Halfway through the 2023 season, the player with the most rushing touchdowns on the Cardinal is a wide receiver. Bryce Farrell is pacing Stanford with three

rushing touchdowns this season, the most of his career.

Farrell had a two-touchdown game against Colorado on October 13, one rushing and one receiving. His rushing touchdown against the Buffaloes was the first touchdown of the game for Stanford as the Cardinal began to erase a 29-point deficit.

With three rushing touchdowns this season, Farrell leads the NCAA in rushing touchdowns by a player whose primary position is wide receiver.

DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACK

Justin Lamson made his first collegiate start against Oregon, but has been making his mark on the Stanford offense as a true dual-threat quarterback all season long.

Lamson has carried the ball more times than any running back on the Stanford roster, and it isn't close. Lamson has 67 rushing attempts on the season, while Ashton Daniels is next closest on the team with 44. Lamson is tied for 23rd in the NCAA in rushing attempts by quarterbacks and is second among Pac-12 quarterbacks.

Against Oregon, Lamson tallied 22 totes, the most by a Pac-12 quarterback in a single game since Utah's Tyler Huntley had 25 in 2017. His 22 carries are tied for the ninth-most in a game by a quarterback this season in the NCAA.

OUTPERFORMING OREGON EARLY

Despite the outcome not going the way of the Card on Sept. 30 against Oregon, the first 20 minutes of the came were completely controlled by Stanford.

Stanford got the first two scores of the game via field goals from Joshua Karty to lead 6-0 early in the second quarter. The Cardinal offense was on the field for 13:37 of the first quarter and was leading the time of possession battle 16:39 - 2:48 midway through the second quarter.

The Cardinal defense held the Ducks offense without a first down on its first two drives, with the team's first first down coming with 9:28 remaining in the second quarter. This marked the first time that the Ducks offense was held without a first down in a quarter since the third quarter of the 2020 Rose Bowl. This has not happened in the first quarter of a Ducks game in at least the last 11 seasons.

SHUFFLING THE LINES

Stanford is still trying to find consistency in the play of both its offensive and defensive lines. Through six games, the Card has employed six different starting offensive line combinations and four different starting defensive line combinations.

The only offensive lineman to start all six games is center Levi Rogers, who is in his first season as a center. Rogers has made 12 straight starts going back to last season.

Defensively, Lance Keneley and Anthony Franklin have started all six games for the Cardinal. This is Keneley's first season as a regular starter, while Franklin has 13 straight starts going back to 2022. His 13 straight starts are second-most on the Stanford roster, behind only Benjamin Yurosek (26).

THIRD DOWN TROUBLES

Offensively, Stanford has not had a lot of trouble converting on third downs. The Cardinal ranks 26th in the NCAA in third down conversions with 41, and that has helped Stanford hold the 10th-best time of possession average in the country (32:49).

Defensively, it has been more of a struggle for the Cardinal. Sacramento State converted 11 third downs in Week 3, and the Hornets' 68.8% conversion percentage was the highest against Stanford since 2020. For the season, Stanford is allowing opposing offenses to convert on 53.9% of its third downs, the highest rate in the NCAA.

FINDING IT ON FOURTH

Stanford kept the offense on the field a lot in its most recent home game against Oregon. The Cardinal attempted six fourth downs and converted on three of those, including multiple fourth down conversions in the first quarter.

The six attempts on fourth down are the most in a single game in program history, and the three conversions are tied for the most the Card has ever picked up. Most recently, Stanford converted a trio of fourth down conversions against USC on Sept. 10, 2022.

BRING IT, BAILEY!

On the strength of his three-sack performance against Hawai'i, David Bailey was named the first Pac-12 defensive lineman of the week. It was the first time in his career that Bailey has earned a weekly award from the Pac-12.

The three-sack performance from Bailey is one of just three in the Pac-12 this season. Bailey was the first player in the NCAA to record a three-sack game this season.

Bailey's award from the Pac-12 is the first weekly defensive award winner for the Cardinal in nearly two years. Kyu Blu Kelly was the most recent winner, taking home Defensive Player of the Week after the second week of the 2021 season.

TIGHT END U IN FULL SWING

Stanford has long been considered "Tight End University" after producing many productive NFL tight ends over the years. Benjamin Yurosek could be next in line after a monster start to the 2023 season.

Yurosek has been more than just a security blanket for first-time starting quarterback Ashton Daniels; he has been the primary weapon. Yurosek was targeted 10 times and hauled in nine passes for a career-best 138 receiving yards and a 32-yard touchdown in the season-opening win at Hawai'i. For comparison, no other Stanford receiver had more than three catches against the Rainbow Warriors.

Through six games, Yurosek is second on the Cardinal with 16 receptions and 239 receiving yards. His 239 receiving yards are the second most in the Pac-12 by a tight end, and his 14.9 yards per catch is seventh-best in the NCAA.

Prior to the start of the season, Yurosek was named Preseason First Team All-Pac-12 (Steele), Preseason Second Team All-Pac-12 (Media), and was named to the John Mackey Award and 2024 Senior Bowl watch lists.

NEW FACES

With a brand new coaching staff intact, the 2023 Stanford roster looks drastically different than it has in the past. Of the 106 players, 35 are brand new to the program this year, including 28 freshmen.

An additional 29 Cardinal are sophomores, resulting in 57 underclassmen on the 2023 roster. In comparison to last year's team, there were 27 freshmen and 25 sophomores for a total of 52 underclassmen.

Through five games, 13 Cardinal players made their collegiate debuts, and 13 made their first career starts.

KARTY PARTY

Joshua Karty earned a host of awards during the 2022 season, becoming one of the best placekickers in the NCAA. He was named First Team All-America by the Associated Press, Second Team All-America by The Sporting News and Third Team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America.

Karty is just the second placekicker in school history to earn First Team All-America honors (Rod Garcia, 1973). He is the first Cardinal since 2018 to earn All-America honors (Paulson Adebo, FWAA Second Team) and the first Stanford football player to earn First Team All-America honors since 2017 (Bryce Love, Associated Pracs)

Karty set a school record with a 61-yard field goal as time expired at Cal in 2022. The previous long was 59 yards (Rod Garcia at USC, 1973; Mark Harmon at Purdue (1981).

Karty missed two field goals against Arizona, both from 51 yards, snapping his consecutive field goals made streak of 26 (previous miss came vs. Notre Dame on Nov. 27, 2021), the longest streak of his career.

He finished last season 24-for-25 on PATs and 18-for-18 on FG attempts. For his career, he is 63-for-64 on PATs and 41-for-49 on field goals. Seven of his misses have come from at least 49 yards, with six of them from 50+.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Stanford faces another very tough schedule during the 2023 season, thanks in large part to the strength of

the Pac-12. The Cardinal will face five of the six ranked teams in the Pac-12 this year, and will see six ranked teams overall.

There is no better example of the strength of the Pac-12 than by looking at how the conference started the season. After Week 1, the Pac-12 was a combined 13-0, the best start for the conference since 1938. Through five weeks, there were three teams 5-0 for the first time since 2013.

Of the ranked Pac-12 teams that Stanford faces, four of those teams were inside the Preseason AP Top-25, with its toughest opponent scheduled as No. 5 Washington on October 28 at Stanford Stadium.

Four of the Cardinal's ranked matchups take place at home this year: Sept. 30 vs. No. 9 Oregon, Oct. 21 vs. No. 25 UCLA, Oct. 28 vs. No. 5 Washington, and Nov. 25 vs. No. 15 Notre Dame.

Many pundits believe that Stanford's schedule is one of the hardest in the country. According to 247Sports. com, Stanford has the 17th-most difficult schedule. This is based on Stanford having the 15th-most difficult schedule based on last year's win-percentage totals.

The most difficult outlook for the Stanford strength of schedule comes from College Football News, which ranks Stanford's schedule as the fourth toughest in the NCAA, behind only Purdue, Colorado and Iowa State.

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 30 states plus Canada.

There are a total of 15 student-athletes from Texas, the largest representation of student-athletes from outside of California (31) on the team. Behind Texas is Georgia (9), Florida (6), and New Jersey (5).

Three student-athletes are from Canada (Aaron Armitage, Elic Ayomanor, Brendon Barrow).

HONORING ANDREW LUCK

On August 17, Stanford Athletics announced its 2023 Hall of Fame class, with 10 former student-athletes being inducted. Andrew Luck was honored as one of this year's inductees. The ceremony took place on Friday, Sept. 29.

A native of Houston, Texas, Luck is also the 19th Cardinal player to join the College Football Hall of Fame, which happened last season. Luck guided Stanford to 23 victories over his final two seasons, including appearances in the 2011 Orange Bowl and

2012 Fiesta Bowl.

He won the 2011 Maxwell, Walter Camp and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm awards and was a two-time runner-up (2010, 2011) for the Heisman Trophy. A 2011 First Team All-American and two-time conference Offensive Player of the Year, Luck rewrote the Stanford and conference record books. Luck went 31-8 as a starter, resurrecting a Stanford program that had suffered seven straight losing seasons before he became the starter in 2009. He passed for 9,430 yards and 82 touchdowns during his Cardinal career, adding 957 yards and seven more touchdowns on the ground.

He was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 2012 NFL Draft and played seven seasons in the NFL before retiring prior to the 2019 campaign. He set the NFL record for most passing yards by a rookie quarterback (4,374) in 2012 and was named the NFL's Comeback Player of the Year in 2018.

REST OF THE CLASS

The other members of the Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2023 include Joe Borchard (baseball/football), Kori Carter (women's track and field), Grace Fattal Luczak (women's rowing), Nicole Gibbs (women's tennis), Paul Goldstein (men's tennis), Lauren Lappin (softball), Arthur Lee (men's basketball), Melissa Seidemann (women's water polo) and Tom Wilkens (men's swimming and diving).

Joe Borchard stands out as one of the members of the Class of 2023 after shining as a two-sport athlete for the Cardinal. He was the No. 12 overall pick of the 2000 MLB Draft by the Chicago White Sox after helping lead Stanford to back-to-back College World Series appearances. He also was a backup quarterback for Stanford football and played in the 2000 Rose Bowl Game.

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 47 academic years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), the longest streak in NCAA history. Stanford leads the NCAA with 134 team titles, including three national team championships during the 2022-23 campaign - men's gymnastics, women's water polo and women's rowing- increasing its overall total to 163.

Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.

Stanford won 25 straight (a streak which snapped in 2020-21) Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cups. The Cardinal's 26th Directors' Cup came during the 2022-23 season.

Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2023.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor took over a Stanford program that has won 108 games since the start of the 2010 season - a total that ranks among the nation's top-20 - with 31 of those wins coming against top-25 opponents, tied for the eighth-best mark in the country in that span.

The Cardinal is 14th nationally with 50 draft picks since 2010, second-most in the Pac-12. Stanford is tied for eighth nationally with 10 consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 15 Academic All-Americans in that span is five more than any other school

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level : since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

After opting not to play in the spring of the 2020-21 season, Taylor guided the Hornets to their second Big Sky Conference title in :

Troy Taylor enters his first season as the Bradford M. Freeman: posted an undefeated record of 8-0 in league games and earned another trip to the FCS Playoffs. Taylor was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year and was one of 17 finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award. Sacramento State finished ninth in total offense (463.9 ypg) and 22nd in total defense (329.7), while its scoring offense was 33rd (30.3) and scoring defense 15th (19.1).

> In his first season with the Hornets, Taylor guided the team to a 9-4 overall record and a 7-1 league mark, which gave Sacramento State a share of the Big Sky Conference title for the first time in school history, and its first NCAA FCS Playoff berth. For those efforts, he was named the conference Coach of the Year and was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS national coach of the year).

> Taylor was Utah's offensive coordinator and guarterbacks coach for two seasons (2017-18), helping the Utes to their first Pac-12 South Division title in program history in 2018. Taylor's Utah offenses featured a balanced attack both seasons, with running back Zack Moss eclipsing the 1,000-yard mark on the ground in back-to-back seasons. At least 16 different players caught passes in both seasons.

> Prior to joining the FBS ranks, Taylor was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Eastern Washington in 2016. That season, he directed the top passing offense in the FCS and set numerous national and school records. The Eagles averaged an FCS-best 401.0 passing yards per game, ranked second nationally with 529.6 yards per game and were third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg). EWU posted a 12-2 overall record and advanced to the FCS semifinals.

> Under Taylor, sophomore Gage Gubrud set an NCAA FCS singleseason record by passing for 5,160 yards while throwing 48 touchdown passes. Gubrud, the 2016 FCS Player of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, averaged 368.6 passing yards per game, which also led the nation. One of Gubrud's favorite targets was All-American Cooper Kupp, who caught 117 passes for 1,700 yards and 17 touchdowns before being selected by the Los Angeles Rams in the third round of the NFL Draft.

> Taylor's success at Eastern Washington followed an illustrious run at Folsom High School, where he was co-head coach from 2012-15. The Bulldogs set numerous California state records, including the most points scored in a season. Folsom posted a 58-3 overall record, won the Sac-Joaquin Section title each season and claimed the 2014 CIF Division I championship with a 68-7 win over Oceanside. The team also set the California record for passing yards in four consecutive years.

Taylor was instrumental in the development of Jake Browning, who would become the 2016 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year for Washington. Taylor coached Browning from fifth grade until he graduated as one of the most prolific passers in prep history. as many seasons in the fall of 2021. That year, Sacramento State: Browning set national records for touchdowns in a season (91 in

2014, tied) and career (229, in just three seasons), while establishing a number of California state high school records as well, including season (5,790) and career (16,775) passing yards.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

Taylor's first coaching job was at Casa Roble High School in Orangevale, Calif., in 1994. The following year, Taylor was a graduate assistant at Colorado, where he worked with the wide receivers. He returned to Cal in 1996 and remained at his alma mater through the 1999 season, where he had stints coaching receivers, quarterbacks and tight ends. Taylor also served as Cal's recruiting coordinator in 1999.

Taylor left Cal to become an assistant athletics director at Christian Brothers High School (2000-01) in Sacramento, where he also taught and was an assistant football coach for one season (2000). He spent 2003-04 at Folsom High School as the co-head coach. Taylor stepped away from coaching after the 2004 season but remained in football, serving as the radio analyst for Cal from 2005-

Taylor, 54, and his wife, Tracey, have three children: sons, Noah and Aaron, and daughter, Ella.
