UW (13-4, 3-1) vs. STANFORD (9-8, 3-1)

UW continues its homestand as Stanford comes to Alaska Airlines Arena on Saturday, Jan. 13 at 5 p.m. The game will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks with Guy Haberman and Mike Montgomery on the call. Additionally, fans can tune into KOMO 1000AM and 97.7 FM to hear the official UW radio broadcast from Tony Castricone and Jason Hamilton. Stanford has the series record at 75-71, but has not played at Alaska Airlines Arena since Feb. 20, 2016 in a UW 64-53 victory. Washington is 49-20 against the Cardinal when playing at home.

THE COACH

Head Coach Mike Hopkins is in his first year at Washington, and first as a head coach becoming the 19th head coach in UW history. After spending 22 years as an assistant at Syracuse, Hopkins oversaw teams that reached the NCAA Tournament 16 times including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s along with four NIT berths. Syracuse never dipped below a 55.0 percent record while Hopkins was on staff.

QUICK HITTERS

- Junior **Matisse Thybulle** and junior **David Crisp** are both in the top 10 in the UW career record books as Thybulle has 158 career steals (5th all-time) and Crisp has 158 career 3's made (6th all-time)
- In 17 games, freshman **Jaylen Nowell** has recorded six 20+ scoring efforts while leading the team in scoring seven times ... he has scored at least 10 points in 10-straight games and in 16 of his 17 career games
- UW is 10-1 at home, 9-1 when leading at the half, 10-0 when leading with five minutes left and 11-0 when shooting better than its opponent
- In its 13 wins, UW is shooting 51.0 percent from the field with three of its starters shooting over 50 percent (Timmins, 65.9; Dickerson, 62.3; Nowell, 53.1) in those wins
- UW assisted on 14 of its 22 baskets, a 63.6 percent mark, which is its highest percentage this season
- Washington has shot over 50 percent from the field in seven of its 17 games ... in the last four seasons, it's taken UW at least 30 games to get to seven outings with 50 percent or better shooting from the field
- Freshman **Naz Carter** has been a spark for the Dawgs off the bench as he scored 10 points in 14 minutes in UW's 66-56 win over California ... he's reached double-figures three times this season and is shooting 48.5 percent from the field
- Washington has overcome 10 point deficits three times this season in wins over Belmont, USC and Washington State ... additionally, UW has trailed by at least five in six of its 13 wins
- Washington has had four players score in double figures in 10 of its 17 games
- After WSU hit four 3's in the first five minutes on Saturday, the Huskies held the Cougs to just three more from long distance as WSU finished 7-of-27 after entering the game leading the nation at 12.1 made from 3 per game
- Junior **Matisse Thybulle** is the only active player in NCAA Division 1 to have over 150 steals and 75 blocks in their career ... his 158 steals rank tied for 18th amongst the NCAA active career leaders in that category ... additionally he is the only player in Husky history to have 150+ career steals (158) and 75+ career blocks (81)
- Washington has had fewer turnovers than its opponents in 11 of its 17 games and are 9-2 in those outings
- Junior **Noah Dickerson** is one of two Pac-12 players averaging at least 14.9 points and 7.6 rebounds while also shooting at least 60 percent from the field (60.3FG%), joining Arizona's Deandre Ayton (20.0 ppg/11.5 rpg/63.0FG%)
- Starting with the Kansas game, sophomore **Sam Timmins** has been 22-of-32 from the field, shooting at a 68.8 percent clip with 10 blocks. **Fourteen of his 22 made FGs (63.6 percent) in that span have come from dunks.**
- UW is the only team in the NCAA to record 16 steals and 15 blocks in the same game this season after doing so against BCU ... since the 2011-12 season only one other school has recorded those numbers in a single game ... Syracuse (12/28/2011 - 17 steals, 15 blocks - v. Seton Hall)
- UW is shooting 79.6 percent from the FT line in final five minutes of its 17 games and that goes up to 81.61 percent in the final two minutes ... UW has not been that efficient from the FT line during those two spans since at least 2002-03 (stats not kept as well before that)

Junior Noah Dickerson has been key for the Huskies at the charity stripe, shooting 74.5 percent (82-110) with the most attempts on the team. In Pac-12 play that number goes up to 87.5 percent (14-of-16) as he has only missed twice in four games.

FINAL 5 MINUTES

Freshman Jaylen Nowell is shooting 73.1 percent from the field during the final five minutes of Washington's 17 games, going 19-of-26. Additionally he is 20-of-23 from the FT line (87.0 percent) during the final five minutes.

THE USC WIN IN LA

Washington put up some outstanding numbers in its 88-81 win at the Galen Center in Los Angeles. Take a look:

- UW got its first win vs. USC on the road since March 1, 2012 (80-58)
- UW's 67.3 percent shooting from the field against USC is its best in the last 15 years ... additionally, UW's 73.1 shooting in the second half is the second time the Huskies have shot 73 percent or better in the second half this season (73.5 vs. BCU, 25-34).
- UW held USC to just 3-of-20 shooting from 3-point range, it's lowest percentage of the year (.150) ... additionally its the lowest 3FG percentage a UW opponent has had since UW held Stanford to 3-of-21 (.143) in Palo Alto on March 9, 2016
- Over half of UW's scoring against USC (52 of 88 - 59.1 percent) came in the paint ... it's the highest percentage of points in the paint this season for UW and the 52 tie the most this season UW has had in a game

10+STEALS x 10+BLOCKS

Washington posted back-to-back games with 10+ steals and blocks for the first time since at least the 2002-03 season... in 2015-16, UW had two games during the season with 10 or more in both categories ... the last time UW had back-to-back games with 10 or more blocks was EWU/Grambling in 2014-15.

TIMMINS' IMPROVEMENT

Sophomore **Sam Timmins** has seen an improvement in his efficiency this year as he is averaging 5.5 rebounds and 5.6 points in 20.1 minutes per game while also shooting 64.3 percent from the field. In comparison to a year ago, Timmins was at 3.8r/3.2p in 14 minutes per outing. Additionally, he has pulled down eight or more boards five times this season through 17 games ... last season, he only had four games with eight or more in 31 outings

TIMMINS LAST SEVEN

Starting with the Kansas game, Timmins has been 22-of-32 from the field, shooting at a 68.8 percent clip with 10 blocks. **Fourteen of his 22 made FGs (61 percent) in that span have come from dunks.**

#'s vs. BETHUNE-COOKMAN

Washington's squad set some outstanding numbers as a team against Bethune-Cookman in its 106-55 win on Dec. 19.

- UW had 6 players in double figures, first time since Jan. 28, 2016 at UCLA with 6 in double figures
- UW's 51 point victory was its biggest since a 54-point win over McNeese State on Nov. 13, 2010
- UW's 106 points tie for the 21st most in UW history
- UW's 15 blocks tie the single-game Husky record
- UW's 15 3-pointers made are the most since 17 against California on Feb. 10, 2011
- BCU had 17 TOs and just six FGs in the second half

**DEFENSE DEFENSE DEFENSE
BLOCK PARTY**

The Dawgs have brought the block party to Hec Ed this season with 71 of their 90 blocks coming at home ... **additionally 51 have come over the last eight games** -road or home... UW tied the single-game record for blocks in a game with 15 against Bethune-Cookman.

STEALING THE SHOW

Washington's 151 steals lead the league by 36 and a 1.7/g average. Should UW keep up its 8.9 per game average, it will set the UW record that is currently at 288 from the 2004-05 season. **The Huskies are ranked 15th nationally in steals per game.**

#2THERAFTERS

Washington will retire the No. 2 jersey of two-time NBA All-Star, Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and Honorable Mention All-American Isaiah Thomas on Feb. 15, 2018 vs. Utah. Thomas becomes the third Husky in program history to have his number retired joining Bob Houbregs (No. 25) and Brandon Roy (No. 3). Here's a look at some of IT's highlights:

- Three of the top 25 single-season scoring #s and is the only player with three seasons of at least 541 points
- Fourth all-time in assists at UW - 415 assists

UW has upped it's game in the second half outscoring opponents 42.6 to 38.2. Additionally, UW has shot over 73 percent in the second half three times this season (BCU, at USC, at WSU). Since 2002-03, the Huskies have only shot over 70 percent from the field in the second half (min 20 attempts) eight times.

Thybulle is also the only player this season to record margins with 19 points, 7 steals, 5 blocks, 7 assists, 6 rebounds and 5 made from 3-point land. Thybulle is the only such player in Division I this season, and that's true even if you remove the points minimum (the three-point minimum means at least 15 points in any case). Only one player did this all of last season - William Lee of UAB. And no other Pac-12 player has done it in STATS INC data (since 1996-97).

UW's 10 wins in non-conference play tied for the second most since 2005-06 ... UW had 11 wins in 2014-15, 10 in 2006-07 and 10 in 2005-06

THAT #2 KANSAS WIN THO

The Huskies shocked the collegiate basketball world on Dec. 6, 2017, as they took down No. 2 Kansas, 74-65, at the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo. Here's a look at some of the notes from that historic win:

- Washington defeated its first top-2 opponent away from Seattle for the first time in UW history ... UW was 0-23 prior to that game
- It was the sixth win over a top 2 opponent in UW history as well - home, away or neutral
- UW's win was the biggest upset so far of the collegiate season according to ESPN's BPI
- Washington had a season high 17 assists
- UW held Kansas to just 5 made from long distance after the Jayhawks entered the game averaging 11.6 per game
- UW's 36 points in the paint were the most given up by Kansas all season
- Kansas' 45.2 percent shooting from the field was its second lowest all season and its 25.0 percent shooting from 3-point land was its lowest of the year

NOAH'S DOUBLE DOUBLES

Junior Noah Dickerson has recorded three double-doubles in 17 games this season after recording six over his first 64 games. He's nearly averaging a double-double with 14.9 points and 7.6 rebounds per outing this year.

FOUR IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Washington currently has four players averaging double-digit scoring in freshman Jaylen Nowell and juniors Noah Dickerson, David Crisp and Matisse Thybulle. All but Thybulle have had a 20+scoring effort as well. If you look at their numbers during UW's 13 wins compared to all 17 games, you see improvements in almost all of their's PPG, FG% and FT%.

DICKERSON'S CAREER NIGHT

Junior Noah Dickerson's solid 28 pts/22 rebounding night against Eastern Washington not only set career highs for the forward but also etched his name in the UW record book. His 22 rebounds were the most by a Husky since Feb. 26, 1972 (Steve Hawes vs. Stanford) and are currently the most in a Division I game this season. Additionally, just one other player has posted 25 points and 20 rebounds in a game this season nationally (Baylor's Jo Acuil-Lual, Jr. - 30 pts/21 rebs vs. Savannah State, 12/17/17).

THYBULLE'S STREAK

Junior Matisse Thybulle has started every game of his UW career which now spans 82 games. Up next on the list is Todd MacCulluch who started 83 straight from 1993-97.

GETTING TO THE LINE

The Huskies are averaging 23.5 free throw attempts through 17 games while only allowing the other team to get there on average 19.8 times.

COACH MIKE HOPKINS (1ST YEAR)

Mike Hopkins took over the helm of the University of Washington men's basketball program, UW Director of Athletics Jennifer Cohen announced on March 19, 2017. Hopkins comes to Washington from Syracuse University, where he spent 22 seasons alongside Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim. In 2015 Syracuse named him head coach designate, set to take over the Orange program after Boeheim's retirement following the 2017-18 season.

"I'm extremely excited to welcome Mike and his family to Seattle," Cohen said. "His resume and reputation within the basketball community made him stand out to us, but ultimately it was his vision for Washington, his passion for teaching and developing student-athletes and his close alignment with the core values of our institution and department that made it more than clear that he was the right fit for us."

Hopkins, 47, had been a member of the Syracuse Orange coaching staff since 1995 and will be the 19th head coach in Washington Basketball history.

"The University of Washington is such a unique place, with a world-class University, an exciting basketball history and unbelievable fan support," Hopkins said. "Together, I believe we can build something very special in Seattle, and I can't wait to get started."

During his time in New York, Syracuse advanced to postseason play in all but one year. He was a part of 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s, along with four NIT berths. Additionally, Syracuse never dipped below a .550 record while Hopkins was on staff.

"I can't express enough thanks to Coach Boeheim for so many years of mentorship and guidance," Hopkins said. "The timing is right for me and my family to make this move."

With the Orange, Hopkins spent his time in New York heavily involved in recruiting and overseeing the development of the SU guards before switching to overseeing the posts during the last four years. He played a key role in the recruitment and success of Carmelo Anthony, Rakeem Christmas, Johnny Flynn, Jason Hart, Gerry McNamara, Andy Rautins and many more who all were able to pursue professional basketball careers either in the NBA or overseas. Additionally, six players earned consensus All-American honors while Hopkins was on staff.

The Syracuse alum not only made an impact with the Orange, but he also played a major role in the success of Team USA Basketball. Hopkins has been a court coach for nine various Team USA staffs which have gone on to win six championships.

He first started with the 21-and-under team in 2000 and 2001 helping with player evaluation for the club that went on to win gold. In 2006, he was with the Senior Men's team before rejoining the staff in 2010 where he travelled with the team en route to their World Championship Title in Turkey.

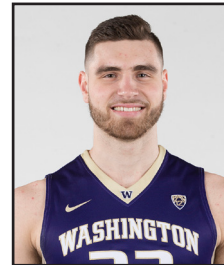
