## USF Head to Maples Pavilion Riding Three Game Winning Streak Dons Square off Against Stanford on ESPNU

### USF at a Glance

- Dons go back on the road for just the second time this season on Sunday, and for the second time they face a member of the Pac-12. Last time USF was on the road came in a 75-57 loss at Arizona State.
- The Dons are riding a three-game winning streak, tied for their longest of the season, the last three game winning streak came from 11/13/17-11/21/17 (Saint Francis, Sacramento State, Sonoma State).
- During the Dons are 6-2 at home and 0-1 away from War Memorial. As a team, USF is averaging 72.8 points per game, while shooting 40.3 percent (219-544).
- In their lone road contest, USF shot 28.6 percent from the floor that contest going 18-for-63, which includes an 11-for-40 performance from beyond the arc.
- USF has outrebounded its opponent in 8-of-9 contests this year, the lone contest in which the Dons were outrebounded came at the hands of Arizona State on the road. The Dons are +4.0 in the rebound margin, and are led by **Chase Foster's** 5.4 rebounds per game.
- Three players are averaging 10.0 points per game or more, led by freshman **Souley Boum** who is tops on the team with 15.2 points per contest. Joining him in double figures is **Jordan Ratinho** (12.4 points per game) and Foster (11.8 ppg).
- USF has employed 14 players this year, with 11 averaging 10 or more minutes per game. USF only has one player averaging more than 30.0 minutes per game, sophomore **Jordan Ratinho**.
- Were picked to finish fourth in the WCC Preseason Coaches' Poll...Saint Mary's was picked first, followed by Gonzaga, then BYU.
- Return 10 letterwinners off last year's squad, including all five starters...welcome five newcomers to the roster, including three freshmen and two sophomore JC transfers.
- USF will play six nationally televised games this season...overall 16 games will be televised this season on regional networks. Moreover, 14 games will be aired live on 95.7 The Game.

# USF Basketball Game Notes



## Head Coach Kyle Smith Hamilton College '92

**Career Record** ..... 127-98 (8th season)

Kyle Smith, who served as the head coach at Columbia University for the previous six seasons, was named USF's head men's basketball coach on March 30.

Smith, 46, becomes the 19th head coach of one of college basketball's most storied programs that has won two NCAA championships (1955 and '56), one National Invitation Tournament title (1949) and 16 conference championships.

In his first season on the Hilltop, Smith led the Dons to a 20-13 overall record, including a 10-8 mark in the West Coast Conference, and earned a postseason bid to the College Basketball Invitational. It was the Dons first 20-win season since the 2013-14 season and the program's third since the 1985-86 season. The 20-wins were also the most by a first-year USF head coach since Pete Barry led the Dons to a 24-7 record in 1980-81. USF bolted out of the gates with 10-2 record after posting a pair of signature wins over Utah and Illinois State to reach the championship game of the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic.

Along the way, USF set a school single-season record for three-pointers and was one of the most improved defensive teams in the nation, lowering its opponent scoring average by more than 10.0 points a game from the previous season. Senior guard Ronnie Boyce was a second team All-West Coast Conference selection while Charles Minlend and Jordan Ratinho earned a spot on the WCC's All-Freshman team.

In six seasons at Columbia, Smith guided the Lions to a 101-82 overall record and two postseason appearances. The 101 victories were the most in a six-year span at Columbia since the program posted 107 victories from 1965-71. This season, Columbia finished with a 25-10 record, finished third in the Ivy League with a 10-4 mark, and captured the CollegeInsider.com Tournament with a 73-67 victory over UC Irvine in the title game. The Lions became only the second Ivy League team to win a postseason tournament after Princeton's 1975 NIT Championship.

The 25 victories established a single-season school-record while the 10 Ivy League victories were the most by a Columbia team since the 1992-93 squad also went 10-4 in the Ivy. It was Columbia's second 20-win season in three years under Smith, who also guided the Lions to a 21-13 record during the 2013-14 season.

During his last three seasons at Columbia, the Lions compiled a 59-38 (.608) overall record. The 59 wins tied Princeton for the third-highest total in the Ivy League behind Yale (64) and Harvard (63).

During his six-year tenure, Smith also developed 10 players who earned All-Ivy League honors, including Maodo Lo, a two-time All-Ivy first-team recipient who is ranks as the Lions second all-time leading scorer and holds the school-record for three-pointers made.

The 2014-15 season saw an injury-riddled Lion team led top-ranked Kentucky for 27 minutes while holding the powerful Wildcats to a season-low 56 points. Lo emerged as one of the top point guards in the Ivy League and earned unanimous all-league honors, as well as NABC All-Region and All-Metropolitan second team accolades.

Prior to his appointment at Columbia in May of 2010, Smith spent 18 seasons as an assistant coach on the NCAA Division I level, including nine seasons (2001-10) at Saint Mary's College, one season at Air Force (2000-01) and eight years at the University of San Diego (1992-2000).

Born in El Paso, Texas, Smith graduated in 1992 from Hamilton College with a degree in English literature. He also played basketball and helped lead the Continentals to a 26-1 record the No. 1 ranking in the nation for NCAA Division III as a junior. He shot 51.3 percent from three-point range and helped Hamilton to an Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) championship. He also shot 51.3 percent from three-point range, which still stands as a Hamilton single-season record.

Smith also earned a master's degree in educational leadership from the University of San Diego, where he began his coaching career. Kyle and his wife, Katie, have three sons, Rocco, Bo and Luke.

## Opening Tip

The Dons are in the middle of their busiest stretch of the season, playing five games in eight days. On the year, they are 6-3, while shooting 40.3 percent from the field. Three players are scoring more than 10 points per contest, and are led by freshman Souley Boum who is averaging 15.2 points per game. Friday's contest against Stanford will be the second time the Dons have squared off against a Pac-12 team.

## Series History with Stanford

The Dons and Cardinal have a long history that dates back to the 1913-14 season. The first time the two teams tangled, Stanford came out on top in a thrilling 22-20 win. Since then the two teams have played some higher scoring games. The last time they squared off was on Nov. 9, 2012 when the Dons fell to the Cardinal 74-62 at Oracle Arena in Oakland.

## About the Cardinal

The Cardinal enter Sunday's contest with a 5-6 overall record, at Maples Pavilion they are 5-2 and coming off a 75-62 win over Denver on Friday night. Five players are averaging better than 10 points per contest and are led by Reid Travis, who averages 21.5 points per contest. The Cardinal love the three point field goal, attempting 203 on the season so far, they are currently shooting 35.5 percent from beyond the arc. As a team, Stanford is averaging 74.7 points per game and shooting 45.6 percent from the floor.

## Last Time Out: USF 74 - Eastern Washington 61

The University of San Francisco men's basketball team had its most complete game on Friday evening, recording a convincing 74-61 win over the visiting Aggies of UC Davis. The Dons had four players score in double figures and shot a season-high 51 percent from the field, extending their winning streak to three games.

USF (6-3) trailed early, as the Dons struggled to find an opening in the Aggies tough defense. UC Davis led for the initial 9:33 of the contest, going up by as much as six before Chase Foster hit the second of his four 3-point field goals to put the Dons out front 15-14 at the 9:35 mark.

From there, the Dons went on a 15-6 run over the next 4:32 and never looked back. USF's offense was firing on all cylinders on Friday evening, the Dons shot a season-high 51.0 percent from the field going 26-for-51, including a red-hot 10-for-22 (45.5 percent) from 3-point range.

Leading the way for USF was Frankie Ferrari, who tallied a career-high 19 points. Ferrari went 5-for-10 from the field and was 2-for-5 from 3-point range, at the charity stripe he connected on 7-of-8 attempts. He also dished out a game-high five assists.

Joining Ferrari in double figures was Foster who chipped in 17, going 6-for-11 from the floor and 4-for-5 from 3-point range. Matt McCarthy and Jordan Ratinho added 12 apiece. McCarthy grabbed a team-high seven rebounds. Taavi Jurkatamm also grabbed seven boards and four steals in a stellar defensive performance.

The Dons defense was stifling, UC Davis was held to

61 points on the evening, their second lowest point total of the season. Leading the Aggies in scoring was Siler Schneider who had 19 points. Chima Moneke tallied a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds.

## First Half Success

The Dons are 6-0 when leading at halftime, to that end, USF has outscored its opponents 339-276 this season. Against the Aggies on Friday, USF scored 38 points, the most points allowed by the Aggies in the opening half.

## Midweek Contests

In the Dons' eight contests this year, four have come during the week. USF is 2-0 on Monday's and 1-1 on Tuesday's. In those four contests, USF is averaging 75.8 points per game, while holding their foes to 68.2. USF is also shooting 43 percent from the field in midweek games, going 102-for-237 and 31.3 percent from 3-point range, going 35-for-112.

## Going Streaking

The Dons are currently riding a three-game winning streak, their second such streak of the season. The during that stretch the Dons are averaging 77.7 points per contest, while shooting 42.3 percent from the field. Five players are averaging double figures during that stretch.

## Cleaning the Glass

The Dons have outrebounded their opponent in all but one contest this season, a big reason for USF's lofty ranking in the national rebounding numbers. USF is currently 68th in the nation, averaging 39.2 rebounds per contest. However, the Dons are just one of eight teams without an rebounder in the top-250 in the country individually.

## From The Floor

The Dons are currently 10th in the WCC, shooting 40.3 percent from the field (219-544), the Dons love the 3-point field goal, having attempted 251 on the year. From inside the arc the Dons are shooting 47.4 percent (139-293).

## From Downtown

As previously mentioned, the Dons love the 3-point shot. USF has taken 251 3-point field goal attempts on the year, which ranks 71st in the nation. The Dons 8.9 made 3-point field goals a game ranks 81st in the nation. In the game against Arizona State, USF attempted 40 3-point field goals, which is the 22nd most this season by any team in the NCAA. The most in the NCAA this season was attempted by Savannah State, who attempted 55 shots from beyond the arc in a 112-66 loss against Wichita State on Nov. 28.

## Holding Opponents To Under 70

USF is 6-3 this season, in four of the six wins, the defense stepped up to hold the opponents to less than 70 points. Under head coach Kyle Smith, USF is 21-5 when the Dons hold their opponents to 69 or less. Last season, USF went 17-5 when holding their foes to less than 70. The last two contests, USF has come away with the win even though their opponent scored more than 70 points.

## Scoring Less Than 70

The Dons defeated Sacramento State 69-56 on Nov. 17, under Coach Smith, USF has scored less than 70 points just 12 times and is 5-7 in those contests. Last year the Dons were 4-7 in games where USF scored less than 70 points.

## Deep Bench...Again

Last season, the Dons had 10 players on the roster who played at least 12 minutes or more - with no players averaging more than 25 minutes per game. Coach Smith is doing it again, 14 players have logged time for the Dons this season, with 11 playing at least 10 minutes, only one player is averaging more than 30 minutes per game, sophomore Jordan Ratinho.

### More on the Dons Bench

The Dons' reserves have scored 324 of the Dons 655 points this season. USF's bench is averaging 36.0 points per contest. Leading the reserves is Souley Boum who is averaging 15.2 points per contest. Next on that list is Frankie Ferrari who is averaging 8.4 points per game.

### Seeing the Glass Half Full

Sure, Arizona State defeated the Dons 75-57 in Tempe on Dec. 2. But, USF is still the only team to hold the Sun Devils to less than 80 points. Last Sunday, ASU defeated traditional powerhouse, Kansas, 95-85 at Allen Fieldhouse in Lawrence, Kansas.

### Points in the Paint

The Dons have scored 242 points in the paint this season, averaging 26.9 points inside the key. Matt McCarthy is a big reason for that, as he is averaging 7.1 point this season. Over the last three games the Dons have scored 74 points in the paint, averaging 24.7 points per contest.

### Averaging Out the Wins and Losses

In the three losses this season, USF has averaged 66.7 points per game, while surrendering 79.0 points per game for a -12.3 scoring margin. In wins, the Dons average 75.8 points per game, while holding their opponents to 63.7 points per game (+12.1).

### Roster Shakedown

The Dons have 16 players on their roster this season, which includes two seniors, five juniors, six sophomores and three freshmen. Chase Foster is the only four-year senior returning, fellow senior Mars Pasache is a walk-on team manager who will only suit up for home games. Also returning is two-time captain Nate Renfro, and fellow juniors Matt McCarthy, Mladen Djordjevic, and Frankie Ferrari.

### Mid-Major Preseason Power Rankings

On Oct. 30 NBC Sports released its preseason power rankings for the Mid-Majors. The "poll" excludes teams from the traditional power-five conferences as well as BYU and Gonzaga due to their national notoriety. SMC was the top-ranked team, with the Dons coming in at 11th.

### Dons Picked Fourth In Preseason Poll

In the annual WCC Preseason Coaches Poll, USF was picked to finish fourth by the coaches of the West Coast Conference. For USF, this is the highest they have been picked since the 2014-15 season, when they were also picked to finish fourth. The Dons return a wealth of talent from last year's squad that went 20-13 en-route to the programs first post season appearance since the 2013-14 season.

### The Losses

USF lost four letter winners from last year's team, notably senior Ronnie Boyce who led the Dons in scoring at 13.1 points per contest. Also gone are sophomore Marquill Smith, and freshmen Chance Anderson and Garrett Turner.

### The Newcomers

Five newcomers dot the 2017-18 roster, which includes three freshmen and two JC transfer sophomores. Hailing from Tallinn, Estonia is 6-9 forward **Taavi Jurkatamm**. Jurkatamm was the U-20 Estonian Player of the Year last season. The Dons also have to freshmen guards, **Souley Boum** (Oakland, CA/Oakland Tech HS) and **Jamaree Bouyea** (Salinas, CA/Palma HS). Boum was a three-time OAL player of the year and ranked a composite three-star recruit by 247sports.com...that same website rated him the No. 36 prospect in California. Bouyea his senior campaign he averaged 19.1 points per game, while dishing out 6.1 assists per contest...he was named the Monterey Herald All-County Player of the Year in his junior and senior year. **Michael Orlich** (Fresno, CA/De Anza College) was named a team captain and was named to the All-Coast Conference First Team, he was number six in the state in assists per game. **Erik Poulsen** (Santa Rosa, CA/Santa Rosa JC) joins the Dons after playing for Santa Rosa JC. In his one year playing for the Bear Cubs he averaged 17.1 points, 10.3 rebounds and shot 53.9 percent from the field in 29 games.

### Beyond the Arc

The Dons made a single-season school record 299 three-pointers last year, besting the previous mark of 249 established in 2012-13. USF ranks second in the WCC and ranked t-37th nationally in three-pointers made per game (9.1). USF's 299 made threes last season are tied for 39th among Division I schools. USF ranked sixth in the WCC in three-point field goal percentage at 35.0. (299-for-855). The Dons have canned 10 or more three pointers in 12 games last season, topped off by a school-record 18 three-pointers in a loss at Eastern Washington.

In his three seasons, the Dons went 64-18, winning the WCAC three-straight seasons, while making three-straight trips to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament. Huey's combination of speed, quickness, intelligence, and jumping ability gave head coach Pete Peletta the perfect weapon to slow down All-Americans
