THE OPENING KICKOFF

- The 126th Big Game takes place on Saturday afternoon at Stanford Stadium as Stanford hosts California. The game is televised on Pac-12 Network and kicks off at 3:30 pm.
- The Cardinal lost last week on the road 62-17 to then-No. 12 Oregon State. After Stanford's defense had its best game of the season at Washington State, it allowed a season-high in points and yards.
- All three Stanford wins in 2023 have come on the road. Despite losing to the Beavers, Stanford has clinched a winning record in road games for the first time in a non-COVID-19 season since 2018.
- Elic Ayomanor eclipsed 100 receiving yards at Oregon State, the third time he has done so this season. He now has the most 100-yard games by a Stanford receiver since J.J. Arcega-Whiteside had five during the 2018 season. He also became the first Cardinal since Luke Powell in 2000 to have multiple 75-yard receptions in the same season.
- Prior to the Cardinal's final road game of the season, kicker Joshua Karty was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award, given to the best kicker in the

- country. Karty was a finalist in 2022 and was named a First Team All-American last year. He ranks seventh in Stanford history in field goals made at 45 and has the best field goal percentage in program history (84.9%).
- After struggling early in the season with third-down defense, Stanford has been better in the past few weeks. At Washington State and Oregon State, the Cardinal held both teams to just 7-22 on third down. Stanford has had the second-worst defense on third downs most of the season, but over the last two weeks, it is 35th in the country and third-best in the Pac-12.
- Stanford has lost three of the last four Big Games, but had won the previous nine.
- California remained bowl eligible after beating Washington State 42-39 last week in Berkeley. The Golden Bears would have to win out to finish 6-6 and be eligible for a postseason bowl. California is averaging over 30 points per game this season and they have one of the best running backs in the conference. Jadyn Ott ranks second in the conference in rushing yards (1,014) and rushing TDs (10).

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.
2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.
3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.
4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.
2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines

will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.

3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.

4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).

5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.

6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

GAME NOTES

THE MATCHUP

- The 126th installment of the Big Game takes place on Saturday afternoon at Stanford Stadium.
- One of the most historic rivalries in college football has seen Stanford win 65 times, including a 31-22-1 advantage when at home.
- California has won the last three of the last four Big Games, which snapped a nine-game winning streak by Stanford. That winning streak is the longest in the history of the matchup.
- Stanford has not scored more than 24 points in the Big Game since 2016, when the team scored at least 35 points in four straight against the Golden Bears.
- This rivalry has seen its share of moments over the years, with none bigger than when the LSJUMB came onto the field in 1982 during the final play of the game. The call was made by the legendary Joe Starkey of California, and this is his first season not in the broadcast booth. Starkey retired after 48 years of calling games for the Golden Bears.

THIS DATE IN STANFORD HISTORY...

...the Cardinal won its eighth straight Big Game over California by a final of 17-14 in 2017. Bryce Love ran for 101 yards and had a 57-yard touchdown in the third quarter. The win kept Stanford in the hunt for a trip to the Pac-12 title game, and after the Card won against No. 9 Notre Dame the following week, Stanford earned a spot in the title game. Eventually, the Cardinal would make the Valero Alamo Bowl.

HEAD COACH TROY TAYLOR

Troy Taylor enters his first season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2023.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor took over a Stanford program that has won 108 games since the start of the 2010 season - a total that ranks among the nation's top-20 - with 31 of those wins coming against top-25 opponents, tied for the eighth-best mark in the country in that span.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch.

Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

END OF AN ERA

David Shaw announced his resignation from the program the morning after the 2022 season finale against BYU. The winningest coach in program history, Shaw finished his 12 seasons with a 96-54 record. Shaw was honored with the 2017 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year award and led Stanford to three Pac-12 titles and two Rose Bowl victories during his tenure.

In addition to guiding Stanford to three Rose Bowl Game appearances, Shaw is the only four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year, having led the Cardinal to three conference titles. Shaw's 96 overall wins rank ninth in Pac-12 history while his 65 conference victories rank fifth. Stanford achieved 29 wins against top-25 opponents (ranking eighth nationally since 2011), 11 against top-10 programs and five against top-5 foes. Additionally, the Cardinal had 43 players drafted, a total ranking tied for 13th nationally and tied for the most in the Pac-12.

The Cardinal was equally accomplished in the classroom during Shaw's tenure, boasting a nation-leading 15 Academic All-Americans since 2010, five more than any other program and 10 more than any Pac-12 school in that span, including Andrew Luck (2011) and Christian McCaffrey (2015) as Academic All-Americans of the Year.

RECENT DRAFT SUCCESS

The Cardinal has had 55 draft picks since 2010, second-most in the Pac-12 behind only USC. Stanford is tied for eighth nationally with 11 consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 19 Academic All-Americans in that span is eight more than any other school nationally.

Since 2012, the number of draft picks to come out of Stanford is tops in the Pac-12 with 48, one more than USC (47). In the 2023 NFL Draft, the Cardinal had five players taken: Michael Wilson (3rd round, AZ), Kyu Blu Kelly (6th round, BAL), Tanner McKee (6th round, PHI), Elijah Higgins (6th round, MIA), and Kendall Williamson (7th round, CHI).

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

THE COMEBACK AT COLORADO

Stanford turned in a comeback for the ages during its road game against the Colorado Buffaloes on October 13. Down 29-0 at halftime, the Cardinal came roaring back to win 46-43 in double overtime.

Some notable facts about the historic road win by the Cardinal:

- Largest comeback win in Stanford football history.
- Biggest blown lead in Colorado football history.
- Largest halftime deficit overcome in a victory in Pac-12 history.
- Second-largest road comeback win in Pac-12 history.
- Fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history.

MIND YOUR (AYO)MANOR

No player had a more significant role in Stanford's dramatic come-from-behind win at Colorado on October 13 than sophomore wide receiver Elic Ayomanor. His performance was one for the record books, and it received a lot of attention on social media.

Ayomanor was held without a catch in the first half, but finished the game with 13 receptions for 294 yards and three touchdowns. All of those numbers were career-bests, and it lands Ayomanor at or near the top of the record book in several single-game categories:

- Most receiving yards in a game in Stanford history, surpassing the previous mark of 278 yards by Troy Walters on September 25, 1999.
- Tied for the second-most receptions in a game by a Cardinal receiver since 2000, trailing only Simi Fehoko's 16 catches on December 19, 2020.
- First game with three receiving touchdowns by a Card since Simi Fehoko on December 19, 2020, one shy of tying the Stanford single-game record.

Following the performance, Ayomanor received props on social media from Terrell Owens, Skip Bayless, ESPN, Bleacher Report, and many more.

In the last five weeks, Ayomanor has the second-most receiving yards (705) in the country, four yards less than Ricky White of UNLV.

ELIC'S ELITE SPEED

Elic Ayomanor got to 294 receiving yards with several big plays that changed the complexion of Stanford's

road game against Colorado.

His first big play game on a 97-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. He took a quick slant pass from quarterback Ashton Daniels and out-ran defenders to score. It was the longest play of the season by the Stanford offense, and the second-longest reception in Cardinal history, behind only Troy Walters and his 98-yard touchdown on September 25, 1999.

Ayomanor then scored a 60-yard touchdown later in the third quarter for his second touchdown of the game. By scoring multiple touchdowns of 60 yards or longer, Ayomanor became the first player in the Pac-12 to do so since Washington's John Ross III on November 5, 2016.

With a 75-yard touchdown against Oregon State on Nov. 11, Ayomanor became the first Cardinal since Luke Powell in 2000 to record multiple receptions of 75 yards or more in the same season. Since his breakout game against Colorado, he is averaging 19.1 yards per catch, the sixth-most in the NCAA in the last five weeks.

EYE OF THE TIGER

True freshman wide receiver Tiger Bachmeier is making his mark in the Stanford offense as the season rolls on, becoming one of the most trusted targets for Ashton Daniels.

Bachmeier caught 12 passes during the first five games of the season, but has caught 23 passes over the last four games. With ten receptions against No. 5 Washington on Oct. 28, Bachmeier became the first true freshman to record 10 catches in a game in Stanford history.

His 35 receptions and 368 receiving yards on the season are the most by a true freshman in the Pac-12 this year. He ranks seventh and ninth in the NCAA in those categories for true freshmen, respectively.

DYNAMIC DANIELS

Since leading Stanford to a comeback win at Colorado, sophomore quarterback Ashton Daniels has taken the reigns as QB1 for the Cardinal.

Daniels has completed 110 passes in the last five games, the fifth most in the Pac-12 since Oct. 11. His 1,346 passing yards in the last five games are also fifth-most in the conference.

Not only is he getting it done with his arm, but Daniels has been an effective runner as of late. Daniels has ran the ball 58 times over the last three games, which is 11th most by an FBS quarterback during that stretch.

Against No. 5 Washington, Daniels compiled a total of 448 yards (81 rushing, 367 passing), which is the second-most total yards in a single game by a Stanford quarterback. Only Davis Mills has had more in a single game, which he did in 2019 with a 491-yard performance against Washington State.

GAME NOTES

DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACKS

Stanford has employed a pair of quarterbacks who are in their first seasons seeing action as starters, and they both are showing impressive abilities as runners as well as passers.

Lamson has carried the ball more times than any running back on the Stanford roster, and it isn't close. Lamson has 108 rushing attempts on the season, while the closest running back is E.J. Smith with 46 carries. Lamson is tops among Pac-12 quarterbacks in carries, leading Shedeur Sanders of Colorado by two totes. Lamson also leads the Cardinal in rushing yards (246) and rushing touchdowns (4).

Against Oregon, Lamson tallied 22 totes, the most by a Pac-12 quarterback in a single game since Utah's Tyler Huntley had 25 in 2017. His 22 carries are tied for the 11th-most in a game by a quarterback this season in the NCAA.

Ashton Daniels has been getting involved as a runner, as well. Daniels is up to 86 carries (fifth-most in the Pac-12 for quarterbacks), giving Stanford quarterbacks 194 totes this season. Only Army (197) has more quarterback carries in 2023 than Stanford.

The combination of Daniels and Lamson ran for three touchdowns against No. 5 Washington, the most rushing touchdowns in a single game by Stanford quarterbacks since Josh Nunes ran in three against Arizona in 2012. They have combined for seven rushing touchdowns in 2023.

OCTOBER AWARDS

Following Week 7 action around the country, Stanford received a host of awards for both individual and team performances from the win over Colorado.

The Cardinal was named the Cheez-It National Team of the Week for overcoming a 29-point deficit to beat Colorado on the road in double overtime during Week 7. This is the seventh time Stanford has earned this honor since its inception in 2002.

Elic Ayomanor received well-earned recognition for his record-setting performance in the win, landing Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week honors. He became the first Cardinal to win the award since Colby Parkinson in 2018. Ayomanor also was named the Walter Camp National FBS Offensive Player of the Week, the first Cardinal to do so since Bryce Love in 2017. Not only was Ayomanor well-decorated for that singular game, but he was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.

Ayomanor was joined by Joshua Karty, who was named the Pac-12 and Reese's Senior Bowl Special Teams Player of the Week after hitting the game-tying and game-winning field goals.

Ashton Daniels was selected to a pair of "Best Of" lists: the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 List and the Manning Award Star of the Week. This comes after he helped

engineer the comeback for the Cardinal by throwing for a career-best 396 yards and four touchdowns in the double-overtime win.

ROAD WARRIORS

Stanford has yet to win a home game in Troy Taylor's first season on The Farm but they have been great away from home. The Cardinal finished the year 3-2 on the road, securing a winning record.

In two of the team's three road wins, Stanford was not leading entering the fourth quarter (trailing at Colorado, tied at Washington State). By winning both of those games, Stanford has a road winning streak in the middle of a season for the first time since 2020.

The last time Stanford had a winning record on the road in a non-COVID-19 shortened season came in 2018, when Stanford went 4-2 on the road.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

There has been a lot to celebrate so far in 2023 when it comes to Stanford alumni in the NFL. Christian McCaffrey is the league's leading rusher, Michael Wilson scored his first professional touchdowns and Zach Ertz joined the 700-reception club, to name a few.

McCaffrey was traded to the San Francisco 49ers midway through the 2022 campaign and has been one of the best players in the league. In 20 regular season games since the trade, McCaffrey has compiled 2,296 scrimmage yards with 23 total touchdowns. He scored in 17 straight games through Week 9 of this season, which tied Lenny Moore (1963-64) for the longest streak in NFL history.

In a Week 4 game between San Francisco and Arizona, Michael Wilson had a breakout game for the Cardinals in the Bay Area. Wilson recorded seven catches for 76 yards and a pair of touchdowns, his first in the NFL.

With six touchdowns between McCaffrey and Wilson in Week 4, it marked just the third time since the AFL-NFL merger where one college had at least six touchdowns scored by former players in the same game (Saints vs. Vikings - 12/25/2020 and Patriots vs. Bills - 11/23/1975).

In the same game, tight end Zach Ertz became just the eighth tight end in NFL history to record 700 career receptions. Ertz joined Jason Witten, Tony Gonzalez, Travis Kelce, and Antonio Gates as the only ones to do so in their first 11 NFL seasons.

Defensively, there have been a few standouts as well. Paulson Adebo has four interceptions for the New Orleans Saints, who are 5-4 and in first place in the NFC South. Adebo's four interceptions are tied for second-most in the NFL. Bobby Okereke is in his first season with the New York Giants, and is tied for seventh in the NFL in tackles. Justin Reid continues to help anchor the Kansas City Chiefs defense, which has allowed the fourth fewest yards in the league.

Through nine weeks of the 2023 NFL season, 27 former Cardinal have appeared in a game.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

The much-maligned Stanford defense found its footing against Washington State on Nov. 4, recording the team's best defensive performance in years.

Stanford limited Washington State to just seven points. That is the first time the Stanford defense has held a team to single-digit points since the 2019 season opener against Northwestern. The last time Stanford held a Pac-12 team to fewer than 10 points on the road came in 2012 when the Cardinal blanked Colorado.

Not only did Stanford excel at preventing Washington State from scoring, but Wazzu struggled to gain traction moving the football against the Cardinal. In the second half, Stanford allowed just 57 total yards, helping the team turn a 7-0 deficit into a 10-7 win.

A large part of that success came from stopping the run. The Cardinal allowed just four rushing yards to the Cougars offense, the second time this season that Stanford has limited a team to fewer than five rushing yards. The Cougars were also unable to pop off a run of 10 yards or more, which was the first time the Stanford defense had pulled that off since Sept. 25, 2015.

OUTPERFORMING OREGON EARLY

Perhaps signs of a strong defensive showing had been brewing. On Sept. 30 against Oregon, the first 20 minutes of the game were completely controlled by Stanford.

Stanford got the first two scores of the game via field goals from Joshua Karty to lead 6-0 early in the second quarter. The Cardinal offense was on the field for 13:37 of the first quarter and was leading the time of possession battle 16:39 - 2:48 midway through the second quarter.

The Cardinal defense held the Ducks offense without a first down on its first two drives, with the team's first first down coming with 9:28 remaining in the second quarter. This marked the first time that the Ducks offense was held without a first down in a quarter since the third quarter of the 2020 Rose Bowl. This has not happened in the first quarter of a Ducks game in at least the last 11 seasons.

SHUFFLING THE LINES

After going through the first half of the season without much consistency on the offensive line, Stanford is one of a handful of teams in the NCAA to experience a significant number of different line combinations.

Stanford has used the same starting lineup combination over the last three games for the first time this season. Stanford has used seven different offensive line combinations, which trails only South Carolina, which has used eight. With those seven different combinations on the offensive line, Stanford has started 10 dif-

ferent offensive linemen.

Defensively, Stanford has used six different starting line combinations. There has been some consistency in that area as of late, though. Up front, Franklin, Moi and Taffiti have started each of the last four games.

The only offensive lineman to start all 10 games is center Levi Rogers, who is in his first season as a center. Rogers has made 16 straight starts going back to last season.

Defensively, Anthony Franklin has started all 10 games for the Cardinal. Franklin has 17 straight starts going back to 2022. His 17 straight starts are the most on the Stanford roster.

THIRD DOWN TROUBLES

After starting the season strong on third downs, Stanford has slowed down when it comes to the most important down in football. Against the Bruins, the Cardinal was just 1-12 on third downs. By converting just one third down, it was the fewest in a single game for Stanford since the 2018 Sun Bowl vs. Pitt, and the lowest conversion percentage since the 2009 Sun Bowl vs. Oklahoma.

Over the last five games, Stanford ranks in the bottom third of the NCAA by converting just 32.9% on third downs.

Defensively, it has been even more of a struggle for the Cardinal. Sacramento State converted 11 third downs in Week 3, and the Hornets' 68.8% conversion percentage was the highest against Stanford since 2020. For the season, Stanford is allowing opposing offenses to convert on 50.0% of its third downs, the second-highest rate in the NCAA behind only UAB (51.6%).

OFFENSE ON THE FIELD A LOT

One of the keys to success on the offensive side of the ball is time of possession, and Stanford has excelled in that area under new head coach Troy Taylor. Stanford ranks 19th in the NCAA in average time of possession, holding onto the ball an average of 31:53 per game.

The only team in the Pac-12 that is better at staying on the field than the Cardinal is Utah, who ranks fourth in the country at 33:24. In seven of 10 games this season, Stanford has won the time of possession battle, and the Card has also done so in all three of its wins.

NEW FACES

With a brand new coaching staff intact, the 2023 Stanford roster looks drastically different than it has in the past. Of the 106 players, 35 are brand new to the program this year, including 28 freshmen.

An additional 29 Cardinal are sophomores, resulting in 57 underclassmen on the 2023 roster. In comparison to last year's team, there were 27 freshmen and 25 sophomores for a total of 52 underclassmen.

Through 10 games, 20 Cardinal players made their collegiate debuts, and 18 made their first career starts.

CASH KARTY

Joshua Karty earned a host of awards during the 2022 season, becoming one of the best placekickers in the NCAA. He was named First Team All-America by the Associated Press, Second Team All-America by The Sporting News and Third Team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America.

Karty is just the second placekicker in school history to earn First Team All-America honors (Rod Garcia, 1973). He is the first Cardinal since 2018 to earn All-America honors (Paulson Adebo, FWA Second Team) and the first Stanford football player to earn First Team All-America honors since 2017 (Bryce Love, Associated Press).

Karty set a school record with a 61-yard field goal as time expired at Cal in 2022. The previous long was 59 yards (Rod Garcia at USC, 1973; Mark Harmon at Purdue (1981).

Karty missed two field goals against Arizona, both from 51 yards, snapping his consecutive field goals made streak of 26 (previous miss came vs. Notre Dame on Nov. 27, 2021), the longest streak of his career.

Despite the uncharacteristic misses in 2023, Karty has still been named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week on two occasions, both for game-winning field goals (at Colorado, at Washington State). He also has been named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award for the second season in a row.

He finished last season 24-for-25 on PATs and 18-for-18 on FG attempts. For his career, he is 70-for-71 on PATs and 45-for-53 on field goals. Seven of his misses have come from at least 49 yards, with six of them from 50+.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Stanford faces another very tough schedule during the 2023 season, thanks in large part to the strength of the Pac-12. The Cardinal faced four of the five ranked teams in the Pac-12 this year, and will see six ranked teams overall.

There is no better example of the strength of the Pac-12 than by looking at how the conference started the season. After Week 1, the Pac-12 was a combined 13-0, the best start for the conference since 1938. Entering

November, the Pac-12 was one of just two conferences with six teams already bowl eligible.

Of the ranked Pac-12 teams that Stanford faces, four of those teams were inside the Preseason AP Top-25, with its toughest opponent scheduled as No. 5 Washington on October 28 at Stanford Stadium.

Four of the Cardinal's ranked matchups take place at home this year: Sept. 30 vs. No. 9 Oregon, Oct. 21 vs. No. 25 UCLA, Oct. 28 vs. No. 5 Washington, and Nov. 25 vs. No. 20 Notre Dame.

How does the 2023 schedule stack up against other teams in the country? Through 11 weeks, Stanford is one of just eight teams to have played at least five ranked teams. The others are Colorado (6), Arizona (5), California (5), Duke (5), LSU (5), Missouri (5), and Utah (5).

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 30 states plus Canada.

There are a total of 15 student-athletes from Texas, the largest representation of student-athletes from outside of California (31) on the team. Behind Texas is Georgia (9), Florida (6), and New Jersey (5).

Three student-athletes are from Canada (Aaron Armitage, Elic Ayomanor, Brendon Barrow).

HONORING ANDREW LUCK

On August 17, Stanford Athletics announced its 2023 Hall of Fame class, with 10 former student-athletes being inducted. Andrew Luck was honored as one of this year's inductees. The ceremony took place on Friday, Sept. 29.

A native of Houston, Texas, Luck is also the 19th Cardinal player to join the College Football Hall of Fame, which happened last season. Luck guided Stanford to 23 victories over his final two seasons, including appearances in the 2011 Orange Bowl and 2012 Fiesta Bowl.

He won the 2011 Maxwell, Walter Camp and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm awards and was a two-time runner-up (2010, 2011) for the Heisman Trophy. A 2011 First Team All-American and two-time conference Offensive Player of the Year, Luck rewrote the Stanford and conference record books. Luck went 31-8 as a starter, resurrecting a Stanford program that had suffered seven straight losing seasons before he became the starter in 2009. He passed for 9,430 yards and 82 touchdowns during his Cardinal career, adding 957 yards and seven

more touchdowns on the ground.

He was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 2012 NFL Draft and played seven seasons in the NFL before retiring prior to the 2019 campaign. He set the NFL record for most passing yards by a rookie quarterback (4,374) in 2012 and was named the NFL's Comeback Player of the Year in 2018.

REST OF THE CLASS

The other members of the Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2023 include Joe Borchard (baseball/football), Kori Carter (women's track and field), Grace Fattal Luczak (women's rowing), Nicole Gibbs (women's tennis), Paul Goldstein (men's tennis), Lauren Lappin (softball), Arthur Lee (men's basketball), Melissa Seidemann (women's water polo) and Tom Wilkens (men's swimming and diving).

Joe Borchard stands out as one of the members of the Class of 2023 after shining as a two-sport athlete for the Cardinal. He was the No. 12 overall pick of the 2000 MLB Draft by the Chicago White Sox after helping lead Stanford to back-to-back College World Series appearances. He also was a backup quarterback for Stanford football and played in the 2000 Rose Bowl Game.

FUTURE IN THE ACC

Stanford's lineup of conference opponents over the next seven seasons was announced last week, as the Atlantic Coast Conference unveiled its new football schedule model for 2024-30.

The Cardinal will join the ACC beginning 2024, transitioning along with longtime Pac-12 rival California and current American Athletic Conference member SMU.

Stanford's annual eight-game ACC slate will feature four home games and four road games. The approved format will have all 17 teams playing each other at least twice over the next seven seasons - once at home and once on the road. The full model for Stanford can be found in the column on the left.

The current 14 conference teams will play a total of three times each in California over the seven years and none will travel west to California in back-to-back seasons.

The new ACC schedule will continue with no divisions and increase the number of annual conference matchups from 56 to 68. The top two teams based on conference winning percentage will compete in the ACC Football Championship Game on the first Saturday in December at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Stanford is 11-10 all-time against active members of the ACC. The Cardinal is 3-1 against Duke, 2-1 against North Carolina, 1-0 against Virginia Tech, 1-1 against Wake Forest, 2-2 against Boston College, 2-2 against Pitt, 0-1 against Clemson and 0-2 against Georgia Tech. Stanford has never faced Florida State, Louisville, Miami, NC State, Virginia or Syracuse.

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 47 academic years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), the longest streak in NCAA history. Stanford leads the NCAA with 134 team titles, including three national team championships during the 2022-23 campaign - men's gymnastics, women's water polo and women's rowing - increasing its overall total to 163.

Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.

Stanford won 25 straight (a streak which snapped in 2020-21) Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cups. The Cardinal's 26th Directors' Cup came during the 2022-23 season.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor took over a Stanford program that has won 108 games since the start of the 2010 season - a total that ranks among the nation's top-20 - with 31 of those wins coming against top-25 opponents, tied for the eighth-best mark in the country in that span.

The Cardinal is 14th nationally with 50 draft picks since 2010, second-most in the Pac-12. Stanford is tied for eighth nationally with 10 consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 15 Academic All-Americans in that span is five more than any other school nationally.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

After opting not to play in the spring of the 2020-21 season, Taylor guided the Hornets to their second Big Sky Conference title in as many seasons in the fall of 2021. That year, Sacramento State

posted an undefeated record of 8-0 in league games and earned another trip to the FCS Playoffs. Taylor was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year and was one of 17 finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award. Sacramento State finished ninth in total offense (463.9 ypg) and 22nd in total defense (329.7), while its scoring offense was 33rd (30.3) and scoring defense 15th (19.1).

In his first season with the Hornets, Taylor guided the team to a 9-4 overall record and a 7-1 league mark, which gave Sacramento State a share of the Big Sky Conference title for the first time in school history, and its first NCAA FCS Playoff berth. For those efforts, he was named the conference Coach of the Year and was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS national coach of the year).

Taylor was Utah's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for two seasons (2017-18), helping the Utes to their first Pac-12 South Division title in program history in 2018. Taylor's Utah offenses featured a balanced attack both seasons, with running back Zack Moss eclipsing the 1,000-yard mark on the ground in back-to-back seasons. At least 16 different players caught passes in both seasons.

Prior to joining the FBS ranks, Taylor was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Eastern Washington in 2016. That season, he directed the top passing offense in the FCS and set numerous national and school records. The Eagles averaged an FCS-best 401.0 passing yards per game, ranked second nationally with 529.6 yards per game and were third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg). EWU posted a 12-2 overall record and advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Under Taylor, sophomore Gage Gubrud set an NCAA FCS single-season record by passing for 5,160 yards while throwing 48 touchdown passes. Gubrud, the 2016 FCS Player of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, averaged 368.6 passing yards per game, which also led the nation. One of Gubrud's favorite targets was All-American Cooper Kupp, who caught 117 passes for 1,700 yards and 17 touchdowns before being selected by the Los Angeles Rams in the third round of the NFL Draft.

Taylor's success at Eastern Washington followed an illustrious run at Folsom High School, where he was co-head coach from 2012-15. The Bulldogs set numerous California state records, including the most points scored in a season. Folsom posted a 58-3 overall record, won the Sac-Joaquin Section title each season and claimed the 2014 CIF Division I championship with a 68-7 win over Oceanside. The team also set the California record for passing yards in four consecutive years.

Taylor was instrumental in the development of Jake Browning, who would become the 2016 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year for Washington. Taylor coached Browning from fifth grade until he graduated as one of the most prolific passers in prep history. Browning set national records for touchdowns in a season (91 in

2014, tied) and career (229, in just three seasons), while establishing a number of California state high school records as well, including season (5,790) and career (16,775) passing yards.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

Taylor's first coaching job was at Casa Roble High School in Orangevale, Calif., in 1994. The following year, Taylor was a graduate assistant at Colorado, where he worked with the wide receivers. He returned to Cal in 1996 and remained at his alma mater through the 1999 season, where he had stints coaching receivers, quarterbacks and tight ends. Taylor also served as Cal's recruiting coordinator in 1999.

Taylor left Cal to become an assistant athletics director at Christian Brothers High School (2000-01) in Sacramento, where he also taught and was an assistant football coach for one season (2000). He spent 2003-04 at Folsom High School as the co-head coach. Taylor stepped away from coaching after the 2004 season but remained in football, serving as the radio analyst for Cal from 2005-11.

Taylor, 54, and his wife, Tracey, have three children: sons, Noah and Aaron, and daughter, Ella.
