**THE GAME:** Stanford will have a brief respite from facing top-10 competition, but things are never easy in the desert, as the No. 1 Cardinal (8-0, 5-0) battles Arizona State (7-2, 3-2), a team receiving votes in the AP Top-25, on Sunday, Jan. 3 at 3 p.m. PST. Cindy Brunson and Tammy Blackburn have the call on Pac-12 Network and Tim Swartz will handle the radio broadcast on TuneIn.

**THE RUNDOWN:** Tara VanDerveer became the winningest coach in women's basketball history on Dec. 15, 2020, passing Pat Summitt with her 1,099th win ... She now has 1,102 career victories ... Stanford has scored its most points through the first eight games of the season since 2001-02, and fifth most to this juncture in program history ... Francesca Belibi is the eighth woman to dunk in a college game and fifth to do so multiple times, having done it twice this year ... Stanford is playing its sixth consecutive true road game, a program record ... Stanford's 81-54 win at #6 Arizona was its largest road win over an opponent ranked that high in program history ... Stanford finished with 22 steals vs. California, the second-most in a single game in program history and most since 1997 ... No team has shot over 40 percent against the Cardinal this season, including six opponents shooting 29 percent or worse ... All 12 players suiting up for the Cardinal this season are averaging at least six minutes per game ... Seven players are averaging at least six points per game, including five averaging over 11 points per game ... Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12 Conference for the first time since 2014.

**VS. ARIZONA STATE:** Stanford is 64-16 in its all-time series with the Sun Devils and has won five straight, including an 11-point win in Tempe last year. The Cardinal has won four of its last seven games in Tempe. Stanford has won each of the last five vs. the Sun Devils by at least seven points, with ASU not scoring over 65 points in each of those meetings. Stanford's current win streak over ASU is its longest since winning 16 straight from 2006-14.

**WHAT TO EXPECT »**

- Stanford is 8-0 for second year in a row, but only for the third time since 2010. The Cardinal has begun conference play 5-0 for the second time in the last three seasons, a feat it has accomplished six times since 2010.
- Stanford has won its first six true road games of the season for the first time since going 15-0 on the road in 2012-13.
- The Cardinal has won seven straight true road games dating back to last year, doing so for the first time since winning eight straight from Dec. 21, 2016-Feb. 16, 2017.
- After playing its first game of the season at Maples Pavilion, the Cardinal has been temporary relocated for training and competition since Dec. 2, due to the emergency directive issued by the Santa Clara County Public Health Department on Nov. 28.
- Stanford spent Dec. 2-12 in Las Vegas, playing UNLV and Washington, Dec. 12-16 in Berkeley, playing California and Pacific, and Dec. 16-21 in Los Angeles, playing USC and UCLA. The Cardinal spent its holiday break in San Mateo County before traveling to Arizona on Dec. 27.

**CATCHING YOU UP »**

- No. 1 Stanford finished the year 2020 with milestones everywhere you look. Starting on Dec. 12 at California, the Cardinal defeated the Golden Bears 83-38, in a game where Francesca Belibi became the eighth woman to dunk in a college basketball game and first since Britney Griner in 2013, on top of Tara VanDerveer tying Pat Summitt's all-time wins record.
- That was followed up with VanDerveer's record-breaking win at Pacific, as Stanford defeated the Tigers 104-61, making her the winningest coach in women's college basketball history.
- VanDerveer earned win number 1,100 at USC, before Belibi added another dunk before the holiday break at UCLA.
- Stanford's 81-54 victory on Friday at No. 6 Arizona is its largest against a team ranked that high since an 89-52 victory over No. 4 Xavier on Dec. 28, 2010. Its the largest road victory against a team ranked that high in program history. Its 25 made free throws vs. the Wildcats are the most since Nov. 29, 2015.
- Stanford's 61-49 triumph against the 10th-ranked Bruins was the first time holding a top-10 opponent under 50 points since a 61-44 win vs. No. 7 Oregon State on Feb. 8, 2019.
- Stanford has already surpassed the century mark the most times in one season since 2010-11.
- Stanford has not allowed more than 61 points this season and has won each of its first eight games by at least 12 points for the first time since 2009-10.
- The Cardinal has held its first eight opponents of the season to 40 percent shooting or worse.

**HIGH EXPECTATIONS »**

- Stanford entered the year at No. 2 in the country, its highest preseason ranking since 2009-10.
- The Cardinal has ascended to No. 1 in the AP Top-25 for four-straight weeks, now with 22 appearances at the top spot in program history, ranking 10th-most all-time.
- Stanford has now appeared at No. 1 in back-to-back seasons after a seven-year hiatus.
- Stanford has been ranked in the top-10 in 32 straight AP polls, the fifth-longest active streak in the country.
- The Cardinal is second in total appearances in the AP poll with 575 behind Tennessee (740). Its 434 appearances in the top 10 are third, trailing Tennessee (617) and Connecticut (500) and its 254 appearances in the top five are fourth behind Tennessee (464), Connecticut (454) and Louisiana Tech (278).

- The Cardinal had been ranked in 312 consecutive polls, the third-longest streak all-time, until it fell out on Dec. 25, 2017. Stanford has appeared in each of the past 53 AP polls, the eighth-longest active streak in the country.

**PAC-12 PROWESS »**

- Approaching a unique scheduling setup, Stanford is set to play a full, 22-game, round-robin, Pac-12 schedule, including eight games against teams that were ranked in the preseason AP Top-25. The Cardinal was 8-5 against ranked competition last year, playing in seven-straight ranked contests to end the season.
- Stanford's eight wins against the Top 25 last season was its most since the 2016-17 season.

**RETURNERS ARE ROCKING »**

- Boasting one of the deepest rosters of talent in the nation, Stanford returned a healthy majority of every statistical category from a season ago, including 84 percent of its scoring, 69 percent of its rebounding, 85 percent of its assists, 88 percent of its made 3-pointers, 68 percent of its blocks and 82 percent of its steals.
- Of note is the return of Haley Jones, the number one recruit in the high school Class of 2019. Jones played in 18 games for the Cardinal as a freshman before suffering an injury that would end her season. Jones is back at full strength and was already named Pac-12 Player of the Week once this year, following a weekend in which she combined for 54 points, 20 rebounds, 10 assists, three blocks and two steals on 81 percent shooting from the field at UNLV and vs. Washington.
- Jones shot 14-of-15 (.933) from the floor against Washington, the second-best shooting percentage in a single game for a Stanford player and best since 1981. It's the second-best single-game shooting percentage (min. 10 made FGs) in the country this year. She is one of only two players in the Pac-12 to lead her team in points, rebounds and assists.
- Jones' fellow sophomores are also showing improvement from an impressive rookie campaign. Francesca Belibi has scored 90 points in eight games this season - it took her 14 games to reach that number as a freshman. Jones (58.2%) and Belibi (58.0%) currently rank fifth and sixth respectively in the Pac-12 in field goal shooting percentage (min. 3 made FG per game).
- Hannah Jump is second on the team in made 3-pointers with 16, shooting 41 percent from deep. Also of note is her improved rebounding - Jump finished her freshman season with 22 total rebounds, she already has 24 in eight games this year.
- The Hull twins, Lexie and Lacie, have played key roles for the Cardinal in their two years with the program - Lexie finished last season with the team lead in rebounds and steals, ranking second in points and assists. Lacie has started 48 games for Stanford and has twice been named an honorable mention on the Pac-12 All-Defensive Team.
- Stanford made 162 3-pointers in conference play last year, its most against the Pac-12 in program history. Additionally, Stanford featured three players with at least 40 made 3-pointers (Kiana Williams, Lexie Hull, Hannah Jump) for the first time since 2014-15.
- Granted a fifth year by the NCAA, Anna Wilson is making the most of it, having started all eight games for the Cardinal after only starting in five her previous four years combined. Her 14-point performance at Pacific was her most points since scoring 21 vs. Ohio State on Nov. 25, 2017 as a sophomore and her nine rebounds at Arizona were a career high. She currently leads the team, shooting 50 percent from 3-point land.

**KI IS THE KEY »**

- Senior Kiana Williams led the Cardinal in minutes played, points, assists and made 3-pointers as a junior and was named honorable mention All-America by the WBCA, Associated Press and USBWA.
- She joined the 1,000-point club last season in a win over No. 23 Tennessee and currently ranks 18th in program history with 1,462 career points.
- Despite modest shooting numbers by her standards this season, Williams has scored in double figures five of Stanford's eight games and was two shy of her career-high at USC, scoring 27 points, while tying her personal best with seven made 3-pointers.
- Her 246 made 3-pointers rank fourth in program history.

**WHO'S NEW? »**

- The Cardinal welcomed the nation's sixth-ranked recruiting class, featuring the No. 3 and No. 39 ranked players in the country in Cameron Brink and Jana Van Gytenbeek, along with top Australian prospect Agnes Emma-Nnoku.
- Brink was named a McDonald's All-American, Jordan Brand Classic All-American and a three-time Naimsmith High School All-American, in addition to being named the Gatorade Oregon Player of the Year twice.
- Brink comes from a basketball family, as both her mother and father played at Virginia Tech. She is the goddaughter of Dell and Sonya Curry; godsibling of Steph, Seth and Sydel Curry.
- Van Gytenbeek etched her name throughout the Colorado state record book, setting the state record

- Emma-Nnopus, born in Nigeria and moved to Australia at the age of three, is known as a rebounding wing player, and features experience playing for the Australian national team since the U16 level.
- Brink's 17 points vs. Cal Poly were the most for a Stanford rookie in their first collegiate game since Candice Wiggins had 24 at Utah in 2004.
- Brink's 95 points through her first eight games is the most for a Stanford freshman since Kayla Pedersen in 2007.
- Brink's five blocks at Arizona are the most for a Stanford player since Alanna Smith at Colorado on January 25, 2019.
- Jana Van Gytenbeek finished with five assists for Stanford in its season opener, the most for a freshman in their first collegiate game since Jeanette Pohlen had five at Yale in 2007.
- Van Gytenbeek's 15 assists through her first four games were the most for a Stanford freshman since at least 1999.

**TARA AT THE TOP »**

- A four-time national coach of the year (1988, 1989, 1990, 2011) and 15-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year, Tara VanDerveer, who prior to coming to Stanford served as head coach for a combined seven seasons at Idaho (1978-80) and Ohio State (1980-85), has accumulated a 1,102-253 (.813) record as a collegiate head coach and a 950-202 (.825) record at Stanford.
- VanDerveer has more wins to her name than 344 of the NCAA's 351 Division I programs and recently surpassed Pat Summitt (1,098) as the winningest coach in women's college basketball history.
- VanDerveer owns the fifth-highest winning percentage (.813) among Division I women's basketball coaches all-time and her 35 20-win seasons are third to Summitt (36) and C. Vivian Stringer (37).
- She has accounted for 950 of Stanford's 1,126 total victories since its first varsity season in 1975.
- In Dec. 2018 the Women's Sports Foundation announced the creation of The Tara VanDerveer Fund for the Advancement of Women in Coaching and is now in its second class of grant recipients.
- A total of \$200,000 was awarded to 10 universities and colleges to support a female coach on the rise, assisting with living expenses, professional development and mentorship. The institutions will use funding to support coaching fellows across a myriad of women's sports including field hockey, wrestling, basketball and volleyball, as well as softball and strength and conditioning.
- The WSF created the VanDerveer Fund to directly address the alarming decline of women in coaching. In the 1970-71 academic year, 90% of all head coaches for women's college teams were women. By 2017, 45 years after the passage of Title IX, women's share of these positions in women's NCAA sports had dropped to 40%.

- Stanford has held its first seven opponents this season to 40 percent shooting or less, winning each game by at least 12 points.
- Stanford's season-opening, 108-40 win over Cal Poly was the third largest in program history.
- In its first two games of the season, the Cardinal scored over 100 points in back-to-back games for the first time since January 2009 (Washington, Washington State)
- Stanford's 108 points scored vs. Cal Poly were its second-most points ever scored in a season-opener.

**TOP OF THE HEAP »**

- Not only is Stanford currently ranked No. 1 as a team, it's near the top in several statistical categories, ranking third in assists (168), fourth in assists per game (21.0) and assist to turnover ratio (1.71), fifth in scoring margin (+36.9), sixth in blocked shots (50), field goal percentage defense (29.7) and rebound margin (+16.9), seventh in rebounds per game (49.12), eighth in scoring defense (50.8) and 10th in scoring offense (87.6).
- The Cardinal also ranks 12th in defensive rebounds per game (32.5), 13th in blocked shots per game (6.2), 14th in 3-point field goals made (71), 16th in turnovers per game (12.2) and 20th in steals (86).
- Haley Jones leads the Pac-12 in rebounding (10.1), is second in field goal percentage (.582), third in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.5), fifth in scoring (15.8), ninth in blocked shots (1.3) and 10th in assists (3.8).
- Other conference highlights include Cameron Brink, leading in blocks per game (2.5), Francesca Belibi, ranking third in field goal percentage (.580), Lexie Hull, ranking fourth in free throw percentage (.903) and sixth in steals (2.0) and Kiana Williams, ranking seventh in made 3-pointers (2.1).
