After playing five of its first six games on the road, Stanford hosts Portland State at Maples Pavilion Wednesday in its first home contest in 22 days. The Cardinal, which will travel a total of 16,339 miles in its first eight games, opened the season with a win over Seattle on Nov. 6 in its lone previous home contest. Stanford's home game against Wofford on Nov. 16 was canceled.

FREQUENT FLYERS

Stanford will play six of its first eight games away from Maples Pavilion, traveling a total of 16,339 miles inside and outside the United States. The Cardinal will make stops in Wilmington, North Carolina, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, Lawrence, Kansas and Paradise Island, Bahamas.

YOUNG SQUAD

Eleven of Stanford's 15 players are in their first or second year playing. Only senior Josh Sharma and juniors Marcus Sheffield, Trevor Stanback and Rodney Herenton entered the year with at least two seasons played. Through six games, first and second-year players have accounted for 79.6 percent of Stanford's scoring (320 of 402) and 83.9 percent of Stanford's rebounding (183 of 218).

LAST TIME OUT

KZ Okpala scored Stanford's first seven points, en route to a game-high 22 as the Cardinal defeated Middle Tennessee, 67-54, last Friday to place seventh in the Battle 4 Atlantis. Okpala, who was limited to a season-low 25 minutes with foul trouble, opened the second half with nine of Stanford's first 13 points and was 7-of-14 from the field overall. Seven of Stanford's nine first-half field goals were threes as the Cardinal built 32-23 halftime lead. Stanford went up by 18 with six minutes left, before Middle Tennessee responded with a 9-2 run to cut it to 58-58. That was as close as the Blue Raiders would get, as Stanford remained in control for the double-digit victory.

AGAINST PORTLAND STATE

Stanford and Portland State have met three times previously, including last season in the PK80 Invitational in Portland. The Cardinal won the first two meetings, defeating the Vikings on Dec. 19, 2001 (87-63) and Nov. 29, 2009 (83-64) at home. Stanford dropped an 87-78 decision to Portland State in the PK80 Invitational on Nov. 26, 2017 at Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Portland.

OKPALA'S IMPACT AS A SOPHOMORE

Sophomore KZ Okpala is averaging a team-best 17.7 ppg in 33.7 mpg through six games this season. He averaged 12.0 ppg in 30.5 mpg in his first six games last season. The forward, who had a career-best 29 points in the season opener against Seattle, is eighth in the Pac-12 in scoring. He was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week on Nov. 12.

BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS RECAP

In its second appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis, Stanford placed seventh with a win over Middle Tennessee and defeats to No. 25 Wisconsin and Florida. The Cardinal struggled from the field against the Badgers and Gators, shooting a combined 31.4 percent (32-of-102). Against Wisconsin, Stanford recorded its worst shooting percentage in three seasons, posting a 27.1 FG percentage overall and 11.1 percent from three. Stanford, which had 46 points against Wisconsin and 49 vs. Florida, had not scored less than 50 points in consecutive games since the 1961-62 season. In the win over Middle Tennessee, seven of Stanford's nine first-half field goals were threes. The Cardinal shot 38.2 percent overall against the Blue Raiders.

RYAN ON TARGET FROM DOWNTOWN

Freshman Cormac Ryan ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in three-point field goals, averaging 2.3 per game. He scored a team-best 12 points, all in the second half and all on three-pointers, last Thursday against Florida. The freshman has recorded at least four three-point field goals in a game in three of Stanford's six contest (5 vs. Seattle, 4 vs. North Carolina, 4 vs. Florida).

Ryan is second on the team in scoring, averaging 11.2 ppg. He is shooting 33.3 percent from three-point range (14-of-42).

DAVIS CONTRIBUTING ON BOTH ENDS

Sophomore Daejon Davis, who broke Brevin Knight's school freshman assist record with 160 last season, has started all 39 career games he has played in. The point guard is averaging 8.2 ppg this year, with nine steals in six games. He ranks eighth in the Pac-12 in steals (1.5 spg). The sophomore has posted at least four points, four rebounds, four assists and four steals in two games this season against UNC Wilmington and Middle Tennessee. He has posted at least four points, four rebounds and four assists in three of Stanford's six games so far. The point guard matched his career-high rebound total with 10 boards against the Blue Raiders last time out.

YOUNGEST PLAYER IN THE PAC-12

With a birthdate of October 13, 2000, Bryce Wills is the youngest player in the Pac-12 and one of the youngest in Division I college basketball. With most of the Division I schools reporting, Wills is the seventh-youngest player in the nation this season. He has started the last three games.

DA SILVA'S SECOND-HALF PRODUCTION

Oscar da Silva has scored 29 of his 38 points on the season in the second half. Over the last four games, 25 of his 28 points have come after halftime.

SCHOOL-RECORD SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN WIN OVER SEATTLE

In the season-opening win over Seattle, Stanford posted a school-record 73.3 three-point field goal percentage. The Cardinal connected on 11-of-15 attempts, led by Cormac Ryan's 5-of-6 FG percentage. The old mark was 72.7 percent (8-of-11) against Oregon State on Dec. 17, 1988.

MOST STEALS IN 22 YEARS IN VICTORY AT UNC WILMINGTON

In the win at UNCW, Stanford recorded 15 steals, matching its best total in a game in the last 22 years. The only other time Stanford had 15 steals in a game during that span was against Oregon State on Jan. 5, 2006.

RYAN POSTS THIRD-BEST POINT TOTAL IN DEBUT

Cormac Ryan's 16-point performance in his collegiate debut against Seattle was the third most by a true freshman in his debut in the program's 104-year history. Ryan connected on five threes, similar to now-sophomore Isaac White's collegiate debut last season (17 points on five three pointers).

BACK-TO-BACK TOP-20 RECRUITING CLASSES

In Stanford's first six games, four true freshmen have made their first collegiate appearances. Cormac Ryan led the way with 16 points in 33 minutes in the season opener against Seattle. Jaiden Delaire had eight points in 25 minutes against the Redhawks. Lukas Kisunas had two points in five minutes. Bryce Wills made his collegiate debut at UNCW, with three points in 14 minutes. He has started the last three games. The Cardinal's class of newcomers was ranked as high as No. 20 nationally, giving the program back-to-back top-20 recruiting classes. Stanford's 2017 class of Daejon Davis, KZ Okpala, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White was ranked No. 8 nationally.

SHEFFIELD RETURNS

Redshirt junior Marcus Sheffield has returned to the lineup this season, after missing the entire 2017-18 season. He injured his leg in practice a couple days before the regular-season opener last year. Sheffield, who poured in a career-best 35 points against Arizona State on Dec. 30, 2016, averaged 6.7 ppg during his true sophomore campaign in 2016-17. Sheffield is averaging 5.8 ppg in 16.5 mpg off the bench in the first six games of 2018-19.

KISUNAS EARNED EXTENDED MINUTES AGAINST TAR HEELS

After playing five minutes in the first two games (did not see action at UNCW), freshman Lukas Kisunas played 12 minutes in the second half at No. 7 North Carolina. The forward scored two points, collected four rebounds and a block in extended action against the Tar Heels in Chapel Hill. He scored two points in nine minutes against Florida in the Battle 4 Atlantis.

2017-18 SNAPSHOT

Stanford's 2018-19 roster includes two returning starters and nine letterwinners overall from last season's squad that won 19 games overall and reached the postseason for the first time in three years.

Davis, who started all 33 games he played in last season, was named to the five-member All-Pac-12 Freshman Team last year after averaging 10.7 points and 4.8 assists. He broke Brevin Knight's freshman assist record with 160. Okpala, who started 21 of the 23 games he played in, averaged 10.0 ppg last year.

PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL

Stanford was picked ninth in the Pac-12 Conference men's basketball preseason poll, as voted on by the media who cover the league.

The Cardinal, picked fifth by the media in last season's preseason poll, finished third in the conference in 2017-18 with an 11-7 record for its best conference finish and most league wins in a decade.

DELAIRE RECLASSIFIED TO JOIN 2018 CLASS

Jaiden Delaire, one of the top-rated players in the 2019 class, reclassified to the 2018 class and signed in August. He completed four years of high school, beginning at Granby Memorial High School before moving

to The Loomis Chaffee School the last two years.

A 6-9, 200-pound forward from North Granby, Connecticut, Delaire was the 2018 Gatorade Boys Basketball Player of the Year in the state of Connecticut. He averaged 21.3 points, 7.4 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game for The Loomis Chaffee School last season.

A consensus four-star prospect, Delaire is ranked No. 68 by Rivals, No. 76 by 247Sports and No. 79 overall by ESPN in the 2019 rankings. Delaire is ranked No. 78 in the recently updated 247Sports rankings for the class of 2018.

HAASE INCREASES TEAM WIN TOTALS EACH SEASON

Jerod Haase has led his teams to increased win totals in each of his first six full seasons as a head coach. In his first season as a head coach in 2012-13, Haase guided UAB to 16 wins, eventually posting 26 wins and a second consecutive postseason berth in his final year with the Blazers in 2015-16. After Stanford earned 14 wins in his first season on The Farm in 2016-17, he led the Cardinal to 19 wins and an NIT berth last season.

CARDINAL SIGNS POINT GUARD TYRELL TERRY

Jerod Haase announced the signing of nationally-ranked point guard Tyrell Terry to a National Letter of Intent on Nov. 14.

The 6-1, guard out of Minneapolis, Minnesota, is a consensus four-star prospect and one of the top point guard's in the Class of 2019.

A star for De La Salle High School in Minneapolis, Terry is ranked No. 61 in the 2019 class by 247Sports, No. 81 by Rivals and No. 90 by ESPN. The point guard is No. 76 in the 247Sports composite rankings. He is the third-ranked prospect in the state of Minnesota by all three outlets. Terry is rated as the fifth-best point guard in the class by 247Sports, while Rivals ranks him No. 11 at his position and ESPN has him at No. 12 in their positional rankings.

Terry averaged 17 points and seven assists per game for DeLaSalle during his junior season. He led the Islanders to a 21-4 record in 2017-18. DeLaSalle placed third in the Minnesota Class 3A state tournament, where Terry was named to the 10-man all-tournament team. Terry also competed with the USA Select Team at the Albert Schweitzer Tournament in Germany and was a standout for D1 Minnesota on the AAU circuit this past summer.

FLOOR BURNS

During his collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the third season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat.

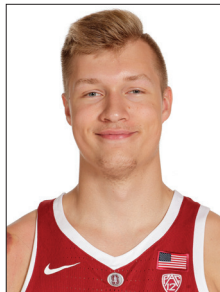

Overall: 116-89 (Six seasons)
Stanford: 36-36 (Two seasons)

In just his first two seasons as Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball, Jerod Haase has already left a strong imprint on the program. Under his leadership, the Cardinal has instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude that has elevated Stanford to success it hasn't enjoyed in a decade.

In his second season on The Farm, Haase guided the Cardinal to a third-place finish in the Pac-12 with 11 conference wins, the program's highest finish and most league victories in 10 seasons. Competing without two starters for half the season, Stanford won 19 games overall and earned a postseason berth for the first time in three years with a second-round appearance in the National Invitation Tournament.

In two seasons with Haase and his staff, several members of the Cardinal have earned individual accolades. Forward Reid Travis has been voted a First Team All-Pac-12 selection by the league's coaches and garnered NABC All-District laurels each of the last two seasons. Forward Dorian Pickens was named an all-conference player for his performance on the court and the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for his efforts in the classroom this past season. Point guard Daejon Davis was named to the five-member Pac-12 All-Freshman Team in 2017-18.

In two full recruiting cycles, Haase and his staff have landed top-tier classes. Stanford's 2017 recruiting class was regarded as one of the best in school history. The four-member group was rated a top-10 class nationally by many, ranked as high as eighth by Rivals. The Cardinal's 2018 class is again regarded among the best in the nation. In his first year with the Cardinal in 2016-17, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules. Stanford finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs in the classroom as well.

Haase was appointed Stanford's 18th men's basketball coach on March 25, 2016. At UAB, Haase led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game. During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003. When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection. Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' 1997 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Haase earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000. Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.
