SUNDAY EVENING TANGLE WITH THE TIGERS

Stanford continues its season-opening five-game homestand Sunday as Pacific comes to The Farm for a 7 p.m. PT tip-off at Maples Pavilion. It's the first meeting between the two Bay Area schools in six seasons.

CARDINAL POWERS PAST MUSTANGS IN OPENER

Reid Travis scored 26 points and had 12 rebounds to lead Stanford to a 78-62 victory over Cal Poly Friday at Maples Pavilion for its eighth consecutive victory in its season opener. Travis led four Cardinal in double figures in the win. Freshman Isaac White added 17 points in his first collegiate game, while Dorian Pickens and Robert Cartwright contributed 10 points apiece.

THE STARTING FIVE

Sunday's contest is the second in a stretch of five games in 11 days. Stanford opened the season with a win over Cal Poly Friday. Following Sunday's game, the Cardinal hosts Eastern Washington Tuesday (Nov. 14), Northeastern Friday (Nov. 17) and caps its five-game seasonopening homestand against defending NCAA champion North Carolina Nov. 20. It's the longest homestand since hosting seven consecutive games from December to January of the 2015-16 season. Last season, Stanford played its fifth home game on Dec. 16 after a 22,132mile journey that included games in Lawrence, Kan., Orlando, Fla. and Shanghai, China.

VETERAN GROUP

Boasting the fifth most experience roster in the nation in terms of games played (504 total), Stanford brought back four starters and five of its top six scorers from last season. The Cardinal welcomed back a good portion of its offense in Reid Travis (17.4 ppg), Dorian Pickens (12.6 ppg) and Michael Humphrey (9.4 ppg) back for their fourth season on The Farm.



WHITE POSTS BEST DEBUT MARK SINCE 1977 (VS. FAMILIAR OPP.)

Freshman Isaac White's 17-point performance against Cal Poly on Friday was the second-most points by a true freshman in his collegiate debut in the 103-year history of the program. The mark is only topped by Mark Pitchford's 28 points on Nov. 25, 1977, also against Cal Poly.

AGAINST PACIFIC

Stanford leads the all-time series against Pacific, 32-3. The Cardinal has won the last 17 games in the series, most recently posting a 79-37 victory over the Tigers on Nov. 28, 2011 at Maples Pavilion.

AGAINST THE WEST COAST CONFERENCE

Stanford owns a 183-80 all-time record over current members of the West Coast Conference. Santa Clara has been the most common opponent, with Stanford owning a 50-26 all-time record against the Broncos. The only team the Cardinal has not played in the 10-team league is Pepperdine. The last WCC opponent Stanford faced was Saint Mary's on Nov. 30 of last season at Maples Pavilion. The Gaels prevailed, 66-51.

PETER SAUER CAPTAINSHIP

Head coach Jerod Haase announced the establishment of the Peter Sauer Captainship in September, naming Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey captains. The three will wear patches on their uniforms honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team.

TOP-TIER RECRUITING CLASS

Stanford signed a consensus top-25 national recruiting class and one of the highest rated classes in school history this off-season. Standout guards Daejon Davis (Seattle, Wash.) and Isaac White (Adelaide, Australia) signed in the spring, after the fall signings of Oscar da Silva (Munich, Germany) and MaxPreps High School All-America selection Kezie Okpala.

CARDINAL UNDERWAY IN SECOND YEAR OF JEROD HAASE ERA

Head coach Jerod Haase, who has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 19 times as either a player or coach in his career, looks to lead the Cardinal back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since Stanford's 2014 NCAA Sweet Sixteen run. Haase owns a 95-70 career record in his sixth season (four at UAB and two at Stanford) as a head coach.

THE FOURTH-YEAR CLASS

The four members of Stanford's fourth-year class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - accounted for 62.6 percent of the team's scoring and 55.4 of the team's rebounding last season. Pickens and Humphrey are true seniors, while Travis and Cartwright have each had their medical hardship waivers granted and are redshirt juniors with another year of eligibility remaining after this season. Cartwright missed the entire 2015-16 season with a compound fracture of his right forearm sustained in preseason practice on Nov. 2, 2015. Travis was forced to miss the final 22 games of the 2015-16 season with a right leg injury.

PICKENS ON TARGET FROM BEYOND THE ARC

Dorian Pickens, the only player to start all 31 games last season, posted at least one three-pointer in all but four games, with multiple three-pointers in 19 contests during his junior season. He ranked ninth in the Pac-12 in three-point field goals made in conference play (39, 2.2) and 11th overall (67, 2.2) last year. Pickens was Stanford's leading three-point shooter (67-of-169, 39.6 percent). The forward registered a career-high seven three-pointers (7-of-10) against Idaho last season. He connected on the game-winning trifecta against Indiana State with 2.0 seconds left. Pickens' 0-for-5 performance from three-point range in Friday's season opener was only the second time in the last 11 games he did not post at least one three-point field goal in a game.

HUMPHREY CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Michael Humphrey (6.2 rpg overall) averaged 7.4 rebounds in Pac-12 play to rank 13th in the conference last season. He finished fifth in the Pac-12 in offensive rebounding (2.8 orpg) in conference play and 10th overall (2.2 orpg). At UCLA, Humphrey set a career-high with 27 points and finished one shy of his career-best with 14 rebounds. Humphrey collected nine rebounds in Friday's season opener.

FIFTH IN PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL

Stanford hwas selected fifth in the Pac-12 Conference preseason poll voted on by the media. The Cardinal totaled 182 points to place fifth in a vote of the media members that regularly cover the conference.

STAR-STUDDED 2017 PHIL KNIGHT INVITATIONAL

Stanford will compete in the prestigious 16-team PK80 – Phil Knight Invitational – over Thanksgiving week. The event, which will honor Nike co-founder and Stanford alumnus Phil Knight MBA '62 in advance of his 80th birthday, will be contested in Portland, Oregon. Stanford will be joined in the 16-team field by Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, DePaul, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State and Texas. This highly-anticipated event will be one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history.

The Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball Jerod Haase

Overall: 95-70 (Sixth Season) **Stanford:** 15-17 (Second Season)

After being introduced as the Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016, Jerod Haase developed a strong relationship with his program and instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude among his student-athletes.

In his first year at the helm of the Cardinal program, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Redshirt sophomore Reid Travis earned First Team All-Pac-12 and NABC All-District honors, developing into one of the top players in the conference on both ends of the court. His program finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs nationally in the classroom as well.

Haase and his staff signed a top-tier recruiting class that is rated as high as No. 10 nationally in the 2017 rankings, welcoming the four-member class to The Farm for the 2017-18 season.

Haase arrived on The Farm prior to the 2016-17 season after completing his fourth season as the head coach at UAB, where he led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helf of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 – 24th), assists per game (18.4 – 4th) and blocks per game (4th – 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the

Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen – all players recruited by Haase and his staff – and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (10), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
