UW (18-9, 8-6) AT STANFORD (14-13, 8-6)

UW takes its final regular-season road trip of the season as it heads to the Bay Area to first face Stanford on Thursday, Feb. 22 at 6 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 22. The game will be televised on Pac-12 Networks with Guy Haberman and Mike Montgomery on the call. Additionally, fans can tune into KOMO 1000AM and 97.7 FM to hear the official UW radio broadcast from Tony Castricone and Jason Hamilton. Stanford won the first meeting this season taking a 73-64 victory in Seattle and have the series record at 76-71.

THE COACH

Head Coach Mike Hopkins is in his first year at Washington, and first as a head coach becoming the 19th head coach in UW history. After spending 22 years as an assistant at Syracuse, Hopkins oversaw teams that reached the NCAA Tournament 16 times including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s along with four NIT berths. Syracuse never dipped below a 55.0 percent record while Hopkins was on staff.

QUICK HITTERS

- Washington's 18 wins in the regular season are its most since the 2011-12 season when UW won 21 regular season games prior to postseason
- With its 13 assists and 12 steals against Colorado, UW recorded its eighth 10+ assist and 10+ steal game of the season
- Washington's 23-point victory over Colorado was its largest conference win since a 26-point decision over Oregon State on Jan. 7, 2017
- UW's eight turnovers vs. CU were a season-low and its fewest since seven vs. Utah at home on Jan. 21, 2017
- Junior **Noah Dickerson** became the 39th player in UW history to reach the 1,000 career scoring mark after scoring a career-high tying 28 points at OSU ... he currently has 1,042 points
- Additionally, junior **David Crisp** is close to getting to 1,000 career points as he is at 989 career points
- The last time UW had two players reach 1,000 points in the same season was the 2008-09 season when both Quincy Pondexter and Justin Dentmon crossed the 1K mark that year
- Out of his 186 career steals, which rank second all-time at UW, **Matisse Thybulle** is creating scoring on 56.9 percent of the direct next possessions ... this year alone, that number jumps to 58.5 (48 of 82)
- Junior **Matisse Thybulle** owns the UW single-season steals record as he now has 82 with four games still remaining in Pac-12 play ... the previous record was held by Bryan Boston (67-1994-95, 27 games) ... his 82 steals are second in the NCAA and are one off of the national lead, held by Jevon Carter of West Virginia (83) ... he also ranks 12th amongst active Division I players with 184 career steals
- Junior **Dominic Green** has seen his season numbers from 3-point range increase immensely over his career as he started at 29.5 pct (13-44) as a FR, 17.3 pct (9-52) as a SO and is now shooting 46.0 (23-50) from long distance as a JR
- Per Elias/Pac-12 Conference, over the last 40 seasons, only two league schools began its conference slate 6-3 or better the season after having no more than two conference victories. Stanford started 1993-94 with a 6-3 record after going 2-16 in 1992-93.
- Junior **David Crisp** has only played less than 30 minutes four times this season in 27 games and in all four of those games he has played 26 minutes
- Junior **Noah Dickerson** recorded his third 20-point/10-rebound double-double of the season against OSU with 28 points and 12 rebounds ... he now has five 20/10 double-doubles on his career
- In the Huskies last four wins, they held opponents to 64.4 points per game, 25.6 percent shooting from 3-point range and outrebounded them by a 3.4 margin.
- Since Pac-12 play has started, UW has held all but two of its opponents to a lower 3-point FG percentage than they had entering the game and on average are holding opponents to 3.2 less 3's per game compared to their season average
- **Thybulle** became the first Husky in program history to rank in the career top 10 in both categories ... Thybulle has 186 career steals (2nd) and 95 career blocks (8th).
- Washington has overcome 10 point deficits three times this season in wins over Belmont, USC and Washington State ... additionally, UW has trailed by at least five in seven of its 18 wins

DAWGS ON THE ROAD

In UW's four road wins (Kansas, USC, WSU, Colorado), it has five players in double-digit scoring, are shooting 52.4 percent from the field while holding opponents to 42.3 while that number drops when you look at the opponent's 3-point FG percentage in those games (23.6 percent).

FROM 2-16 TO 8-6

After going 2-16 in Pac-12 play a year ago, the Huskies now are 7-6 in league action. Via Elias Stats/Pac-12 Conference, **over the last 40 seasons, only two league schools began its conference slate 6-3 or better the season after having no more than two conference victories. Stanford started 1993-94 with a 6-3 record after going 2-16 in 1992-93.**

IN 18 W'S VS OVERALL STATS

Washington currently has four players averaging double-digit scoring in freshman Jaylen Nowell and juniors Noah Dickerson, David Crisp and Matisse Thybulle. All have had a 20+scoring effort as well. If you look at their numbers during UW's 18 wins compared to all 27 games, you see improvements in all of their's PPG, FG% and FT%.

JAYLEN IN THE CLUTCH

Freshman Jaylen Nowell has been key for the Huskies in the second half as he has been averaging 9.4 points on 51.9 percent shooting from the field over the final 20 minutes compared to 6.4 points and 41.2 percent shooting from the field in the first half.

FINAL 5 MINUTES

Nowell becomes even more efficient in the final five minutes as he is shooting 55.1 percent from the field of Washington's 26 games, going 27-of-49. Additionally he is 26-of-30 from the FT line (86.7 percent) during the final five minutes.

DEFENDING THE 3

In Pac-12 Conference play, the Huskies have been making it hard for opponents to knock it down from long distance. Eight of UW's 14 league teams have been held to less than 30 percent from three and all but two of the 14 have been held below their average made entering the game vs UW.

Washington retired the No. 2 jersey of two-time NBA All-Star, Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and Honorable Mention All-American Isaiah Thomas on Feb. 17, 2018 vs. Colorado. Thomas became the third Husky in program history to have his number retired joining Bob Houbregs (No. 25) and Brandon Roy (No. 3). Here's a look at some of IT's highlights:

UW AT ALASKA AIRLINES ARENA

The Dawgs currently have 988 wins inside Alaska Airlines Arena and play two of their next four in the friendly confines. Washington's 988 wins are the most by any Division I team at its current home arena. The Huskies started playing in their arena on Dec. 27, 1927.

MR. AUTOMATIC

Junior Noah Dickerson has been key for the Huskies at the charity stripe, shooting 76.4 percent (126-165) with the most attempts on the team. In Pac-12 play that number goes up to 81.7 percent (58-of-71) as he has only missed 13 in 14 games.

THYBULLE'S STREAK

Junior Matisse Thybulle has started every game of his UW career which now spans 92 games. Up next on the list is Bryan Boston who started 96 straight in games he was able to play from 1991-1996, as he redshirted the 1993-94 season.

GREEN FROM 3!!

Junior Dominic Green has been on fire from long distance as of late knocking down 20 of his 32 this season during Pac-12 play. His 20 are a career best in league action and he's shooting at 43.5 percent clip over the last 13 games. Twenty of his made 26 FGs in Pac-12 action have been from 3-point range.

TIMMINS' IMPROVEMENT

Sophomore **Sam Timmins** has seen an improvement in his efficiency this year as he is averaging 5.2 rebounds and 4.6 points in 19.5 minutes per game while also shooting 57.0 percent from the field. In comparison to a year ago, Timmins was at 3.8r/3.2p in 14 minutes per outing. Additionally, **he has pulled down eight or more boards seven times this season** through 26 games ... last season, he only had four games with eight or more in 31 outings.

MR. VERSATILE

Thybulle is also the only player this season to record margins with 19 points, 7 steals, 5 blocks, 7 assists, 6 rebounds and 5 made from 3-point land. Thybulle is the only such player in Division I this season, and that's true even if you remove the points minimum (the three-point minimum means at least 15 points in any case). Only one player did this all of last season – William Lee of UAB. And no other Pac-12 player has done it in STATS INC data (since 1996-97).

SECOND HALF SUCCESS

UW has upped it's game in the second half outscoring opponents 39.5 to 38.7. Additionally, UW has shot over 73 percent in the second half three times this season (BCU, at USC, at WSU). Since 2002-03, the Huskies have only shot over 70 percent from the field in the second half (min 20 attempts) eight times.

Washington had two 20+ scorers against Loyola Marymount as Jaylen Nowell had 21 and Noah Dickerson scored 20 ... it was the first time since Dec. 11, 2016 that UW had two players score at least 20 (vs. Nevada - Fultz and Crisp). UW followed that up with two more 20 point scorers in the same game at Oregon State, as Dickerson had 28 and Nowell had 23.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

UW's 10 wins in non-conference play tied for the second most since 2005-06 ... UW had 11 wins in 2014-15, 10 in 2006-07 and 10 in 2005-06

SWISS ARMY STYLE

Junior Matisse Thybulle could be called the Swiss Army Knife of the UW basketball squad as he has put together nights with each of the following stats

THE USC WIN IN LA

Washington put up some outstanding numbers in its 88-81 win at the Galen Center in Los Angeles. Take a look:

- UW got its first win vs. USC on the road since March 1, 2012 (80-58)
- UW's 67.3 percent shooting from the field against USC is its best in the last 15 years ... additionally, UW's 73.1 shooting in the second half is the second time the Huskies have shot 73 percent or better in the second half this season (73.5 vs. BCU, 25-34).
- UW held USC to just 3-of-20 shooting from 3-point range, it's lowest percentage of the year (.150) ... additionally its the lowest 3FG percentage a UW opponent has had since UW held Stanford to 3-of-21 (.143) in Palo Alto on March 9, 2016
- Over half of UW's scoring against USC (52 of 88 - 59.1 percent) came in the paint ... it's the highest percentage of points in the paint this season for UW and the 52 tie the most this season UW has had in a game

#'S VS. BETHUNE-COOKMAN

Washington's squad set some outstanding numbers as a team against Bethune-Cookman in its 106-55 win on Dec. 19.

- UW had 6 players in double figures, first time since Jan. 28, 2016 at UCLA with 6 in double figures
- UW's 51 point victory was its biggest since a 54-point win over McNeese State on Nov. 13, 2010
- UW's 106 points tie for the 21st most in UW history
- UW's 15 blocks tie the single-game Husky record
- UW's 15 3-pointers made are the most since 17 against California on Feb. 10, 2011
- BCU had 17 TOs and just six FGs in the second half

THAT #2 KANSAS WIN THO

The Huskies shocked the collegiate basketball world on Dec. 6, 2017, as they took down No. 2 Kansas, 74-65, at the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo. Here's a look at some of the notes from that historic win:

- Washington defeated its first top-2 opponent away from Seattle for the first time in UW history ... UW was 0-23 prior to that game
- It was the sixth win over a top 2 opponent in UW history as well - home, away or neutral
- UW's win was the biggest upset so far of the collegiate season according to ESPN's BPI
- Washington had a season high 17 assists
- UW held Kansas to just 5 made from long distance after the Jayhawks entered the game averaging 11.6 per game
- UW's 36 points in the paint were the most given up by Kansas all season
- Kansas' 45.2 percent shooting from the field was its second lowest all season and its 25.0 percent shooting from 3-point land was its lowest of the year

DICKERSON'S CAREER NIGHT

Junior **Noah Dickerson's** solid 28 pts/22 rebounding night against Eastern Washington not only set career highs for the forward but also etched his name in the UW record book. His 22 rebounds were the most by a Husky since Feb. 26, 1972 (Steve Hawes vs. Stanford) and **are currently the third most in a Division I game this season.**

His 32 points are also the most this early in the season by any Dawg - Isaiah Thomas had 30 as a sophomore on Nov. 13, 2009 and Markelle Fultz had 30 as a freshman on Nov. 13, 2016.

COACHING UPDATES

Along with the addition of head coach Mike Hopkins, Washington welcomed two former head coaches to its staff in Dave Rice (UNLV) and Cameron Dollar (Seattle U). Joining them is third-year assistant coach Will Conroy. Washington also added Jerry Hobbie (SMU) as a Special Assistant to the Head Coach.

HUSKIES IN THE NBA

UW's presence in the NBA remains strong as the Dawgs boast seven former players holding spots on rosters this season - No. 1 pick Markelle Fultz (Philadelphia 76ers), Marquese Chriss (Phoenix Suns), Justin Holiday (Chicago Bulls), Dejounte Murray (San Antonio Spurs), Quincy Pondexter (Chicago Bulls), Terrence Ross (Orlando Magic), and Isaiah Thomas (Los Angeles Lakers).

DOUBLE UP ON THAT No. 1

Washington became the first program in NBA/WNBA history as it boasted both the No. 1 pick in the NBA Draft in Markelle Fultz (Philadelphia 76ers) and the WNBA Draft in Kelsey Plum (San Antonio Stars) in 2017.

COACH MIKE HOPKINS (1ST YEAR)

Mike Hopkins took over the helm of the University of Washington men's basketball program, UW Director of Athletics Jennifer Cohen announced on March 19, 2017. Hopkins comes to Washington from Syracuse University, where he spent 22 seasons alongside Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim. In 2015 Syracuse named him head coach designate, set to take over the Orange program after Boeheim's retirement following the 2017-18 season.

"I'm extremely excited to welcome Mike and his family to Seattle," Cohen said. "His resume and reputation within the basketball community made him stand out to us, but ultimately it was his vision for Washington, his passion for teaching and developing student-athletes and his close alignment with the core values of our institution and department that made it more than clear that he was the right fit for us."

Hopkins, 47, had been a member of the Syracuse Orange coaching staff since 1995 and will be the 19th head coach in Washington Basketball history.

"The University of Washington is such a unique place, with a world-class University, an exciting basketball history and unbelievable fan support," Hopkins said. "Together, I believe we can build something very special in Seattle, and I can't wait to get started."

During his time in New York, Syracuse advanced to postseason play in all but one year. He was a part of 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s, along with four NIT berths. Additionally, Syracuse never dipped below a .550 record while Hopkins was on staff.

"I can't express enough thanks to Coach Boeheim for so many years of mentorship and guidance," Hopkins said. "The timing is right for me and my family to make this move."

With the Orange, Hopkins spent his time in New York heavily involved in recruiting and overseeing the development of the SU guards before switching to overseeing the posts during the last four years. He played a key role in the recruitment and success of Carmelo Anthony, Rakeem Christmas, Johnny Flynn, Jason Hart, Gerry McNamara, Andy Rautins and many more who all were able to pursue professional basketball careers either in the NBA or overseas. Additionally, six players earned consensus All-American honors while Hopkins was on staff.

The Syracuse alum not only made an impact with the Orange, but he also played a major role in the success of Team USA Basketball. Hopkins has been a court coach for nine various Team USA staffs which have gone on to win six championships.

He first started with the 21-and-under team in 2000 and 2001 helping with player evaluation for the club that went on to win gold. In 2006, he was with the Senior Men's team before rejoining the staff in 2010 where he travelled with the team en route to their World Championship Title in Turkey.

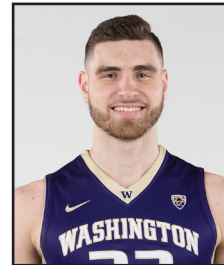

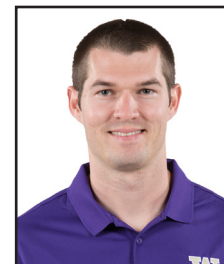
