STANFORD CARDINAL

CAL VISITS STANFORD FOR 126TH BIG GAME

ABOUT THE SERIES

- Saturday will be the 126th all-time meeting between California and Stanford
- Stanford leads the series 65-49-11, but the Bears have taken three of the last four matchups, including a 27-20 come-from-behind victory in the 125th Big Game last season at California Memorial Stadium
- Cal blew out Stanford in its last trip to The Farm, taking down the Cardinal 41-11 behind three plays of at least 75 yards, including the longest play in Big Game history, an 84-yard touchdown pass from Chase Garbers to Trevon Clark

JAYDN IK

- All-American candidate Jaydn Ott cemented the 19th 1,000-yard rushing season in Cal history and first since Patrick Laird in 2017 in last week's win over Washington State. 17 Cal players have recorded 1,000 rushing yards in a season with Marshawn Lynch and Russell White each doing it twice
- Ott has 1,016 rushing yards through the first 10 games of 2023 and is within 161 yards of Shane Vereen for 10th-place on Cal's all-time single-season list
- Ott has four of the top eight rushing games by Pac-12 players in 2023 while no one else has more than one (190 at North Texas, 167 vs. Washington State, 165 vs. Arizona State, 153 vs. USC)
- Ott is among Pac-12 and national leaders in several rushing categories - rushing yards per game (112.9 ypg, #1 Pac-12, #8 NCAA), total touchdowns (12, #1 Pac-12, #17 NCAA), rushing yards (1,016, #2 Pac-12, #13 NCAA), rush yards per carry (5.9, #5 Pac-12, #29 NCAA), rushing TDs (10, #3 Pac-12, #23 NCAA) and all-purpose yards per game (126.0 ypg, #3 Pac-12, #19 NCAA)
- Ott moved into Cal's all-time top 10 for rushing touchdowns, currently in a tie for 10th with 18, while his 10 in 2023 are two shy of the top 10 and five off of the school record of 15 shared by J.J. Arrington (2004), Justin Forsett (2007) and Jahvid Best (2008)
- Ott is re-writing the Cal record books with 1,913 yards rushing through his first 21 games as a Golden Bear, the most in program history through 21 career games. J.J. Arrington had 1,901 in his first 21 games, while Marshawn Lynch (1,680), Jahvid Best (1,615) and Joe Igbor (1,506) round out the top five
- Scoring on touchdown runs of 61 and 43 yards in the Oct. 28 game vs. USC, Ott now has five career TD runs of at least 40 yards

CADE'S WORLD

- Freshman All-American candidate Cade Uluave has made an instant impact after stepping into a starting role at inside linebacker. He was named Pac-12 Defensive Player and Freshman of the Week on Monday after recording two fumble recoveries (one returned for a TD), one interception, a forced fumble and nine tackles in Week 11's win over WSU
- Uluave is second among Pac-12 freshmen in total tackles and tackles per game (45, 4.5), while his career 0.2 fumbles forced per game and 0.2 fumble recoveries per game are both the second-most of any active Cal player
- Uluave became the first Cal player since Nick Forbes in 2012 vs Washington with multiple fumble recoveries in the same game as the Bears were the first FBS team since Western Kentucky in 2007 to have three fumble recovery touchdowns in the same game. Cal is the first Pac-12 team since USC in 2003 vs. UCLA to have multiple fumble recovery scores in the same game

TAKE IT AWAY

- Cal is atop the Pac-12 and tied for second in the NCAA with 21 turnovers gained
- The Bears are first in the Pac-12 and tied for ninth nationally with three defensive touchdowns
- Cal leads the nation in fumbles recovered (12) and fumble return touchdowns (3)
- Cal is the conference leader and is tied for fifth nationally in fumbles recovered (9), while sitting fifth in the Pac-12 with nine interceptions
- Patrick McMorris, Cade Uluave and Nohl Williams are each tied for first in the Pac-12 and tied for 12th nationally with two fumbles recovered

OFFENSIVE MINDSET

- Fernando Mendoza made history against the Trojans, becoming the first Cal QB with multiple pass and rush TD in a single-game since Aaron Rodgers in 2003 (Rodgers had 2 pass TD and 2 rush TD against Virginia Tech in the Insight Bowl on 12/26/2003)
- Jaydn Ott is the first Bear with two career games of 3 rush touchdowns since Shane Vereen got his second in the 2009 Big Game. Vereen ended his Cal career with three games of 3 rush TDs or more, getting his third in 2010
 - Cal scored 42 points in the Week 11 victory over Washington State at California Memorial Stadium, the fourth time the Bears have scored 40+ points in a game this season. It's the first time since 2016 Cal has put up 40 or more points in at least four games

RUSHING THINGS

- Cal is third in the Pac-12 and 16th nationally with 24 rushing touchdowns. The school record for rushing touchdowns in a season is 34 in 1951
- The Bears are averaging 189.0 yards rushing per game (4th Pac-12, 25th NCAA) the most since putting up 235.2 per game in 2005 and more than doubling the 96.6 average in 2022

STANFORD CONNECTIONS

- Barrett Miller is the only known Stanford scholarship football player to have transferred to Cal (Brennan Scarlett is the only known Cal scholarship player to have transferred to Stanford). Cal defensive backs coach Terrence Brown played at Stanford, while former Cal quarterback Troy Taylor is the head coach at Stanford

BIG BOOT

- Punter Lachlan Wilson's 45.4 yard per punt average would currently be second on Cal's all-time single season list and first on the Bears' career list. Cal's record holders are Scott Tabor (44.0 career) and Bryan Anger (46.5 2010 season)

SEASON HONORS

- Cade Uluave earned Pac-12 Defensive Player and Freshman of the Week honors on Nov. 13 after recording two fumble recoveries (one returned for a TD), one interception, a forced fumble and nine tackles vs. Washington State in Week 11
- Brian Driscoll garnered Pac-12 Offensive Lineman of the Week honors on Nov. 13 after scoring his first career touchdown on a fumble recovery vs. Washington State. Driscoll also earned the award on Sept. 5 after helping the Bears score 58 points and tally 669 yards of total offense in a win over North Texas
- Lachlan Willson was named Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 2 after booting four of his seven punts 53 yards or longer including his Cal career long of 59 yards
- Cal has 13 players who earned 2023 preseason All-Pac-12 honors. OLB

CMS 100

- California Memorial Stadium turns 100 in 2023 and has been the home to Cal Football since the stadium's debut on November 24, 1923. CMS has produced scores of unforgettable memories for generations of Golden Bears - the Wonder Teams of the 1920s to the Pappy Waldorf years mid-century to recent success that has yielded eight bowl teams since 2003
- Cal Football has brought many traditions to CMS over the past 100 years. Although started before CMS opened, card stunts continue to be staple on gamedays as fans hold up colorful pieces of paper creating a unique image in the stands. In 1941, Oski, the beloved Golden Bear mascot, made his official debut at CMS. The California Victory Cannon was introduced in 1964 and shot off at beginning of the game, after each score, and upon victory

TOUGH SCHEDULE

- Cal played its first ranked team at then-No. 8 Washington on Sept. 23 and finished a string of four straight games against teams ranked in the polls with last week's game at then-No. 6 Oregon, after playing then-No. 15 Oregon State (Oct. 7) and then-No. 16 Utah (Oct. 14), followed by a matchup vs. then-No. 24 USC on Oct. 28
- The Bears are 4-1 against unranked teams with two games remaining on regular-season schedule vs. opponents with a combined record of 9-11 (Stanford 3-7, UCLA 6-4). Five of Cal's six losses (all five Pac-12 defeats) have come to ranked teams with a combined record of 41-10

- Rodgers is one of five Pro Bowlers from Cal currently on NFL rosters along with Allen, Anger, Goff and Jordan
- Cal also has seven former players coaching in the NFL, Ron Rivera (Washington Head Coach); Vincent "Bug" Rivera (Washington Assistant Linebackers); Richard Rodgers Sr. (Washington Senior Defensive Coach/Safety); Bert Watts (Carolina Safeties Coach); Matt Giordano (New Orleans Defensive Assistant); Davis Webb (Denver QB Coach); Austin Clark (Miami Defensive Line Coach)

MENDOZA GETS FIRST WIN AS A GOLDEN BEAR

- Redshirt freshman Fernando Mendoza was inserted into the starting lineup for Cal's game against Oregon State and has thrown for 975 yards and eight touchdowns over the past five games
- Against Washington State, he went 14-for-21 for 150 yards and two touchdowns. He posted a career-best passer rating of 158.1 and a career-best completion percentage of 66.7.
- Mendoza has also rushed for two touchdowns - both against USC
- Mendoza has led the Bears' offense to at least 40 points during three of his five starts (OSU, USC, WSU)
- Had a career performance during a 50-49 loss to USC, going 25-for-39 for 292 yards and two passing touchdowns and a pair of rushing scores
- Sophomores Ben Finley and Sam Jackson V have also shared time at the signal-caller position this season. Jackson has thrown for 556 yards with five touchdown passes. He also has 118 yards rushing with a touchdown. Finley has thrown for 572 yards and three touchdowns on the year.
- None of the six quarterbacks on the 2023 Cal roster had taken a game snap for the Golden Bears entering the season.
- Three of Cal's quarterbacks started their collegiate career elsewhere – Finley (North Carolina State), Jackson V (TCU) and Tyler Jensen (Louisville).
- Jackson (6-of-6, 140 yards passing; 15 rushes, 79 yards, 2 TD) and Finley (65-of-123, 741 yards passing, 3 TD, 3 INT) saw limited action for their respective teams.

OTT GOES FOR 1,000

- SO Jaydn Ott leads the Pac-12 and ranks eighth nationally in rushing yards per game (112.9); he is also 17th in the nation and tops in the Pac-12 in total touchdowns with 12 (10 rushing, 2 receiving).
- Ott rushed for 167 yards and a touchdown against Washington State last Saturday, giving him 1,016 rushing yards for the season. Ott is the first Cal player to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season since Patrick Laird in 2017
- Ott's 1,016 yards is 13th in the nation and second in the Pac-12.
- Ott has 24 carries this season that have gone for at least 10 yards
- Fifth-year senior Isaiah Ifanse recorded both a rushing and receiving touchdown against Oregon State, becoming the first Cal player with both in the same game since Ott had one of each against UNLV last season. Ifanse has seven rushing touchdowns this season to give him 32 for his career, and is averaging 5.2 yards per rush
- Ifanse went over the 4,000-yard career rushing mark against Arizona State
- FR Jaivian Thomas registered his first career touchdown reception against USC

ELARMS-ORR RACKING UP TACKLES: ULUAVE STEPS IN AND PRODUCES

-- Cade Uluave was named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week on Monday after recording two fumble recoveries and an interception against WSU. His first fumble recovery went for a 51-yard touchdown return, the first score of his career. He finished with nine tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

- Uluave had a career-high 14 tackles against Oregon in his second career start. In three starts, he's averaging 10.6 tackles per game while also adding a sack and 3.5 tackles for a loss.
- Kaleb Elarms-Orr, who missed the game at Oregon due to injury, ranks third in the the Pac-12 at 8.7 tackles per game. He is third overall with 78 tackles.
- In his first season as a starter, Elarms-Orr also has an interception, fumble recovery and pass break-up to his credit this season. He recorded his first career sack against Washington State.
- Jackson Sirmon, a preseason fourth-team All-American and first-team All-Pac-12 selection, has a sack, forced fumble and a fumble recovery but is out for the remainder of the season due to injury
- Sirmon is one of three players in the position group who entered the season having started a game for the Golden Bears with Blake Antzoulatos, Muelu Iosefa and Nate Rutचना, who have 16 and four Cal starts, respectively.
- Sirmon, who has played in 51 career games with 34 starts, spent four seasons at Washington from 2018-21 and started all 12 games in his first season at Cal in 2022. He led the team with career-highs in tackles (104) tackles for loss (6.0, -18 yards), 3.5 sacks (-12 yards), three pass breakups, 37 fumble recovery yards and one fumble recovery touchdown in a dramatic fourth quarter comeback Big Game win over Stanford.

BEARS DEMONSTRATE DEPTH IN DEFENSIVE BACK ROOM

-- San Diego State transfer Patrick McMorris ranks third on the team with 66 tackles while also recording five pass breakups, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

-- Craig Woodson recorded two pass breakups against Washington State. The week prior at Oregon, he registered a career-high 15 tackles

-- CB Nohl Williams had a fumble return for a touchdown for the second straight game against Washington State. He registered his first career touchdown at Oregon on a 9-yard fumble return

-- Williams had two interceptions and ranks seventh on the team with 34 tackles

-- Woodson returned from an injury that forced him to miss the entire 2021 campaign and was one of eight Cal players, including four on defense, to start all 12 games last year. He was an honorable mention All-Pac-12 selection of the league's coaches in 2022 when he put up the most productive numbers of his career, contributing career highs of 75 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss (-8 yards), two interceptions that he returned for 41 yards including one 39 yards for a touchdown against UC Davis, one forced fumble, three pass breakups and two quarterback hurries.

-- Earby, a Freshman All-American last season, recorded his second career interception against North Texas. He also had one in the 2022 season-opener against UC Davis

-- Cal both returns and adds a lot to its defensive backfield in 2023, highlighted by four defensive backs who have earned preseason All-Pac-12 honors in returnees Earby (third-team Athlon; honorable mention Pac-12 Media) and Woodson (second-team Athlon, Pac-12 Media, Phil Steele; third-team Pro Football Focus), as well as McMorris (second-team Pro Football Focus; third-team Athlon; honorable mention Pac-12 Media) and Williams (third-team Pro Football Focus; fourth-team Phil Steele).

-- Earby played in all 12 games with seven starts as a freshman and led the team with two fumble recoveries. He returned one 36 yards for a touchdown, while also ranking second in the Pac-12 with a team-high 11 pass breakups, adding 36 tackles that were the most among the team's cornerbacks.

-- McMorris played in 42 games with 27 starts over four seasons at San Diego State (2019-22) and contributed 162 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss (-14 yards), five interceptions that he returned for 61 yards, 15 pass breakups, 20 passes defended and two fumble recoveries, including one that he returned 30 yards for a touchdown, while earning first-team All-Mountain West Conference honors as both a 2021 sophomore and 2022 junior.

-- Williams was a three-year starter who played in 26 games at UNLV (2020-22) and contributed 98 tackles, five interceptions that he returned for 62 yards, 10 pass breakups, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

-- Cal has had five safeties selected in the NFL Draft since 2020 in Camryn Bynum (Minnesota, 2021), Ashtyn Davis (New York Jets, 2020), Jaylinn Hawkins (Atlanta, 2020), Elijah Hicks (Chicago, 2022) and Daniel Scott (Indianapolis, 2023) with all still on rosters of the teams they were drafted by (Scott is on injured reserve with Indianapolis).

-- Transfer Lachlan Wilson (Tulsa) ranks 17th in the nation and second in the Pac-12, averaging 45.4 yards per punt.

-- Against Washington State, Wilson had three punts of 50+ yards with one downed inside the 20.

-- For the year, Wilson has 14 punts of 50+ yards and 11 that have been downed inside the 20.

-- Wilson was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 2 after averaging 49.7 yards per punt and pinning four punts inside the Arizona State 20-yard line.

-- Wilson had a season-best 60-yard punt at Utah.

-- Wilson was a preseason All-Pac-12 second-team (Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media) selection who was on the Ray Guy Award watch list during each of the three seasons he saw action at Tulsa, registering a 44.3 career average on 103 punts for 7,127 yards including 44 that traveled 50 or more yards, while playing in all 34 games possible during the period.

Justin Wilcox is in his seventh season as the Travers Family Head Football Coach at Cal in 2023. Wilcox, who signed a contract extension through the 2027 campaign in January of 2022, has compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins during his first six seasons, including three victories over Stanford in the last four Big Game meetings, most recently in 2022 with a dramatic fourth-quarter comeback. The other two Big Game victories during the stretch came at Stanford in 2019 and 2021 to make Wilcox only the fifth head coach in Cal history to be victorious at least twice in a row on The Farm, and along with Jeff Tedford, one of only two in the last 70 years since Pappy Waldorf won three straight from 1947-51. The Golden Bears also have a pair of wins over USC under Wilcox including Cal's most recent victory against the Trojans in its 2021 season finale after a road win in the Los Angeles Coliseum in 2018.

"I appreciate the opportunity to be the head football coach at Cal and am excited about the future of our program," Wilcox said in the announcement of his extension. "I have thoroughly enjoyed every minute I have spent with the extraordinary young men who have been in our program. We are in a great position and strongly aligned with our university thanks to the leadership of Chancellor Carol Christ and our Director of Athletics Jim Knowlton. I thank both of them for their continued trust and confidence in me to lead a football program that will make the entire Cal community proud. We have very high expectations. I think we've earned the right to expect more, and that's exactly what we're going to do."

"Justin Wilcox is a football coach who shares our values and vision, and we want to ensure that he is the leader of our program for the long term," Knowlton commented. "Justin is a great fit for Cal Athletics and our university, with a philosophy that places an emphasis on developing young men on the field, in the classroom and as people. I am confident our fans and alumni share my enthusiasm for the direction of our program, and the level of success we have seen to date has set a foundation for sustained excellence in the future."

"Since the beginning of his tenure, I have been impressed by Justin Wilcox's leadership, and his commitment to enabling our student-athletes to take full advantage of the academic and athletic opportunities we offer," Christ said. "He is, in my opinion, the quintessential Berkeley coach who understands the university's values, as well as the value his program brings to the campus as a rallying point for Cal's global community. College football is a highly competitive environment, and the investment represented in Justin's new contract is commensurate with all that I know he will contribute to our university in the years ahead."

Cal is off to a 4-6 start in 2023 with a defense that is atop the conference and second nationally in turnovers gained (21) and an offense that is fourth in the Pac-12 and 25th in the nation in rushing yards per game (189.0) leading the way. Cal started the season with a bang at North Texas on Sept. 2 with a 58-21 victory, tallying 681 yards of total offense, its most ever in a road game and most overall in eight seasons. It was also the most points the Bears had scored in a game since 2015. After falling to Auburn, 14-10, Cal scored 31 straight points in a 31-17 victory over Idaho and put the game away late in a 24-21 win vs. Arizona State. The Bears dropped 52-40 and 34-14 decisions to Oregon State and Utah, before falling just short in a 50-49 loss to USC and taking down Washington State 42-39.

The Bears were also active in the offseason adding 50 new players, including 28 transfers to the program. Cal's 2023 spring transfer portal class was listed by The Athletic as one of its 10 "winners", while also being recognized by On3 (1 of 12 "winners") and 247Sports (No. 17 overall class). In addition, three new full-time coaches have joined the staff since the end of the 2022 campaign, including offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Jake Spavital, offensive line coach/run game coordinator Mike Bloesch and tight ends coach Tim Plough.

The Golden Bears excelled in several team statistical categories in 2022, including tying for second in the Pac-12 and tying for 12th nationally with three defensive touchdowns, while also ranking among the top three in the Pac-12 and Top 25 nationally in several turnover categories, including fumbles lost, turnover margin and turnovers lost. At one point during the season, Cal had the nation's longest active streak by forcing at least one turnover in 19 consecutive games starting with the 2020 finale through the first six games of 2022.

Wilcox has coached eight players as Cal's head coach who are currently on NFL rosters in Camryn Bynum (Minnesota), Jake Curhan (Seattle), Ashtyn Davis (New York Jets), Cameron Goode (Miami), Jeremiah Hawkins (Los Angeles Chargers), Elijah Hicks (Chicago), Patrick Mekari (Baltimore) and Daniel Scott (Indianapolis, injured reserve). A total of 25 players have been on NFL rosters that played at Cal since Wilcox became the Bears' head coach in 2017.

Cal has also had success in the classroom throughout Wilcox's tenure. The program announced its highest GSR ever at 86 percent in December of 2022 and has improved each of the last four years. Cal has also recorded its top two scores in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate and its highest team grade-point average under Wilcox. The team's APR of 978 for the 2021-22 academic year announced in May of 2023 was 16 points higher than the national football average of 962. In addition, Cal has earned a combined 82 spots on the last three Pac-12 Academic Honor Rolls.

Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB)

Sirmon is in his sixth season at Cal and his fourth as the Golden Bears' defensive coordinator in 2023, while he also continues to be the program's position coach for the inside linebackers for the sixth consecutive campaign. Sirmon started at Cal in 2018 as the inside linebackers coach before adding co-defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator duties to his role in 2019, for which he served three seasons (2019-21). Sirmon has been instrumental in developing a multitude of key players at Cal, including a pair of All-Americans in ILB Evan Weaver and CB Elijah Hicks, with Weaver a consensus pick and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in 2019 while Hicks was a third-teamer. Weaver was also the nation's leading tackler in 2019. His son, Jackson Sirmon, is a preseason fourth-team All-American in 2023. Sirmon's defense has at least one takeaway in 23 of Cal's last 25 games dating back to final contest of the 2020 campaign.

**Jake Spavital (OC/QB)**

Spavital is in the first season of his second stint as Cal's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2023. Spavital served in the same role at Cal in 2016 when the Golden Bears' offense and quarterback Davis Webb set several school records while ranking fourth in the nation in passing offense and 10th in total offense. Spavital spent four seasons (2019-22) in his first head coaching position at Texas State, while he has also been at West Virginia (2017-18, OC/QB coach; 2011-12, QB coach), Texas A&M (2014-15, OC/QB coach; 2013, co-OC, QB coach). As an offensive coordinator, Spavital has piloted offenses on teams that finished in the top 20 in the country in total offense six times, reached seven bowl games and earned a spot in the AP Top 25 in seven different seasons. Spavital has recruited and worked with several elite college and future NFL quarterbacks in addition to Webb, including Will Grier (West Virginia), Case Keenum (Houston), Johnny Manziel (Texas A&M), Kyler Murray (Texas A&M), Geno Smith (West Virginia) and Brandon Weeden (Oklahoma State). Murray was the first overall selection of Arizona in the 2019 NFL Draft, while Weeden and Manziel were both first-round picks by Cleveland in 2012 and 2014, respectively.

Vic So'oto (STC/OLB)

So'oto is in his second season at Cal and his first campaign as the special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach in 2023 after serving as the outside linebackers coach in 2022. In his first campaign in 2022, So'oto ran the Golden Bears' kickoff unit that posted an average of 19.83 yards allowed per return, Cal's best since 2016. He coached an outside linebacker unit that was highlighted by the team's leader in tackles for loss and sacks Xavier Carlton.

**Mike Bloesch (OL)**

Mike Bloesch is in the first season as Cal's offensive line coach and run game coordinator in 2023. Bloesch's offenses have been known for protecting the quarterback, with each of his last two squads at North Texas (2021, '22) ranking in the top 10 nationally in fewest sacks allowed, while his balanced offensive attacks were highlighted by a 2020 North Texas unit that averaged 513.2 yards of total offense per game (283.0 passing, 230.2 rushing) to rank eighth in the nation.

**Terrence Brown (DB)**

Terrence Brown is in his second season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2023. Brown shares duties with Tre Watson coaching the Golden Bears' defensive backs. Brown made an immediate impact in his first season at Cal in 2022 and along with Watson, tutored a pair of the Pac-12's top safeties in Daniel Scott and Craig Woodson, as well as one of the nation's top freshmen defensive backs in cornerback Jeremiah Earby.

**Andrew Browning (DL)**

Andrew Browning is in his fifth season as the defensive line coach and his sixth campaign overall at Cal. Browning's 2023 defensive line includes five players that have made a combined 37 collegiate starts at Cal during their 97 appearances. Health could be the determining factor for the Golden Bears' defensive line in 2023 with the nine members of the unit missing a combined 38 games in 2022 but all expected to be ready for the 2023 campaign.

**Tim Plough (TE)**

Plough is in the first season as Cal's tight ends coach in 2023. Plough coached previously at Boise State (2021-22), UC Davis (2008-12, 2017-20) and Northern Arizona (2013-16) with his experience including 11 campaigns as an offensive coordinator.

**Aristotle Thompson (RB)**

Thompson is in his fourth season as the running backs coach at Cal in 2023. Jaydn Ott is a 2023 Pro Football Focus first-team preseason All-Pac-12 selection after earning a host of honors in 2022, including first-team Freshman All-American from The Athletic and honorable mention All-Pac-12 recognition from the league's coaches.

**Burl Toler III (WR/RC)**

Toler is in his second stint and ninth season on the coaching or football staff at his alma mater Cal in 2023, as well as his fifth working with the wide receivers. He is also in his second campaign as the team's recruiting coordinator. Toler is expected to have three of his top four wide receivers from 2022 at his disposal in 2023 in Jeremiah Hunter, Mavin Anderson and Monroe Young, all of whom put up their top collegiate receiving numbers in 2022.

**Tre Watson (DB)**

Watson is in his third season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2023, sharing the duties for the second campaign with Terrence Brown. In 2022, along with Brown, he tutored a pair of the Pac-12's top safeties in Daniel Scott and Craig Woodson, as well as one of the nation's top freshmen defensive backs in cornerback Jeremiah Earby.

**Brian Johnson (AP)**

Johnson is in his third campaign as the head football athletic performance coach at Cal in 2023. Johnson has coached 79 players during 11 collegiate seasons that have been selected for the NFL Draft including a total of 11 first-rounders.

GAME 1: BEARS ROUT NORTH TEXAS TO OPEN 2023 SEASON

DENTON, Texas – In the Cal football team's first game with Jake Spavital as its offensive coordinator, the Bears did something they hadn't done since the last time he was the offensive coordinator.

The Bears racked up their most points in one half since 2016 and rolled to a 58-21 rout of North Texas in their 2023 season-opener on Saturday.

Cal led 33-21 at halftime and then shut out the Mean Green in the second half. It was the most points the Bears have scored in a half since amassing 35 in a victory over Texas in 2016, when Spavital served one season as the team's offensive coordinator.

Cal tallied 669 yards of total offense, its most in a game in eight seasons. It was also the most points the Bears have scored in a game since 2015.

"We expected to come out and play well," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "To say you're going to have 669 yards of offense every week is not realistic, but we have some good players and we felt like we matched up well and should have been able to move the ball on them. Spav and all of those coaches and players on that side of the ball contributed today. It was a big day for them."

Spavital went on to serve as the offensive coordinator at West Virginia before moving on to become the head coach at Texas State for four years. He returned as the Bears' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach before this season.

Sophomore running back Jaydn Ott exploded for 188 yards rushing with two touchdowns, the second-highest total of his career. Backup Isaiah Ifanse tied a career-high with three rushing touchdowns in his Cal debut. He previously accomplished the feat twice while playing for Montana State.

Quarterback Sam Jackson V threw his first career touchdown pass on his first attempt at Cal before eventually being replaced by Ben Finley due to injury. Finley went 24-for-34 for a career-high 274 yards in his Cal debut after transferring from North Carolina State.

"When I sat down with Spav and he told me they were going to go with Sam as the starter, I respected the decision and totally understood," Finley said. "Sam is a great player. At the same time, I had to prepare like I was the starter."

GAME 2: CAL'S DEFENSE SHINES IN LOSS TO AUBURN

BERKELEY – Defense kept the California football team within striking distance into the final minutes of its home opener on Saturday against Auburn, but the Golden Bears weren't able to turn takeaways into enough points, falling 14-10 in front of 44,141 at California Memorial Stadium.

Cal's defense forced four turnovers, including a fumble forced by safety Patrick McMorris with just over four minutes remaining in the game. That gave the Bears the ball in Auburn (2-0) territory, needing a touchdown trailing by just four points.

Quarterback Sam Jackson V hit wide receiver Trond Grizzell for 11 yards and an Auburn unnecessary roughness penalty added 15 more, quickly putting the Bears at the Tigers' 15-yard line. However, the Bears weren't able to find the end zone, and Auburn subsequently picked up the third-down conversion it needed to run out the rest of the clock.

"Our defense did a really good job for most of the night," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We're going to show our guys what they did right and encourage them, but this is a team game and it's about winning, and we didn't get the job done."

Jackson – who exited Cal's season-opener early with an injury – initially entered the game midway through the second quarter and provided the offense with an instant boost. The Bears immediately went 65 yards in six plays, capping things off with a Jaydn Ott 14-yard touchdown scamper to go up 10-7.

"I was just looking to give the team a spark," said Jackson. "Just like in our first game, we were explosive from the jump. I was just looking for ways to get the guys going and get the offense going."

Ott finished the night with a game-high 78 rushing yards before missing the final quarter due to injury. Jackson completed 14-of-27 passes for 126 yards.

Linebacker Kaleb Elarms-Orr had a career night, leading all players with 13 tackles and helping force a turnover less than 90 seconds into the game as he pursued Auburn quarterback Payton Thorne to the sideline and knocked the ball free just before Thorne went out of bounds. That led to Cal's first scoring drive, as kicker Michael Luckhurst connected from 39 yards out.

That was the first of three fumbles recovered by the Bears' defense, which forced four turnovers – not including a turnover on downs to begin the second half – for the first time since the 2018 Cheez-It Bowl against TCU. Cal also totaled three sacks and picked off one pass on a high throw in the second quarter that went off a receiver's fingertips before being reeled in by cornerback Nohl Williams.

"We just wanted to play fast, play physical, and play our game," Elarms-Orr said. "We're a really good defense and we're a really good team. We just wanted to get to the quarterback, tackle in space, knock back tackles in the run game, and I feel like we did a pretty good job of doing that."

The Bears outgained Auburn 273-230 on offense, but missed key opportunities going 1-for-4 in the red zone.

GAME 3: BEARS SCORE 31 UNANSWERED POINTS IN WIN OVER IDAHO

BERKELEY – The California football team used a second-quarter surge to take control of Saturday's game against Idaho and shut out the Vandals for the final 39 minutes in a 31-17 win at California Memorial Stadium.

Quarterback Sam Jackson V contributed to three touchdowns – two through the air and one on the ground – while running back Isaiah Ifanse rushed for 137 rushing yards on 22 carries. Defensively, the Golden Bears (2-1) forced three turnovers.

In the final minutes of the opening half, Jackson dropped in a couple of perfect throws to the end zone of 20 yards to Jeremiah Hunter and 36 yards to Trond Grizzell. That started a run of 31 unanswered points, as Cal scored on five of seven possessions.

"Momentum is a huge part of this game. You can feel it in the stadium," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We work real hard in terms of emphasizing the last four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half. You can really change the momentum in those eight minutes. That'll be a positive we talk about when we watch the tape."

On the first drive of the second half, the Bears went 80 yards in 10 plays, capping things off with Jackson's two longest runs of the day. One play after going for 10 yards on 3rd-and-8, Jackson broke contain for his longest carry of the season, making multiple defenders miss on a 27-yard touchdown run.

While Idaho (2-1) struggled to get first downs, the Bears' run game started to wear the Vandals' defense out. Ifanse had 81 of his 137 yards in the third quarter, scoring from 1 yard out with 2:53 left in the period to put Cal ahead 28-17.

After cornerback Lu-Magia Hearn III forced a fumble on the Vandals' next possession – the first of two fourth-quarter fumbles recovered by the Bears' defense – running back Ashton Stredick reeled off a highlight 41-yard run to set up a 39-yard Michael Luckhurst field goal.

Combined with cornerback Nohl Williams' second-quarter interception, Cal's defense has now forced 10 turnovers through its first three games.

"Our goal is three turnovers a game so we can give the ball back to the offense and they can put points on the scoreboard," said Williams, who has now picked off a pass in two straight games. "We were just emphasizing winning our 1-on-1s and getting off the field on third downs. After we cleaned up a couple things, we were good."

GAME 4: BEARS FALL AT NO. 8 WASHINGTON

SEATTLE – The Cal football team fell to No. 8 Washington 59-32 on Saturday evening at Husky Stadium.

Wide receiver Trond Grizzell led the Golden Bears (2-2) with 86 receiving yards and a touchdown on four receptions. Quarterback Sam Jackson V went 10-of-14 through the air for 156 yards and a score.

After Washington (4-0) took an early 14-0 lead, the Golden Bears responded with a nine-play, 75-yard drive capped off by a one-handed, highlight catch in the end zone by receiver Jeremiah Hunter from quarterback Ben Finley on 1st-and-goal.

On the Bears' first drive of the second quarter, Finley completed three passes of at least 20 yards, hitting wideout Taj Davis for a 24-yard touchdown. Finley ended the night with 207 yards on 17-of-32 passes, while Davis had 60 receiving yards and tied Hunter with a team-high five receptions.

Running backs Jaydn Ott and Ashton Stredick both found the end zone in the second half for the Bears, combining for 70 yards on the ground.

GAME 5: BEARS RUN PAST ARIZONA STATE, 24-21

BERKELEY – The California football team rushed for 196 yards – including 81 during a pivotal clock-draining drive in the fourth quarter – and the Golden Bears put away Arizona State 24-21 on Saturday afternoon at California Memorial Stadium.

Sophomore Jaydn Ott gained 165 yards on the ground with a touchdown on a career-high 29 carries, as the Golden Bears eventually dispatched the Sun Devils in the final football game between the teams as members of the Pac-12 Conference.

Cal's final drive took 6 minutes, 28 seconds off the clock and consisted of 18 plays – 15 of which were rushes. The possession ended at the Sun Devils' 1-yard line with 2:50 remaining in the game, and the Bears' were able to turn back Arizona State's final drive and preserve the victory.

"We're happy with the win, especially in the Pac-12 this year," Cal inside linebacker Jackson Sirmon said. "There is always stuff you can get better at. We look at every game as an opportunity."

Quarterback Sam Jackson V threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to Jeremiah Hunter and backup tailback Isaiah Ifanse added a 1-yard scoring scamper for the Bears, who never trailed and built a 24-13 lead after Ott's 2-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter.

Linebacker Kaleb Elarms-Orr registered a career-high 15 tackles while Jackson Sirmon added 13, and defensive back Matthew Littlejohn came up with his first career interception. Myles Jernigan also forced a fumble on the final play of the first half, which was recovered by Xavier Carlton.

Punter Lachlan Wilson made a significant impact on the game with seven punts for an average of 49.7 yards. Among his efforts was a career-high 59-yarder early in the third quarter.

"You could make the argument he was the MVP for us today," Cal head coach Justin Wilcox said.

GAME 6: CAL FALLS TO NO. 15 BEAVERS

BERKELEY – A strong game on the ground and a spirited starting debut at quarterback by Fernando Mendoza helped keep the California football team within striking distance against No. 15 Oregon State on Saturday at California Memorial Stadium, but the Beavers pulled away in the fourth quarter en route to a 52-40 victory.

Making his first career start, Mendoza guided Cal's offense to points on five of six possessions midway through the game. He finished 21-of-32 through the air for 207 yards and two touchdowns, also making plays with his legs totaling 41 rushing yards on four attempts.

"Fernando did a great job," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "He brought energy to the game. He made good decisions in the run game and the RPO game. He made good plays with his feet. For his first start, in that environment, against that defense, I thought he did a hell of a job."

The Golden Bears (3-3, 1-2 Pac-12) jumped out to a 17-14 second-quarter lead when Isaiah Ifanse scored two touchdowns over a span of 3 minutes, 7 seconds. First, Mendoza extended a third-down play before hitting Ifanse for a 9-yard score at the 11:16 mark of the second. Safety Patrick McMorris recovered a fumble forced by linebacker Jackson Sirmon on the first play of the Beavers' next drive, leading to another Ifanse touchdown from 1 yard out.

"[Ifanse] plays so hard. Every time he carries the ball, you just see how much will he has," Wilcox said. "The entire stadium can see it every time he carries the ball that going down is the absolute last resort. I just love the spirit he plays with and how tough he is. He's got a ton of heart."

Ifanse scored three touchdowns for the first time as a Bear while totaling 86 rushing yards on 11 carries. Jaydn Ott added 85 yards (6.5 YPC) on the ground and Cal finished with 241 as a team, averaging a season-best 7.3 per attempt.

Trading punches with the Beavers into the second half, the Bears went down the field on each of their first two drives of the third quarter. Ifanse punched it in for a third time from 5 yards out and Mendoza hit tight end Jack Endries on a seam route for a 30-yard score. Mendoza followed up his second career passing touchdown with a successful two-point try, once again leaving the pocket and directing traffic before finding wide receiver Jeremiah Hunter in the back of the end zone to bring Cal within just three points, 35-32.

The fourth quarter belonged to Oregon State as the Beavers found the end zone twice in the opening minutes of the period. Cal reached the end zone one more time before it was over, as freshman running back Jaivian Thomas added his first career rushing touchdown in the final minutes from 9 yards out and Mendoza connected with receiver Trond Grizzell for the final two points of the night.

Endries ended his night with a team-leading 66 receiving yards on four catches, both career bests. Receiver Taj Davis tied a career high with six receptions that went for 63 yards.

GAME 7: BEARS FALL TO NO. 16 UTAH, 34-14

SALT LAKE CITY – Fernando Mendoza threw two more touchdown passes in his second career start but the California football team fell to No. 16 Utah 34-14 on Saturday at Rice-Eccles Stadium.

Mendoza, who led the Golden Bears' offense to 40 points in his first start last week against No. 15 Oregon State, was 10-for-17 for 149 yards with two touchdowns and an interception against the Utes. His 48-yard scoring pass to Jaydn Ott opened the scoring and gave the Bears a 7-0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

After Utah responded with 24 unanswered points, Mendoza fired a perfect strike over the middle to wide receiver Taj Davis for a 24-yard touchdown to close the gap to 24-14 with 4:21 remaining in the third quarter. The Bears' defense forced Utah to then turn the ball over on downs, and Cal's offense drove 57 yards to the Utes' 12 before the drive stalled on a missed field goal.

"There were four or five plays that totally swung this game," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We didn't capitalize on momentum well enough or come through in those moments of pressure. It's not that guys aren't trying. Effort is a prerequisite, but it doesn't guarantee anything. We have to produce in those moments."

Mendoza was forced to sit out much of the fourth quarter after suffering an injury. He was replaced by Ben Finley. Davis finished with seven catches for 93 yards and a touchdown while Ott had 94 yards from scrimmage.

"We went out and did a good job competing," Davis said. "The entire game, we always had belief that we were going to go out and win the game. We just have to connect on big plays down the field, and put our defense in a better position."

Safety Matthew Littlejohn recorded a career-high 10 tackles for the Bears while linebacker Cade Uluave and safety Patrick McMorris each added nine apiece.

The Bears played the game without All-Pac-12 linebacker and team captain Jackson Sirmon, who will miss the remainder of the season due to injury, according to Wilcox.

"My heart hurts for Jackson," Uluave said. "Jackson was an incredible leader, and a mentor to me. I feel bad that his season is over. It's next man up - when your number is called, you have to be ready. We just have to move on without him."

GAME 8: BEARS EDGED BY NO. 24 USC

BERKELEY – The California football team racked up 527 yards of total offense but failed on a two-point conversion with 58 seconds remaining and fell to No. 24 USC 50-49 on Saturday afternoon at California Memorial Stadium.

The Golden Bears (3-5, 1-4 Pac-12) led 43-29 early in the fourth quarter but the Trojans strung together three straight touchdowns to surge in front 50-43 with 3:33 to play. Cal answered with a 9-play, 79-yard drive of its own that culminated with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Fernando Mendoza to Jaivian Thomas. After a timeout, the Bears elected for a two-point try but Mendoza's pass fell incomplete, and USC was able to run out the clock.

"Late in the game we had some opportunities to make a play here or there to change the outcome and we just couldn't quite come up with it," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "That's a very talented team we just competed with and (we) had a number of chances to win and we didn't do it."

Mendoza went 25-for-39 for 292 yards and two touchdowns while also notching his first two career rushing scores. Running back Jaydn Ott tied a career-high with three rushing touchdowns while amassing 153 yards on the ground.

After falling behind 17-7 late in the first quarter, Cal scored three unanswered touchdowns to establish a 28-17 advantage. Ott had TD runs of 43 and 61 yards and wide receiver Trond Grizzell caught a 17-yard touchdown pass from Mendoza.

USC took a 29-28 lead midway through the third quarter before Mendoza had two short scoring runs to put the Bears up by two scores.

Wide receiver Jeremiah Hunter tied a career-high with eight catches while piling up 96 yards and Grizzell had career-best of six receptions for 91 yards. Tight end Jack Endries also had a career-high seven catches.

Defensive backs Craig Woodson (12) and Jeremiah Earby (8) each had a career-high in tackles.

GAME 9: BEARS FALL AT NO. 6 OREGON

EUGENE, Ore. – The California football team scored a defensive touchdown and running back Jaydn Ott rushed for 93 yards and a touchdown, but the Golden Bears fell to No. 6 Oregon 63-19 on Saturday afternoon at Autzen Stadium.

Junior Nohl Williams returned a fumble recovery 9 yards for a touchdown and safety Patrick McMorris recorded his first interception with the Bears, who trailed just 14-13 early in the second quarter before the Ducks began to pull away.

Ott, the Pac-12's leading rusher, scored on a 20-yard touchdown run in the third quarter – his conference-best ninth rushing score of the year. Mateen Bhaghani made field goals of 43 and 27 yards.

McMorris' interception came on the game's first play from scrimmage but Cal wasn't able to turn it into points. The Ducks then scored touchdowns on each of their next two possessions to take a 14-0 lead. After Bhaghani's first field goal, Williams recovered an Oregon fumble and scampered into the endzone untouched to trim the deficit to 14-10 with 1:32 left in the first quarter. Another Bhaghani field goal made it 14-13 early in the second period.

The Ducks were able to string together touchdowns on each of their next three possessions to take a 35-13 lead at halftime.

The Bears (3-6, 1-5 Pac-12) took the second-half kickoff and immediately went 75 yards on six plays, with Ott finishing off the drive with his touchdown run to cut the deficit to 35-19 early in the third quarter.

GAME 10: BEARS PREVAIL OVER WSU IN THRILLING HOME FINALE

BERKELEY – Hosting Washington State on Saturday in the final home game of California Memorial Stadium's 100th anniversary season, the Cal football team came away with a 42-39 victory behind a handful of key defensive plays and 181 scrimmage yards from running back Jaydn Ott.

The Golden Bears' defense forced four turnovers for the second time this year and set a season high with six sacks. Outside linebacker David Reese led all players with three sacks and two forced fumbles.

"I'm really proud of how the guys fought and competed. We made enough plays to win the game, and we certainly can learn a lot from plays that weren't quite as good," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We made it much harder than it needed to be, to be honest. But I commend the guys for continuing to compete and finding a way to win. You have to stay in the moment and do what you need to do to win."

Inside linebacker Cade Uluave recovered two fumbles, the first of which he also forced and took 51 yards to the house on the Cougars' first possession of the game. Uluave finished with a team-high nine tackles to go with a game-ending interception.

The Bears staved off a second-half WSU rally with back-to-back touchdowns early in the fourth quarter. Holding on to a 28-24 lead, Ott carried the ball for all five plays on a 75-yard scoring drive, highlighted by a 52-yard burst through the left side. He capped the possession with a 5-yard scamper into the end zone which saw him become the first Bear since Patrick Laird in 2017 to surpass 1,000 rushing yards in a season.

Less than two minutes later, Reese blindsided Cougar quarterback Cameron Ward just as he was about to throw. The ball was picked up in the secondary by defensive back Nohl Williams and returned 52 yards to paydirt, giving Cal a commanding 42-24 advantage with 9:26 remaining.

WSU was quick to respond, scoring a pair of touchdowns and converting a two-point conversion to make it a three-point game. After forcing a Cal punt, the Cougars moved the ball into Bear territory with under a minute left but weren't able to connect on a 48-yard potential game-tying field goal. It was their second missed field goal of the fourth quarter.

Washington State had one last chance to steal the game on a Hail Mary pass from 53 yards out, but Uluave came away with his first interception of the season as time ran out.

The Bears finished with three fumble recovery touchdowns in total, as offensive lineman Brian Driscoll fell on one in the end zone in the second quarter.

Mendoza did most of his damage in the first half, when he was 11-of-15 through the air for 129 yards and two touchdowns. The Bears' first offensive possession of the day went 65 yards on 12 plays. Mendoza capped it off on 3rd-and-goal by rolling left in a fake quarterback keeper and finding Endries sneaking out to the corner for a 6-yard score to put Cal up 14-0.

Mendoza later found a wide-open Ott coming across the middle for a 13-yard touchdown to make it 28-14. It was the second time in three weeks the Bears put up 28 points in the first half.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the Peter E. Haas Press Box and work from the main press area on level seven.

PHOTOGRAPHERS WORK ROOM

A photographers work room is available on the field level at California Memorial Stadium (entrance on west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and ethernet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional photographer work stations are available on level seven of the press box. Pregame meals and drinks for photographers and videographers are available on the south end of level seven in the press box.

PHOTOS

Requests for photos can be made through the Athletic Communications Office. Photos of all 30 teams can also be purchased through Cal's official photographer by visiting klcfotos.com/calbears.

PLAYER/COACH/STAFF INTERVIEWS

All football player, coach and staff interviews must be coordinated through Kyle McRae.

PRACTICE MEDIA COVERAGE

Cal is scheduled to practice at California Memorial Stadium throughout the 2023 season. Kyle McRae will distribute specific practice and media availability schedules as well as policies regarding non-gameday coverage of the team. Weekly updates are normally distributed each Monday throughout the season.

PRESS BOX

The media level of the Peter E. Haas Press Box at California Memorial Stadium is on the seventh floor. The photo deck is on level six.

TELEPHONE/VISITING RADIO PHONE LINES

ISDN and dial lines, as well as dry pairs to the visiting team locker room and visiting team interview room, are available for complimentary use for the official visiting team radio network. All other telephone lines, both in the press box and inside the television compound, must be requested at least one week in advance through Kyle McRae.

BIG GAME HISTORY

THE STANFORD AXE

The Stanford Axe, the trophy awarded to the winner of the Big Game every season, actually made its debut on the eve of a baseball game between the rival universities on April 13, 1899. On that afternoon at a pre-game rally, a group of Stanford students introduced the instrument to decapitate a straw man adorned in California blue and gold, much to the delight of the Indian faithful who chanted "Give 'em the axe" while the proceedings continued.

The next day, Stanford rooters taunted their Cal counterparts by cutting pieces of blue and gold ribbon with The Axe and using it to chop at a designated piece of wood whenever the Indians made a good play.

Cal rallied for an upset over Stanford and the Golden Bears' fans were so overcome with emotion that a group of Cal men wrestled The Axe away from the Stanford students and smuggled it across the bay via ferry. The Axe was placed in a safe at a Berkeley bank, to be removed once a year for the Axe Rally.

By 1933, both sides decided that The Axe would make an ideal Big Game trophy. It was mounted on a plaque that lists the scores of each game since 1933.



BIG GAME HISTORY

Cal has been a winner in the Big Game three of the last four seasons including 2022 when the Golden Bears were a 27-20 winner in a sold out 125th edition in Berkeley. Cal scored 21 fourth-quarter points after trailing 17-6 heading into the final 15 minutes. Jackson Sirmon returned a fumble 37 yards for a touchdown on the game's signature play. Daniel Scott had knocked the ball loose on the play before Jeremiah Earby picked it up but fumbled before Sirmon grabbed the ball and scampered to the end zone.

The Bears also won in 2019 and 2021, breaking a nine-game losing streak to the Cardinal in the first victory. Chase Garbers was the winning quarterback in both contests, scoring the game-winning touchdown with a 16-yard run with 1:19 remaining in the game in 2019 before leading the Golden Bears to a 41-11 blowout win keyed by an 84-yard touchdown connection with Trevon Clark two years later.

The rivalry between the Bay Area's Pac-12 schools dates back to 1892 and is the sixth-longest active running series between two Football Bowl Subdivision teams. The series is also the sixth-longest series overall between two FBS squads and the second-longest in the West. Stanford leads the all-time series, 65-49-11.

The status of the rivalry as one of the nation's truly great sporting spectacles was established in the very first game, when Stanford upset Cal, 14-10, on March 19, 1892, in a contest played on a field at the corner of Haight and Stanyan streets in San Francisco. Stanford manager Herbert C. Hoover, later to become the 31st president of the United States, and his Cal counterpart counted the gate receipts and reported a then-staggering sum of \$30,000.

The game continued to grow in popularity with capacity crowds becoming the norm. In 1923, the Golden Bears opened California Memorial Stadium with a 9-0 win over Stanford to cap an undefeated season. Stanford and Cal had also previously opened Stanford Stadium in 1921, with the Bears winning, 42-7, en route to the Rose Bowl.

Cal achieved great success in the series under Pappy Waldorf, who retired with a 7-1-2 record against Stanford from 1947-56. The 1949 game was highlighted by Jim Monachino's 84-yard run – still the longest rush and tied for the longest play ever by a Cal player in Big Game history.

The series has been a remarkably close rivalry, with the Big Game having been determined by a touchdown or less 55 times including on five occasions on the final play, most recently with Garbers' heroics in Cal's 2019 victory and beginning with the 1972 meeting in Berkeley. In the latter contest, Cal faced fourth down from the Stanford seven-yard line with three seconds to go, but Vince Ferragamo completed a touchdown pass to a diving Steve Sweeney to give the Bears a 24-21 win.

Two years later, Stanford's Mike Langford booted a 50-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Cardinal to a 22-20 decision over the Bears in the 1974 Big Game.

In 1982, Cal won on the five-lateral, 57-yard kickoff return that will forever be remembered simply as The Play, and is arguably the most iconic moment in college football history. Trailing 20-19, the Bears received Stanford's kickoff with just four seconds remaining and proceeded to travel the length of the field, marching through the Stanford Band to produce an improbable 25-20 victory.

The Cardinal prevailed in 1990 by scoring nine points in the final 12 seconds. John Hopkins connected on a 37-yard field goal as time ran out for a 27-25 win.

In 2000, Cal and Stanford played the first overtime game in the history of the series, with the Cardinal emerging 36-30 winners when Randy Fasani found Casey Moore for a 25-yard score in the extra period.

For the 100th Big Game, the teams donned uniforms representative of the ones they wore more than a half-century earlier. On the night prior to the contest on Nov. 21, 1997, a gala event dubbed the "Big Auction" raised more than \$1 million in scholarship funds for each school.
