

**Stanford Postgame Notes**  
**Sept. 14, 2013 · Michie Stadium · West Point, N.Y.**  
**Attendance: 39,644**

**No. 5/4 Stanford (2-0) 34**  
**Army (1-2) 20**

- Stanford improved to 2-0 overall and gained an edge in the all-time series with Army, 6-5
    - It was the first meeting between Stanford and Army since 1976
  - The Cardinal improved to 11-10 all-time against the service academies
    - 6-5 vs. Army, 1-2 vs. Navy, 4-3 vs. Air Force
  - Stanford forced a third-quarter Army fumble to extend its nation-best streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 26 contests
  - In a battle against one of the nation's top rushing defensive units against one of the nation's best ground games, Stanford allowed 284 rushing yards on 61 Army carries
  - Head coach David Shaw improved to 2-1 (.500) in road openers
    - Shaw won his road debut at Duke in 2011, 44-14, before losing at Washington last season, 13-17
  - Stanford improved to 4-3 in games played in the Eastern Time Zone since 2008
  - Stanford improved to 14-2 during the month of September dating back to 2009
  - Stanford extended its overall winning streak to 10 games
  - Stanford moved to 34-8 since the start of the 2009 season

**Junior QB Kevin Hogan**

- Finished 11 of 18 passing for 188 yards and three touchdowns
- Matched career-high with three passing touchdowns (last vs. Oregon State in 2012)

**Junior WR Ty Montgomery**

- Finished with six receptions for career-high 130 yards and one touchdown
- Finished with 30 rushing yards on two attempts
- Caught 46-yard touchdown pass from Kevin Hogan early in the second quarter
  - Second touchdown reception in as many games
- 25-yard rush in the second quarter

**Senior RB Tyler Gaffney**

- Finished with career-high 132 rushing yards on 20 attempts
  - Second straight 100-yard rushing game
- 23-yard touchdown catch in third quarter to help give Stanford a 27-13 lead
- First player with receiving and rushing touchdown in same game since Steфан Taylor (vs. Oregon State in 2012)

**Sophomore WR Michael Rector**

- First career catch (26-yarder in first quarter from Kevin Hogan) resulted in first career touchdown

**Senior P Ben Rhyne**

- Season's first punt came at 9:38 mark in first quarter
- It was Stanford's first punt since the 2013 Rose Bowl, snapping a span of 78:04 of action without a punt
- Stanford did not punt in its season opener against San Jose State

**Senior K Jordan Williamson**

- Made 31-yard field goal to give Stanford a 17-6 second-quarter lead
- Made 47-yard attempt to end first half, giving Stanford a 20-13 lead

**Freshman WR Francis Owus**

- Became first true freshman to make season debut

**Sophomore DT Ikenna Nwafor**

- Made career debut
