Postgame Notes

November 20, 2014 No. 10/13 Texas 87 - No. 6/1 Stanford 81 (OT) Stanford, Calif. Maples Pavilion

- Stanford lost in Maples Pavilion for the first time since Jan. 13, 2013 against No. 7 California, 67-55. The Cardinal had won 28 straight games at home, which was the third longest active streak in the nation.
- Thursday marked the first time in program history the Cardinal had played back-to-back overtime games.
- It was Stanford's first overtime loss since falling at No. 6 Tennessee, 82-72, on Dec. 19, 2010. The Cardinal's only overtime game since was on Jan. 28, 2012 against Cal, a 74-71 victory.
- The loss was Stanford's first in home non-conference play since dropping a 61-35 decision to No. 2 Connecticut on Dec. 29, 2012.
- Stanford has scored more than 80 in each of its first three games for the first time since 2009-10.
- Lili Thompson scored a career-high 28 points. She's gone for 26, 24 and now 28 points in the first three games this season and is the first Stanford guard to score 20 or more in three consecutive outings since Candice Wiggins did so in 2008 against Santa Clara on Feb. 5 (20), Oregon on Feb. 7 (25) and Oregon State on Feb. 9 (25).
- Thompson's seven rebounds were also a career high, surpassing the six she had against South Dakota last March 22.
- Briana Roberson played 13 minutes off the bench and tied a career high with eight points. She missed both of her two field goal attempts, but was 8-of-10 at the free throw line.
- Freshman Kaylee Johnson played 38 minutes, 10 more than the 28 she was on the court for against Connecticut on Monday night. She grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds for the second straight game and is the first Stanford freshman to go for more than 10 in back-to-back outings since Chiney Ogwumike in 2010-11.
- With 15 points, Amber Orrange now has 992 in her career and is just eight away from becoming Stanford's 35th 1,000-point scorer. Her four assists give her 439 and moved her into ninth place on the Cardinal's all-time list, ahead of Kate Starbird (437) and Candice Wiggins (436). Next up is Molly Goodenbour, who handed out 441 from 1989-93.
- Stanford's last loss to Texas came all the way back on March 24, 1988 (79-58). The Cardinal is now 6-3 all-time against the Longhorns.
