2023 NOTABLES

- No. 1 Stanford (13-0, 1-0 MPSF) hosts No. 4 UCLA on Saturday, March 11, returning to Avery Aquatic Center for the first time in five weeks.
- Stanford is enjoying its best start since 2011, when the Cardinal opened 24-0 and finished 28-1 on the way to winning the NCAA title.
- Aria Fischer was named MPSF Player of the Week for the third time this season after scoring a career-high seven goals in Stanford's 16-7 win over Indiana on March 4 as the Cardinal opened conference play. Fischer, who posted a hat trick through the first quarter and totaled five goals by halftime, fired off 10 shot attempts and achieved her career high with a seventh goal 12 seconds into the final period. Fischer now has 192 career goals, ranking seventh on Stanford's all-time scoring list.
- In addition to averaging 16.0 goals per game (208 total), the Cardinal has received at least one goal from 20 different players this season. Returning All-Americans Aria Fischer (37 goals, 17 assists, 70 shots) and Ryann Neushul (31 goals, 23 assists, 55 shots) pace the squad.
- Stanford's defense has been stingy, holding its opponent scoreless for at least an eight-minute stretch in seven of its 13 games this season. Maya Avital has been dependable as the primary goalkeeper, making 102 saves.
- Freshmen have played a key role in Stanford's success, with Jenna Flynn (30 goals, 53 shots, 8 multi-goal games), Maggie Hawkins (12 goals, 18 shots, 5 multi-goal games), Ella Woodhead (6 goals, 4 assists) and Jackie King (8 games, 26 saves) standing out.
- Sophie Wallace's goal with 10 seconds left powered Stanford to an 11-10 victory over USC on Feb. 26, as the Cardinal repeated as Barbara Kalbus Invitational champions and captured its sixth tournament crown overall. The highly-anticipated contest – a rematch of the 2022 NCAA championship which Stanford won 10-7 – lived up to the hype, with very little separating the nation's two remaining unbeaten teams.
- Head coach John Tanner picked up his 600th career victory in Stanford's 25-8 win over Fresno State on Jan. 28. Now in his 26th season, Tanner has compiled a 611-88 (.874) overall record while directing the Cardinal to 21 all-time NCAA appearances, eight NCAA titles (2022, 2019, 2017, 2015, 2014, 2012, 2011, 2002) and nine national runner-ups.
- Stanford is bidding to repeat as NCAA champions for the first time since 2014-15, after capturing its eighth NCAA crown in school history last May following a 10-7 victory over USC. The nation's winningest program, Stanford has reached the NCAA final in 11 of the last 12 seasons while appearing in every NCAA Championship since the event's inception in 2001. The Cardinal also won its first MPSF crown since 2014.
- Stanford's 2023 coaching staff features two familiar faces as additions. A captain of Stanford's 2011 NCAA championship team and four-year letterwinner, Kim Krueger arrives on The Farm after working for 10 years at the intersection of health, partnerships, technology and innovation, most recently serving as Deputy Chief of Staff to the Chief Operating Officer at Clover Health, specializing in partnerships and operations. Kayla Constandse, a member of two NCAA championship teams during her four-year career from 2017-20, joins the staff as a volunteer assistant coach.
