STANFORD

- Stanford had a 10-game win streak snapped in Pullman dating back to May 22, 1971
- Stanford had a two-game overall win streak snapped against Washington State
- Stanford has still won 25 of the last 28 games overall between the clubs and leads the all-time series, 31-16
- Stanford needs a victory in the final game of its current series to end series losing streaks of both six series overall and six straight Pac-10 series that are the longest since the team lost six straight Pac-10 series by dropping its final five Pac-10 sets of 1993 and its first conference series of 1994, and eight straight series overall from April 13, 1978 March 31, 1979
- Stanford had its season-best string of consecutive double-digit hit games snapped at nine in a row as the Cardinal fell one hit short with nine
- · Stanford had a season-high three sacrifice bunts
- The loss was Stanford's third in a row on Sunday and the fourth in its last five Sunday games after the Cardinal had previously won six in a row on Sundays
- Sean Ratliff (CF) has now played in and started all 44 games this season and is the only Stanford player to do so
- Sean Ratliff extended his career-high hit streak to 10 games with an RBI single with the streak on the line in his last at bat to tie the game at 6-6 in the top of the eighth inning
- Adam Sorgi extended his hit streak to 10 games with a season-high-tying three hits for his seventh three-hit contest of the season and is now hitting .407 on the campaign
- · Adam Sorgi's two doubles equaled a career-best with his third career two-double game and his first two-double game of the season
- Brendan Domaracki had a career-high-tying two hits and a career-high-tying three RBI with the three RBI also a new season-high
- · Jason Castro scored a season-high two runs and walked a season-high twice, which also tied for the team's season-high by an individual
- · Toby Gerhart had his career-high hit streak end at eight games
- · Michael Taylor had his stretch of six straight multiple-hit contests end by going 0-for-5 with a strikeout
- · Stanford's pitching staff hit a season-high five batters
- · Nolan Gallagher hit a career-high four batters
- The game clocked in at 3:07 to mark the 27th time in 44 games this season that Stanford has played for 3:00 or more
