### CARDINAL MEETS WISCONSIN IN BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS OPENER

Stanford is in the Bahamas to compete in the eight-team Battle 4 Atlantis tournament over the Thanksgiving week. The Cardinal opens play Wednesday against No. 25 Wisconsin at 11:30 a.m. PT in the Imperial Arena on the Atlantis resort.

### BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS

The 2018 Battle 4 Atlantis field features Stanford, Florida, Butler, Virginia, Dayton, Oklahoma, Wisconsin and Middle Tennessee State. The Cardinal has faced six of the other seven teams in its history, having yet to meet Middle Tennessee State. Stanford's most recent contest against a member of the 2018 Battle 4 Atlantis field was Florida, which the Cardinal faced in the PK80 Invitational in Portland, on Thanksgiving Day last season.

Stanford is making its second appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis. The Cardinal was part of the 2012 field, placing sixth in the tournament with losses to Missouri and Minnesota and a victory over Northern Iowa.

Head Coach Jerod Haase is making his second appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis. In his third season as the head coach of UAB in 2014-15, Haase and the Blazers faced No. 2 Wisconsin in the 2014 tournament opener. UAB lost to the Badgers, 72-43.

### OKPALA HONORED

Sophomore KZ Okpala, the Pac-12 Player of the Week last week, leads the Pac-12 in scoring at 22.7 ppg. He averaged 26.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.0 blocks and 2.0 steals in wins over Seattle and UNCW, and scored a team-best 16 points with nine rebounds at North Carolina. Okpala posted a career-best 29 points and collected 10 rebounds, five assists and three blocks in the 96-74 win against Seattle. In the 72-59 road win over UNC Wilmington, the forward scored 23 points and added three rebounds. Okpala also recorded three steals at UNCW, as Stanford matched its highest steal total in a game in the last 22 years with 15 swipes against the Seahawks.

## THE ROAD MORE TRAVELED

Stanford will play more than half of its 12-game nonconference schedule away from Maples Pavilion. The Cardinal will hit the road for seven games inside and outside the United States. In Stanford's first eight games, the Cardinal will travel 16,339 miles, with stops in Wilmington, North Carolina, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, Lawrence, Kansas and Paradise Island, Bahamas.

## AGAINST WISCONSIN

Stanford is 6-3 in nine previous meetings with Wisconsin. The two teams last met Dec. 27, 1994, a 95-78 victory for the Cardinal at Maples Pavilion. Stanford has won three of the last four in the series. The only other neutral-site contest between the teams occurred Dec. 29, 1975. Stanford dropped a 70-64 decision to Wisconsin in the Milwaukee Classic in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

## AGAINST THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

Stanford owns a 35-37 all-time record against current members of the Big Ten Conference. The Cardinal has played Wisconsin (6-3) and Nebraska (6-3) the most among current members. The only school among the 14 members of the conference the Cardinal has not played yet is Penn State. Stanford last played a team from the Big Ten Conference in the PK80 Invitational last season, dropping a 79-71 contest to Ohio State in Portland.

## AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

No. 25 Wisconsin is Stanford's second nationally-ranked opponent in as many games. Stanford is 1-14 vs. ranked foes in the AP poll in the Jerod Haase era, defeating No. 16 Arizona State (86-77) Jan. 17, 2018. Stanford's last road win over a ranked team came at No. 9 Texas (74-71 OT) Dec. 23, 2014. Jerod Haase owns a 3-22 record against ranked teams as a head coach. He played 10 ranked foes at UAB, leading the Blazers to a win over No. 9 Iowa State (60-59) in the NCAA Tournament on March 19, 2015, and a victory over No. 16 North Carolina (63-59) in Birmingham, on Dec. 1, 2013. Stanford, which played at No. 7 North Carolina in its last game, previously played ranked teams in consecutive games Jan. 17 and 20 of last season, defeating No. 16 Arizona State (86-77) and falling to No. 14 Arizona (73-71) at home.

**NOTABLE MARKS FROM THE FIRST THREE GAMES**

In the season-opening win over Seattle, Stanford posted a school-record 73.3 three-point field goal percentage. The Cardinal connected on 11-of-15 attempts, led by Cormac Ryan's 5-of-6 FG percentage. The old mark was 72.7 percent (8-of-11) against Oregon State on Dec. 17, 1988.

In the win at UNCW, Stanford recorded 15 steals, matching its best total in a game in the last 22 years. The only other time Stanford had 15 steals in a game during that span was against Oregon State on Jan. 5, 2006.

Twelve players saw action at North Carolina, the most members of the Cardinal to appear in a game since Feb. 3 of last season when 12 players appeared in a 96-61 victory over Oregon.

**YOUNG SQUAD**

Among the 15 players on the 2018-19 Stanford roster, 11 are in either their first or second year playing. Only senior Josh Sharma and juniors Marcus Sheffield, Trevor Stanback and Rodney Herenton entered 2018-19 with at least two seasons under their belt. Through three games, first and second-year players have accounted for 80 percent (79.2) of the Cardinal's scoring (190 of 240 points). The underclassmen have also accounted for 82.7 percent of Stanford's rebounding total (91 of 110 rebounds).

**OKPALA'S IMPACT AS A SOPHOMORE**

Sophomore KZ Okpala is averaging a team-best 22.7 ppg in 35.3 mpg through three games this season. He averaged 10.0 ppg in 33.0 mpg in his first three games last season.

**RYAN POSTS THIRD-BEST POINT TOTAL IN DEBUT**

Freshman Cormac Ryan's 16-point performance in his collegiate debut against Seattle was the third most by a true freshman in his debut in the 104-year history of the program. Ryan connected on five three pointers in the contest, similar to now-sophomore Isaac White's collegiate debut last season (17 points on five three pointers).

**BACK-TO-BACK TOP-20 RECRUITING CLASSES**

In Stanford's first three games, four true freshmen have made their first collegiate appearances. Cormac Ryan led the way with 16 points in 33 minutes in the season opener against Seattle. Jaiden Delaire had eight points in 25 minutes against the Redhawks. Lukas Kisunas had two points in five minutes. Bryce Wills made his collegiate debut last Friday at UNCW, with three points in 14 minutes. The Cardinal's class of newcomers was ranked as high as No. 20 nationally, giving the program back-to-back top-20 recruiting classes. Stanford's 2017 class of Daejon Davis, KZ Okpala, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White was ranked No. 8 nationally.

**SHEFFIELD RETURNS**

Redshirt junior Marcus Sheffield has returned to the lineup, after missing the entire 2017-18 season. He injured his leg in practice a couple days before the regular-season opener last year. Sheffield, who poured in a career-best 35 points against Arizona State on Dec. 30, 2016, averaged 6.7 ppg during his true sophomore campaign in 2016-17. Sheffield is averaging 8.3 ppg in 19.3 mpg off the bench in the first three games of 2018-19.

**DAVIS DIRECTING THE OFFENSE**

Sophomore Daejon Davis, who broke Brevin Knight's school freshman assist record with 160 last season, has started all 36 career games he has played in. The point guard is averaging 10.7 ppg this year, with five steals in three games.

**KISUNAS EARNS EXTENDED MINUTES AGAINST TAR HEELS**

After playing five minutes in the first two games (did not see action at UNCW), freshman Lukas Kisunas played 12 minutes in the second half at No. 7 North Carolina last time out. The forward scored two points, collected four rebounds and a block in extended action against the Tar Heels in Chapel Hill.

**YOUNGEST PLAYER IN THE PAC-12**

With a birthdate of October 13, 2000, freshman Bryce Wills is the youngest player in the Pac-12 Conference and one of the youngest in Division I college basketball. With most of the Division I schools reporting, Wills is the seventh-youngest player in the nation this season.

**CARDINAL SNAPSHOT**

Stanford's 2018-19 roster includes two returning starters and nine letterwinners overall from last season's squad that won 19 games overall and reached the postseason for the first time in three years.

Davis, who started all 33 games he played in last season, was named to the five-member All-Pac-12 Freshman Team last year after averaging 10.7 points and 4.8 assists. He broke Brevin Knight's freshman assist record with 160. Okpala, who started 21 of the 23 games he played in, averaged 10.0 ppg last year.

**PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL**

Stanford was picked ninth in the Pac-12 Conference men's basketball preseason poll, as voted on by the media who cover the league.

The Cardinal, picked fifth by the media in last season's preseason poll, finished third in the conference in 2017-18 with an 11-7 record for its best conference finish and most league wins in a decade.

**DELAIRE RECLASSIFIED TO JOIN 2018 CLASS**

Jaiden Delaire, one of the top-rated players in the 2019 class, reclassified to the 2018 class and signed in August. He completed four years of high school, beginning at Granby Memorial High School before moving to The Loomis Chaffee School the last two years.

**FLOOR BURNS**

During his collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the third season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat.

A 6-9, 200-pound forward from North Granby, Connecticut, Delaire was the 2018 Gatorade Boys Basketball Player of the Year in the state of Connecticut. He averaged 21.3 points, 7.4 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game for The Loomis Chaffee School last season.

A consensus four-star prospect, Delaire is ranked No. 68 by Rivals, No. 76 by 247Sports and No. 79 overall by ESPN in the 2019 rankings. Delaire is ranked No. 78 in the recently updated 247Sports rankings for the class of 2018.

**HAASE INCREASES TEAM WIN TOTALS EACH SEASON**

Jerod Haase has led his teams to increased win totals in each of his first six full seasons as a head coach. In his first season as a head coach in 2012-13, Haase guided UAB to 16 wins, eventually posting 26 wins and a second consecutive postseason berth in his final year with the Blazers in 2015-16. After Stanford earned 14 wins in his first season on The Farm in 2016-17, he led the Cardinal to 19 wins and an NIT berth last season.

**CARDINAL SIGNS POINT GUARD TYRELL TERRY**

Jerod Haase announced the signing of nationally-ranked point guard Tyrell Terry to a National Letter of Intent on Nov. 14.

The 6-1, guard out of Minneapolis, Minnesota, is a consensus four-star prospect and one of the top point guard's in the Class of 2019.

A star for De La Salle High School in Minneapolis, Terry is ranked No. 61 in the 2019 class by 247Sports, No. 81 by Rivals and No. 90 by ESPN. The point guard is No. 76 in the 247Sports composite rankings. He is the third-ranked prospect in the state of Minnesota by all three outlets. Terry is rated as the fifth-best point guard in the class by 247Sports, while Rivals ranks him No. 11 at his position and ESPN has him at No. 12 in their positional rankings.

Terry averaged 17 points and seven assists per game for DeLaSalle during his junior season. He led the Islanders to a 21-4 record in 2017-18. DeLaSalle placed third in the Minnesota Class 3A state tournament, where Terry was named to the 10-man all-tournament team. Terry also competed with the USA Select Team at the Albert Schweitzer Tournament in Germany and was a standout for D1 Minnesota on the AAU circuit this past summer.

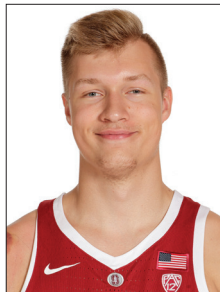

In just his first two seasons as Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball, Jerod Haase has already left a strong imprint on the program. Under his leadership, the Cardinal has instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude that has elevated Stanford to success it hasn't enjoyed in a decade.

In his second season on The Farm, Haase guided the Cardinal to a third-place finish in the Pac-12 with 11 conference wins, the program's highest finish and most league victories in 10 seasons. Competing without two starters for half the season, Stanford won 19 games overall and earned a postseason berth for the first time in three years with a second-round appearance in the National Invitation Tournament.

In two seasons with Haase and his staff, several members of the Cardinal have earned individual accolades. Forward Reid Travis has been voted a First Team All-Pac-12 selection by the league's coaches and garnered NABC All-District laurels each of the last two seasons. Forward Dorian Pickens was named an all-conference player for his performance on the court and the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for his efforts in the classroom this past season. Point guard Daejon Davis was named to the five-member Pac-12 All-Freshman Team in 2017-18.

In two full recruiting cycles, Haase and his staff have landed top-tier classes. Stanford's 2017 recruiting class was regarded as one of the best in school history. The four-member group was rated a top-10 class nationally by many, ranked as high as eighth by Rivals. The Cardinal's 2018 class is again regarded among the best in the nation. In his first year with the Cardinal in 2016-17, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules. Stanford finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs in the classroom as well.

Haase was appointed Stanford's 18th men's basketball coach on March 25, 2016. At UAB, Haase led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game. During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003. When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection. Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' 1997 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Haase earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000. Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

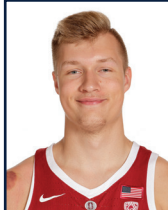
