In 2015, a new era for America East field hockey began as four west coast institutions - Stanford, California, Pacific and UC Davis - joined the conference as associate members. They join Albany, New Hampshire, Vermont, and UMass-Lowell to form one of the most geographically diverse conferences in the nation.

A Look Back

- No. 13 Stanford blasted past conference rival UC Davis 5-1 Friday afternoon on their home turf, posting their second highest goal output of the season behind only their 7-0 win over Saint Louis. Stanford outshot UC Davis 12-6 on the night while five different Cardinal scored in the win.
- Dulcie Davies was flawless again, keeping the Aggies shutout in her 61 minutes of action, garnering her a second America East Defensive Player of the Week award.

Matchup History

- The Cardinal (11-5, 3-2 America East) last faced the Tigers (10-6, 4-1 America East) on Oct. 16 in Stockton, Calif., and despite holding 13-10 advantage in shots and a 6-4 edge in penalty corners, Stanford fell 1-0 to Pacific.

When head coach Tara Danielson first arrived on The Farm, Stanford was considered to be one of the country's fast-rising programs.

Six years later, Danielson has continued to elevate the program's national standing in the form of both team and individual success.

In addition to making five of the past six NCAA Tournaments, Stanford has remained a fixture in the national rankings for all but one week during Danielson's tenure.

In 2014, Danielson led Stanford to new heights, including program records in wins (19), winning-streak (12) and national ranking (No. 3). Perhaps most noteworthy was the Cardinal's first-ever NCAA Tournament victory, a 2-1 thriller over No. 10 Louisville.

Stanford finished the 2013 season with a 16-5 record, winning 15 games for the fifth consecutive season. The Cardinal earned its fifth straight NorPac West regular season title and appeared in its eighth consecutive NorPac Championship final

Stanford wrapped up the 2012 campaign at 16-7 overall, reaching the NCAA Tournament while capturing the NorPac Championship for the fifth time in six years. Perhaps even more impressive, the Cardinal navigated through a grueling non-conference schedule in which it played four games against the nation's No. 1-ranked team at the time.

Danielson's 2011 squad (17-4, 6-0 NorPac) tied a school record for victories, reached its highest-ever national ranking at No. 6 and sported a top-10 RPI for the entire season. Boasting six top-20 victories, the Cardinal earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

Stanford's winningest first-year head coach, Danielson led Stanford to a 15-6 overall record in 2010, with the 15 victories ranking as the third-most in school history. Danielson's debut season resulted in Stanford's 10th NCAA Tournament appearance and third postseason trip in four years.

Stanford has also excelled academically under Danielson, including a school-record 18 players named to the SGI/NFHCA Division I National Academic Squad in 2012. The Cardinal has been honored with at least 10 selections in 10 of the past 12 seasons.

NEWS AND NOTES

A Look Back

• No. 13 Stanford defeated America East conference rival UC Davis on Friday afternoon at the Stanford Varsity Turf. The Cardinal saw five players collect goals in the 5-1 win. Stanford put up 12 to UCD's six shots with Dulcie Davies put up over 60 minutes of shut out action to garner another America East Defensive Player of the Week award.

Matchup History

• This season, the Tigers hold the lead with a 1-0 win over Stanford earlier this year. Under Head Coach Tara Danielson, Stanford is 10-1 all-time against Pacific. Stanford has outscored Pacific under Danielson 47-7.

Close Quarters

• Out of the Cardinal's 14 games this season, 12 have been decided by one goal.

Leading the Way

• Maddie Secco leads the Cardinal in goals (6), assists (10) and points (22), while Fran Tew leads the team in shots (34). Secco, Sarah Hegelson and Jessica Chisholm have all netted two game winning goals as well. Dulcie Davies, the reigning America East Defensive Player of the Week, has made 86 saves on the season and ranks 3rd in the nation with an .827 save percentage and 7th with a 1.12 goals against average.

In the Polls

• The Cardinal checked in at No. 13 in the latest Penn Monto/NFHCA Poll. Stanford was also listed No. 11 in the NCAA's RPI rankings.

Looking Ahead

• The Cardinal look to find out seeding for the America East Tournament, which starts next week in Albany, N.Y.

Taking on the Best

• Stanford's 2015 schedule includes six teams who finished 2014 in the top-20. The Cardinal put up close games against two-time defending national champion Connecticut, and NCAA runner-up Syracuse, while topping NCAA quarterfinalist Duke 3-2(OT), Kent State 4-2 and Northwestern 3-2.
