

STANFORD FOOTBALL GAME NOTES



STANFORD CARDINAL 37 (1-0) HAWAI'I RAINBOW WARRIORS 24 (0-2) CLARENCE T.C. CHING COMPLEX (13,793) • SEPT. 1, 2023

TEAM

- Stanford won the season opener for the tenth time in the last 13 season openers (10-3)
- Head Coach Troy Taylor picked up his first win as head coach of the Cardinal, and improved to 4-0 in season openers as a head coach
- Speaking of 4-0, Stanford is now 4-0 all-time against Hawai'i, with three of those wins coming on Oahu
- With the win, Stanford has won three-consecutive non-conference road games, their longest such winning streak since 1971-72 (four-straight)
- Stanford held the Rainbow Warriors to -5 rushing yards, the fewest the Cardinal has allowed in a game since Oct. 10, 2014 vs. Washington State (-26 yards)
- The -5 rushing yards allowed in the season opener were also the fewest allowed in a non-conference road game since Sept. 20, 2003 at BYU (-5 yards)
- Stanford's defense registed six sacks on Friday, the most in a game since Nov. 24, 2018 at UCLA (6)
- The six sacks recorded by the defense are the most in a non-conference road game since Sept. 16, 2017 at San Diego State (6)
- David Bailey recorded three sacks for Stanford, the first three sack game by a Cardinal since Henry Anderson on Nov. 15, 2014 vs. Utah
- With his rushing touchdown in the first quarter, E.J. Smith scored the first points of the season for Stanford in consecutive seasons.
- Ashton Daniels carried the ball 11 times, the 11th time since 2014 that a Stanford quarterback has had double-digits in carries
- Eight different Cardinal made their first career starts on Friday: Ashton Daniels, Scotty Edwards, Connor McLaughlin, Simione Pale, James Pogorelc, Mudia Rueben, and Sam Roush
- An additional eight players made their collegiate debuts in Friday's season opener: Justin Lamson, Elic Ayomanor, Jshawn Frausto-Ramos, Tiger Bachmeier, Sedrick Irvin, Matt Rose, Simione Pale, and Peyton Warford

INDIVIDUAL

QB ASHTON DANIELS

- Finished his first collegiate start 25-36 for 248 yards and his first two collegiate passing touchdowns
- Also recorded 11 carries for 42 yards, carrying the ball more times than any Stanford running back
- First collegiate passing touchdown came on a 32-yard toss to tight end Benjamin Yurosek

RB CASEY FILKINS

- Despite not carrying the ball until the second quarter, finished as the team's leading rusher, with 67 yards on six totes
- Broke loose for a 47-yard scamper in third quarter, the longest run of his collegiate career

WR BRYCE FARRELL

• Recorded his first career rushing touchdown in the second quarter, just his second collegiate touchdown

WR TIGER BACHMEIER

• Finished his collegiate debut with three receptions, tied for the second most among Cardinal receivers in their collegiate debuts

TE BENJAMIN YUROSEK

- Set a career-high in receiving yards with 138
- Finished one reception shy of tying a career-high, finished the game with nine

DT ANTHONY FRANKLIN

• Notched his first career sack, coming in the third quarter

EDGE DAVID BAILEY

- First multi-sack game of his career
- Three sacks in the game are the most since Henry Anderson in 2014

S ALAKA'I GILMAN

• Paced the defense with seven tackles

S SCOTTY EDWARDS

• Notched his first career sack, coming in the fourth quarter
