Stanford vs. UC Davis

Stanford Regional

Stanford, Calif.

- Stanford improves its all-time postseason record to 70-26 in NCAA Regional/District competition. UC Davis, playing in its first-ever NCAA Division 1 Regional, is now 1-2.
- Stanford is now 53-14 in NCAA Tournament games played at Klein Field at Sunken Diamond, and 41-4 in NCAA Regional games played at its home facility.
- Stanford's Jake Schlender recorded his first three-hit game at Stanford
- Stanford's 17 hits in the contest marks the fourth time this season that the Cardinal reached that hit total.
- Brent Milleville's home run was his 10th of the season, making him the fourth Stanford player in 2008 to reach a double-digit total in home runs.
- The victory marks Stanford's first victory in four tries against UC Davis this season.
- The last time Stanford won a regional elimination game against a team that had beaten it earlier in the very same regional was in 2005, when the Cardinal beat TCU, 12-4, on June 5, 2005 after losing its Waco Regional opener, 5-1, to the Horned Frogs two days prior.
- UC Davis allowed eight runs on Sunday afternoon- the most since surrendering 13 in a 13-4 loss at California on May 6
- Ty Kelly finished the regional batting .615 (8-for-13) with two doubles.
- Jake Jefferies, UC Davis' leading hitter with a .396 average heading into the postseason, got his first three hits of the postseason Sunday against Stanford.
- Aggies reliever Justin Fitzgerald, who suffered the loss after allowing three runs (two earned) in two-thirds of an inning of work, was charged with his first loss since March 6 against Portland, and allowed an earned run for the first time in five outings, dating back to May 10's game at UC Riverside.
- Stanford will face Pepperdine in the regional final Sunday evening, marking the first meeting between the Cardinal and Waves since March 25, 1992. The Waves won that midweek contest in Malibu, 5-4.
