ARTHUR F. DAUER MEMORIAL SPORTS PERFORMANCE AWARD

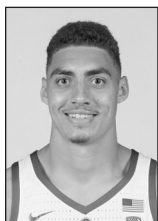

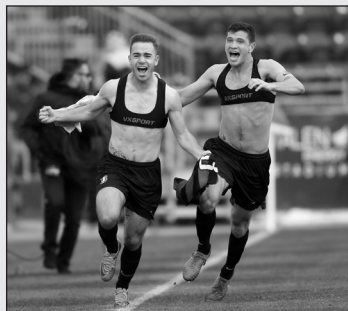

SAM WERNER SOCCER – SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND SOCIETY The Herbert H. Katzev Memorial Scholarship

Stanford won its third consecutive NCAA men's soccer championship when Sam Werner scored in the second overtime to give the Cardinal a 1-0 victory over Indiana at Talen Energy Stadium on Dec. 10. On a sequence that began with a throw-in deep in Hoosier territory, Werner stripped an Indiana player with one touch and stabbed a right-footed shot under the crossbar on his next, at 102:03, to give Stanford the first three-year championship run since Bruce Arena-coached Virginia won four straight from 1991-94.

Daejon Davis, basketball: Daejon Davis acted like it was no big deal. That's because he was unaware of what he had just achieved. The freshman hit a desperation 50-foot 3-pointer at the buzzer and Stanford shocked USC 77-76 in Maples Pavilion on Jan. 7. The Trojans grabbed a 76-74 lead with

1.7 seconds left on an acrobatic shot under their the basket. Davis took the inbound pass, dribbled twice and let it fly, hitting nothing but net as time expired.



Ella Eastin, swimming: Ella Eastin set an American and NCAA record with her individual NCAA title in the 400-yard individual medley. She swam it in 3:54.60, crushing the old record of 3:56.53. Only 10 women have ever been under 4:00 and Eastin still took another two-plus seconds off those marks.



Elizabeth Price, gymnastics: In her final performance for Stanford at the NCAA Championships, Elizabeth Price earned a perfect 10 on the uneven bars to win an individual NCAA title. At the end of her routine, the crowd of more than 5,000 in St. Louis gave her a standing ovation, which is unheard of in collegiate

gymnastics, especially on the road. It was a tremendous moment and a testament to the impact she has had on the NCAA gymnastics community.

ABRAHM DeVINE SWIMMING - COMPUTER SCIENCE

The Buck/Cardinal Club

Won Stanford's first individual NCAA title in the 400-yard individual medley with the third-fastest time (3:35.29), becoming the second-fastest swimmer in history ... finished eighth in the 800-yard freestyle relay, fourth in the 200-yard individual medley, eighth in the 200-yard backstroke and 10th in the 400-yard freestyle relay, giving him five All-America honors in

2018 ... won the 200 IM and 200 back at the Pac-12 Championships (March 3), while posting a third-place finish in the 800 free relay.

Alameda Food Bank and the St. Vincent de Paul Community Center ... Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention.



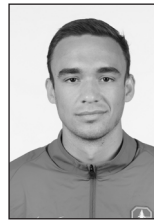

Stanford advanced to match play at the NCAA Championships for the fourth straight year, notching its fourth consecutive top-3 finish.



In its inaugural Pac-12 season, No. 2 seed Stanford rolled over top-seeded Colorado, 15-6, to win the first conference tournament title.

American record holder in the 500-yard, 1000-yard, 1650-yard, 400-meter, 800-meter and 1500-meter freestyles ... as a collegian, broke American records 11 times, NCAA records 15 times and NCAA meet records six times ... member of NCAA-winning 800 free relay team to help Stanford to a sweep of the relays – only the third time a school has won all five relays at the NCAA Championships (2018) ... Stanford won 2018 NCAA team championship by the third-largest margin of victory in meet history ... finished sophomore season undefeated in the 200 free, 500 free, 1,000 free and 1,650 free ... two-time Pac-12 Championships Swimmer of the Meet ... set an American record in the 400 IM at the Pac-12 Championships (2018) ... 2017 Honda Cup winner ... 2017 Women's Sports Foundation Sportswoman of the Year ... two-time Olympian ... six-time Olympic medalist (five gold, one silver) ... 14-time World Championships gold medalist - most by a female ... CoSIDA At-Large Academic All-American of the Year ... Pac-12 All-Academic first team ... two-time CSCAA Scholar All-America ... several visits to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital ... head coach Greg Meehan: "Katie personifies everything that is great about Stanford. An eight-time NCAA champion and nine-time All-American, Katie Ledecky broke American records 11 times, NCAA records 15 times and NCAA meet records six times during her two-year collegiate career. Ledecky finishes her time at Stanford as an American record holder in six different events.

AWARD NAMES DEFINED

Thomas W. Ford Community Service Award – Thomas Ford had a profound impact on the Stanford community. He worked at Stanford for 11 years beginning in 1955 as a legal counsel in the business office, then advanced to the university's director of land development. He served on the Stanford Athletics Board and The Board of Trustees. In 1989, the Ford Center for Sports and Recreation was dedicated in his honor. Community service was important to him, and he funded many service initiatives in the athletics department. This award was established in memory of Tom in the late 1990s.

Sherry Posthumus Club Sports Team of the Year Award – Sherry Posthumus was an assistant athletics director at Stanford for nearly 25 years before her death in 2007. She was the manager of the men's and women's U.S. Olympic fencing teams in 1988, 1992, and 1996, and was instrumental in developing the Stanford fencing program. This award was established in her memory by her colleagues in the athletics department in 2008.

Shirley Schoof Club Sports Athlete of the Year Award – Shirley Schoof retired in 1999 after working for 35 years for the athletics department. She was a physical education instructor and coach, and served for 20 years as an assistant athletics director. This award was established in her name in 2004 to recognize the impact that Schoof made on the university in the areas of physical education, club sports, and wellness.

Arthur F. Dauer Memorial Sports Performance Award – Arthur Dauer, '59, was a dedicated volunteer who served on many local boards, including the Stanford Athletics Board. This award was established by the Dauer family in 2009.

Bob Murphy Award – Bob Murphy, '53, played baseball for Stanford and became the passionate voice of Cardinal sports from 1965 until his retirement in 2007. As an emcee, Murphy shared his "...unparalleled knowledge of Stanford sports history..." during Stanford competitions. This award was established in 2008 in honor of his service as a broadcaster for the Cardinal.

Jake Gimbel Award – Jacob "Jake" Gimbel was a well-known philanthropist in the 1930s who established this award to recognize a senior who, "Shall have shown the best mental attitude toward athletics."

Pam Strathairn Award – Pamela Strathairn, '45, MA '49, EDD '62, was the women's physical education director at Stanford during the enactment of Title IX. She worked, not only to comply with Title IX, but also to lay the foundation for women's athletics at Stanford. She was a leader in athletics administration when the men's and women's departments merged in 1975, creating a model program for universities across the nation. This award was established to honor and recognize Strathairn for her support of female student-athletes at Stanford.

Dick and Anne Gould Captain's Award – Dick Gould, '59, MA '60, played tennis for Stanford and was the Stanford head men's tennis coach for 38 years from 1966-2004. His Stanford teams won 17 NCAA Championships, and 50 of his players won All-America honors. He went on to serve as the John L. Hinds Director of Tennis until his retirement in 2018. Anne Gould, '72, MA '80, played tennis for Stanford and was the women's tennis coach for four years, coaching the Cardinal's first national championship women's team before retiring as head coach to become a tennis instructor on The Farm. This award was established by the Goulds in 2007.

Biff Hoffman Award – Clifford "Biff" Hoffman, '29, played football for Stanford. Under the legendary Coach Pop Warner, Hoffman helped Stanford secure its first Rose Bowl victory in 1928. As a track and field student-athlete, Hoffman set an NCAA discus record helping Stanford win the 1925 NCAA Track and Field Championship.

Spirit of Stanford Award – Frank "Frankie" Albert, '42, played quarterback for Stanford, where he led the 1940 team to an undefeated season and a win at the Rose Bowl. The Spirit of Stanford is a 1942 feature film about the 1940 Stanford "Wow Boys" football squad, featuring star quarterback Frankie Albert. This award was established in 2009.

Donald Kennedy Award – Dr. Donald Kennedy served as Stanford's eighth president from 1980-1992. This award was named in Kennedy's honor upon his retirement as president for his incredible support of Stanford's student-athletes.

Al Masters Award – Al Masters, '24, was the athletics director at Stanford from 1925-1963. He is remembered as one of the most distinguished sports administrators in college history. This award was first presented in 1963 by KCBS Radio in memory of Masters' passing.

Stanford Athletics Board

The mission of the Stanford Athletics Board is to enhance and protect the core values of the Stanford athletics department and Stanford University. To do so, the athletics board supports and nourishes athletic, physical education, and recreation programs at the university and works to ensure that all such programs operate under the highest standards of ethical conduct, sportsmanship, and integrity.

The Stanford Athletics Board was established in 1964 by the Stanford University Board of Trustees.

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
