2023 NOTABLES

- No. 2 Stanford (18-1, 5-1 MPSF) is the No. 2 seed and will face No. 21 San Jose State in Friday's opening round of the MPSF Championship.
- Stanford is attempting to repeat as MPSF champions for the second time in school history and capture its seventh conference title overall. The Cardinal secured the 2022 MPSF title with an 11-9 victory over USC, erasing a fourth-quarter deficit to capture its first conference crown since 2014. Stanford also won MPSF championships in 2006, 2003, 2001 and 2000.
- Stanford's 16-game winning streak earlier this season was its longest overall since 2014. The Cardinal's 16-0 start was its best since opening 24-0 during the 2011 campaign.
- Stanford and USC have combined to win the last 12 NCAA titles, fueling a rivalry that dominates the sport. The Cardinal has won four of the last six meetings overall, including a 10-7 victory in the 2022 NCAA final before repeating as Barbara Kalbus Invitational champs on Feb. 26. The Trojans have won the last four MPSF regular-season contests, including a 17-12 decision on April 8 representing the Cardinal's only loss.
- Aria Fischer, Ryann Neushul and Jewel Roemer have been named to the Peter J. Cutino Award Watch List, as Stanford is well represented in
 the discussion for the nation's top player. Among the 20-player list, Stanford joins USC as the only schools with three selections. Six Cardinal
 players have combined to win the award nine times: Makenzie Fischer (2019, 2022), Kiley Neushul (2012, 2015), Annika Dries (2011, 2014),
 Melissa Seidemann (2013), Jackie Frank (2003) and Brenda Villa (2002).
- A four-time MPSF Player of the Week this season, Aria Fischer scored a career-high eight goals, including the 200th of her career, in a 19-6 win over Arizona State on March 26. Fischer, who became the seventh player in school history to reach the 200-goal mark and now has 212 overall, leads the Cardinal in goals (57), points (84) and shots (110) while ranking second in assists (27).
- The Cardinal is averaging 16.7 goals per game (318 total) and has received at least one goal from all 22 available players. In addition to Fischer's success, Stanford has been led offensively by MPSF Rookie of the Year front-runner Jenna Flynn (49 goals, 14 assists, 81 shots) and fellow returning All-Americans Ryann Neushul (48 goals, 30 assists, 82 shots) and Jewel Roemer (28 goals, 21 assists, 49 shots).
- Stanford's defense has been stingy, holding its opponent scoreless for at least an eight-minute stretch in 10 of its 19 games this season. Maya Avital has been dependable as the primary goalkeeper, making 149 saves and totaling at least 10 stops in six contests.
- Head coach John Tanner picked up his 600th career victory in Stanford's 25-8 win over Fresno State on Jan. 28. Now in his 26th season, Tanner has compiled a 616-89 (.873) overall record while directing the Cardinal to 21 all-time NCAA appearances, eight NCAA titles (2022, 2019, 2017, 2015, 2014, 2012, 2011, 2002) and nine national runner-ups.
- Stanford is bidding to repeat as NCAA champions for the first time since 2014-15, after capturing its eighth NCAA crown in school history last May following a 10-7 victory over USC. The nation's winningest program, Stanford has reached the NCAA final in 11 of the last 12 seasons while appearing in every NCAA Championship since the event's inception in 2001.
