No. 9 Stanford (6-1-0, 4-1-0) vs. California (2-3-0, 2-3-0) | Wednesday, March 24 • 7 p.m. | Pac-12 Network

LOOKING AHEAD » No. 9 Stanford faces a quick turnaround following its first loss of the season, hosting rival California at Cagan Stadium on Wednesday, March 24 at 7 p.m. on Pac-12 Networks.

LAST TIME OUT » The Cardinal couldn't find the back of the net and dropped its first result of the season last weekend at No. 6 Washington. The Huskies scored in the 85th minute to prevent overtime in a rainy Seattle. It was the first time Stanford has been shut out this season.

HOT START » Stanford's 20 goals through seven games is its best start offensively since scoring 23 goals in its first seven games in 2002. The Cardinal has already featured seven different goal scorers this season, while 11 different players own at least one point. Stanford's already scored at least three goals in five games this season; the Cardinal had five such games in 22 matches last year.

A DOMINANT RUN » Under Jeremy Gunn, Stanford has solidified its place among college soccer's elite. No team has won more NCAA titles since 2006 than the Cardinal (3), and Stanford is tied with Indiana with the second-most wins of any team in the nation in the last five seasons (78). The Cardinal had won five consecutive Pac-12 championships before finishing second in 2019.

STANFORD-CALIFORNIA SERIES » Stanford is 35-24-9 all-time against its Bay Area rival, having played the Golden Bears at least once every season dating back to its first varsity year of 1973. The two have played twice each season dating back to 2000 and have split the season series each of the last two years. The Cardinal won its first matchup against Cal in Berkeley just over a month ago, 3-1.

THE CONFINES OF CAGAN » Stanford has earned one of the best home field advantages in the sport of late, boasting a home record of 56-8-12 (.806) since 2014. The Cardinal went 8-2-2 at home in 2019.

AGAINST RANKED » The Cardinal is 33-18-12 all-time against ranked opponents under Jeremy Gunn, including 26-6-8 in its last 39, and is 8-3-4 in its last 15 against top-10 teams, with losses to No. 7 Washington and No. 2 Georgetown last season.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE » It's no secret that the Cardinal has faced unique circumstances to get to this point. Stanford's season opener on Feb. 12 was its first competition since a 2-0 loss to Georgetown in the College Cup on Dec. 13, 2019. The Cardinal was able to train for a number of weeks during the fall, without playing matches, and returned to campus on Jan. 4 and was able to restart training the week of Jan. 18.

CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE » Stanford is one of just two programs to win three straight NCAA titles (2015-17). Virginia won four in a row from 1991-94. It is also one of seven to win at least three national championships along with Saint Louis (10), Indiana (8), Virginia (7), San Francisco (4), UCLA (4) and Maryland (4). Stanford went 52-7-10 (.826) during its three-year championship run.

PAC-12 PROWESS » Stanford has won five of the last six conference titles, setting a Pac-12 record with championships each year from 2014-18. No team has won more conference games than Stanford in the last six years, with an overall record of 45-8-10. Jeremy Gunn is the only coach in league history to win more than two consecutive Pac-12 titles.

RICHMOND ROCKING » Entering the season with two career goals, Will Richmond's junior year is off to a hot start, as the Piedmont, Calif. native has already scored four times for the Cardinal in six games. He scored twice, also adding an assist against San Francisco, along with an assist against UCLA. Richmond scored Stanford's first goal of the match last weekend against Oregon State.

WEHAN DISHING » Charlie Wehan has appeared in five of Stanford's six matches off the bench and leads the Cardinal with five assists, ranking eighth nationally. His two assists against OSU tied a career-high, set as a sophomore.

PLAYER(S) OF THE WEEK » Stanford has already picked up two weekly honors from the Pac-12 Conference this season. Redshirt junior Zach Ryan picked up his first on Feb. 23, named the league's Player of the Week following two goals against California and a goal with an assist against USF.

Similarly, sophomore Gabe Segal was named the conference's Player of the Week on March 2 following his overtime golden-goal at San Diego State.

STARTERS TO START » Gabe Segal and Mark Fisher started their first career games for the Cardinal this season. Segal has scored four times for Stanford this season, against both Pacific and California, along with the game-winners in one-goal victories over San Diego State and Oregon State, while Fisher is tied for second on the team with three assists.

Segal's three game-winners rank fifth in the nation.

GREAT UNDER GUNN » One of four coaches to win NCAA titles in both Division I and Division II, head coach Jeremy Gunn has led a team to the College Cup final four times in the past nine seasons. He and Virginia's Bruce Arena (1991-94) are the only coaches to win three consecutive NCAA men's soccer championships. His teams are 116-33-28 (.729) in his eight-plus seasons on The Farm and he owns a career record of 303-94-59 (.727) in 21+ seasons, a mark which makes him the fifth winningest active coach at the Division I level (by percentage).

BRICK WALL » A redshirt junior with two seasons of experience under his belt, Andrew Thomas returns for the Cardinal as one of the top goalkeepers in the nation. A third-team All-America selection by United Soccer Coaches last year, Thomas started all but one match for the Cardinal in 2019, missing to train with the U.S. U23 national team in San Diego. He ranked 11th nationally with a .805 save percentage, while the Cardinal was 10th as a team with a goals against average of 0.688. Thomas already ranks fourth in Stanford's record books for career shutouts (19), and is five away from moving into a tie for second. Thomas was key in Stanford's 2019 postseason run saving four penaltky kick attempts in the Cardinal's second round advancement past Seattle U, and making the game-clinching penalty kick save in the quarterfinals at Clemson.

The summer of 2019, Thomas was called for a combined preparation camp with players from the United States' Senior and U-23 Men's National Teams from May 26-June 2 in Annapolis, Md. and also participated in a U-23 training camp in Herriman, Utah from June 9-16. An engineering physics major, Thomas was named CoSIDA Academic All-America second team as a redshirt-sophomore and won the NCAA Elite 90 Award. Raised in London, he was born in Moscow and holds triple citizenship (United Kingdom, United States, Russia). Thomas is on the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Best XI first team.

NATIONAL RANKINGS » Stanford ranks fourth in goal differential (+16), fifth in scoring offense (2.9), fifth in points per game (8.9, fourth in assists per game (3.1), eighth in corner kicks per game (7.3), sixth in total assists (22)

RYAN RETURNS » Stanford's leading goal scorer each of the last two seasons, Zach Ryan leads all returning Cardinal with 22 career strikes, including six already this season. A two-time All-Pac-12 honoree, three of Ryan's six goals as a redshirt sophomore were game-winners.

Ryan's six goals this year are second in the Pac-12 and eighth nationally.

NEW FACES » Stanford welcomes in another highly ranked recruiting class, the nation's 10th-best group according to College Soccer News. Six of Stanford's seven freshmen feature experience at the academy level, while the seventh, Aiden Weaver, competed for Pennsylvania Classics, the same club as teammate Ryan Ludwick and former Cardinal Logan Panchot, Drew Skundrich and Brian Nana-Sinkam. From New York, Conner Maurer enters the fold as Stanford's highest-ranked freshman, having competed for the New York Red Bulls Academy. The Cardinal featured four freshman starters last season.

NEAR THE TOP OF THE POLLS » The United Soccer Coaches slotted Stanford at No. 3 in its first poll oft he spring, and the Cardinal currently check in at No. 9. Stanford checks in at No. 7 according to Top Drawer Soccer and No. 6 according to College Soccer News. The Cardinal was picked second in the Pac-12 preseason coaches poll, earning 21 points with one first place vote, just shy of Washington's 22 points and three first-place votes. Stanford was followed by Oregon State (19), with two first-place votes, while UCLA (12), California (11) and San Diego State (5) rounded out the poll.
