THE OPENING KICKOFF

- Stanford (1-3, 0-3) returns home for the first time in nearly a month when it hosts Oregon State (3-2, 0-2) on Saturday night at Stanford Stadium. Both teams enter the contest having lost consecutive games to ranked opponents.
- This weekend's game will serve as Stanford's Mental Health Awareness Game as well as its Breast Cancer Awareness Game. The Cardinal will continue to partner with Solomon Thomas' foundation - The Defensive Line - whose mission is "to end the epidemic of youth suicide, especially for young people of color, by transforming the way we communicate and connect about mental health." Thomas, a current member of the New York Jets, came to campus last May to speak with Cardinal student-athletes and coaches and hold educational workshops on the topic. He will be represented at the game by his parents, Chris and Martha.
- The game will kick off at 8 p.m., Stanford's third straight game to start at 7:30 p.m. PT or later. The Cardinal's game at Washington kicked off at 7:40 p.m. and the contest at Oregon started at 8:10 p.m. In both instances, the team did not return to campus until 3:45 a.m. on Sunday.

- After this week's 8 p.m. kick off vs. the Beavers, the Cardinal heads to Notre Dame for a 7:30 p.m. ET/4:30 p.m. PT kick off on Oct. 15.
- Stanford has played three straight games against Top-20 opponents, its first-such regular season stretch since 2012 (Nov. 10 vs. No. 13 Oregon State; Nov. 17 at No. 1 Oregon; Nov. 24 at No. 15 UCLA).
- Saturday's game marked Stanford's 55th against a ranked opponent in David Shaw's 142nd game as head coach. That represents 38.7% of games coached. The Cardinal's 55 games against ranked opponents is tied for seventh nationally in that span and eight more games than the next closest Pac-12 school (Oregon, 47).
- Prior to the season opener against Colgate, Stanford had played 25 straight games against Power Five opponents and 38 straight against either Power Five or ranked Group of Five foes.
- The Cardinal is the only Pac-12 school to have had its bye week already. Stanford had its bye week during week three (Sept. 17) while the other 11 Pac-12 schools have their bye week during the month of October.

MEDIA POLICIES

Stanford University is constantly monitoring public health guidelines and adjusting its policies to reflect the latest guidance from the CDC, State of California and Santa Clara County. At this time, the Stanford Athletic Communications office plans to host media at Stanford Stadium with no Covid restrictions. Stanford Athletics understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. Our goal is to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets, however, the Stanford Stadium pressbox and work spaces have limited seating and not all requests may be met for all games. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Stanford Athletic Communications staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the communications department.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.
2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.
3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.
4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.
2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.
3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.
4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).
5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.
6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

GAME NOTES

THE MATCHUP

- Stanford and Oregon State meet for the 89th time on Saturday. Oregon State is Stanford's fifth-most common opponent, behind Cal, USC, UCLA and Washington.
- Stanford owns a 59-26-3 record against the Beavers. The Cardinal's 59 wins against Oregon State are its second most against any opponent, behind only its 65 wins over Cal.
- Last season, Oregon State snapped Stanford's 11-game winning streak in the series (2011-21). It was Stanford's second, 11-game winning streak in series history, doing so from 1919-1936 to begin the series. Stanford also owns a 10-game winning streak in the series (1969-78).
- Saturday's game marks Oregon State's first visit to The Farm since 2018. The Cardinal have played in Corvallis each of the last three seasons. It was the second time in series history (also 1973-75) that Stanford has played three straight road games in the series.
- Head coach David Shaw is 10-1 in his career against the Beavers.

SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

Since 2010, Stanford Football has been one of the best programs nationally. In that span, the Cardinal ranks:

- Tied for 15th nationally with 106 wins** (106-49 overall) and 2nd in the Pac-12 behind Oregon. No other Pac-12 program ranks in the Top 25.
- Tied for 14th with 50 NFL Draft picks**, 2nd most in the Pac-12 behind USC.
- Tied for 8th in wins over Top 25 opponents with 31** (31-26 in that span), the best in the Pac-12.
- Tied for 8th nationally with 10 consensus All-Americans**, most in the Pac-12.
- 1st nationally with 15 Academic All-Americans**, five more than any other program and 10 more than any Pac-12 school in that span.
- Including the 2009 season, Stanford's five Top-Two finishers in the Heisman Trophy voting is second nationally to Alabama's six in that span.
- The Cardinal has appeared in four Pac-12 Championship Games since 2011 and would have appeared in five under the newly instituted Pac-12 Championship Game format.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Through five weeks of the college football season, Stanford is one of three schools to have played three Top-25 opponents. Arizona State and Florida have also done so.
- The Cardinal has played three straight games against Top-20 opponents (No. 10 USC, at No. 18 Washington, at No. 13 Oregon)
- The Cardinal was one of 11 programs scheduled to face at least five teams ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25 this season. Stanford and Texas Tech are the only two to play four ranked inside the Preseason Top 15.

STAFF STABILITY

- David Shaw believes in staff stability and proves it in his actions. Stanford was one of just five FBS programs with no staff changes this offseason. The others: BYU, Iowa State, NC State and Wyoming.
- Shaw is in his 16th straight season at Stanford, and 12th as head coach. Defensive coordinator Lance Anderson has been at Stanford all 16 years with Shaw and is in his ninth season leading the Cardinal defense. Offensive coordinator Tavita Pritchard has also been on The Farm all 16 years with Shaw, first as a player, followed by as a coach, and is in his fifth season leading Stanford's offense.
- Stanford is one of three schools in the FBS (also Navy and Utah) to have six assistant coaches who have been on staff for at least seven years. In addition to Anderson and Pritchard, Special teams coordinator Pete Alamar is in his 11th at Stanford, DB coach Duane Akina his ninth, DL coach Diron Reynolds his seventh straight (eighth overall) and TE coach Morgan Turner his 13th straight season on The Farm.

HEAD COACH DAVID SHAW

- Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football David Shaw '94 owns a career record of 94-48 (.662) overall and a mark of 64-35 (.646) against Pac-12 foes.
- Shaw's 94 wins are the most in school history, as he surpassed the legendary Pop Warner (71 wins) during the 2017 season.
- Shaw owns a 29-26 (.527) record against AP Top 25 programs. Of Shaw's 29 wins against ranked foes, 17 of them have come against Top-15 opponents and 11 of those have been against teams ranked in the Top 10. Last year's win over No. 3 Oregon marked Shaw's fifth Top-5 win and fourth Top-3 victory.
- Stanford has defeated multiple Top-15 opponents in five of Shaw's 11 seasons. Stanford has defeated multiple Top-15 teams in 2012, 2013, 2015, 2017 and 2021 under Shaw.
- Stanford has defeated a Top-20 opponent on the road in eight of Shaw's 11 seasons.
- Shaw is one of eight active coaches in the country who is the winningest head coach at his current school. He is joined by North Carolina's Mack Brown, Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald, Iowa's Kirk Ferentz, Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy, Navy's Ken Niumatalolo, Kentucky's Mark Stoops and Utah's Kyle Whittingham.
- Shaw is the only four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year in conference history (dating back to 1975).
- Shaw's 94 wins are currently the 10th-most in Pac-12 history and his 64 conference wins are tied for sixth-most in Pac-12 history.

BLACK LEADERSHIP

- Stanford is one of four Power Five schools with a Black head football coach (David Shaw) and athletic director (Bernard Muir), joined by Maryland, Michigan State and Virginia.
- Stanford is one of two FBS schools to have had three Black head football coaches, joined by Colorado. Shaw (12th season) was preceded by Dennis Green (1989-91) and Tyrone Willingham (1995-01) for a combined 22 seasons in the last 35. Colorado's three Black head coaches have combined for six seasons.
- David Shaw is the longest tenured Black head coach (12th season) at one school in FBS history.
- Shaw's has the most wins by a Power Five Black head coach in NCAA history.
- Willie and David Shaw form the only father-son pairing of Black coaches who held coordinator roles at the same Power 5 school.
- Stanford hired the Pac-12's first and second Black coaches in Green (1989) and Willingham (1995). The third came eight years later (Karl Dorrell, UCLA, 2003).
- Athletic director Bernard Muir is the second-longest tenured Black AD in the country behind Ohio State's Gene Smith. Muir serves on the executive committee of the Black AD Alliance, whose mission is to grow, develop and elevate Black athletics administrators at the Division I level while partnering with NCAA senior leadership and the Minority Opportunities Athletic Association.

TOP 20 WINS ON THE ROAD

- Stanford has defeated at least one Top-20 opponent on the road in eight of the 11 seasons under head coach David Shaw. Stanford had only one Top-20 road win in the nine seasons prior to the start of Shaw's tenure.

A RETURN TO NORMALCY IN 2022

- For the first time since 2019, Stanford Football enjoyed a 'normal' offseason training schedule and program.
- The team reported to campus in early January and began its winter strength and conditioning program before spring ball started in late February. After the April 9 spring game, the Cardinal had its normal spring and summer strength and conditioning program and schedule before training camp.
- In 2020, the team was sent home in March and didn't return until July 1. Then, before an abbreviated six-game schedule commenced in November, the season was canceled, shortened, canceled again and finally restarted. The Cardinal faced county limitations, forcing it to begin training camp in October at nearby Woodside High School before spending the last three weeks of the season away from home due to Santa Clara County policies.
- In 2021, the team didn't return to campus until March, with spring ball starting in late April and the spring game taking place on May 22.
- For any player entering their fourth year or fewer in the Stanford Football program, the 2022 season marks the first college football offseason that has been 'regular' in their careers.

THE STANFORD TREES

- Led by 6-foot-6 quarterback Tanner McKee, the Cardinal offense features height across the board.
- Stanford's top five receiving threats are all 6-foot-2 and above, including 6-foot-5 WR John Humphreys, 6-foot-4 tight end Benjamin Yurosek, 6-foot-4 WR Brycen Tremayne, 6-foot-3 WR Elijah Higgins and 6-foot-2 WR Michael Wilson.
- From left to right, Stanford's starting offensive line so far has been: 6-foot-6 LT Walter Rouse, 6-foot-5 LG Jake Hornibrook, 6-foot-1 C Drake Nugent, 6-foot-4 RG Levi Rogers and 6-foot-7 RT Myles Hinton. 6-foot-5 Barrett Miller started at right tackle Saturday night in place of the injured Hinton, and 6-foot-5 Jack Leyrer replaced Miller after his injury at Oregon.

GAME NOTES

A PLETHORA OF WEAPONS

- Stanford returned 2,241 of 2,582 (86.8%) receiving yards from 2021 and 195 of 239 (81.6%) receptions in 2022.
- Stanford's top four wide receivers (Elijah Higgins, John Humphreys, Brycen Tremayne and Michael Wilson) plus tight end Benjamin Yurosek all returned. Those five combined for 147 catches for 1,870 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2021.
- Tight end Benjamin Yurosek, a Mackey Award watch lister in 2022, led Stanford with 658 receiving yards in 2021. Yurosek, who had 43 catches - 29 of which went for first downs or touchdowns - had 13 catches of more than 20 yards last season.
- So far in 2022, those five pass-catching options have combined for 56 catches for 749 yards and 6 TDs.

CONSISTENT PASS CATCHERS

Fifth-year WR Michael Wilson has a reception in 22 consecutive games dating back to the 2019 season. Senior WR Elijah Higgins has a reception in 17 straight games, junior TE Benjamin Yurosek 15 straight and fifth-year WR Brycen Tremayne 12.

WILSON RUNS WILD ON WASHINGTON

- Fifth-year WR Michael Wilson tallied six catches for 176 yards and two touchdowns at Washington (Sept. 24), nearly two years after he was injured on the same field in 2020 and missed 11 months.
- The 176 yards receiving was tied for the third-most by a Cardinal in the David Shaw era. Of all Cardinal receivers with 175 receiving yards in a game in school history, only two others have done so on six-or-fewer catches.
- Wilson tallied 188 all-purpose yards, as he tacked on a 12-yard rush.
- The UW game marked his second career 100-yard game (114 at Washington State, 11/6/19).
- Wilson has recorded two, multi-TD games in just three so far this season. He is the first Cardinal since Simi Fehoko in 2019 with two, multi-TD games in the same season. J.J. Arcega-Whiteside did so four times during the 2018 campaign.

2022 TEAM CAPTAINS

- Stanford elected its 2022 team captains on Aug. 21. The Cardinal captains are: returning captain Michael Wilson, alongside newly appointed captains Levani Damuni, Jonathan McGill, Tanner McKee, Ricky Miezian and Drake Nugent.
- Wilson is the eighth two-time captain in Shaw's 12 seasons.

FILKINS' FAST START

- Junior running back Casey Filkins made his first career start at Washington and has impressed through four games and two starts in 2022.
- Filkins set career highs with 20 rushes for 100 yards in his first career start at Washington.
- Through four games, Filkins has rushed 61 times for 277 yards and his first two career touchdowns. He's also added nine catches for 146 yards and his first career receiving touchdown, a 42-yarder Saturday night at Oregon.

TWO 100-YARD RUSHERS

Both E.J. Smith and Casey Filkins tallied 100-yard rushing games in the season's first three games. The last time that happened at Stanford was in 2007, when Toby Gerhart had 140 rushing yards vs. SJSU in the second game of the season and Anthony Kimble had 119 yards against No. 13 Oregon in the third game of the year.

EARLY ENROLLEES

- Stanford welcomed three early enrollees in January 2022 for the winter quarter for the first time in program history: EDGE David Bailey, WR Mudia Reuben and TE Sam Roush. All three have played in each of the season's first four games.
- In 2021, QB Ari Patu and CB Jaden Slocum became Stanford's first-ever early enrollees, but joined the program in March for the spring quarter.
- In 2021, Stanford's Faculty Senate voted to implement a three-year pilot program that allows certain student-athletes to enroll as early as winter quarter before their freshman year. Early enrollment is limited to no more than 15 students per year, and each must be academically qualified and have already graduated from their respective high school.

BAILEY STARTS SEASON OPENER

Early enrollee and true freshman David Bailey has started at EDGE in the first three games for Stanford. He became the first true freshman to record an official start in a season opener at Stanford since Owen Marecic (fullback) in 2007 and the first defensive player dating back to at least 2000.

KARTY THE KICKER

- Junior kicker Joshua Karty attempted - and made - his first two field goals of the season Saturday night at Oregon. His makes came from 23 and 53 yards.
- The 53-yarder was a career long and Stanford's longest field goal made since a 54-yarder in 2009. Karty's previous career long was 51 yards.
- He is 14-for-14 on the season on PATs and now 2-for-2 on FG attempts. For his career, he is 41-for-41 on PATs and 12-for-17 on field goals. His five misses have come from 49, 51, 54, 55 and 58 yards.

33 FIRST DOWNS

Stanford's 33 first downs vs. USC was its second-most since 1996 (34 in 1997). The Cardinal has had 30+ first downs five times under David Shaw.

MCKEE BY THE NUMBERS

• Through four games, junior QB Tanner McKee is 78-of-121 (64.5%) for 980 yards and eight touchdowns against four interceptions. He has been sacked 16 times.

• He has multiple touchdowns in each of the first four games, marking nine career games with multiple touchdowns responsible for. His 308 yards passing in the season opener marked his second career 300-yard passing game.

• The offseason leading up to the 2022 season was McKee's first full offseason since 2017 when he was entering his senior season of high school. In 2018, McKee embarked on a two-year LDS mission in Brazil, before returning during the early stages of the pandemic in spring of 2020. McKee was ranked as the No. 4 quarterback in the Class of 2018 by 247Sports.

• McKee finished his 2021 (redshirt freshman athletically, sophomore academically) season 206-of-315 (65.4%) passing for 2,327 yards and 15 touchdowns. He played in 10 games with nine starts.

• McKee became the third freshman in program history (Andrew Luck, 2009; Chad Hutchinson, 1996) to reach the 2,000-yard passing mark. He was also just the fourth Cardinal QB since 2000 to reach 2,000 passing yards in a season. Andrew Luck and Kevin Hogan did so three times each, while K.J. Costello did so in 2018.

• Since 2000, McKee's five games with three-plus total touchdowns in 2021 was the most for a Stanford freshman and the fourth-most overall (Andrew Luck: 9 in 2011; Kevin Hogan: 7 in 2015; Luck: 7 in 2010).

• McKee led Stanford to a road win at No. 14 USC in his first career start on Sept. 11, 2021, becoming the first Pac-12 QB since Tavita Pritchard in 2007 to defeat a ranked opponent on the road in his first career start.

LDS MISSIONS PRIOR TO STANFORD

• Stanford has five student-athletes who have served LDS missions: Senior ILB Levani Damuni (New Zealand), freshman S Scotty Edwards (South Africa), senior ILB Spencer Jorgensen (Thailand), sophomore WR Kale Lucas (Philippines and Seattle) and junior QB Tanner McKee (Brazil). Additionally, ILB Anson Pulsipher is currently on a mission in Chile and will return in 2023.

• In addition to the student-athletes, defensive coordinator Lance Anderson served an LDS mission to Phoenix.

• Stanford was one of seven schools to return all five offensive line starters from the 2021 season. Expected starter at RG, Branson Bragg, announced his retirement from football on Sept. 12.

• Stanford's OL has still combined to make 108 career starts: OT Walter Rouse (33), OG Barrett Mills (28), OG Jake Hornibrook (16), C Drake Nugent (16), OT Myles Hinton (11) and OG Levi Rogers (4).

• The Cardinal OL, by major: Rouse (Biomechanical Engineering), Miller (Mechanical Engineering), Nugent/Hornibrook (Science, Technology and Society), Hinton (Human Biology) and Rogers (Communication).

ROUSE NOMINATED FOR CAMPBELL TROPHY

• Stanford's left tackle Walter Rouse was the Cardinal's nominee for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy in 2022. The trophy, dubbed the academic Heisman, is given annually by the National Football Foundation to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. To be eligible for the Campbell Trophy, a student-athlete must have a minimum 3.3 GPA, be a major contributor on and off the field and be in their final season of eligibility. In October, the NFF will name this year's Scholar-Athlete Class and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, with the winner to be announced in December at its annual Hall of Fame Awards dinner in Las Vegas.

• Rouse has started 33 consecutive games at left tackle and is thriving as a biomechanical engineering major on The Farm.

• Stanford has had 14 National Scholar-Athletes in its history, most recently Thomas Booker (2021) and Casey Toohill (2019).

GOOD WORKS TEAM

• Fifth-year graduate transfer safety Patrick Fields was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team on Sept. 19, honoring student-athletes for their outstanding contributions to their communities. Fields is one of 11 FBS players on the team.

• After four years at Oklahoma, Fields joined the Cardinal in January and is pursuing his master's in management science and engineering.

• This past summer, Fields planned, fundraised, and executed a free, three-day educational, mentorship and networking event for high school and college students in his hometown of Tulsa, Okla. The event brought together the students with black business owners, leaders and mentors leading into Tulsa's celebration of Juneteenth.

• While at Oklahoma, Fields founded the Black Wall Street Scholarship in collaboration with the OU National Black Alumni Association and also hosted the Patrick Fields Back To School Bash and football camp for economically vulnerable elementary students in July 2021.

• Fields is passionate about educating students, especially underrepresented students, about financial literacy, money management, credit and personal branding and founded Town Business to do just that in his hometown of Tulsa, Okla.

GAME NOTES

A RARE TRANSFER

- Since the NCAA's graduate transfer rule went into effect, Patrick Fields is just Stanford's third graduate transfer. He is pursuing a master's degree in management science and engineering.
- Stanford's other two transfers were DE Brennan Scarlett (2015 from Cal) and QB Isaiah Sanders (2020-21 from Air Force). Scarlett is still active with the Miami Dolphins and Sanders, the 2021 Wuerffel Trophy recipient, is active in the Air Force.

EXPERIENCED SECONDARY

- Stanford returned an experienced secondary in 2022, led by senior CB Kyu Blu Kelly, who led the Pac-12 with 13 passes defended a season ago (11 pass breakups, two interceptions).
- Last year, the Cardinal had 10 different players make a start in the secondary, with graduate transfer S Patrick Fields (37 starts at Oklahoma) joining the program this offseason.
- This year's secondary has combined to make 147 career starts.
- S Patrick Fields (41) leads the way, followed by S Kendall Williamson (30), CB Kyu Blu Kelly (29), S Jonathan McGill (16), CB Ethan Bonner (10), CB Salim Turner-Muhammad (6), S Jimmy Wyrick (6), S Jaden Slocum (4), CB Nicolas Toomer (3) and S Alaka'i Gilman (3).

THE CARDINAL BY MAJOR

- Stanford requires students to declare a major before their junior year. Among the Cardinal roster in 2022, 20 different majors are represented.
- There are five student-athletes pursuing credits towards a master's program and five others who are pursuing double majors.

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

- Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 32 states plus Canada.
- Twenty-seven student-athletes come from the state of California. After that, from largest to smallest: Texas (14), Georgia (9), New Jersey (4), Alabama (3), Canada (3), Colorado (3), Florida (3), Maryland (3), Minnesota (3), Tennessee (3), Utah (3), Hawaii (2), Idaho (2), Massachusetts (2), Missouri (2), Nevada (2), New York (2), Oregon (2), Virginia (2), Washington (2) and one each from Arizona, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma and Pennsylvania.

HONORING ANDREW LUCK

- Stanford held its Hall of Fame celebration in conjunction with its game against USC (Sept. 10). First ballot College Football Hall of Famer **Andrew Luck** was recognized with a National Football Foundation on-campus salute in between the first and second quarters.
- A native of Houston, Texas, Luck becomes the 19th Cardinal player to join the College Football Hall of Fame. Luck guided Stanford to 23 victories over his final two seasons, including appearances in the 2011 Orange Bowl and 2012 Fiesta Bowl.
- He won the 2011 Maxwell, Walter Camp and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm awards and was a two-time runner-up (2010, 2011) for the Heisman Trophy. A 2011 First Team All-American and two-time conference Offensive Player of the Year, Luck rewrote the Stanford and conference record books. In total, Luck went 31-7 as a starter, resurrecting a Stanford program that had suffered seven-straight losing seasons before he became the starter in 2009. He passed for 9,430 yards and 82 touchdowns during his Cardinal career, adding 957 yards and seven more touchdowns on the ground.
- He was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 2012 NFL Draft and played seven seasons in the NFL before retiring prior to the 2019 campaign. He set the NFL record for most passing yards by a rookie quarterback (4,374) in 2012 and was named the NFL's Comeback Player of the Year in 2018.

David Shaw enters his 12th season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football in 2022. A 1995 Stanford graduate who is the fifth alum to hold the position, Shaw is the 34th head coach in Stanford history, and the winningest coach in program history.

In his first 11 seasons, Shaw has guided Stanford to 93 wins, eight bowl games, four Pac-12 Championship Game appearances and three Rose Bowl Games. Shaw's teams have won at least 11 games four times and at least eight games eight times. He owns a career record of 93-45 (.674), including a 64-32 (.667) record in Pac-12 play. His 93 victories are tied for the 10th-most in conference history while his 64 league wins are tied for sixth-most.

Shaw has led Stanford to three Pac-12 titles and a pair of wins in The Granddaddy of Them All. In total, the Cardinal has won five bowl games under Shaw.

Shaw is the longest tenured Black head football coach in FBS history at one school and the winningest Power Five Black head football coach.

He owns a 29-23 (.558) record against AP Top-25 opponents with 17 of those victories over Top-15 foes, 11 against Top-10 teams and five over Top-5 opponents.

Shaw's Cardinal has defeated multiple Top-15 opponents in five of his 11 seasons and has defeated at least one Top-20 opponent on the road in eight of his campaigns.

Shaw has produced 42 NFL Draft picks (including six first rounders), 40 first team All-Conference recipients, 24 AP All-Americans (including nine first teamers), 13 Academic All-Americans, three National Football Foundation scholar athletes, three Pac-12 Offensive Players of the Year, two CoSIDA Academic All-Americans of the Year and numerous other National Award winners.

National Award recipients under Shaw include: Andrew Luck (2011 Walter Camp Player of the Year, Maxwell Award winner, CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, Heisman Trophy runner up); Christian McCaffrey (2015 Paul Hornung Award winner, CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, Heisman Trophy runner up); Bryce Love (2017 Doak Walker Award winner, Heisman Trophy runner up), Jordan Richards (2014 Pop Warner College Football Award winner, William V. Campbell Trophy finalist); Casey Toohill (2019 William V. Campbell Trophy finalist), Thomas Booker (2021 William V. Campbell Trophy finalist); and Isaiah Sanders (2021 Wuerffel Trophy). Three Cardinal have also been named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team under Shaw (2020 Treyjohm Butler, 2019 Connor Wedington, 2017 Harrison Phillips).

The 2017 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year, Shaw is the only four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year in conference history (dating back to 1975). He was the recipient of the award in 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017. He has been named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year three times and has been a finalist for National Coach of the Year four times.

Of the 42 NFL Draft picks under Shaw, six have been first round selections: Andrew Luck (2012, 1st Overall, Indianapolis), David DeCastro (2021, 24th Overall, Pittsburgh),

Andrus Peat (2015, 13th Overall, New Orleans), Joshua Garnett (2016, 28th Overall, San Francisco), Solomon Thomas (2017, 3rd Overall, San Francisco) and Christian McCaffrey (2017, 8th Overall, Carolina).

Multiple Cardinal have been selected in all 10 NFL Drafts since Shaw took over as head coach, with at least four selections in seven different drafts. Six Stanford players were drafted in both the 2014 and 2015 drafts, the most during Shaw's tenure.

Shaw is one of seven active coaches in the country who is the winningest head coach at his current school. He is joined by North Carolina's Mack Brown, Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald, Iowa's Kirk Ferentz, Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy, Navy's Ken Niumatalo and Utah's Kyle Whittingham.

In 2021, Shaw led the Cardinal to wins over No. 3 Oregon (31-24 in overtime) and at No. 14 USC (42-28). The Cardinal were one of only two Pac-12 schools with multiple wins over Top-15 opponents, joined by Pac-12 champion Utah.

Six Cardinal garnered All-Pac-12 recognition, led by Thomas Booker and Kyu Blu Kelly who were both named to the second team. RG Branson Bragg, QB Tanner McKee, C Drake Nugent and TE Benjamin Yurosek were all honorable mention.

McKee ushered in a new era for the Cardinal offense, starting nine of 12 games and passing for 2,327 yards and 15 touchdowns. He added four more scores on the ground, setting a new freshman record at Stanford for total touchdowns. By defeating No. 14 USC, McKee became the first Pac-12 quarterback since Tavita Pritchard in 2007 to beat a Top-15 opponent on the road in his first career start. In October, McKee became the first freshman quarterback since Bo Nix in 2019 to defeat a Top-5 team with Stanford 31-24, overtime victory over No. 3 Oregon.

Booker and S Noah Williams were named Academic All-Americans, with Booker garnering a spot on the first team for the second consecutive season. Booker was also named an NFF Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy, along with a Senior CLASS Award first teamer.

The off field success didn't stop in the classroom, as sixth-year QB Isaiah Sanders was named the recipient of the 2021 Wuerffel Trophy, college football's premier community service award.

Stanford's 2020 season was unlike any in program history, as Shaw guided the Cardinal to four straight wins to finish the season, en route to a 4-2 overall record. Playing a six-game, conference-only schedule due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, Stanford was forced to spend its final 19 days away from campus due to county restrictions.

The Cardinal began its winning streak with a one-point, Big Game win at Cal. Stanford went on to defeat Washington, Oregon State and UCLA on the road to end the year, capping off the UCLA win with a 14-point, fourth-quarter comeback and a double-overtime victory.

Shaw was named to the Uplifting Athletes' Rare Disease Champion Team in 2020. In 2018, Shaw was a bone marrow donor for his brother, Eric, who is now cancer free after battling a rare disease for over seven years.

Additionally, fifth-year CB Treyjohm Butler was a member of the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team, given to 11 FBS players who stand out both on the field and in the community.

In 2019, Stanford endured many injuries to starters and key players throughout the season. The Cardinal played 21 true freshmen, including 12 who used a year of eligibility by playing in more than four games, and eight who combined for 43 starts throughout the season. The Cardinal started three true freshmen on the offensive line for half the year, while four true freshmen started at least one game along the offensive line.

Off the field, Stanford student-athletes shined. The Cardinal had a league-best 33 named to the Pac-12 Honor Roll, which honors any student-athlete who boasts at least a 3.3 cumulative grade-point average, excluding freshmen. In addition, two Cardinal

earned recognition for arguably the biggest off-field accolades in college football. Fifth-year OLB Casey Toohill was named one of 12 finalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy and a member of the NFL Scholar-Athlete Class, while junior WR Connor Wedington was a member of the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team.

In 2018, Shaw led Stanford to its 10th straight bowl game and a win over Pitt in the 2018 Sun Bowl for their fifth bowl game victory in eight seasons under Shaw. Quarterback K.J. Costello finished with the second-most passing yards and third-most touchdowns in a season in school history, while wideout JJ Arcega-White tied a 41-year-old school record with 14 receiving touchdowns.

Stanford did most of its damage on the ground during the 2017 season, as its 5.9 rushing yards/attempt ranked first in program history, and its 2,833 rushing yards ranked fourth. Running back Bryce Love set the school's single-season (2,118) and single-game (301) rushing records while being named the 2017 Doak Walker Award winner. Love, also the Lombardi Award winner and Heisman Trophy runner-up, set Stanford's career records for yards/rush (7.76) and consecutive 100-yard rushing games (9). The unanimous All-American combined with Cameron Scarlett to form the top rushing tandem in program history.

Love was the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year and winner of the Touchdown Club of Columbus Jim Brown Award. He ranked first among Power 5 conference running backs in over a dozen categories, including FBS records for 50-yard rushes (13), consecutive games with a 30-yard rush (13) and consecutive games with a 50-yard rush (11).

Shaw was named recipient of the Dodd Trophy following the 2017 season in which he guided Stanford to a 9-5 record. It was Stanford's third all-time national coach of the year award, following Chuck Taylor (1951) and Clark Shaughnessy (1940) winning the AFCA Coach of the Year Award. The Dodd Trophy, college football's most coveted coaching award, honors the head football coach whose program embodies the award's three pillars of scholarship, leadership and integrity, while also having success on the playing field throughout the season.

In 2016, Shaw led the Cardinal to the Sun Bowl where the 25-23 win over the Tar Heels capped a 10-3 season in which the Cardinal ranked 12th in the final AP and USA Today polls. The Cardinal also won at least 10 games for the fifth time under Shaw, a mark the program only accomplished four times from 1891-2010.

Stanford ranked eighth nationally in defensive touchdowns (4), 12th in winning percentage (.769), 17th in time of possession (32:46), 22nd in team sacks (2.85), 18th in scoring defense (20.4) and 25th in team passing efficiency defense (117.8). All-America running back Christian McCaffrey ranked first in all-purpose yards per game (211.6), fourth in rushing yards (145.7) and 20th in rushing yards per carry (6.34). Conrad Ukropina ranked fifth in field goals per game (1.83). Dallas Lloyd ranked 13th in total interceptions (5) and 18th in interceptions per game (0.4). Jake Bailey ranked 24th in punting (43.5).

McCaffrey and Love combined to rush for 2,386 yards, which was a school record until the next season, while McCaffrey's 284 rushing yards at Cal was a school record at the time, as well.

Stanford had two top-10 NFL Draft picks for only the fifth time, following the 2016 season. Solomon Thomas was the third overall pick by the San Francisco 49ers, and was the highest drafted defensive player in program history. Thomas also won the Pac-12's Morris Trophy, given to the league's top lineman. McCaffrey, the CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, was selected by the Carolina Panthers with the eighth overall pick. He was Stanford's highest running back draft pick since 1982.

Following the 2015 season, Stanford became the only school ever ranked in the top four by U.S. News and World Report (4th) and the Associated Press (3rd) in the same year.

Stanford was 12-2 overall and 8-1 in Pac-12 play in 2015, going on to win the Pac-12 and Rose Bowl crowns. The Cardinal topped five ranked opponents, including Top-10 foes in No. 6 USC, No. 4 Notre Dame and No. 6 Iowa. Stanford was one of four teams in 2015 to record five or more wins over AP Top-25 opponents and one of four teams with three or more wins over AP Top-10 foes.

McCaffrey was named AP Player of the Year and won the Paul Hornung Award and Johnny "Jet" Rodgers Award. McCaffrey, also a Heisman Trophy finalist, set the NCAA record for all-purpose yards (3,864) and earned Academic All-America honors. McCaffrey earned consensus All-America first team nods and Outland Trophy winner Joshua Garnett received unanimous All-America distinction. Blake Martinez and Austin Hooper were named All-America third teamers. Fifteen Cardinal were lauded with All-Pac-12 honors and 22 received All-Pac-12 academic distinction.

McCaffrey posted the top four FBS individual all-purpose, single-game performances in 2015 and his 461 all-purpose yards vs. USC in the Pac-12 Championship Game was fifth-most in FBS history. He owned three of the top five 100-yard receiving and rushing games by an FBS player and became the only FBS player ever with 200 rushing, 100 receiving and 100 kickoff return yards vs. USC. He earned Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year honors following the season.

Shaw was instrumental in the maturation of quarterback Kevin Hogan during his Cardinal career. Hogan appeared in more than 50 contests and posted a school-record 36-10 mark as a starter. He ranked first in career total offense (10,634), second in completion percentage (.659) and passing efficiency (154.6), and third in passing yards (9,385) and passing touchdowns (75). His 171.0 passing efficiency clip in 2015 was the best single-season mark ever by a Cardinal signal caller. Hogan also set school records for career rushing yards (1,249) and touchdowns (15) by a quarterback.

Stanford's West Coast offense led the nation with 13 consecutive games scoring at least 30 points. The Cardinal amassed a school-record 3,131 rushing yards on 610 attempts

in 2015, the most ever by a Cardinal program. The offensive unit's 529 points ranked second-most in a season and its 33 rushing touchdowns, 223.7 rushing yards/game, 30 passing touchdowns, 37.8 points/game and 6,097 total yards of offense ranked third.

Stanford won eight games in 2014 and closed the season on a three-game winning streak, including a victory in the Foster Farms Bowl. The Cardinal scored at least 30 points in seven of 13 games.

While facing six nationally ranked opponents that season, including four on the road, the Cardinal defensive unit helped Stanford rank second nationally in scoring defense (16.4 points/game), third in total defense (282.4 yards/game), seventh in rushing defense (104.5 yards/game) and eighth in passing defense (177.9 yards/game). The Cardinal joined Penn State and Clemson as the only three teams to finish in the top-10 nationally in all four categories. The team was also among the best nationally in getting to the quarterback, ranking sixth with 46 sacks. Stanford also led the nation in punt return average and strong safety Jordan Richards was a 2014 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy.

In 2013, Shaw led Stanford to a second straight Pac-12 title and the program's 14th trip to the Rose Bowl. Stanford became the only team to earn four consecutive BCS bowl bids during the Bowl Championship Series era.

After leading the team to a landmark regular season, Shaw received AFCA Regional Coach of the Year honors and was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year.

Stanford defeated five nationally-ranked opponents at home in 2013 while winning 11 games despite playing the fifth-toughest schedule nationally in the Sagarin ratings. Stanford was among just three schools (Alabama and Oregon) with 10 or more wins in each season from 2010-13.

The Cardinal finished the 2013 campaign ranked fifth in the BCS standings, the fourth straight Top-10 BCS ranking for the Cardinal. The team ranked sixth in the final 2012 BCS standings, following back-to-back No. 4 rankings at the end of the 2010 and 2011 seasons.

The 2013 team ranked among the nation's best in kickoff return average (1st), rushing defense (3rd), tackles for loss allowed (4th), sacks (t-7th), scoring defense (10th), kickoff coverage (10th), total defense (14th), sacks allowed (16th), red zone offense (16th), passing efficiency (17th) and red zone defense (19th).

Stanford had six players receive All-Pac-12 first-team honors with 19 all-conference selections in 2013. There were also eight different national awards that listed Stanford players as semifinalists and finalists. There were 25 players chosen to the Pac-12 All-Academic team and four were placed on the Capital One Academic All-District list, including Jordan Richards who was a second team All-America selection.

Shaw guided the Cardinal to a 12-2 record in 2012 and its first Pac-12 championship in 13 years. The campaign culminated with Stanford's first Rose Bowl victory in over 40 years, a 20-14 win over Wisconsin in 2013.

Shaw was named the 2012 Pac-12 Conference Coach of the Year, becoming the second to earn the honor outright in consecutive seasons since the award's inception in 1975. Stanford became the first school to defeat programs ranked No. 1 (Oregon) and 2 (USC) in the AP poll during the regular season and the Cardinal closed its season with five straight wins over as many ranked opponents.

Stanford's historic defensive output in 2012 broke the single-season sacks record (57) and led the Pac-12 in scoring defense (17.2), total defense (336.2), rushing defense (97.0), sacks (4.07) and tackles for loss (9.00). The Cardinal ranked first nationally in sacks, second in tackles for loss, fifth in rushing defense and 11th in scoring defense.

Stanford became the first program to win both the AFCA Academic Achievement Award and a BCS bowl game in the same season.

Stepfan Taylor, a Doak Walker Award semifinalist, set the Stanford career record with 4,300 rushing yards and Zach Ertz led Stanford pass catchers and all FBS tight ends in receiving yards (898) and total receptions (69), both school records for a tight end. Ertz was a John Mackey Award finalist and the seventh unanimous All-American in program history.

Stanford was one of five schools to have four or more players selected to the 2012 AP All-America teams, with Ertz earning the honor along with David Yankey (second team), Trent Murphy (third team) and Ed Reynolds (third team). Yankey was a consensus All-American.

In Shaw's first season as head coach in 2011, the Cardinal posted an 11-2 record and made its second consecutive BCS appearance, falling to Oklahoma State in the Fiesta Bowl. Shaw became just the ninth major college head coach in history to post 11 or more wins in his first season, and the first since Chris Peterson (13-0) of Boise State and Bret Bielema (12-1) of Wisconsin in 2006.

Shaw was named the 2011 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, becoming just the third in Stanford history to earn the award, following Bill Walsh (1977) and Tyrone Willingham (1995, 1999).

The Cardinal was ranked in the Top 10 of both major polls for all 16 weeks of the season, peaking at No. 3 in the AP poll and No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches poll on Nov. 6.

Behind 2011 Heisman Trophy runner-up Andrew Luck, Stanford averaged 43.2 points/game and established a school-record with 561 points. Stanford's 11 victories in 2011 came by an average of 27.4 points.

Stanford's 2011 defense was ranked first or second in the Pac-12 in six categories, including rushing defense (1st - 84.4), third-down conversion defense (1st - 31.1), scoring defense (2nd - 21.9), total defense (2nd - 337.6), sacks/game (2nd - 3.00) and opponent first downs (2nd - 17.5).

Luck was named Walter Camp Football Foundation National Player of the Year along with receiving the Maxwell Award as the nation's top player. He finished second in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy and was the Pac-12's Offensive Player of the Year for a second straight season.

Right guard David DeCastro was a unanimous All-America selection; left tackle Jonathan Martin landed spots on the Walter Camp and AFCA All-America squads; tight end Coby Fleener and outside linebacker Chase Thomas were named All-Americans by Sporting News.

In all, 21 players earned All-Pac-12 honors in 2011, including six first-teamers. Twelve earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors, including first-team selections Luck and Brent Etiz. Luck was also named the Capital One Academic All-American of the Year by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Shaw served as Stanford's offensive coordinator for four seasons, playing an instrumental role in the resurgence of the Cardinal program which established school scoring records in 2009 and 2010 before setting another scoring mark in his first year as head coach. During Shaw's tenure as offensive coordinator, the Cardinal scored 40 or more points in 11 games from 2007-10.

Stanford's balanced offense amassed a school-record 6,142 yards during the 2010 season, averaging 213.8 on the ground and 258.7 yards through the air. In addition, Shaw's play calling in the red zone helped Stanford convert on a national-best 88.6 percent of its scoring opportunities inside the 20-yard line.

Prior to Stanford, Shaw served as the wide receivers and passing game coordinator at the University of San Diego during the 2006 season, winning the Division I-AA Mid-Major national title and the Pioneer League championship with the nation's top offense. The Toreros led all NCAA Division I-AA teams in passing offense (293.3 yards/game), total offense (494.25) and scoring offense (42.83). Quarterback Josh Johnson was one of four offensive All-Americans on the team and led all NCAA Division I-AA quarterbacks in passing efficiency (169.0 quarterback rating), touchdown passes (34), passing yards (3,320) and total offense (336.7).

Shaw's coaching resume also includes nine years of NFL experience with the Philadelphia Eagles (1997), Oakland Raiders (1998-2001) and Baltimore Ravens (2002-05). Shaw's last coaching job in the NFL with Baltimore included a stint as the quarterbacks and wide receivers coach from 2002-04 before working solely with the wide receivers in 2005. His tenure included an AFC North title in 2003. Derrick Mason set a franchise record with 86 receptions for 1,073 yards under Shaw's tutelage in 2005. Mark Clayton set a franchise rookie record for receptions in 2005 when he caught 44 balls for 471 yards.

After three seasons of quality control with the Oakland Raiders from 1998-2000, Shaw moved into the role of quarterbacks coach in 2001 as the Raiders won a second straight AFC West title. Quarterback Rich Gannon made the Pro Bowl for the second straight season and was the game's MVP.

Shaw began his NFL coaching career as the quality control coach with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1997.

He launched his coaching career at Western Washington, where he coached outside linebackers in 1995 and the tight ends in 1996.

A four-year letterwinner at Stanford from 1991-94 as a receiver, Shaw was a member of Stanford's 1991 Aloha Bowl team coached by Dennis Green that finished the season 8-4 and was the third-highest scoring team in school history at the time. He was also on the Cardinal team that went 10-3 and won the 1993 Blockbuster Bowl under Bill Walsh. Shaw finished his Stanford career with 57 catches for 664 yards and five touchdowns.

He also competed in a varsity track meet and a varsity basketball game before graduating in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Shaw's father, Willie, had two coaching stints at Stanford (1974-76, 1989-91) during his 33-year coaching career, which also included time with the Detroit Lions, Kansas City Chiefs, Minnesota Vikings, New Orleans Saints, Oakland Raiders, San Diego Chargers and St. Louis Rams. Stanford announced in 2013 that its defensive coordinator position had been endowed by a gift from an anonymous donor, named in honor of Willie Shaw.

Shaw is Chair of the NCAA Football rules committee and is on the Board of Trustees for the AFCA. He is also on the NCAA Football Competition Committee and represents the Pac-12 on the AFCA Ethics Committee. He was previously on USA Football's Football Advisory Committee and a member of the NCAA Commission to Combat Campus Sexual Violence. In addition to his work with that commission, Shaw has been a leading advocate of the Set The Expectation program, aimed at working to end the culture of sexual assault and domestic violence among college and high school athletes. Stanford players became the first university in the country to sign the Set The Expectation student pledge, stating they would use their platforms to speak out against sexual assault and violence against women.

Born in San Diego, Shaw and his wife, Kori, are the parents of three children - Keegan, Carter and Gavin.
