CARDINAL AND HUSKIES OPEN FINAL WEEK AT HOME

Stanford and Washington meet Thursday night at Maples Pavilion as both teams battle for positioning in the Pac-12 standings with two weeks remaining in the regular season. Winners of five of its last seven against Washington, the Cardinal is looking for its second two-game sweep of the Huskies in the last four seasons. The teams played just once during the 2016 and 2017 Pac-12 regular season slate. Stanford earned a 73-64 win in Seattle on Jan. 13.

THE PAC-12 PICTURE

Stanford (8-6) and Washington (8-6) enter Thursday tied in the loss column with Utah (9-6) for fourth place in the Pac-12 standings. Arizona leads the league at 11-3, with UCLA and USC tied for second at 10-5. A win on Thursday would give Stanford the tiebreaker over Washington, should the two teams finish the regular-season tied in the conference standings. The top-four teams in the conference standings will receive a first-round bye in the Pac-12 Tournament.

STANFORD IN THE PAC-12

Stanford's eight conference wins so far are two more than its win total from all of last season's league slate. The Cardinal opened Pac-12 play with a 5-1 mark for the second time in the last 14 seasons. In January, Stanford won five consecutive conference games for the first time in 10 seasons and posted its first conference road sweep in eight seasons.

AGAINST WASHINGTON

Stanford leads the all-time series against Washington, 76-71. The Cardinal has won three straight and five of the last seven in the series, including a 76-69 win in Seattle in January. Stanford was won the last three games played between the two teams at Maples Pavilion. The current members of the Stanford roster have not lost to the Huskies at home in their careers.

THE LAST MEETING WITH THE HUSKIES

Seattle native Daejon Davis recorded his first career double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds to lead Stanford to a 73-64 victory at Washington Jan. 13. Reid Travis finished with 16 points as Stanford completed its first two-game road sweep in conference play in eight years.

NOBODY BETTER FROM THREE IN THE PAC-12 THAN PICKENS IN LAST 11 GAMES

Dorian Pickens is the only Pac-12 player with at least 31 three pointers and a three-point shooting percentage better than 46 percent in their last 11 games. The senior is shooting 47.2 percent with 34 three pointers over that span.

PICKENS 10TH ON CAREER THREE POINTERS LIST

Dorian Pickens, who missed 11 games with a foot injury, returned for the beginning of conference play. He ranks 10th in school history with 172 career threes. The forward has totaled 40 threes in the last 13 games. He is second the Pac-12 in threes per game (3.0), fourth in three-point percentage (.447) and eighth in scoring (15.9 ppg) during conference play. Despite missing nearly half the season, Pickens leads the team with 44 threes. Earlier this season, Pickens became the 46th all-time and second active member of Stanford's 1,000-point club. He enters the Washington contest with 1,066 career points in 108 career games.

TRAVIS AMONG NATION'S ELITE POST PLAYERS

Junior Reid Travis is fifth in the Pac-12 in scoring (18.8 ppg) and rebounding (7.8 rpg). Travis and Arizona's DeAndre Ayton are the lone players to rank in the top five of the conference in both scoring and rebounding. Travis ranks in the top-six in the Pac-12 in 10 categories overall. The junior matched his career-high with 29 points in wins over USC and San Francisco this season. He became the 45th member of Stanford's 1,000-point club earlier this year and enters the Washington game with 1,252 points and 662 rebounds in his 90-game career so far.

LAST TIME OUT

Daejon Davis scored 22 points before fouling out, Dorian Pickens made two free throws with 8.7 seconds remaining and Stanford overcame a second half surge to beat California 77-73 on Sunday. The Cardinal led by eight late in the second half before California rallied to make it 67-all. Stanford scored the next five points and never looked back, en route to the win. Pickens added 17 points and Reid Travis collected his ninth double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

THE CAPTAINS IMPACT

Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey were each voted to the role of the Peter Sauer Captainship, honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. The three captains account for 59.4 percent of the scoring average (44.4 out of 74.8 ppg) and 50.0 percent (19.0 out of 38.0 rpg) of the rebounding average.

WINNING THE BATTLE OF THE BOARDS

Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey have helped Stanford win the rebounding battle in 21 of 27 games this year, including 17 of the last 20 contests. The Cardinal is second in the Pac-12 in rebounding at 38.0 rpg. Only one opponent (USC's Chimezie Metu, 12 pts, 10 rebs.) has recorded a double-double against Stanford in the last 32 games, dating back to last season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

One of the top recruiting classes in school history has played a big role in its first season on The Farm. Each of the Cardinal's four freshmen have started at least one game and three - Daejon Davis, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White - started together in six games. At least two freshmen have started in 25 games and at least one freshman has started in all 27 games.

All four average at least 20 minutes per game. Davis leads the Cardinal in assists (4.8 apg), White is second on the team in three pointers (38) and da Silva leads the Cardinal in blocks (27). KZ Okpala, who made his collegiate debut 15 games ago, is averaging 8.9 ppg in 27.4 mpg.

In the win over Arizona State, Stanford's final 16 points were scored by freshmen. In the victory at Washington State, Stanford's four freshmen scored the first 23 points of the second half during the Cardinal's 21-3 run to erase its deficit en route to the road win.

DAVIS DIRECTING THE OFFENSE

Freshman Daejon Davis has started all 25 games he has played in. In his last 13 games, Davis is averaging 13.1 points, 5.5 assists and 4.8 rebounds per game. He averaged 15.0 points, 6.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds during Stanford's five-game winning streak in January.

Highlighting his play during conference action is the 50-foot heave to win the game at the buzzer against USC. The freshman registered career-highs in points (23) and assists (10) against UCLA on Jan 27. He has totaled 45 points and 17 assists in the two games against the Bruins this season. Davis has posted two double-doubles this season with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the win at Washington and the 23-point, 10-assist performance at UCLA. The freshman is coming off a 22-point, seven-rebound, five-assist performance in the win at California this past Sunday.

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the second season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

POST PRESENCE

Stanford's starting post players, Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey, have combined to average 29.2 points and 15.2 rebounds per game. The duo is second in the conference among starting post players in combined rebounding and fourth in combined scoring. Travis is fifth in the Pac-12 in scoring (18.8 ppg) and rebounding (7.8 rpg). Humphrey is seventh in the conference in rebounding (7.4 rpg) along with 10.4 ppg.

OKPALA MAKING IMPACT IN CONFERENCE PLAY

Freshman KZ Okpala made his collegiate debut 15 games ago in Stanford's nonconference finale. The forward is fifth on the team in scoring at 8.9 ppg in 27.4 minutes per contest. Okpala, who has started 13 of the 15 games he has played in, has a pair of 20-point games against Washington State (21) and Oregon (20).

DAVIS FOURTH FRESHMAN ALL-TIME TO WIN PLAYER OF WEEK

Freshman Daejon Davis, who averaged 15.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists to lead Stanford to road wins at Washington State and Washington, was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week Jan. 15. Davis was the fourth Stanford freshman to win conference Player of the Week honors in school history and the first since Jan. 29, 2007, joining Brook Lopez, Jason Collins and Howard Wright.

DAVIS' BUZZER-BEATER WAS FIRST IN 14 SEASONS

Daejon Davis' 50-foot shot to defeat USC at the buzzer Jan. 7 was the first game-winning buzzer-beater for the Cardinal in 14 seasons. On March 3, 2004, Matt Lottich hit a desperation three-pointer as time expired to give No. 1 and undefeated Stanford a 63-61 victory over Washington State at Beasley Coliseum. Davis' buzzer-beater was the first for the Cardinal at Maples Pavilion since Nick Robinson connected on a 35-foot running jumper at the buzzer to give No. 2 Stanford an 80-77 victory over No. 12 Arizona on Feb. 7, 2004.

Reid Travis, the Pac-12 Conference's leading returning scorer (17.4 ppg) and rebounder (8.9 rpg), entered the year with several preseason accolades.

MOST POWER FIVE OPPONENTS IN FIVE YEARS

Stanford's challenging nonconference schedule included four opponents from power five conferences. The Cardinal played North Carolina (ACC), Florida (SEC), Ohio State (Big Ten) and Kansas (Big 12), with all but the UNC contest taking place away from Maples Pavilion. It's the most power five conference opponents in five years, since the Cardinal faced Missouri (SEC), Minnesota (Big Ten), NC State (ACC) and Northwestern (Big Ten) during its 2012 slate. Stanford went 1-3 in those games, defeating Northwestern (70-68) on the road.

WIN NO. 100 FOR HAASE

The Dec. 17 victory over San Francisco was head coach Jerod Haase's 100th career coaching victory. He is in his sixth season as a head coach and second with Stanford, following four successful seasons at UAB. He is 28-30 in his second season as head coach of the Cardinal.

WHITE POSTS BEST DEBUT MARK SINCE 1977

Freshman Isaac White's 17-point performance against Cal Poly in the season opener on Nov. 10 was the second-most points by a true freshman in his collegiate debut in the 103-year history of the program. White ranks sixth on the team in scoring at 6.8 ppg.

PETER SAUER CAPTAINSHIP

Jerod Haase announced the establishment of the Peter Sauer Captainship this season, naming Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey captains. The three wear patches on their uniforms honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. Stanford will celebrate the 20-year anniversary of the 1998 Final Four team Feb. 24 vs. Washington State.

THE FOURTH-YEAR CLASS

The four members of Stanford's fourth-year class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - accounted for 62.6 percent of the team's scoring and 55.4 percent of the team's rebounding last season. Pickens and Humphrey are true seniors, while Travis and Cartwright have each had their medical hardship waivers granted and are redshirt juniors with another year of eligibility remaining after this season. Cartwright missed the entire 2015-16 season with a compound fracture of his right forearm sustained in preseason practice on Nov. 2, 2015. Travis was forced to miss the final 22 games of the 2015-16 season with a right leg injury.

TOP-TIER RECRUITING CLASS

After signing a consensus top-25 national recruiting class last season, the Cardinal once again inked one of the nation's top classes for 2018. On Nov. 8, Stanford announced the signing of 6-5 guard Cormac Ryan from New York, New York, and 7-0 forward Keenan Fitzmorris of Overland Park, Kansas. Fitzmorris is the younger brother of Stanford women's volleyball All-American Audriana Fitzmorris.

SEEING DOUBLE

Stanford individuals have totaled 17 double-doubles in 27 games, with nine from Reid Travis, four Michael Humphrey, two from Daejon Davis and one each from Dorian Pickens and Oscar da Silva.

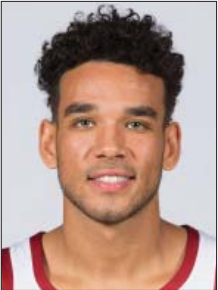

After being introduced as the Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016, Jerod Haase developed a strong relationship with his program and instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude among his student-athletes.

In his first year at the helm of the Cardinal program, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Redshirt sophomore Reid Travis earned First Team All-Pac-12 and NABC All-District honors, developing into one of the top players in the conference on both ends of the court. His program finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs nationally in the classroom as well.

Haase and his staff signed a top-tier recruiting class that is rated as high as No. 10 nationally in the 2017 rankings, welcoming the four-member class to The Farm for the 2017-18 season.

Haase arrived on The Farm prior to the 2016-17 season after completing his fourth season as the head coach at UAB, where he led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (11), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
