SERIES HISTORY

All-time vs. Washington

- Overall Record: 53-29 (.646)
- Last season: L, 4-3; W, 8-7 (12); L, 4-0
- Stanford led 3-1 in the sixth inning of the opener last year, but lost on a walk off. The next day, the Cardinal scored two in the ninth to tie the game, and then won it with an Alex Dunlap solo homer in the 12th before being shut out on Sunday.
- Stanford had won three straight series over Washington until the Huskies took the last three. Washington won two of three games in Seattle in 2014, swept the series at Sunken in 2015, and won two at Husky Ballpark last season.
- Until that 2015 sweep, Stanford had won every series at Sunken since 1997.

Current Cardinal Against Washington

- Quinn Brodey holds a .438 career average and four of his seven hits have gone for extra bases (two doubles, triple, HR) in five career games against the Huskies (also has 6 RBI).
- Kris Bubic allowed three runs in 2.1 innings in his start against Washington last year.
- Andrew Summerville has a 1.59 ERA in two relief appearances and 6.0 innings vs. UW.
- Chris Castellanos has a 6.00 ERA in two appearances (one start) and 6.0 innings against the Huskies. He allowed three earned in 5.1 innings of a no decision last season.

LAST WEEKEND

- ▶ Stanford won its fourth straight series and improved to 4-0 in Pac-12 road series this year.
- ▶ Stanford also completed an undefeated midweek season (10-0).
- ▶ On Saturday, sophomore Nico Hoerner celebrated his 20th birthday with a game-winning single in the 10th inning, and Stanford topped rival Cal, 6-5, at Evans Diamond.
- ▶ In the middle game, junior southpaw Andrew Summerville pitched 8.2 innings and Stanford overcame an early 3-0 deficit to win 8-5.
- ▶ In the finale on Monday, Maverick Handley's career-high three hits helped Stanford erase another 3-0 deficit, but Cal took a 5-3 lead and held on in the late innings.
- ▶ In Stanford's final midweek game of the year on Wednesday, junior Jesse Kuet's four hits and career-high four RBI led No. 9 Stanford to a 15-9 win at Santa Clara. Hoerner, Handley, Duke Kinamon and Quinn Brodey each knocked in two runs, and every Stanford starter scored a run.

UP NEXT

- ▶ Head Coach Mark Marquess' final regular season series will be a three-game set at Washington State, Thursday-Saturday. All three games can be seen on the Pac-12 Network.
- ▶ Hosts for the NCAA Regionals will be unveiled on Sunday, May 28, and the postseason field will be announced on Monday, May 29. Stanford last played in a Regional in 2014 (won Bloomington, lost Super Regional at Vanderbilt), and last hosted a Regional in 2012.

CARDINAL NOTES

Big Milestone

Only five NCAA coaches have reached 1,600 career wins, only four have been Division I coaches, and only three have done it at one school. Coach Marquess is a member of each of those exclusive clubs after an 8-4 win over arch rival Cal at Sunken Diamond on April 4.

Moving Up

Junior reliever Colton Hock set the school record with his 14th save of the season on May 9 against San Francisco. He surpassed the record of 13 set 30 seasons ago by Steve Chitren and matched by Jeff Burksch in 2000.

Hock's 23 career saves ranks second at Stanford behind Chitren's 26 from 1986-89, and is tied for 10th all-time in Pac-12 history.

Chitren, who recorded the final out of both of Stanford's national championships (1987 and 1988), congratulated Hock after his record was broken.

Stanford Streaks

- Stanford has won 15 of its last 17 games and is 10-2 in its last 12 Pac-12 games. Stanford's 11-game win streak from April 18-May 6 was the the program's best since 1999. In that span, Stanford also won eight straight conference games for the first time since 1999.
- Stanford swept back-to-back Pac-12 opponents (at Oregon, vs. #13 Arizona) for the first time since 2012 (WSU and Utah).
- Freshman Daniel Bakst owns Stanford's longest hitting streak this year at 11 games (March 12-April 6). He has a hit in 28 of his last 34 games.
- Matt Winaker has reached base in 19 straight games, a career high and the longest of streak for Stanford since Alex Blandino reached in 31 straight games in 2014.
- Brandon Wulff and Maverick Handley have reached base in 8 straight (career highs).
- Winaker has played in 116 straight games. The last time he did not enter Coach Marquess' lineup was April 28, 2015 vs. SJSU).
- Junior Quinn Brodey has started 112 consecutive games for the Cardinal — last time he was not in starting lineup was May 5, 2015 vs. Santa Clara.

Stanford Stats

- A lefty has started 39 straight games for Stanford and all but two this year (senior righty Brett Hanewich started Feb. 18 and Feb. 28). Stanford has used just five starting pitchers this season (Miller, Castellanos, Bubic, Summerville, Hanewich).
- Stanford is 34-8 this year when scoring at least one run (0-6 when scoring 0 or less).
- Stanford is 32-5 (.865) this season when scoring more than three runs.
- The Cardinal is 46-5 (.902) when out-hitting its opponent since 2016.
- Stanford, which led the nation with a school record fielding percentage of .983 last season, is 22-1 when not committing an error this year.
- April was Stanford's winningest month (13-5) since 15 wins in May of 2003.
- Stanford has clinched its 37th 30-win season and 39th winning season under Coach Marquess (41 yrs), and matched last season's win total with 10 games remaining.

Closing the Door

- Stanford is 25-0 this year when leading after six innings and 31-0 when tied or leading after seven innings.
- The Cardinal is 22-4 (.846) this season when scoring first, and is 8-2 in one-run games.

Stanford Student Standouts

- Junior Matt Winaker and Andrew Summerville each earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors on Thursday. Winaker owns a 3.65 GPA in management science and engineering, while Summerville is completing his undergrad degree in three years and starting his master's degree while maintaining a 3.87 GPA.

▶ Stanford was one of three teams with three players on the Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list (TCU, Florida)—junior Colton Hock, junior Quinn Brodey and sophomore Tristan Beck.

#FinalSeas9n 🏠

▶ Shortly after the 2016 season, head coach Mark Marquess announced that 2017 would be his final season.

- » Became fourth Division I head coach (fifth ever) to win 1,600 games (4/4/17 vs. Cal).
- » Coached 2,500th game at Cal on Sunday—fifth ever to sign that many lineup cards.
- » Most wins in Pac-12 history, fourth-most wins in Division I history.
- » Two national championships (1987, 1988), 29 NCAA Tournament berths and 14 CWS.
- » Stanford has finished .500 or better in 39 of his 41 seasons.
- » Nine-time conference Coach of the Year, three-time national Coach of the Year.
- » Six 50-win campaigns, 20 years with 40 wins and 37 campaigns with 30 wins.

▶ Other “9” Notables

- » All his student-athletes get at least one quarter ahead academically by their junior year.
- » Handwrites all his practice schedules.
- » Carries his signature briefcase to the dugout for each game.
- » Baseball student-athletes are responsible for Sunken Diamond groundskeeping.
