



Stanford Post-Game Notes vs. SAN JOSE STATE, SEPTEMBER 3, 2011

- Andrew Luck's rushing touchdown in the first (0:57) was his sixth career rushing touchdown of his career. His 13-yard pass to Zach Ertz (14:55) and two-yard pass to Ryan Hewitt (2:25), both in the second quarter, were the 46th and 47th of his career, moving him into sole possession of fourth place. He found seven different receivers on the day. With 171 passing yards he now has 6,084 yards in his career, passing Guy Benjamin for sixth all-time. **NEXT UP ON THE TD CHARTS:** No. 3 Jim Plunkett had 52 TD passes from 1968 to 1970.
- It was David Shaw's first career win as a head coach.
- The nine consecutive wins is the longest since 1951 when the team started off 9-0. It is the fourth-longest streak in school-history.
- There were seven first-time starters on offense and defense (Yankey, Schwartzstein, Fleming, Hewitt, Stephens, Gardner, Murphy). That does not include kicker Jordan Williamson or long snapper Andrew Fowler.
- The 57 points in the season opener are the most since 1969 when Stanford scored 63 versus San Jose State. The three points allowed is the least points allowed in a season-opener since SJSU in 2004.
- The first career field goal for Jordan Williamson was at 8:51 in the first quarter, a 23-yarder to make it 3-0. He nailed another at 37 yards in the second quarter to make it 20-0 (9:48). Over the last four seasons Stanford kickers are a combined **49-for-60 in field goal tries**.
- Chase Thomas had 1.0 sack on Saturday and now has 15.5 career sacks in 27 career games.
- Stanford led 27-3 at the half after outscoring opponents 301-90 in the first half in 2010.
- The 59-yard kickoff return for Chris Owusu to start the second half, was the seventh KOR for 50 yards or more in the Southern California native's career.
- The safety in the third quarter was the first since Oregon in 2008.
- The 46-yard punt return by Drew Terrell was a career-best in the second quarter (11:12). Previous best was 40 yards in 2010 in Tempe.
- Stanford is now 9-3 in last 12 season openers and 18-2 in its last 20 games dating back to 2007. It was the Cardinal's seventh consecutive home win and ninth overall win. Stanford is now 26-13 over last three-plus seasons.
- It was the 11th time in last 27 games dating back to 2009 that Stanford had scored 40 or more points.
