NOTABLES

- This is the 98th season of Northeastern men's basketball
- Northeastern has an all-time record of 1,186-1,091 (.521) in 2,277 games
- The Huskies are 376-253 (.598) all-time in conference play including a 118-83 (.587) record since joining the CAA in the 2005-06 season
- Northeastern amassed 12 regular season conference championships and eight tournament titles including a 2015 CAA title which sent NU to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 24 years
- Bill Coen is in his 12th season as the leader of the Huskies and since Coen has taken the reigns, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage amongst current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play with a 119-96 all-time mark
- Northeastern and Stanford meet on Friday night for the first time in program history
- The Huskies enter the game with an 0-3 record all-time against current Pac-12 teams
- The Huskies have a doozy of a road trip ahead of them beginning with Friday's game against Stanford and concluding at Ohio State Sunday
- Northeastern also enters the game with a +20 scoring margin, which ranks just second in the CAA (Towson, +20.5) (*more on page 2*)
- One of the members of the team that helps Northeastern to that margin was freshman Tomas Murphy who was recently named CAA Rookie of the Week (*more on page 2*)
- The Huskies return seven letterwinners, including a pair of Preseason All-CAA honorable mention honorees in Devon Begley and Jeremy Miller
- Northeastern lost three seniors, Jimmy Marshall, Alex Murphy & CAA Player of the Year T.J. Williams, two of which are playing professionally
- Williams is a member of the Greensboro Swarm, a Charlotte Hornet's affiliate in the G League, while Murphy is overseas in Finland
- The Huskies will have five new faces on the court this year in four freshmen, Derrick Cook, Myles Franklin, Tomas Murphy (younger brother of Alex) and Jason Strong, and Vasa Pusica, a transfer from San Diego who sat out last season

SCOUTING THE CARDINAL

- Stanford began the season off 2-0 for the fourth-straight year before falling to Eastern Washington at home Tuesday night 67-61 for their third game in five days
- The Cardinal have outscored their opponents by an average of 6.3 ppg and took wins from Cal Poly and Pacific to start the season
- All three of Stanford's games this season have come at Maples Pavilion

LEADING THE WAY

- The Cardinal are led by redshirt junior Reid Travis who is averaging 23.0 ppg through the first three games of the season for Stanford while also adding 7.7 rpg and shooting 22-42 from the field
- Senior Michael Humphrey is averaging a double-double through the first three games with 11.3 ppg and 12.7 rpg
- The Cardinal have a trio of freshmen in their starting lineup in guards Isaac White (Adelaide, Australia) and Daejon Davis (Seattle, Wash.) and forward Oscar Da Silva (Munich, Germany)

ALL-TIME SERIES

- This will be the first meeting between the two teams in program history
- The Huskies have faced three current Pac-12 opponents in the past (more below)

HUSKIES VS. THE PAC-12

- Northeastern has faced three current Pac-12 teams in program history
- However, one of those teams was not in the Pac-12 when the meeting occurred
- Friday's meeting marks the first time the Huskies will face a Pac-12 opponent not in a tournament setting
- Northeastern will look for its first win against a Pac-12 conference opponent when they face Stanford

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Following his first two games in the red and black, freshman Tomas Murphy was named Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week
- Murphy led all scorers on the weekend averaging 11.5 points per game as well as 4.0 rebounds per game as he helped the Huskies begin their season 2-0 for the fourth-straight year
- On Friday night, Murphy was a catalyst in the Huskies' opening-night victory at BU notching a game-high 15 points while pulling in six rebounds
- This also marks the fourth-straight season that the Huskies have earned conference honors following the first weekend of action
- Last year T.J. Williams was named Player of the Week while David Walker earned Co-Player of the Week honors consecutively in the two previous seasons
- The Wakefield, R.I. native became the first Husky to earn conference Rookie of the Week honors after his first weekend of action since Reggie Spencer achieved the feat Nov. 15, 2011

FROM DEEP -- NO REALLY ONLY FROM DEEP

- Through the first two games of the year, Northeastern sophomore Shawn Oceaux has taken seven shot attempts and connected on five of them
- And every single one of those attempts has come from behind the arc
- Oceaux, who attempted 93 treys in his rookie year connecting on 35 of them for a .376 3FG pct., is shooting at a .714 clip through the first two games
- The sophomore led all Husky scorers, for the first time in his career, with 12 points against Wentworth (Nov. 12) with nine of those points coming from deep
- Oceaux also completed a rare 4-point play on the day

FREQUENT FLIER MILES

- The Northeastern basketball team will add a bunch of frequent flier miles to its total this weekend when it begins play in the PK80 Invitational with a road trip that will take the team across the country and back
- The Huskies will play at Stanford on Friday, Nov. 17 at 6 p.m. EST/3 p.m. PST, will travel across the country, and will conclude at Ohio State Sunday at 3 p.m.
- The trip from Boston to Stanford to Columbus and back again will journey over 6,400 miles
- The PK80 will conclude next weekend in Nashville where the Huskies will face Utah State and Furman and add another 2,200 miles to their total
- The tournament will pit the Huskies against Pac-12, Big 10, Mountain West and Southern Conference opponents when all is said and done

...BY HOW MUCH?

- Through the first two games of the season the Huskies are outscoring their opponents by a 20-point margin, 74.0 ppg to 54.0 ppg
- The +20 margin and the Huskies' scoring defense just barely ranks second in the CAA (Towson +20.5, 51.0 ppg), however the Huskies are 2-0 on the year and the Tigers are 1-1 through two games
- In their second game of the season, Northeastern held Wentworth to just 49-points marking the first game the Huskies held an opponent to under-50 points since a 47-44 victory at Towson on Feb. 11, 2016
- The 34-point win also tied the second-largest of the Bill Coen era (79-45 win over Drexel on Jan. 9, 2008) and was the largest since a 36-point victory over Delaware last season
- The Huskies have now recorded a 30-point victory in the last three seasons

NORTHEASTERN PICKED SIXTH

- The Huskies were picked to finish sixth in the CAA in 2017-18 by the conference's coaches
- Charleston was picked to win the league while Towson was second and Elon was chosen to finish third
- NU has matched or surpassed the expectations of the preseason polls in five of the last six seasons.

PRESEASON All-CAA NODS

- Both senior Devon Begley and junior Jeremy Miller have been honored by the CAA with All-Conference honorable mention honors entering the 2017-18 season
- Begley was named to the CAA All-Defensive Team after leading the league in steals in 2016-17
- The Huskies' lone senior finished his junior campaign with 9.7 points per game, 3.3 assists per game, and 3.7 rebounds per game while making 48 steals in 2016-17
- In an injury shortened season, Miller played in 12 non-conference games before suffering an injury at Michigan State
- In his first 12 games of the year, Miller averaged 9.5 points and 5.1 rebounds while making 16 blocks while connecting 56.8 percent of his field goals

INTO THE HALL OF FAME

- The men's basketball program added another former student-athlete into the Northeastern Hall of Fame this season in 2011 graduate Chaisson Allen
- Allen finished his Northeastern career on the All-CAA First Team in his junior and senior seasons while also finding a spot on the CAA All-Rookie team in 2008
- In addition he was honored twice by the National Association of Basketball Coaches on the All-District First team in 2010 and the All-District second team after his senior season
- A three-time CAA All-Defensive team honoree, Allen finished his career second on the career steals list with 232 behind Northeastern Hall of Famer Andre LaFleur
- Allen led the Huskies in dishing out assists in each of his four seasons on campus finishing his time on Huntington Ave. fourth all-time in assists (430) and (at the time) ninth in scoring (1,550)

ELITE COMPANY

- Bolden Brace joined some elite company last season when he became the 18th player in Colonial Athletic Association history to record a 40-point game
- He also became just the eighth player to achieve the feat during a conference game
- Brace's 40 points were one shy of the Huskies' school record 41 points set by Reggie Lewis (vs. Siena, Feb. 19, 1986) and then by J.J. Barea (vs. Stony Brook, March 5, 2005)

OUT WITH THE OLD....

- Following the 2016-17 season, the Huskies saw the departure of three letterwinners including the team's top-two pointgetters in CAA Player of the Year T.J. Williams and Alex Murphy
- Williams, who finished the 2016-17 season as the CAA's leading pointgetter averaged 21.4 ppg, a mark that also ranked 13th in the country, 4.7 rpg and 5.3 apg
- Along with his Player of the Year accolades, Williams would go on to earn USBWA All-District, First Team NABC All-District and AP Honorable Mention All-America honors
- Murphy was the team's second-leading point-getter averaging 14.0 ppg and a team-leading rebounder pulling down 5.8 rpg in his lone season with the Huskies
- The Huskies will also be without role player Jimmy Marshall, who saw action in 29 games last season and shot 41.1 from the field

...IN WITH THE NEW

- However, the Huskies added five new names to the squad in the offseason adding four freshmen along with a transfer in former-George Washington guard Jordan Roland
- Northeastern's freshman class is comprised of guard Derrick Cook (Langston Hughes (Ga.)), guard Myles Franklin (Villa Park (Calif.)), forward Tomas Murphy (Northfield Mount Hermon (Mass.)) and forward Jason Strong (Westminster Academy (Fla.))
- The four incoming Huskies hail from four different states and combined for four state championships and an appearance in the National title game during their high school careers
- Three of this year's incoming freshmen are coming to Northeastern fresh off of state championship titles
- Freshman Tomas Murphy is the younger brother of former Husky Alex Murphy who played for Northeastern last season

SOME OLD-BUT-NEW FACES

- The Huskies have added a pair of old, but new faces to the staff this season in Manny Adako and Danny Young
- Young joins Northeastern as the Director of Basketball Operations after serving as a manager for the Huskies from 2011-15, round out his senior year with a CAA Championship
- Adako is a former letterwinner for the Huskies and returns to his alma mater after a seven-year professional basketball career that took him to countries like Holland, Egypt, Qatar and Dubai
- He joins the Huskies as a graduate manager

HUSKIES IN THE PROS

- Since beginning his head coaching career at Northeastern in the 2005-06 season, head coach Bill Coen has helped 18 former student-athletes to professional contracts
- Two of the members of the 2017 senior class are currently playing professional basketball with T.J. Williams playing for the Greensboro Swarm, a Charlotte Hornets affiliate, in the NBA G League while Alex Murphy took his basketball career to Finland
- Three different Huskies took part in the NBA Summer League this season in Williams (Cavaliers), Quincy Ford (Hawks) and David Walker (Nuggets)
- The three Huskies represented half of the six CAA basketball alums who played in the Summer League (Jerrelle Benimon, Towson; Marcus Thornton, William & Mary; Canyon Barry, Charleston)
- Northeastern's three alums marked the second-highest total from a New England school to play in the Summer League (Providence, 4; UConn, 3)
- This season, J.J. Barea enters his 12th season in the NBA as a member of the Dallas Mavericks

THE TOURNAMENT

- Northeastern video coordinator Joel Smith kept his basketball skills polished when he took part in The Basketball Tournament this summer with The Citi Team from Boston
- Smith helped The Citi Team earn one of the four final spots in The Tournament by winning a pair of games in the tournament's first annual TBT Jamboree at Philadelphia University
- Smith averaged 15.5 ppg, 3.0 apg and connected on nine threes in two games to help his team upend a pair of teams including Josh Selby-led Brothers Dat Ball

IN THE RANKINGS

- The Huskies are set to face four teams that are ranked and another three teams receiving votes in the mid-major top-25 poll
- The Huskies will face No. 17 Furman and No. 7 Harvard in back-to-back games at the end of November
- Harvard is also receiving votes in the AP Top-25 and the USA Today Coaches Polls entering the season

THE COEN FILE

Bill Coen, is in his 12th season as head coach at Northeastern, continues to lead a basketball renaissance on Boston's Huntington Avenue.

Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players. In his 11 seasons at Northeastern, NU players have earned 29 All-CAA honors, including eight First Team and six All-Rookie selections. Eighteen of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and eight Huskies remain active in professional basketball. Entering the 2017-18 season, Coen had amassed 178 career wins in 11 seasons at Northeastern and ranked fourth on the CAA's list of all-time winningest coaches with 119 wins in conference regular season and tournament play. He is one of just two current CAA coaches to have cracked the top 10.

Coen's teams have proven that they are contenders in the CAA. The Huskies have finished .500 or better in eight of Coen's 11 seasons at the helm. Northeastern also has appeared in the CAA Tournament quarterfinals in all 11 seasons under Coen, advanced to the semifinals five times, and to the title game in 2012-13 before winning it all in 2014-15. Since Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program 11 seasons ago, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage amongst current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play.

In 2016-17, Coen helped coach guard T.J. Williams to be named an honorable mention All-American, just the second Husky in program history to be honored as an All-American (J.J. Barea, 2006 honorable mention) and the first during Coen's tenure. Williams was also named CAA Player of the Year, NABC First Team All-Region, USBWA All-District, All-CAA first team and finished the season ranked 13th in the nation in scoring with 21.4 points per game. The Huskies finished the season 15-16 and made an appearance in the CAA Quarterfinals.

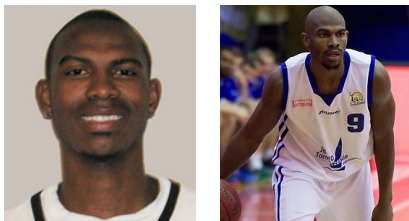
BENNET DAVIS

Lee's name appears throughout the NU record books finishing his career second all-time in career 3-point pct. (.404), fifth in career free throw pct. (.798), and 21st in career scoring (1,161). Lee holds the record for the all-time best single-season 3FG pct. performance (.472) and had the seventh-best single-season performance at the free throw line (.846). Lee also is tied for the single-game record for free throws made (18).



DINKO MARSHAVELSKI 2010-11, 13 • Bulgaria (retired)

Marshavelski played in 27 games in his final season at Northeastern. A proven scoring talent, he battled back from an ACL injury suffered before his final season.



JOEL SMITH 2010-13 • Mexico (retired)

The shooting guard averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game as a senior and helped lead the Huskies to the CAA regular-season title. Smith was one of the best pure shooters in Northeastern history, and holds the single-season record for 3-pointers made (83). He ranks second in career 3-point field goals made, third in career 3-point percentage, and 13th in career scoring.



ZACH STAHL 2012-16 • Finland

The 36th Northeastern player to cross the 1,000-point mark, Stahl did so in the most prolific way, on Senior Night. Noted as a "Swiss Army knife-like player" by head coach Bill Coen, Stahl finished his career playing in 128 games (T-3rd), while notching career field goal percentage of 50.4. Stahl pulled down 606 rebounds, dished out 197 assists, blocked 46 shots and finished with 86 steals in his Northeastern career.



ALEX MURPHY 2017 • Finland

In one season with the Huskies, Alex Murphy left his mark on the program. The Duke and Florida transfer led the team with 168 rebounds, while also adding his name to the record books with a big 3-point shooting day against William & Mary.



EUGENE SPATES 2007-09 • Qatar

Spates' names also appears in the NU record books. Most notably, he finished his career ranked 10th in career 3-pointers made (140) playing in two career postseason games with the Huskies in his final season on Huntington Ave. Spates, alongside Adako, helped Al Gharafa to win the Qatar Cup in 2014. Spates finished with 29 points in the final, sinking 22 3-pointers during the tournament.



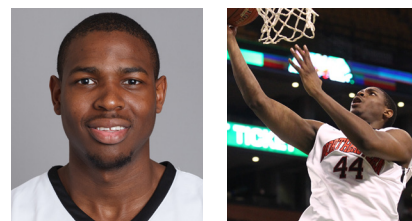
DAVID WALKER 2012-16 • Andorra

One of the most prolific 3-point shooters in NU history, Walker finished with his name all over the record book. He topped the charts with 97 3FG in 2015-16 (1st), finishing his career with 250 3FGs (2nd). The 10th ever Husky to cross the 1,500-point plateau finishing with 1,631 (8th). A two-time CAA All-Conference and All-Rookie team honoree, Walker was named NABC All-District first team his senior season and was named MVP of the Reese's All-Star Game.



NKEM OJOUGBOH 2008-10 • NBA D-League (retired)

Ojougboh finished his career with 849 points to rank 48th all time at Northeastern. He was better known for his rebounding prowess, leading the Huskies in rebounding in 2007-08, at 6.4 per game, and again in 2009-10, at 7.2 per game. He earned CAA All-Academic honors in back-to-back seasons.



REGGIE SPENCER 2011-15 • Italy (retired)

Over the course of his Northeastern career, Spencer took part in 125 games, starting 82 of them. He tallied 992 career points, 36th all-time on the Northeastern scoring leaders list and took down 648 rebounds over the course of his career, finishing as the Huskies rebound leader during his freshman and sophomore campaigns. His 77 career blocks rank 10th all-time on the career blocks list.



T.J. WILLIAMS 2013-17 • NBA G League

Williams' senior season was one for the record books as the 2017 CAA Player of the year led the CAA and ranked 13th nationally with 21.4 ppg, the seventh best mark in school history while his 1,377 career points are 15th most in school history. Northeastern's second ever AP All-American, Williams set the school record in 2016-17 with 202 made FTs while his 403 career assists ranks sixth all-time.

BOSTON - In his first game as a Husky, Tomas Murphy helped Northeastern to a 65-59 victory over BU in the season opener at Case Gym.

The rookie had a game-high 15 points and six rebounds in his NU debut going 6-for-12 from the field with a pair of highlight reel dunks in the win. Three different Huskies tallied double-digit scoring on the night, led by Murphy, as Devon Begley and Anthony Green each added 10 points to the total. Begley added six assists while Green went 4-of-5 from the field.

BU was led by Cheddi Mosely who had 12 points, including a three with time expiring in the second half, while Max Mahoney added 11 points and five rebs and Cedric Hankerson had 10 points.

The Huskies improved to 7-1 in the last eight season openers against the Terriers and took the lead, 74-73, in the 147th meeting between these two teams. Northeastern has now won seven of the last nine meetings with BU.

Bill Coen, in his 12th season as the leader of the Huskies, improved to 3-0 all-time at BU in season opening games.

The Huskies were paced by sophomore Shawn Occeus who tallied 12 points on the day on 3-of-4 shooting from behind the arc. Three other Huskies tallied double-digit scoring with Donnell Gresham finishing with 11 points, seven rebounds and two assists while Bolden Brace and Devon Begley added 10 points each. 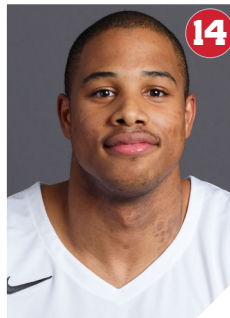
