

**Stanford 24, Arizona 23**  
**Stanford (4-3, 3-1 Pac-10), Arizona (4-2, 2-1 Pac-10)**

**Notes**

- Arizona owns a 13-11 lead in the all-time series. However, Stanford has now won five of the last six games overall.
- Stanford has opened the year 3-0 at home for the first time since 2003, when the Cardinal began the season with victories over San Jose State, UCLA and Arizona State. Dating back to last season's 20-13 win over California in the regular season finale, Stanford has now won four in a row to match the team's longest winning streak since 2001-02.
- The last time Stanford notched a one-point victory at home was Nov. 22, 1997, when the Cardinal edged California 21-20 in the final game of the regular season.
- Stanford rolled up a season-best 286 yards on the ground, the most since producing 276 yards against San Jose State on Sept. 15, 2007.
- Toby Gerhart (116 yards) and Anthony Kimble (110 yards) led an impressive Stanford rushing attack. The last time two Cardinal players rushed for at least 100 yards in a game came back on Nov. 10, 2001 against Arizona, when Brian Allen rushed for 143 yards and Kenneth Tolon chalked up 100 yards on the ground.
- After converting on four of five red zone opportunities this afternoon, Stanford is now 19-21 for the year on scoring chances inside the 20 for a percentage of 90.4.
- The Cardinal has outscored its opponent after halftime in four games this year.
- Arizona was limited to just 77 yards rushing on 23 carries.
- Stanford racked up 438 yards of total offense on 72 plays compared to Arizona's 336 yards on 57 plays.
- Stanford owned the advantage in time of possession for the second game this year, holding the ball for 34:35 compared to Arizona's 25:25.
- Anthony Kimble's 1-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 17-17 was his third score of the year. Two plays earlier, Kimble set up the scored with a 70-yard run, representing Stanford's second-longest play from scrimmage this year. Kimble's 83-yard scamper against Washington stands as the benchmark.
- Toby Gerhart finished with 116 yards on 24 carries for his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game. Gerhart now has four 100-yard games on the year and five in his career.
- Tavita Pritchard's 3-yard touchdown strike to Doug Baldwin late in the first quarter signaled just the second time this year in five games that Stanford has scored in the opening stanza. The Cardinal had been held scoreless during the first quarter in its first two games this year.
- Jason Forcier entered the contest at the start of the third quarter, making his first appearance since Sept. 6 at Arizona State. Forcier completed two of six pass attempts for 18 yards.
- Alex Loukas served as Stanford's signal-caller for the team's final two drives of the game. Loukas completed his only pass attempt for 21 yards, but also gained 39 yards on the ground on five carries.
- Josh Catron and Chris Owusu both caught their first career passes in the first quarter. Fourteen different players have totaled at least one reception this year for the Cardinal. Last year, 15 different players caught at least one pass.
- David Green's 70-yard punt in the third quarter matches the sixth-longest punt in school history.
