WHAT'S NEXT: No. 3 Stanford and No. 2 USC are set to clash Friday in a top-three NCAA men's water polo showdown at the Uytengsu Aquatics Center in Los Angeles. The highly-anticipated match will serve as the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Opener for both teams.

HOW TO FOLLOW: Friday's match will air live on the Pac-12 Networks. Jason Knapp (play-by-play) and USA Women's Water Polo Head Coach Adam Krikorian (analyst) will have the call on Friday. Fans can also access live stats throughout the match - http://www.thefosh.net/livestats.php?gameid=3272.

WEEKEND SWEEP AT BRUNO CLASSIC: Stanford comes into Friday's match 4-0 after the Cardinal outscored its four opponents, 85-11, last weekend in the Bruno Classic in Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Stanford downed No. 10 Harvard (21-5), MIT (24-1), St. Francis Brooklyn (21-5) and No. 15 Brown (19-0) during its trip to the Northeast.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Junior Blake Parrish led the way offensively, totaling 13 goals. Freshman Ben Hallock was named the MPSF Newcomer of the Week on Monday after recording 11 goals in his first collegiate action this past weekend. Sophomore Bennett Williams (11) and senior Jackson Kimbell (10) round out the Cardinal's double-digit scorers so far on the year.

HALLOCK HONORED: Freshman Ben Hallock was named the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Player of the Week on Monday. The Cardinal freshman totaled 11 goals in four games at the Bruno Classic to lead Stanford to a sweep of No. 10 Harvard, No. 15 Brown, No. 19 St. Francis Brooklyn and MIT.

Hallock made his collegiate debut in Stanford's season opener against Harvard, scoring three goals. He tied with fellow Cardinal Reid Chase for the most goals in the match. The freshman followed the Harvard match with four scores against MIT later in the day. He added two more goals each in wins over Brown and St. Francis Brooklyn on Sunday. Hallock, who redshirted last season after playing for USA Water Polo in the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janiero, posted the second-most goals on the Stanford roster over the four games. Junior Blake Parrish registered 13 goals in the Bruno Classic.

DEFENSIVELY: Senior Drew Holland and sophomore Andrew Chun split time in the cage for the Cardinal over the four matches last weekend, anchoring a strong defensive performance. With 743 career saves, Holland needs one more stop to tie Chris Aguilera (1994-98) as Stanford's all-time saves leader.

Jonathan BARNEA – bar-NAY-uh Sam PFEIL - File Marco STANCHI - stahn-key **STRONG START:** The Cardinal has out-scored its opponents 54-5 over the first half in the first four matches of the season. In the first quarter alone, Stanford has out-scored its opponents 29-2.

A LOOK AT THE POLLS: The Cardinal check in at No. 3 in the second Collegiate Water Polo Association national poll released on Sept. 6. Stanford has been in the top five of the national poll every week over the past two seasons.

VETERAN GROUP: Stanford's veteran group features eight seniors on the 2017 roster, including Drew Holland, Jackson Kimbell, Connor Stapleton, Cody Smith, Justin Roberto, Reid Chase, Sam Pfeil and Oliver Lewis. Holland, Kimbell, Stapleton and Chase redshirted last season.

ALL-AMERICAN QUINTET: Among Stanford's 18 returning letterwinners is a group of five individuals who have earned All-America honors in their career in goalie Drew Holland, utility man Jackson Kimbell, and drivers Connor Stapleton, Blake Parrish and Cody Smith.

SMITH SCORING: Senior Cody Smith has posted nine goals in Stanford's first four games and leads the Cardinal's active roster in career goals with 113. Smith is one of five members of the Cardinal - Blake Parrish, Ben Hallock, Bennett Williams, Jackson Kimbell are others - to record multiple goals in all four games.

FRESHMAN PRODUCTION: The freshman trio of Ben Hallock, Tyler Abramson and Sawyer Rhodes have accounted for 20 of Stanford's 85 goals in the first four games. Hallock is a redshirt freshman after sitting out last season following his participation in the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janiero. Abramson and Rhodes are true freshman.

OLYMPIC TEAMMATES: Friday will be the first time Olympic teammates face each other as collegiate foes. Stanford's Ben Hallock and USC's McQuin Baron were both members of the 2016 USA Men's Water Polo Olympic team that competed in the Games in Rio de Janeiro. Hallock was one of four current and former members of the Cardinal to compete for Team USA in the Games, joining captain Tony Azevedo, Alex Bowen and Bret Bonanni.
