## SUNDAY SHOWDOWN

Stanford plays its second game of a three-game homestand to end the regular season when it hosts No. 25 Washington Sunday at 1 p.m. at Maples Pavilion. The Cardinal has won the last four meetings between the teams at Maples and three of the last four vs. the Huskies overall.

## HOME SWEET HOME

Stanford ends the regular season at home for the first time in five seasons. The Cardinal last finished its regular-season slate at home in 2014, against Utah. Since then, Stanford has concluded the regular season three times in the state of Arizona and once in Utah.

## THE FRIENDLY CONFINES

Stanford is 10-2 at home this season, outscoring its opponent by a combined 155 points (1,001-846) over the 12 games. Stanford is shooting 52.1 percent from the field in 12 games at home this season, as opposed to 41.8 percent in 16 games away from Maples Pavilion. The Cardinal averages 83.4 ppg at home, compared to 73.5 ppg away from The Farm.

## JOSH SHARMA: THE PAC-12'S MOST IMPROVED PLAYER

Senior Josh Sharma is making a strong case for the Pac-12's Most Improved Player award. In his first three seasons, the center averaged 3.0 points and 2.3 rebounds. Last season, he averaged 3.5 points and 2.3 rebounds. As a senior, Sharma is averaging 9.7 ppg and 6.5 rpg. He has 272 points this season, after combining for 268 points over his first three seasons. He ranks in the top-12 in the Pac-12 in rebounds, offensive rebounds, blocks, and field goal percentage. His 70.8 percent field goal percentage not only leads the conference, it is the highest mark in 22 seasons.

## SHARMA SINGLE-SEASON FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE LEADER

Senior Josh Sharma's 70.8% field goal percentage is the highest in a season in program history. He is currently ahead of second-place John Revelli, who shot 67.1 percent during the 1982-83 season. He leads the Pac-12 by seven percent (Oregon State's Tyler Kelley ranks second at 63.8%). Sharma would lead the nation in FG percentage, however the NCAA only ranks individuals who average 5.0 or more field goals per game. Sharma currently averages 4.1 field goals per game. Sharma's 70.8% is currently fourth-best in a season in conference history. It's the best mark in 22 years, since UCLA's Jelani McCoy set the conference single-season record at 75.6%.

In Pac-12 play, Sharma is shooting 77.9% (74-of-95). He is 33-of-39 (84.6%) from the field over his last five games, highlighted by a 10-of-11 performance vs. UCLA, 7-of-7 at ASU and 4-of-4 vs. WSU.

### SHARMA SHOOTING 84.6 PERCENT FROM THE FIELD IN THE LAST FIVE GAMES

Josh Sharma has made 33 of his last 39 field goal attempts over the last five games, shooting 84.6 percent during the span. He was a perfect 7-of-7 from the field against Arizona State, 4-of-4 from the floor against Washington State, and shot 10-of-11 from the field in the win over UCLA on Feb. 16. The center became the 10th player in program history with at least 10 field goal attempts and just one miss or zero misses with his performance against the Bruins.

### SEVENTH ON THE CAREER LIST

Sharma owns a career field goal percentage of 56.7%, which currently ranks seventh in program history. It is the highest FG% by a Stanford player since Josh Owens shot 57.2% from 2007-12.

### JOSH JAMS

Of Josh Sharma's 114 field goals this season, 52 are dunks. He has 45 dunks in the last 23 games.

### SHARMA'S LAST 12 COMPARED TO HIS FIRST 16

Over his last 12 games, Josh Sharma is averaging 12.3 ppg and 8.6 rpg, and is shooting 77.5 percent. He averaged 7.8 ppg and 4.9 rpg with a 64.2 field goal percentage in his first 16 contests.

### SENIOR AMONG SELECT COMPANY WITH MULTIPLE CONFERENCE HONORS

Josh Sharma, the Pac-12 Player of the Week Dec. 31 and Feb. 18, is the first Stanford player to be recognized with the conference's weekly award multiple times in the same season in nine years.

**KZ OKPALA AMONG PAC-12'S BEST**

Sophomore KZ Okpala, one of 10 finalists for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award, ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring (17.4 ppg) and 14th in rebounding (5.8 rpg). In conference play, the forward is fourth in scoring, averaging 18.1 ppg. Okpala scored a career-high 30 points at California.

**BREAKING DOWN OKPALA'S PERFORMANCES**

- Has increased scoring average by 7.4 ppg from last season
- 14 20-point games is second-most in Pac-12 and is 10 more than last year
- 30 points at Cal is one of 11 30-point games in conference play this year
- Stanford is 4-1 when Okpala scores 23 points or more
- Of the 23 performances of 29+ points in the Pac-12, only Okpala and Robert Franks have achieved the feat three or more times

**OKPALA'S IMPACT AS A SOPHOMORE**

KZ Okpala leads Stanford in scoring (17.4 ppg) in 33.2 mpg in 26 games this season (missed Washington State and Arizona State games with an injury). In 23 games as a freshman, he averaged 10.0 ppg in 28.5 mpg.

**COACHING FOR LITERACY**

**AGAINST WASHINGTON**

Stanford owns a 77-72 lead in the all-time series with Washington. The Cardinal has won the last four meetings at Maples Pavilion and three of the last four overall. They have split the last two, with both teams winning at home. Stanford defeated Washington, 94-78, at Maples Pavilion last season.

**CARDINAL PLAYERS AGAINST WASHINGTON**

Twelve active Stanford players have faced Washington previously. KZ Okpala has averaged 13.3 ppg in three games, and Daejon Davis has averaged 9.3 ppg and 5.3 rpg in three games against the Huskies.

**NOTABLES FROM THE 48-POINT WIN OVER WSU**

- Largest margin of victory in a conference game in 19 years. The Cardinal defeated Cal by 51 (101-50) on Feb. 19, 2000.
- Largest margin of victory overall in 11 years. The Cardinal defeated Harvard by 55 (111-56) on Nov. 9, 2007
- Handed Washington State its worst defeat of the Ernie Kent era (five seasons).
- The 15 points by WSU at the half was the fewest by a Cardinal opponent in a half since Arkansas-Pine Bluff scored 14 on Dec. 29, 2014.
- 13 different members of the Cardinal played in the game and all but two scored. Those two were starters Daejon Davis and Oscar da Silva.

**YOUNG SQUAD**

Eleven of Stanford's 15 players are in their first or second year playing. Only senior Josh Sharma and juniors Marcus Sheffield, Trevor Stanback and Rodney Herenton have more than two years of playing experience. Through 28 games, first and second-year players have accounted for 82% of Stanford's minutes (4,591 of 5,627), 80% of Stanford's scoring (1,650 of 2,063) and 77% of Stanford's rebounding (788 of 1,015).

Stanford's starting lineup in seven games has been made up of freshmen and sophomores. Freshmen and sophomores have combined for 119 out of a possible 140 starts through 28 games. The Cardinal is one of only four teams in Division I that have started all freshmen and sophomores this season, joining East Carolina, Incarnate Word and Mount St. Mary's.

**DAVIS DOES IT ALL**

Sophomore Daejon Davis is fifth in the Pac-12 in assists (4.6 apg) and sixth in steals (1.6 spg). He is third in the conference with 5.3 apg during Pac-12 action. He has posted a season-best 19 points in three games, against Kansas, Eastern Washington and San Francisco. The point guard ranks in the top-20 in program history with 274 career assists.

The sophomore has recorded at least four points, four rebounds, and four assists OR four steals in a game six times this season. Against Colorado, he recorded 16 points, six assists and four rebounds. Davis has posted at least four points, four rebounds, four assists AND four steals in two games this season against UNC Wilmington and Middle Tennessee.

**FLOOR BURNS**

During his collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the third season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE FOR DAEJON**

Daejon Davis recorded 12 points and a career-high 11 assists against UCLA at home for his third career double-double. Two of his three career double-doubles are against the Bruins. He posted a career-best 23 points and 10 assists at UCLA during his freshman season.

**DA SILVA'S LAST NINE GAMES**

Sophomore Oscar da Silva is averaging 10.9 points and 6.1 rebounds in the last nine games. He is averaging 9.6 ppg and 5.8 rpg overall.

**13 FOR NUMBER 13**

Stanford is 5-1 on the season when sophomore Oscar da Silva scores at least 13 points. He matched his career-high with 23 points (17 in the first half) to go along with nine rebounds and a career-best seven assists at Oregon State. Stanford suffered its lone defeat when da Silva met the 13-point threshold last week at Arizona State. He had 15 points against the Sun Devils.

**CORMAC CONNECTS**

Freshman Cormac Ryan has recorded at least four three-pointers in a game in seven contests (6 vs. USC, 5 vs. UCLA and Seattle, 4 vs. North Carolina, Florida, Washington State and Eastern Washington), and has multiple three-point field goals in 10 games. He scored a career-high 19 points, thanks to five three-pointers against UCLA at home.

Ryan owns 44 threes on the season, the fourth-most by a freshman in program history. His career-best six threes at USC (all in the second half) were the most threes in a game by a Stanford freshman since Chasson Randle (6) vs. Arizona State on March 7, 2012.

**WILLS ONE OF NATION'S YOUNGEST PLAYERS**

With a birthdate of October 13, 2000, Bryce Wills is the youngest player in the Pac-12 and one of the youngest in Division I. Wills is the seventh-youngest player in the nation. He has started the last 12 games, and 20 overall.

In Pac-12 play, Wills is averaging 8.3 ppg and 4.1 rpg.. In Stanford's last 11 games, he is averaging 9.6 ppg. Wills recorded a career-best 16 points at Cal. The freshman averaged 3.3 ppg and 2.6 rpg in 11 nonconference games.

**SHEFFIELD PROVIDES SPARK**

Redshirt junior Marcus Sheffield, who injured his leg in practice a couple days before the 2017-18 regular-season opener and missed the season, is averaging 5.0 ppg in 14.2 mpg off the bench in 24 games this year. He scored a season-best 16 points, shooting 4-of-5 from three-point range in the win over USC at home. Sheffield knocked down three of those threes in the final 7:27.

Sheffield has recorded 11 threes in the last seven games, after registering 12 in the first 21 contests.

**MOST BLOCKS IN THREE SEASONS**

Stanford's 10 blocks against Utah marked its highest total in a game in three seasons. The Cardinal last reached double digits in blocks in a game on Nov. 13, 2015 against Green Bay, finishing with 12. Stanford owns 126 blocks on the year, and ranks third in the Pac-12 (4.5 bpg).

**SHARMA'S FIRST PAC-12 POW AWARD COMES AFTER CAREER NIGHT**

Senior Josh Sharma was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week Dec. 31, following his career-night against Long Beach State. Sharma posted his first career double-double with a career-high 23 points and a career-best 18 rebounds. He played 28 minutes off the bench, finishing 10-of-15 from the field against Long Beach State.

**SHARMA'S PERFORMANCE AGAINST LBSU HISTORICALLY**

Josh Sharma's performance vs. Long Beach State marked just the third time in the last 22 years a Stanford player posted at least 23 points and 18 rebounds in a game. Michael Humphrey recorded 26 points and 18 rebounds against Pacific Nov. 12, 2017 and Curtis Borchardt registered 25 points and 21 rebounds against Arizona Feb. 2, 2002. Sharma's performance vs. Long Beach State is one of 19 23+ point and 18+ rebound games in the nation this season. Sharma's 12 offensive rebounds is tied for the second-most in the nation this season. He joined Washington's Jon Brockman (vs. Stanford, Jan. 8, 2009) as the only Pac-12 players with at least 12 off. rebs. in a game since the 1996-97 season.

**THE FRESHMAN FIVE**

Five true freshmen have seen action this season. Bryce Wills has started the last 12 and 20 overall. He is averaging 8.3 ppg and 4.1 rpg during conference play. Cormac Ryan has started 15 games. He is fifth on the team in scoring (8.9 ppg) with 44 three-pointers on the year. Fellow freshman Jaiden Delaire is averaging 3.9 points in 13.4 minutes with a pair of starts. Lukas Kisunas has played in 26 games, averaging 6.3 minutes per contest. Sam Beskind made his Cardinal debut in the win over Eastern Washington.

**BACK-TO-BACK TOP-20 CLASSES**

Stanford's freshman class was ranked as high as No. 20 nationally last summer, giving the program back-to-back top-20 recruiting classes. Stanford's 2017 class of Daejon Davis, KZ Okpala, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White was ranked No. 8 nationally.

**MOST STEALS IN 22 YEARS**

In the win at UNCW, Stanford recorded 15 steals, matching its best total in a game in the last 22 years. The only other time Stanford had 15 steals in that span was vs. Oregon State Jan. 5, 2006.

**FREQUENT FLYERS**

Nine of Stanford's first 14 games were played away from The Farm. The Cardinal traveled 16,787 miles during that span. Stanford has played outside the Pacific time zone in six of its 14 road games, traveling to Chapel Hill and Wilmington, North Carolina, Lawrence, Kansas and the Bahamas. Stanford spent 16 of the first 26 days of the season (Nov. 6-Dec. 2) on the road, traveling inside and outside the U.S. Stanford's 12 home games so far this season is the least amount among the 10 major conferences in Division I.

**SCHOOL-RECORD SHOOTING PCT. VS. SEATTLE**

In the win over Seattle, Stanford posted a school-record 73.3 three-point field goal percentage. The Cardinal connected on 11-of-15 attempts, led by Cormac Ryan's 5-of-6 performance. The old mark was 72.7 percent (8-of-11) vs. Oregon St. Dec. 17, 1988.

**HAASE INCREASES WINS EACH SEASON**

Jerod Haase has led his teams to increased win totals in each of his first six full seasons as a head coach. In his first season as a head coach in 2012-13, Haase guided UAB to 16 wins, eventually posting 26 wins and a second consecutive postseason berth in his final year with the Blazers in 2015-16. After Stanford earned 14 wins in his first season on The Farm in 2016-17, he led the Cardinal to 19 wins and a second-round appearance in the NIT last season.

**CARDINAL INKS TERRY FOR 2019**

Stanford signed Tyrell Terry to a National Letter of Intent. The Minneapolis, Minnesota native is a consensus four-star prospect and one of the top point guard's in the Class of 2019.

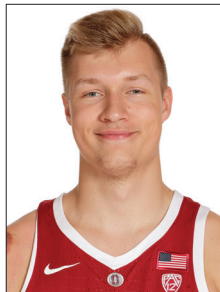

In just his first two seasons as Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball, Jerod Haase has already left a strong imprint on the program. Under his leadership, the Cardinal has instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude that has elevated Stanford to success it hasn't enjoyed in a decade.

In his second season on The Farm, Haase guided the Cardinal to a third-place finish in the Pac-12 with 11 conference wins, the program's highest finish and most league victories in 10 seasons. Competing without two starters for half the season, Stanford won 19 games overall and earned a postseason berth for the first time in three years with a second-round appearance in the National Invitation Tournament.

In two seasons with Haase and his staff, several members of the Cardinal have earned individual accolades. Forward Reid Travis has been voted a First Team All-Pac-12 selection by the league's coaches and garnered NABC All-District laurels each of the last two seasons. Forward Dorian Pickens was named an all-conference player for his performance on the court and the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for his efforts in the classroom this past season. Point guard Daejon Davis was named to the five-member Pac-12 All-Freshman Team in 2017-18.

In two full recruiting cycles, Haase and his staff have landed top-tier classes. Stanford's 2017 recruiting class was regarded as one of the best in school history. The four-member group was rated a top-10 class nationally by many, ranked as high as eighth by Rivals. The Cardinal's 2018 class is again regarded among the best in the nation. In his first year with the Cardinal in 2016-17, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules. Stanford finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs in the classroom as well.

Haase was appointed Stanford's 18th men's basketball coach on March 25, 2016. At UAB, Haase led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game. During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003. When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection. Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' 1997 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Haase earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000. Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

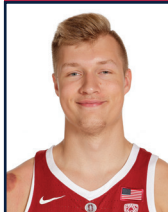
