

EWU Plays at Stanford vs. 2nd-Straight Pac-12 Foe

Eagles face tall task against Cardinal after falling by 10 at Washington

Playing its third game in five days, the Eastern Washington University men's basketball team will face a tall task Tuesday (Nov. 14) when it plays at Stanford at 8 p.m. Pacific time.

The Stanford game will be televised by the Pac-12 Networks, and all EWU games will be carried live on 700-AM ESPN and 105.3-FM in the Spokane/Cheney area, with Larry Weir calling the play-by-play. Broadcasts begin a half-hour prior to tipoff and may also be heard via <http://www.tunein.com> (search for Eastern Washington University). A mobile phone app is also available via tunein radio.

Eastern is coming off a 79-69 loss at Washington on Sunday in which UW's Noah Dickerson scored 28 points and had 22 rebounds. Prior to that, Eastern beat Walla Walla 82-61 on Nov. 10 in the debut for **Shantay Legans** as EWU's head coach.

Dickerson stands 6-foot-8, 245 pounds, and Eastern will once again have its hands full with a pair of Stanford players at that weight. Reid Travis stands 6-foot-8 and averaged 17.4 points and 8.9 rebounds per game a year ago, and Michael Humphrey stands 6-9. He averaged 9.4 points and 6.2 rebounds last season, while 6-5 guard/forward Dorian Pickens averaged 12.6 points and 3.5 boards.

"They are good," Eastern head coach Shantay Legans said. "We have to do a good job and keep them off the glass. They aren't a great 3-point shooting team, but they are a good 3-point shooting team. So we'll play the same type of defense we played (against Washington), but we'll have to set up to match their physicality. They are very, very strong team and do a great job on the glass. We have to match them -- our team will bounce back and play tough."

Reid has scored at a 24.0 clip so far this season, and Humphrey is at 13.0. Reid is at 9.0 rebounds per game, and Humphrey is averaging 13.5 with three blocked shots. "He's a beast down low -- he's even a little bigger and stronger than Dickerson was," added Legans of Reid. "So we'll have to be ready to go against him."

The Eagles are in the midst of a stretch of 36-straight days without a home game -- one of just four NCAA Division I teams with such a road stretch this year. Eastern will continue its road trip with four games -- three of them played in Las Vegas and the other at Utah -- before returning home on Nov. 25. Then there are four more games before a pair of pre-Christmas home games.

The first leg of EWU's road stretch includes 4,432 airline miles, while the other trips in the road stretch will include 6,408 miles. That's a total of 10,840 air miles, not including ground travel.

Stanford, 6-12 in the Pac-12 and 14-17 overall a year ago, is 2-0 after beating

Pacific 89-80 on Sunday (Nov. 12) and winning two days earlier by a 78-62 score against Cal Poly. The Cardinal are also playing three games in five nights, but had all of those games at home.

"We have to be playing our best basketball when it comes around to this time," added Legans. "It's a different situation when we get into Big Sky play, but right now when we play against these bigger schools we need to make sure we are doing everything at a high level. We have to have good practices and get the best out of our players. We have to go into those games with chips on our shoulders because teams like UW and Stanford are where we want to be. They are really good, and we need to be able to put our best foot forward to be able to beat those teams."

Following the Stanford game, Eastern will play at UNLV on Friday (Nov. 17) at 7 p.m. Pacific time at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas, Nevada. That game is part of the "undercard" schedule for the fourth-annual MGM Resorts Main Event, which will take place Nov. 20-22 at the T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas, Nevada.

UNLV is 1-0 heading into its game Wednesday (Nov. 15) versus Prairie View A&M. The Rebels beat Florida A&M 108-66 on Nov. 11, with 7-foot, 250-pound freshman Brandon McCoy finishing with 25 points and 18 rebounds. Jovan Mooring and Shakur Juiston added 20 and 19 points, respectively.

The Eagles are coming off a third-straight appearance in a national postseason tournament, and were 22-12 overall a year ago. Eastern finished 13-5 in the Big Sky to finish second behind regular season champion North Dakota, and then the Eagles advanced to the semifinals of the league tournament. Eastern beat Portland 76-70 in an exhibition game on Oct. 29 in Portland.

The Eagles return eight letterwinners from last year, including a trio of returning starters – **Bogdan Bliznyuk, Mason Peatling** and **Luka Vulikic**. The others are **Cody Benzel, Grant Gibb, Ty Gibson, Jesse Hunt** and **Sir Washington**, with **Jacob Davison** and **Joshua Thomas** returning as a 2016-17 redshirts. A senior, Bliznyuk was a second team All-Big Sky Conference selection a year ago, and was the league's Freshman of the Year in 2014-15.

Game Notes

With 6-foot-6 Bogdan Bliznyuk Seeing Time at Point, Eagles Feature Size

Led by Big Sky Conference Player of the Year candidate **Bogdan Bliznyuk**, the Eagles feature a team with size throughout their lineup. They were bolstered by the addition of 7-footer **Benas Griciunas**, a senior graduate transfer from UNC Charlotte.

A 6-foot-6 point-forward, Bliznyuk was named to the preseason All-Big Sky team, and is one of 10 returning players to the Eagle roster. The Eagles return eight letterwinners from last year, including a trio of returning starters -- Bliznyuk, **Mason Peatling** and **Luka Vulikic**. The others are **Cody Benzel**, **Grant Gibb**, **Ty Gibson**, **Jesse Hunt** and **Sir Washington**, with **Jacob Davison** and **Joshua Thomas** returning as a 2016-17 redshirts.

Bliznyuk is off to a great start, making 55 percent of his field goals and 87.5 percent of his free throws to average 19.0 points through two games. He also has 11 rebounds and seven assists. On Nov. 8, Bliznyuk was selected to the Lou Henson Award preseason Watch List by Collegeinsider.com. The award is presented annually to the nation's top Division I mid-major player, and the initial watch list featured 51 players from across the country.

In 105 career games (15th in school history), Bliznyuk is the 20th Eagle to join the 1,000-point club, currently ranking fifth with 1,466 points, passing 10-year NBA veteran Rodney Stuckey (1,438 points from 2006-07) in EWU's first game of the season, and then Dave Hayden (1,461 points from 1970-73) against Washington. Bliznyuk entered his senior season in 2017-18 needing just 375 points to break EWU's all-time mark of 1,803 points set by Venky Jois from 2013-16. In addition, if Bliznyuk plays 23 more games he will equal the record of 128 set by his former teammate Felix Von Hofe from 2014-17.

Bliznyuk concluded his junior season with 701 points, becoming just the fourth player in school history to hit that mark (Jake Wiley, a senior on the 2017-18 squad, ranks fifth in school history with 694). A senior, Bliznyuk was a second team All-Big Sky Conference selection a year ago, and was the league's Freshman of the Year in 2014-15. He also earned second team All-District 6 honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches. He is formerly from Lutsk, Ukraine, and graduated from Todd Beamer High School in Federal Way, Wash., in 2014.

The Eagles finished the season with five Big Sky Conference records and 14 EWU marks, most broken as the result of EWU's 130-124 triple-overtime victory over Portland State on Feb. 4. Wiley and Bliznyuk set the most intriguing record when *both* scored a school-record 45 points in that game versus the Vikings.

Eastern to Open Versus Georgia State in MGM Resorts Main Event on Nov. 20

The Eagles will play Georgia State and either Prairie View or Eastern Kentucky as part of the fourth-annual MGM Resorts Main Event on Nov. 20-22 at the T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas, Nevada.

Ole Miss, Rice, UNLV and Utah comprise the Heavyweight Bracket with Eastern Kentucky, Eastern Washington, Georgia State and Prairie View A&M competing in the Middleweight Bracket.

The Main Event tips off on Monday, Nov. 20 with Eastern Kentucky playing Prairie View A&M at 11 a.m. Pacific time, followed by Eastern Washington taking on Georgia State at 1:30 p.m. Monday evening's Heavyweight Bracket features UNLV-Rice at 7 p.m. and Utah-Ole Miss at 9:30 p.m.

Two days later on Wednesday, Nov. 22, Eastern will play in either the championship game of the middleweight bracket at 1:30 p.m., or the consolation at 1:30. The heavyweight bracket consolation game is 7 p.m. on ESPNU, and the championship game follows at 9:30 p.m. on ESPN2.

Home Games Will be Cherished in 2017 Preseason

With just three home games in the preseason, the first season at the helm will be road-heavy and a challenging one for **Shantay Legans** and his team. Eastern will play eight opponents who played in national postseason tournaments last season, including five in the non-conference portion of EWU's schedule.

Three Pac-12 Conference opponents and a stretch of 36-straight days without a game at home are the task ahead. Three other teams in NCAA Division I will also have such a streak:

- 39 – Penn (Nov. 18 vs. PSU-Brandywine; Dec. 27 vs. Delaware State)**
- 39 – Harvard (Nov. 12 vs. UMass; Dec. 21 vs. Boston University)**
- 37 – New Mexico State (Dec. 12 vs. vs. Eastern New Mexico, Jan. 18 vs. Seattle U.)**
- 36 – Eastern Washington (Nov. 10 vs. Walla Walla; Dec. 17 vs. CSU-Northridge)**

After opening the season at Reese Court on Nov. 10 against Walla Walla in the debut of Legans' head coaching career, the Eagles go on the road for 10-straight games. The Eagles play at Pac-12 foes Washington on Nov. 12 and Stanford on Nov. 14, respectively, before playing three games in Las Vegas.

Utah and South Dakota advanced to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT), Georgia State advanced to the College Insider Tournament (CIT) and San Francisco and Wyoming joined EWU in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI). The other three postseason opponents came from the Big Sky Conference – North Dakota in the NCAA Tournament and Idaho and Weber State in the CIT.

In all, Eastern will play teams from 10 different conferences, with all but two of its games versus NCAA Division I opposition. Seven opponents won at least 20 games a year ago – Georgia State, Utah, San Francisco, South Dakota, Wyoming, North Dakota and Weber State.

Graduate Transfer Griciunas Scores Team-Leading 18 in Unofficial Eagle Debut

Eastern's eight newcomers this season include Lithuanian seven-footer **Benas Griciunas**, a graduate transfer who has 59 games of NCAA Division I experience. He scored four points and had five rebounds and two blocked shots in his Eagle official Eagle debut on Nov.

10 against Walla Walla. He unofficially opened his Eastern career by scoring 18 points on 6-of-13 shooting from the field in EWU's exhibition victory over Portland on Oct. 29. He had a trio of 3-pointers and also had nine rebounds. His best scoring performance while at UNC Charlotte was 14 points and his best as a freshman at Auburn was eight. He had 12 rebounds once while playing for the 49ers.

A total of 13 Eagles played in EWU's opener versus Walla Walla, and Griucinas was one of four newcomers to see action. The others were redshirt freshman **Jacob Davison** and true freshmen **Richard Polanco** and **Jack Perry**. **Brendan Howard**, **Kim Aiken Jr.**, and **Tanner Groves** sat out the game as potential redshirts.

Veteran and Newcomer Honored on College Sports Madness Preseason All-Big Sky Squad

Senior **Bogdan Bliznyuk** and true freshman **Brendan Howard** were selected to the College Sports Madness preseason All-Big Sky Conference team announced Oct. 3. The 6-foot-6 Bliznyuk was a first team all-league pick, and the 6-6 Howard was selected as the Big Sky's Freshman of the Year by CSM.

Howard ended his career at Great Falls (Mont.) High School career with a school-record 2,083 points to become the first AA player in the state of Montana to exceed the 2,000-point mark (the previous record was 1,930). He was a two-time Gatorade Player of the Year in Montana, was a four-time All-State selection and helped the Bison advance to the state tournament in each of his four years with the school.

"Brendan understands the game and plays extremely hard," said Legans. "Once he adjusts to the next level of competition, we expect big things from him in the years to come."

He had a 3.71 grade point average in high school, and is the son of former Montana State University players Bob and Kathleen Howard. Bob was his coach at Great Falls, and played two seasons in Bozeman for MSU. Kathleen is a native of Seattle who holds school records of 1,761 points and 990 rebounds at MSU. Brendan's brother, Bobby, went on to score 1,366 points and grab 600 rebounds for MSU.

Eagles Picked as High as Sixth in Preseason Polls

Last year the Eagles exceeded expectations of the prognosticators, and this season the Eagles will seek to do the same under first year head coach **Shantay Legans**.

Eastern has been picked to finish sixth by the media and seventh by the coaches in preseason polls released Oct. 13 by the league office. A year ago, Eastern was in a tie for fifth by the media and were also picked seventh by the coaches, but went on to finish as the league runner-up in the regular season.

Idaho, Weber State and Montana hold down the top three positions in both polls for the upcoming 2017-18 season. The media picked Montana State fourth, North Dakota fifth and Eastern sixth. The coaches picked Northern Colorado and Montana State in a fourth-place tie, followed by UND and EWU.

Eastern Honored For Fourth-Straight Year by the NABC for Academics

For the fourth consecutive year, the Eastern men's basketball team was honored with the National Association of Basketball Coaches

Eagles in the Big Sky Tournament



- Eastern has made 15 Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance in 30 years as a member of the league, and has a record of 13-13 in its 26 games. The Eagles are 1-0 in the first round, 4-5 in the quarterfinals, 6-4 in the semifinals and 2-4 in the championship. Before winning the 2015 title, Eastern hadn't appeared since the 2011-12 and 2010-11 seasons, which were EWU's first since 2006. The Eagles qualified for each tournament from 1998-2006.

- Eastern won Big Sky Conference Tournament championships and appeared in the NCAA Tournament in 2015 & 2004. The Eagles have also advanced to the National Invitation Tournament in 2003 and the College Basketball Invitational in 2016 and 2017. Eastern registered the school's first NCAA Division I postseason win with a 79-72 victory over Pepperdine in the first round of the CBI in 2016.

- Former Eastern head coach **Jim Hayford** coached in nine Big Sky Conference Tournament games, with a record of 6-3 in three appearances. His 2014-15 squad won the title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament with a trio of victories in Missoula, Montana. Included was a come-from-behind 69-65 over the host Grizzlies in the championship game.

- Before beating Montana for the 2015 title, Eastern had ended its season with losses to the Grizzlies in appearances in 2012, 2006 and 2005. But the year before, in 2004, EWU won the title with a 71-59 championship game victory over Northern Arizona to advance to the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament (EWU made its first-ever NIT appearance in 2003).

- Although its streak of Big Sky tournament berths came to an end in the 2006-07 season, at the time Eastern was just the fifth school in league history to make nine-straight appearances in the Big Sky Conference Tournament. Eastern started the streak back in 1998 after making just one trip to the tourney in their first 10 seasons as a member of the conference. Interestingly, Montana's 77-69 victory over the Lumberjacks on Feb. 28, 2005, extended Eastern's streak and ended NAU's eight-season streak. Eastern's streak started in 1998 with an end-of-year victory at Montana. That "winner advance, loser eliminated" game ended Montana's 21-year streak.

- In 2011, Eastern's season came to an end with a 79-70 loss at Weber State in the quarterfinal round of the tournament. That came just three days after the Eagles stunned WSU on their home court 75-59 to end the regular season. Because of the upset, the Wildcats lost their chance at a first-round bye and had to face the Eagles again. In the rematch, WSU out-scored EWU 46-25 in the second half as the Wildcats overcame a 12-point EWU halftime lead and a 15-point deficit early in the second half. In 2013-14, the Eagles were 15-16 overall and missed the Big Sky Conference Tournament with a 10-10 league mark. Interestingly, Sacramento State was also 10-10, but secured the final bid because of a tiebreaker advantage over EWU, which dropped its final game of the season to Weber State 82-78.

(NABC) Team Academic Excellence Award announced last summer. In addition, a trio of players – including returning senior forward **Bogdan Bliznyuk** – were honored on the NABC Honors Court.

The team award was won by 209 colleges and universities for having a team cumulative grade point average of 3.0 and above for the 2016-17 season. Teams in NCAA Division I, II, III and NAIA Division I and II were eligible. Eastern and Gonzaga were the only NCAA Division I schools in the state of Washington to be honored, and were joined by Central Washington from NCAA Division II and Northwest College from the NAIA. Eastern, Idaho State and Montana were the only Big Sky Conference schools to be recognized.

Players on EWU's 2016-17 team included Academic All-America nominees **Ty Gibson** and **Jesse Hunt**, as well as their fellow Big Sky Conference All-Academic selections **Jacob Wiley** (Big Sky MVP), **Bogdan Bliznyuk** (second team All-Big Sky), **Mason Peatling**, **Mario Soto** and **Luka Vulikic**. Other members of the squad included **Julian Harrell**, **Felix Von Hofe**, **Sir Washington**, **Cody Benzel**, **Michael Wearne**, **Grant Gibb** and **Jeremy McKay**, with **Jacob Davison** and **Joshua Thomas** redshirting.

Besides Bliznyuk, former Eagles Julian Harrell and Mario Soto were selected on the Honors Court. Recipients of the award must be a varsity player, and academically a junior or senior while earning a cumulative grade point average of 3.2 or higher.

Bliznyuk is from Lutsk, Ukraine, and graduated in 2014 from Todd Beamer High School in Federal Way, Wash. He is a marketing major at Eastern, and currently has a 3.29 grade point average at EWU. A three-time member of the Big Sky All-Academic team, Bliznyuk is one of five returning players who earned that honor in the 2016-17 season. The others are Gibson, who has a near-perfect 3.99 GPA, Hunt (3.68 GPA), Peatling (3.96 GPA) and Vulikic (3.44 GPA).

Eagles Sign Standout Elijah Jackson from Chief Sealth HS in Seattle

The Eagles have signed Seattle's **Elijah Jackson** to a letter of intent to attend EWU and play for the Eagles next year, head coach **Shantay Legans** announced Nov. 9. Jackson is a 6-foot-4 guard at Chief Sealth High School in Seattle. He averaged 16.4 points, 2.4 assists, 2.2 steals and 2.9 rebounds per game as a junior to earn first team All-Metro League honors. He helped lead the Seahawks to the Metro League Playoffs in the 2016-17 season.

An exceptional jumper, he won the dunk contest at a Seattle versus Tacoma All-Star game and has also competed in track and field for Chief Sealth. He finished third in the long jump at the 2017 State 3A Championships with a personal-best leap of 22-10 3/4. He was also sixth in the

high jump with a jump of 6-2 and eighth in the triple jump with a mark of 43-8. His best in the high jump is 6-6 and his best in the triple jump is 44-5 1/4.

He's accumulated over 400 hours of service in the community as well, including working with children with severe disabilities and volunteering at the Hoops For Life basketball camps. His parents are Jennifer Bermudez and Diallo "Steven" Jackson.

Comments from Head Coach Shantay Legans . . .

On UW Loss: "Our team played hard and I'm proud of the effort they gave. When we go back and our staff looks at it, we'll figure out how we can make our players better. We feel like we let them down a little out there tonight."

On Huskies: "Washington is a very good team – they are long and athletic, and made shots when they needed to. Dickerson played huge for them, and he made free throws – our plan was to put him on the free throw a little bit. But it wasn't the plan to give him give him 28 points and 22 rebounds – those were video game numbers. A lot of our bigs were in foul trouble early and we relied on a freshman (Polanco) who played huge minutes for us. He ended up going 3-of-3 but he didn't get us any rebounds which were key at the time. He was solid, but we have to be smarter and better the next time we come out."

On Defense: "We played well defensively and our first-shot defense was good. We held down Dickerson too, but he got a lot of putbacks, offensive rebounds and hustle plays. We have to make sure we come back and we're tougher and better. We have to challenge our players and try to play without fouling – that hurt us. Our two starting post players fouled out, and our two backups were in foul trouble. We have to be smart about how we go about it. Stanford's big fella makes free throws, is athletic and he makes shots from the perimeter. So we have to be smarter and tougher, and I have to put them in a better situation."

On Turnovers & Missed Free Throws: "I told our players that if we have 10 or less, we'll win. We had 10 turnovers so I lied to them a little bit. But we left 11 points out there on the free throw line, so maybe it's a different game if we make some more. We'll get in the gym tomorrow and get some shots up, and we'll get ready to go against Stanford. It will be another great test. They enjoyed their time here in Seattle. They played with a lot of effort and that's all you can ask for from a team. They came out and got after it. Now we just have to sharpen them up a little bit and get them pointed in the right direction. That belongs to the coaching staff and we'll get them there."

On Bliznyuk: "Bogdan has been the personification of what we want our EWU program to look like. He is the perfect student-athlete and deserves all the accolades he is getting this preseason. He shows that hard work and determination pays off. We talked about it before the season started that he was going to be double-teamed and he has to make sure he's making the pass. He's making the pass and that's exactly what we're looking for. He's doing a great job of leading our players, getting them in the huddle and talking to make sure we are doing everything the right way. He's a great captain."

On Winning Opener: "Coming out of halftime we picked up our defensive effort and that was good for us. But we need to do that from the start. A positive is that we put up 35 3-pointers, but the negative is we made only 10. I know we're a better shooting team than that, and we'll get those same looks on Sunday and knock them down. I was excited about how our team played. We followed the game plan, but we just missed some open shots. Our focus was maybe looking forward to UW. It showed a little bit, but our guys played hard and that's what we are looking for."

On Vulikic Against Walla Walla: "He played with more confidence. We were playing a little bit faster, even though it didn't look like it at times. He's getting out and playing a little more free. He has to get a couple of more passes here and there, but he did a great job of running the team and that's exactly what we are looking for."

On Road Stretch: "It's going to be a great experience for our guys and will help us get ready for Big Sky play. We'll see who can play, and at what times during the game. It's a learning experience for me too, and the first game was a learning experience. Going on the road and playing seven straight, coming home and then going back on the road, will tell us a lot about our team. We'll see our character and where we are. I think we have a veteran group who knows what we are really playing for once we get into Big Sky play."

On Addition of Recruit Elijah Jackson: "We are excited to officially welcome Elijah and his family to our EWU Family. Eastern fans will love his mix of athletic and playmaking abilities around the basket. Elijah will be one of the better athletes in the conference next year. Adding a recruit from our own backyard is not only special, but critical to our program's success. Some of our greatest players at Eastern have come from in-state. We need to protect our backyard which has been a major emphasis in our recruiting plans."

On Benas Griciunas: "I've been trying to tell people – he's a great person and a great teammate. He puts in all the hard work and he's a great-shooting big guy who makes a lot of threes. He hit a couple of those early and it changed the way Portland had to guard. He was out there making threes like he was Cody Benzel or Ty Gibson. We got a really good player when he decided to play his senior season with us."

On Academic Honors: "This is just a testament that we are more than just a talented basketball team. It also shows that academics are the highest priority for our student-athletes at Eastern Washington. I am proud of our players for finishing the year strong in the classroom, and setting an example for the incoming student-athletes."

Series Notes

* Since Eastern moved to NCAA Division I in the 1983-84 season, EWU is 2-40 against the Pac-12 Conference with a current 21-game losing streak versus the Pac-12. Eastern has never played Utah, Arizona State or Stanford. Besides falling to Washington 79-69 on Nov. 12, 2017, the Eagles lost to Colorado 76-68 on Dec. 22, 2016. It had been two years since Eastern had played a current member of league, having fell at Cal 78-67 on Dec. 19, 2014.

* Coupled with an 11-55 record versus Washington State, 1-14 mark versus Washington and a 0-14 record against other current members of the Pac-12, the Eagles have a 12-83 record all-time against that league. Eastern's 62-58 win at Washington on Dec. 14, 2002, is the last time EWU beat a Pac-12 opponent, and had snapped a five-game losing streak versus that league dating back to Eastern's 83-82 overtime win versus Washington State on Dec. 22, 1997, in Kennewick, Wash. That victory over WSU was Eastern's first-ever win over a Pacific 8 or Pacific 10 Conference opponent since the inception of the conference in 1968. It was also Eastern's first win over Washington State since Dec. 1, 1952, when the Eagles pulled out a 72-71 overtime road win, which is EWU's last win in Pullman in the series. The Cougars had led the all-time series 50-10 and had won 17-straight games over the Eagles prior to that EWU victory in 1997.

Recent Game Recaps

Huskies Hold Off Effort of Eagles 79-69

Eastern's defensive effort was good enough to win, but 11 missed free throws and 40 percent shooting by the Eagles helped Washington survive for a 79-69 victory over EWU Nov. 12 at Alaska Airlines Arena in Seattle. Eastern began a monstrous 10-game road trip with a promising defensive effort, holding Washington to 41 percent shooting. The first half featured 11 lead changes and seven ties, but Washington pulled ahead late in the first half and held-off EWU in the second half. Eastern used a 9-3 run – including a pair of baskets by **Luka Vulikic** – to take its biggest lead of the game with 6:12 left in the first half. But Washington followed with a 16-4 run to take the lead for good, and then hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to lead 40-34 at halftime. The Eagles closed the margin to four on a 3-pointer by **Ty Gibson** with 9:54 to play, but Washington went on a 10-3 run and led by double digits much of the remainder of the half. The Huskies didn't score for a more than five-minute stretch in the second half, but the

Eagles couldn't capitalize. Washington missed five-straight field goals in that stretch, but the Eagles missed four shots of their own and didn't make a field goal for 5:06. **Bogdan Bliznyuk** scored 20 points to lead the Eagles, making 6-of-11 shots from the field and 6-of-7 free throws, and also had eight rebounds and three assists. Vulikic had his second-straight game scoring in double figures, finishing with 10. Gibson made three of EWU's eight 3-pointers and finished with nine points. True freshman **Richard Polanco** came off the bench to make all three of his shots and finish with eight points. Foul trouble limited him to playing just 12 minutes. Seven-foot graduate transfer **Benas Griciunas** played only 14 minutes because of foul trouble, and finished with eight points and three rebounds before fouling out.

10 rebounds. Eastern made 10-of-35 3-point shots, with **Ty Gibson** hitting three en route to 11 points. Sophomore **Luka Vulikic** had 10 points, eight rebounds and a career-high four assists. Sophomore forward **Mason Peatling** chipped in seven points and seven rebounds, and senior guard **Sir Washington** also had seven points. Eastern held the Wolves to 34 percent shooting in the game and had a 45-33 rebounding advantage. The Eagles allowed Walla Walla to make nine of its first 19 shots, but just two of its next 20 as EWU turned a deficit into a double-digit lead. The Eagles led for all but 4:51 of the game and led by as many as 25 with six minutes left in the second half. Eastern made 42.6 percent of its shots from the field, including 19-of-33 (57.6 percent) from inside the 3-point stripe. The Eagles made only 10-of-35 (28.6 percent) from 3-point range, but held the Wolves to 18-of-53 shooting in the game for 34.0 percent.

New Era Begins as Eagles Soar Past Wolves 82-61

The head coaching career for **Shantay Legans** got off to a defensive-minded start, as Eastern officially opened the 2017-18 season with an 82-61 victory over Walla Walla University Nov. 10 at Reese Court. Four Eagles scored in double figures, led by senior **Bogdan Bliznyuk** with 18 points and four assists. Junior **Jesse Hunt** had the first double-double of his career with 11 points and a career-high

Shantay Legans, a coaching veteran of eight years on the Eastern Washington University men's basketball coaching staff, was announced as EWU's new head basketball coach by athletic director Bill Chaves on Wednesday March 29, 2017.

Legans replaced Jim Hayford, who won 103 games in six seasons as head coach. Legans spent all six years on his staff and two previous seasons under former head coach Kirk Earlywine. Legans has been associate head coach under Hayford for the past three seasons.

A former player at Cal and Fresno State, Legans assisted Hayford in recruiting, scouting and game preparation for the Eagles, as well as on-the-floor coaching and the development of EWU's backcourt players. He becomes Eastern's 18th head coach in the school's 109-year basketball history, and the 10th head coach since EWU became a member of NCAA Division I in the 1983-84 season.

He has been a part of Eastern teams from the 2013-14 through 2016-17 seasons which have win totals of 15, 26, 18 and 22. The two 20-victory seasons are the top two win totals in EWU's 34-year history in NCAA Division I. The combined 81 victories in four seasons, 66 in three and 44 in two are also the most since EWU became a member of NCAA Division I in the 1983-84 season.

Eastern has had its first back-to-back national tournament postseason appearances at the Division I level with a current stretch of three-straight, including its first-ever win (79-72 over Pepperdine in the College Basketball Invitational in 2016). He helped coach Eastern to a 26-9 record overall, Big Sky Conference regular season and tournament titles and a NCAA Tournament appearance in the 2014-15 season.

Legans has coached in 10 Big Sky Conference Tournament games, with a record of 6-4 in four appearances. Eastern's 2014-15 squad won the title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament with a trio of victories in Missoula, Montana. Included was a come-from-behind 69-65 over the host Grizzlies in the championship game.

While at Eastern, Legans has helped developed a quartet of All-Big Sky Conference guards in Glen Dean, Cliff Colimon, Tyler Harvey, and Austin McBroom. Dean was the league's Freshman of the Year in 2010 and an All-BSC guard in 2011; Colimon earned first-team all-league and All-Big Sky Conference Tournament honors as a senior in 2012.

Legans helped develop Harvey from an Eastern walk-on to NBA draftee, including Harvey's transition to a starting position late in the 2012-13 season. Harvey averaged 16.5 points on 55 percent shooting from the field (including 20-of-44 3-point attempts) in EWU's last eight games that year after scoring just 17 points in the first 13 games he played.

In the 2013-14 season, Harvey was a first team All-Big Sky selection and earned second team honors on the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 6 team – EWU's first player honored on that team since Rodney Stuckey in 2007. He followed that by leading NCAA Division I in scoring (23.1) and 3-pointers (4.0) per game in the 2014-15 season, and was eventually taken in the second round of the NBA Draft by the Orlando Magic as the 51st pick overall.

Harvey also earned honorable mention All-America honors and was a first team Academic All-America selection. Harvey was also MVP of the Big Sky Conference Tournament. The year after, McBroom earned first team All-Big Sky and NABC All-District 6 honors in his lone season as an Eagle.

Legans came to Eastern in the 2009-10 season under then head coach Kirk Earlywine, and was retained by Jim Hayford when he took over as head coach in the 2011-12 season.

Prior to coming to Eastern, Legans was as an assistant coach for two seasons at Laguna Blanca High School in Santa Barbara, Calif. Previously, he was a student assistant coach for Ray Lopes at Fresno State for two seasons before embarking upon a more than three-year career playing professional basketball in Europe. Legans also has experience coaching various AAU teams in California.

He played at California for three seasons from 1999-2002, helping lead the Golden Bears to a collective record of 61-35 (.635). He then spent his senior season (2003-04) at Fresno State, which finished with a 14-15 record overall and a 10-8 mark in the Western Athletic Conference. He averaged 15.0 points and 5.6 assists while averaging more than 38 minutes per game in his final collegiate season. He was team captain at Fresno State and received his bachelor's degree in African American studies in 2004.

Formerly from Goleta, Calif., and Dos Pueblos High School, Legans averaged 4.4 assists, 10.4 points and 1.4 steals per game during his 124-game collegiate career, making 83.9 percent of his free throws, 40.2 percent of his field goals and 36.6 percent of his three-point shots.

While at Dos Pueblos High School, he was named league MVP and Player of the Year for Santa Barbara County. He also earned All-California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) honors, and was rated as the seventh-best point guard in the country by Recruiting USA and the No. 19 point guard by PrepStar. His high school team advanced to the CIF Playoffs each of his four seasons on the squad.

Because of his accomplishments and contributions on and off the basketball court, Legans was part of the third class of inductees into the Santa Barbara Court of Champions on June 5, 2016, in Santa Barbara, Calif. Among the other previous inductees are basketball legends Jerry West, Jamaal Wilkes, Ben Howland, Gary Colson, Gary Cunningham and Brian Shaw.

Legans was born July 30, 1981, in Ventura, Calif. He was married on May 10, 2014, to former Eastern women's basketball player Tatjana Sparavalo. Their daughter, Zola Lee, was born June 16, 2016, and they have a second on the way.

- **JACOB WILEY**, playing in his first and only season as an Eagle in 2016-17, made Big Sky Conference history by becoming just the second player in league history to score at least 639 points and have at least 303 rebounds in a single season in the league's 54-year existence. The honorable mention All-American, Big Sky MVP and first team NABC All-District 6 selection finished with totals of 694 and 309, respectively, and no other player in league history has coupled that with at least 58 blocks (Wiley finished with 94 to come one shy of the league record) or a shooting percentage of at least .621 (Wiley finished at .643). Wiley finished the season ranked sixth in NCAA Division I in field goal percentage, eighth in blocked shots (2.76 per game), 29th in scoring (20.4), 48th in rebounds (9.1) and 112th in free throw percentage (.828). He signed a contract with the New Jersey Nets of the NBA.

- **FELIX VON HOFE** finished his career in 2016-17 sixth in league history for career 3-pointers with a school-record total of 262. He played in a school-record 128 games and finished with the 18th-most points in school history with 1,058, and 3-point records for both makes (262) and attempts (657)

- **BOGDAN BLIZNYUK** concluded his junior season with 701 points, becoming just the fourth player in school history to hit that mark (Wiley ranks fifth in school history with 694). In 103 career games (16th in school history), Bliznyuk is the 20th Eagle to join the 1,000-point club, currently ranking seventh with 1,428 points. He'll enter his senior season in 2017-18 needing just 375 points to break EWU's all-time mark of 1,803 points set by Australian Venky Jois from 2013-16. He earned second team NABC All-District 6 and second team All-Big Sky honors as a junior. He was the Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year in 2014-15. As a sophomore, he recorded the first triple-double in school history when he had 11 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists against Northern Arizona on Jan. 16, 2016.

- A four-time All-Big Sky performer, **VENKY JOIS** was selected to the All-Big Sky Conference first team as a senior for the second -straight season. He was also a NABC All-District 6 second team selection in the 2015-16 season, and a year earlier he earned first team All-District 6 honors and was picked for the Big Sky Conference All-Tournament team. He was the Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year in the 2013-14 season, and earned honorable mention All-Big Sky accolades as both a freshman and sophomore. He set 10 school records as an Eagle, including a school-record 1,803 career points.

- Eagle sharpshooter **TYLER HARVEY** was selected by Orlando in the second round as the 51st pick overall in the National Basketball Association Draft on June 25, 2015. Harvey was a walk-on to the Eastern program in the fall of 2011, then developed into a honorable mention All-American in the 2014-15 season when he led NCAA Division I in scoring (23.1) and 3-pointers made per game (4.00). He set Big Sky Conference and school records with 128 3-pointers in the 2014-15 season.

- The Eagles closed a monumental 2014-15 campaign with a 26-9 record overall after finishing 14-4 in the Big Sky Conference to share the regular season title with Montana. Eastern swept through three games in the Big Sky Conference Tournament to garner the school's second NCAA Tournament appearance in school history. The Eagles finished with program bests for victories overall (26), in the Big Sky (14), on the road (11) and in non-conference play (9) as a member of NCAA Division I. Eastern set a total of 18 school records during the year.

- * Eastern's heart-stopping 88-86 victory at Big Ten Conference member Indiana Nov. 24, 2014, will go down as one of the greatest victories in school history after the Eagles snapped the nation's third-longest non-conference home court winning streak at 43 in front of 11,636 Hoosier fans at Assembly Hall in Bloomington, Ind. It was the first-ever win for the Eagles in 14 tries against a Big Ten Conference opponent and was the first Big Sky win on a Big Ten home court.

More Milestones from EWU's 130-124 Victory Over Portland State . . .

- * The combined 90 points by Bliznyuk and Wiley was easily a school and Big Sky Conference record, and came just two points from the NCAA Division I mark of 92 set by Kevin Bradshaw (72) & Isaac Brown (20) for U.S. International (now Alliant International) vs. Loyola Marymount on Jan. 5, 1991. Interestingly, they combined for 68 (Bradshaw 37, Brown 31) in a 118-83 loss to Eastern on Feb. 2, 1991, and 39 the year before (Bradshaw 30, Brown 9) in a 102-93 victory over EWU on Dec. 21, 1989.
- * The 17 rebounds by Jacob Wiley equaled the eighth most in school history.
- * The 20 free throws attempted by Bogdan Bliznyuk equaled the second-most in school history behind the record of 21, and his 17 free throws made were second behind the record of 20 (Tyler Harvey was 20-of-20 on 1/23/14 vs. Southern Utah, and Matt Piper was 17-of-21 on 12/28/82 vs. Humboldt State).
- * With 92 being the NCAA record for combined points, it is the first time in NCAA history two players have scored at least 45 points in the same game. Notre Dame had two players also score 90 on Feb. 23, 1970, in a 121-114 non-overtime win over Butler (Austin Carr with 50 and Collis James with 40). Loyola Marymount's Bo Kimble and the late Hank Gathers each scored 40 against Gonzaga in 1989, and the Bulldogs also had a 40-point scorer in that game, Doug Spradley. On Feb. 20, 1971, Idaho State's Willie Humes scored 58 points and MSU's Bill Brickhouse and Willie Weeks each scored 38 in a 105-92 Bobcat win, also in regulation.
- * On Big Sky Conference lists, the 45 points both Bliznyuk and Wiley scored equaled the 12th-most in the 54-year history of the league. Only three players in NCAA Division I (at the time) had scored more than 45 in the 2016-17 season, and Wiley's 18 field goals made were No. 1.
- * At the time, Eastern's 130 points had been exceeded just three times by NCAA Division I schools this season, including twice by The Citadel (146, 144) and once by Troy (135).
