





## PLENTY OF CARDINAL IN THE NWSL PLAYOFFS

- » Stanford is well-represented in the 2022 NWSL Playoffs, with all six teams having at least one representative with ties back to The Farm
- » The Portland Thorns feature Sophia Smith and Tegan McGrady
- » There is a Card on the field and front office for KC Current, with Lo'eau LaBonta playing midfield for GM Camille Levin Ashton
- » 2022 NWSL Shield winner OL Reign was represented by Alana Cook and Sam Hiatt
- » Drafted just one year ago, Naomi Girma and Belle Briede made an immediate impact for San Diego Wave
- » Jane Campbell currently completed her sixth season as a goalkeeper with the Houston Dash
- » A staple of the U.S. Women's National Team, Tierna Davidson anchored the back line for the Chicago Red Stars before missing the season due to injury

## PRESS CLAIMS HER HALL OF FAME SPOT

- » Stanford's all-time leading goalscorer, the 2010 Hermann Trophy winner, and a World Cup Champion with the United States, Christen Press added Stanford Hall of Famer to her impressive resume on September 9
- » Press was one of 10 women included in Stanford's first all-female class honoring 50 years of Title IX
- » Joining Press as former student-athlete inductees were Lisa Bernhagen Ramos (women's track and field), Elaine Breeden Penrose (women's swimming and diving), Margie Dingeldein (women's water polo), Ashley Hansen Church (softball), Carly Janiga Reardon (women's gymnastics), Nneka Ogwumike (women's basketball) and Sally Voss Krueger (women's golf)
- » Tara VanDerveer (women's basketball) was inducted for her legendary coaching career, which enters a 37th season in 2022-23, while longtime volunteer Linda R. Meier received special recognition for her service to the department
- » In addition to producing a combined four NCAA team championships and six NCAA individual titles, all eight former student-athletes were recognized as All-Americans in multiple seasons
- » Press (2007-10) led the Cardinal to four NCAA appearances (2007-10), including national runner-up finishes in 2009 and 2010 ... MAC Hermann Trophy recipient (2010), Soccer America Player of the Year (2010), Top Drawer Soccer Player of the Year (2010) and three-time All-American (2008-10) ... Pac-10 Player of the Year (2010) and Pac-10 Freshman of the Year (2007) while directing Cardinal to a pair of Pac-10 titles (2009-10) ... school record holder in career points (183), goals (71) and shots (500) while ranking second in career assists (41) ... CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team (2010) and Pac-10 Scholar-Athlete of the Year (2010) ... two-time World Cup champion (2015 and 2019 with Team USA), totaling 155 appearances, 64 goals and 43 assists as a member of the national team ... selected in first round (No. 4 overall) of 2011 WPS Draft by the Washington Freedom, named WPS Rookie of the Year (2011) and currently playing for Angel City FC of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) ... Olympic medalist (2020 bronze with Team USA)

## REPRESENTING THE SENIOR NATIONAL TEAM

- » 12 current and former Cardinal are currently competing with their respective Senior National Teams
- » The United States Women's National Team features nine former Cardinal - Jane Campbell, Alana Cook, Tierna Davidson, Naomi Girma, Catarina Macario, Kelley O'Hara, Christen Press, Sophia Smith and Andi Sullivan
- » Former Cardinal Ali Riley captains New Zealand, while current Cardinal Amy Sayer plays for Team Australia and former Cardinal Kyra Carusa represents Ireland

## CARDINAL TABBED PRESEASON FAVORITE

- » For the seventh time in eight seasons, Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12 by the Conference's head coaches
- » The 2022 season also marks the 14th time in 25 years that the Cardinal has been selected the favorite
- » Stanford, which has not received fewer than 100 points since 2010, garnered 116 points and six first-place votes
- » UCLA (112 points, four first-place votes) and Washington State (100 points, two first-place votes) followed in second and third, respectively

## SISTER ACT

- » Twins Catherine and Sarah Paulson enter their third year on The Farm in 2022
- » There are 50 teams in NCAA Division I that feature at least one sister duo in 2022, while 10 schools have a pair - Duke, Kansas State, Minnesota, Purdue, Saint Francis, South Dakota State, Temple, Tulsa, UC Irvine and Western Carolina
- » The Paulsons are one of two sets of sisters in the Pac-12, joining California's Anysa and Amaya Gray (also twins), and Washington State's Sydney and Jenna Studer
- » Twenty-two teams in NCAA Division I feature twins, including UC Irvine, Saint Francis and Temple boasting two sets

## DOMS LANDS ON HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- » Senior Maya Doms is one of 60 NCAA Women's Division I college soccer players named to the 2022 Missouri Athletic Club Hermann Trophy Watch List
- » The Hermann Trophy is the nation's highest individual honor recognizing the nation's National Player of the Year as determined by the voting of Division I coaches who are members of United Soccer Coaches
- » Including Doms, an NCAA-best nine players from the Pac-12 are included on this year's initial list - Doms, UCLA's Lauren Brzykcy and Lily Reale, Washington State's Nadia Cooper and Mykia Minnis, Oregon's Leah Freeman, USC's Croix Bethune, Arizona State's Nicole Douglas, and Washington's Summer Yates
- » A Cardinal player has claimed three of the last five MAC Hermann trophies, with Andi Sullivan taking the award in 2017, followed by Catarina Macario becoming a back-to-back winner in 2018 and 2019 ... Kelley O'Hara became the first Stanford player to win the MAC Hermann Trophy at the conclusion of the 2009 season ... O'Hara was followed by Christen Press (2010) and Teresa Noyola (2011) to bring Stanford's total to six winners
- » Fifteen men's players and 15 women's players become Hermann Trophy semifinalists on Nov. 30 following completion of Division I All-America voting following the fall season ... on Dec. 7, the top three players from a final round of voting are the 2021 finalists ... the 2022 winner is revealed on Jan. 6, 2023, at a ceremony at the historic Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis, Mo.

## TEAM STANFORD VS. TEAM CHINA

- » Scoreless through 83 minutes of play, No. 21 Stanford received a game-winning goal from senior Maya Doms in the 84th minute to earn a 1-0 victory over the Chinese National Team in an exhibition match on August 21 in front of a capacity crowd from Cagan Stadium.
- » Team China entered the match ranked No. 16 in the FIFA world rankings
- » Freshman Lumi Kostmayer, who narrowly missed putting the Cardinal on the board in the 47th minute after drilling a shot from distance that hit off the crossbar, fed Doms a perfect pass through a Chinese defender that found her right foot. The native of Davis, Calif. took one touch toward goal before unleashing a shot that beat Team China goalkeeper Zhu Yu to the far post for the game-winner
- » The match proved an even pairing as both squads managed 11 shots and four on frame, with China holding a possession advantage of 56% compared to Stanford's 44%
- » Cardinal goalkeeper Ryan Campbell made four saves to post the shutout, while Yu finished with three. Campbell's biggest save of the night came in the 34th minute when China's Yang Lina lined up a shot from 25 yards out and fired to the upper-left 90 of the goal. Campbell leapt up and touched it over the bar to keep the Cardinal even headed into halftime

## STATE SCHOOL TO START

- » Stanford opened the season against Sacramento State - one of two CSU schools on the regular-season slate (Cal Poly)
- » Stanford went 3-0 against CSU schools last year after defeating Cal Poly 2-0 on August 19, CSUN 7-0 on August 26 and San Diego State 6-0 on August 29
- » So far this season, Stanford is 2-0 against CSU schools after beating Sacramento State 5-0 on August 18 and Cal Poly 4-1 on September 4
- » The Cardinal has won 37 consecutive matches over CSU schools and owns a 50-0-1 record over the last 51 - the only tie being a scoreless match at San Diego State on October 10, 1993
- » Stanford last lost a match to a CSU school on October 20, 1988 - a 2-1 setback to Cal State Hayward (now Cal State East Bay)
- » Stanford is 24-0-0 against CSU schools under Paul Ratcliffe
- » The Cardinal is 54-17-3 all time against the CSU schools

## ALL-AMERICAN SENIOR

- » Maya Doms returns for her senior year after earning United Soccer Coaches All-America third team honors in 2021
- » Doms, a three-time all-conference pick, started all 20 games in the midfield, playing 1,571 minutes and leading the team in goals (11) and points (25) with three game-winners
- » Her 11 goals ranked sixth in the Pac-12 while her 4.00 shots per game ranked fourth in the conference
- » The native of Davis, Calif. managed two multi-goal games last season, including a hat trick in Stanford's 7-0 rout of CSUN on August 26

## GETTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- » With a 5-0 victory over Sac State this year, Stanford now owns a 16-match unbeaten streak in season openers (15-0-1)
- » Including this season, Stanford has posted eight shutouts over the 16-match streak
- » The Cardinal has won 12 straight season openers ... played to a 1-1 draw at Boston College to start the 2010 season
- » Stanford last dropped a season opener in 2006 - a 2-1 defeat at Utah
- » Stanford is 33-4-2 all time in season openers - including 17-2-1 under Paul Ratcliffe

## ALL-REGION RETURNER

- » Sierra Enge returns to The Farm after being named All-Region a year ago
- » Enge was a third-team selection in 2021 after landing on the second team in 2020-21
- » Enge started all 20 matches for the Cardinal, logging 1,642 minutes to place second among field players
- » The native of Cardiff, Calif. scored a pair of goals and added three assists to collect seven points en route to earning a spot on the all-conference third team
- » Enge was joined by Maya Doms and Naomi Girma on the All-Region team in 2021

## A LOOK BACK AT 2021

- » Stanford went 13-6-1 overall in 2021, including 7-3-1 in the Pac-12 to place fourth
- » The Cardinal entered the postseason ranked No. 20 in the United Soccer Coaches poll ... carried a season-best No. 7 ranking the week of September 28
- » The Cardinal made its 30th NCAA Tournament appearance overall, including its 23rd in the last 24 seasons
- » The Cardinal scored at least three goals in seven games last season
- » Four Pac-12 schools made the tournament a year ago - Stanford, UCLA, USC and Washington State
- » The Cardinal posted the Pac-12's second-best scoring offense (2.30) while ranking 24th nationally
- » Stanford's 46 total goals ranked second in the Pac-12 (24th nationally)
- » The Cardinal averaged 19.75 shots per game - second in the Pac-12 and fifth nationally
- » Stanford averaged 7.40 corner kicks per game to lead the Conference and rank eighth nationally
- » Four different players recorded multi-goal games last year (Belle Brieche, Maya Doms, Abby Greubel and Andrea Kitahata) with Doms recording a pair
- » Stanford started the season 3-0 through three matches for the ninth time in the last 15 years ... has been unbeaten through three matches in 12 of the last 15 seasons

## CARDINAL IN THE NWSL DRAFT

- » Naomi Girma was selected with the first overall pick by San Diego Wave FC during the 2022 NWSL Draft before San Diego also nabbed Belle Brieche 27th overall to start the third round
- » Girma became the fourth No. 1 overall pick from Stanford in the last five years - joining Andi Sullivan (2018), Tierna Davidson (2019) and Sophia Smith (2020) ... Girma's selection runs Stanford's NWSL first-round pick total to 10 - the most of any program in the nation
- » With two selections, Stanford has now seen 19 total players drafted into the league since its inception in 2013, and has had at least one player drafted in each of the NWSL drafts - including at least two in each of the last four
- » Adding one more last year, the Cardinal is the only program in the nation to have a player drafted in the top-five picks each of the last five seasons

## #OLYMPIANSMADEHERE

- » Six former Cardinal competed at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics - the most of any program in the nation
- » North Carolina featured the second-most players with five
- » Ali Riley played in her fourth Olympic Games, serving as team captain for New Zealand
- » Jane Campbell, Tierna Davidson, Catarina Macario, Kelley O'Hara and Christen Press captured bronze medals while competing for Team USA
- » Campbell, Davidson and Macario were competing in their first Olympic Games ... O'Hara made her third Olympic appearance after winning gold in London and competing in Rio ... Press, a two-time Olympian, captured her first Olympic medal after appearing in all six matches (starting three) for Team USA
