LEADING OFF

- » **STANFORD** has lost a season-high six straight games, seven of its last eight, and 22 of the last 34 overall ... has been swept in back-to-back series for the first time since dropping three straight series vs. Arizona (3/20-3/22/15), at then-No. 6 Arizona State (3/27-3/29/15) and vs. Washington (4/2-4/4/15) ... is 20-12 when scoring at least three runs in a game, but 0-16 when falling short of three runs ... averaging 9.70 strikeouts per nine innings to rank second in the Pac-12 and 34th nationally ... allowed the first run in seven of its first eight games of the season, but has scored first in 22 of the last 40 ... is 13-10 when scoring first and 7-18 when the opponent scores first ... is 17-8 when posting more hits than its opponent, 2-19 when the opponent manages more hits, and 1-1 when hits are even ... dropped consecutive weekend series to start the year for the first time since losing two-of-three to Rice and Texas over the first two weekends of the 2014 campaign ... finished the 2023 season ranked No. 4 in the nation according to D1Baseball ... made its 19th College World Series appearance (38th postseason appearance overall) last year, including its third consecutive trip to Omaha - the only team in the nation to make the College World Series in each of the last three seasons ... clinched a second consecutive Pac-12 conference title in 2023 and won the Pac-12 by five games ... is the only D1 program to host a regional in each of the last six tournaments, and the only program to have made the super regional round in each of the last four.
- » **TEMO BECERRA** has hit safely in 19 of his last 27 games and 25 of his last 33 overall ... has amassed 13 multi-hit games this season ... is batting .318 (28-for-88) with 11 runs scored, five doubles, a triple and five RBIs in Pac-12 play ... hit .455 (5-for-11) with three RBIs in the series vs. Creighton (March 23-25).
- » **OWEN COBB** has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games and 21 of his last 26 overall, managing multiple hits in 15 of those 26 contests - including six of his last nine contests ... had a 13-game hitting streak snapped on May 11 vs. Arizona State, but batted .431 (25-for-58) with 14 runs scored, five doubles, a homer and 10 RBIs over the streak ... is batting .378 (17-for-45) with nine runs scored and two doubles over the last 10 games ... has raised his average 112 points (.203 to .315) over the last 25 games and is hitting .389 (44-for-113) with 22 runs scored, 10 doubles, four homers and 19 RBIs over the span ... is batting .357 (41-for-115) with 17 runs scored, 12 doubles, three homers and 17 RBIs in Pac-12 play ... has managed four hits in a game four times this year ... batted .500 (7-for-14) with four runs scored, three doubles, a homer and eight RBIs in the series against Oregon ... launched a grand slam to help Stanford to a 9-5 victory over Penn State on February 25 before connecting for a pair of solo homers in a 9-4 victory over San Jose State on February 26 ... contributed a double and two triples in Stanford's 4-1 victory over Cal State Fullerton on February 18.
- » **DAVID ESCUER** was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year last season for the third time while at Stanford (2018, 2022) and fourth overall (2001, California) ... earned a second consecutive ABCA West Region Coach of the Year last year ... has amassed a 246-120 overall record at Stanford and owns a 771-587-2 record as a Division I head coach (18 seasons at California) ... 6.72 win percentage at Stanford is the best in program history ... won his 100th game at the helm of the program on March 4, 2021 as Stanford walked off with a 7-6 victory over San Francisco in 10 innings ... 700th career win came in a 5-4 triumph vs. Arizona on May 28, 2022 at Pac-12 Tournament ... collected win No. 200 at Stanford with a 16-5 win at Oklahoma on April 2, 2023 ... 300th career Pac-12 win came against USC on May 21, 2022 to claim sole possession of 2022 Pac-12 title, while his 100th Pac-12 win at Stanford came in a 9-4 win at No. 20 Arizona State to sweep a three-game series on May 7, 2023 ... made his 10th postseason appearance as a head coach (fifth with Stanford) last year and fourth trip to Omaha after previously guiding California to Omaha in 2011 while earning National Coach of the Year honors.
- » **TREVOR HASKINS** has hit safely in 13 of his last 17, 22 of 27, and 26 of his last 34 games overall ... had a nine-game hitting streak snapped on April 28 vs. California, but batted .417 (15-for-36) with 13 runs scored, four doubles, four homers and nine RBIs over the streak ... batted .362 (34-for-94) with 22 runs scored, eight doubles, a triple, six homers and 20 RBIs over the last 25 games ... had a nine-game hit streak snapped at No. 5 Oregon State on April 12 ... batted .457 (16-for-35) with eight runs scored, four doubles, a triple, two homers and 11 RBIs over the span ... has improved his average 122 points (170 to .292) over his last 32 games played ... has totaled 15 runs scored, seven doubles, five homers and 17 RBIs in Pac-12 play ... hit for the cycle at Texas Tech on April 2 ... went 4-for-5 with four runs scored and three RBIs, managed a two-RBI triple in the fifth, singled in the seventh, led off the eighth with a double, and hit a towering home run for his second round-tripper of the year in the ninth to complete the cycle ... the cycle was the first for Stanford since Brian Ragira vs. Santa Clara on March 22, 2011 and the first in the Pac-12 this season ... connected for a pair of homers and drove in five vs. California on April 27 ... went 4-for-5 with two runs scored, a double, a homer and five RBIs at Utah on March 30 ... five RBIs were the most for a Cardinal player since Carter Graham had five against No. 25 Texas A&M on June 4, 2023.
- » **ETHAN HOTT** has hit safely in nine of his last 10 and 14 of his last 16 overall ... is hitting .356 (32-for-90) with 14 runs scored, six doubles and seven RBIs in Pac-12 play.
- » **BRANDON LARSON** has batted .351 (13-for-37) with four runs scored, two homers and eight RBIs over the last 10 games ... batted .417 (5-for-12) with three runs scored, two homers and five RBIs in the series against Cal from April 26-28 ... went 6-for-12 (.500) with a run scored and three RBIs in a three-game series at No. 21 Arizona (May 3-5), including a four-hit game to open that series ... has compiled two doubles, three homers and driven in 14 runs in Pac-12 play.
- » **CHRISTIAN LIM** has been named Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week twice this season (March 2 & March 25) ... is the first Stanford pitcher to earn the honor multiple times in a season since Quinn Mathews won it three times and Alex Williams twice in 2022.
- » **CORT MACDONALD** has hit safely in four straight, seven of the last eight, 14 of his last 16, 22 of his last 25 and 28 of his last 32, and has reached in all but five of his games played ... has hit safely in all but six contests he's played on the season and has not been held hitless in back-to-back games ... has amassed a team-best 19 multi-hit games, including multiple hits in eight of his last 14 ... has compiled 17 runs scored, three doubles, a triple, two homers and 15 RBIs while batting .304 (34-for-112) in Pac-12 play ... strung together a seven-game hit streak from April 13-26, batting .407 (11-for-27) with seven runs scored, a double, a triple and seven RBIs over the span ... had an eight-game hit streak snapped on April 12 at No. 5 Oregon State after batting .351 (13-for-37) with five runs scored, four doubles, a home run and five RBIs over the span ... hit safely in his first 10 games played this season, but had the streak snapped at California on March 5 ... batted .382 (13-for-34) with nine runs scored, a homer and seven RBIs over the 10-game hitting streak ... hit safely in six straight games from March 15-25, batting .474 (9-for-19) with four runs scored, a homer and four RBIs over the string ... batted .545 (6-for-11) with four runs scored and three RBIs in the series vs. Oregon ... hit .545 (6-for-11) with two runs scored and two RBIs in the three-game series against Creighton (March 23-25) ... batted .385 (5-for-13) with four runs scored, four RBIs and two multi-hit games in the three-game series at Rice.

- » **MALCOLM MOORE** has hit safely in seven straight games and is batting .333 (9-for-27) with six runs scored, two doubles and two RBIs over the span ... connected for three home runs vs. #16 Oregon on April 19 and finished the series with a grand slam on April 21 ... batted .500 (4-for-8) with six runs scored, four homers and eight RBIs to total a 2.000 SLG% in the series against Oregon ... reached at a .714 clip against the Ducks while drawing five walks and a hit-by-pitch ... homered in back-to-back games at Washington (March 9-10) ... has connected for eight home runs while scoring 25 runs and driving in 17 in Pac-12 play ... has reached in all but five games he's played this year while leading the team and ranking third in the Pac-12 in walks (.38) ... managed a double and two home runs in the three-game series at Rice ... Preseason All-America according to Baseball America (first team) and Perfect Game (second team) ... Preseason All-Pac-12 ... 2024 Golden Spikes, Buster Posey Award and Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Watch List.
- » **JIMMY NATI** has hit safely in all but 14 games this season, including eight of his last 12 and 14 of his last 20 overall, and has reached in all but 12 ... hitting .385 (15-for-39) with seven runs scored, four doubles, four homers and 17 RBIs over the last 10 games ... hit safely in the first 10 contests of the season, batting .474 (18-for-38) with five runs scored, eight doubles, a triple and eight RBIs ... 19 doubles rank second in the Pac-12 and 32nd nationally ... has managed 18 multi-hit games this season ... has scored 19 runs with eight doubles, eight homers and 24 RBIs while batting .308 (32-for-104) in Pac-12 play ... finished 4-for-5 with two runs scored, a pair of homers and five RBIs vs. Arizona State on May 12 ... batted .615 (8-for-13) with five runs scored, two doubles, two homers and nine RBIs in the series against Cal to register a 1.231 slugging percentage ... homered twice in a nine-run fifth inning on April 27 vs. Cal to become the first Cardinal to homer twice in an inning since Michael Taylor hit a pair in the top of the fourth at USC on May 26, 2007 ... batted .464 (13-for-28) with seven runs scored, four doubles, three homers and 14 RBIs over a seven-game hit streak from April 21 to May 3.
- » **TORAN O'HARRAN** ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in saves (6) ... has inherited 29 runners this year, allowing 10 to score (34%)
- » **BRADY REYNOLDS** strung together a seven-game hit streak from March 3-16, batting .333 (8-for-24) with two runs scored and a double.
- » **CHARLIE SAUM** has homered in two of his last four games and three of his last seven ... hit safely in six straight games from April 14-23 and batted .385 (10-for-26) with seven runs scored, two doubles, three homers and seven RBIs over the span ... batted .462 (6-for-13) with five runs scored, a double, two homers and four RBIs against Oregon.
- » **MATT SCOTT** was named Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week after tossing seven innings, allowing one run on three hits and two walks while striking out nine at Washington to open Pac-12 play on March 8 ... has struck out a Pac-12-best 96 batters over 13 starts and 71 2/3 innings on the season to rank 18th in the nation ... averaging 12.06 strikeouts per nine innings to rank second in the conference ... Preseason All-America third team according to Baseball America ... Preseason All-Pac-12.

THIS WEEK

- » Stanford will begin a string of four straight road games to conclude the regular season, traveling to California on Monday at 6:05 p.m.
- » The game with the Golden Bears will be broadcast live on Pac-12 Networks.

UP NEXT

- » Following the midweek game at Cal, Stanford will conclude the regular season at UCLA in Pac-12 play.
- » The series with UCLA begins Thursday at 7 p.m. and runs through Saturday.
- » All three games against the Bruins will be broadcast live on Pac-12 Networks.

A LOOK BACK

- » Stanford was swept by Arizona State in a three-game series last weekend.
- » The Cardinal was limited to .264 hitting with nine runs scored, three doubles, a triple and two home runs.
- » Malcolm Moore batted 5-for-13 with two runs scored, a double and an RBI.
- » Jimmy Nati laced a pair of homers - the only two for the Cardinal in the series - while driving in five runs.
- » Stanford's pitching staff allowed 39 runs (36 earned) on 46 hits, including nine doubles and 11 home runs, for a 12.00 ERA.
- » Cardinal hurlers struck out 24 batters in 27 innings of work.

BATS ARE COMING ALIVE

- » Stanford was hitting .259 through the first 23 games of the season, but has batted .311 over the last 25 games to raise its average to .287.
- » The Cardinal has scored 163 runs on 283 hits over those 25 games, compiling 63 doubles, three triples and 34 home runs.
- » Stanford had amassed 34 doubles, four triples and 17 home runs over the first 23 games of the season.
- » Graduate student Owen Cobb and junior Trevor Haskins have been key cogs in the offensive outburst, with Cobb batting .389 (44-for-113) with 22 runs scored, 10 doubles, four homers and 19 RBIs and Haskins hitting .362 (34-for-94) with 22 runs scored, eight doubles, a triple, six homers and 20 RBIs.
- » Ethan Hott has amassed a .341 average (28-for-82) with 15 runs scored, four doubles and eight RBIs over the 25 games.
- » Charlie Saum has launched five home runs and driven in 13 while batting .327 (17-for-52) and playing in 15 of the 22 games, while Malcolm Moore has connected for seven homers while scoring 23 runs and driving in 16 over the string.
- » Jimmy Nati is batting .323 (32-for-99) with 16 runs scored, 10 doubles, seven homers and 28 RBIs over the 25 games, while Cort MacDonald is hitting .327 (33-for-101) with 18 runs scored, four doubles, a triple, a homer and 13 RBIs.

HASKINS HITS FOR THE CYCLE

- » Junior Trevor Haskins hit for the cycle in a 15-12 loss at Texas Tech on April 2, nearly sparking a comeback that originally saw Stanford trailing 12-0 after four innings.
- » Haskins, who finished 4-for-5 with four runs scored and three RBIs, managed a two-RBI triple in the fifth, singled in the seventh, led off the eighth with a double, and hit a towering home run for his second round-tripper of the year in the ninth to complete the cycle.
- » The cycle was the first for Stanford since Brian Ragira vs. Santa Clara on March 22, 2011 and the first in the Pac-12 this season.

CALIFORNIA KINGS

- » Stanford is the winningest Division I program in California since the 2011 season, compiling 486 victories.
- » UCLA has won 481 games since 2011, followed by UC Santa Barbara (470), UC Irvine (463) and Cal State Fullerton (432).

HITS COMING IN BUNCHES FOR COBB

- » Owen Cobb has compiled a team-high 19 multi-hit games this season, including recording four games with four hits.
- » He batted 4-for-7 with a run scored and a double at Utah on March 30, including a pair of hits in a seven-run 11th inning.
- » The native of Seattle finished 4-for-5 with a pair of runs scored, a double, a homer and four RBIs at Texas Tech on April 2
- » Cobb went 4-for-6 with two doubles, a homer and three RBIs vs. Washington State on April 7.
- » Most recently, he managed a pair of doubles, scored twice and drove in three as part of a 4-for-5 day to conclude a series win over No. 16 Oregon on April 21.
- » In addition to the quartet of four-hit days, Cobb has posted two-hit games 11 times and has finished with three hits four times.
- » Though Cobb has reached four hits four times, Jimmy Nati holds the single-season Stanford high with five hits against Cal on April 27.
- » Trevor Haskins has posted a pair of four-hit game this season, doing so in games in which Cobb also reached four - at Utah (March 30) and Texas Tech (April 2), while Brandon Larson posted four at No. 21 Arizona on May 3 and Nati finished with four vs. Arizona State on May 12.

PRETTY GOOD IN A PINCH

- » The Cardinal is hitting .315 in pinch-hit opportunities this year, batting 17-for-54 with five doubles, two homers, nine walks and six RBIs.
- » Pinch-hit home runs from Charlie Saum and Gabe Springer on March 17 vs. USC highlight the opportunities.
- » Brett Blair is 4-for-8 in the pinch, collecting a double, while Springer has gone 3-for-11 with two RBIs and two walks.
- » Saborn Campbell is 2-for-5 with a pair of doubles, while Jake Sapien is also 2-for-5.
- » Stanford's pinch hitters have combined to post a .422 on-base percentage while slugging .519.

PAC-12 PITCHERS OF THE WEEK

- » Stanford has won a trio of Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week honors, with Christian Lim most recently selected for the second time this year on March 25.
- » Stanford garnered Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week in back-to-back weeks during March, with Lim earning the honor on March 4 before Matt Scott on March 11.
- » The back-to-back selections were the first for Stanford since Alex Williams and Quinn Mathews in April of 2022.
- » Lim became the first Pac-12 pitcher to win the award multiple times in the same season since Oregon's Jace Staffel earned three honors in 2023 ... also was the first Stanford pitcher to earn the honor multiple times in a season since Quinn Mathews won it three times and Alex Williams twice in 2022.
- » Following a stellar start at Rice in game two of a three-game series on March 2, Lim was named Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week for the first time in his career ... Lim tossed six scoreless innings and struck out a career-best 10 batters to record his first career win and help Stanford sweep Rice on the road ... the left-hander did not allow a hit over the first 4 1/3 innings, striking out seven batters compared to just one walk over the string ... Lim threw 66 of his 97 pitches for strikes in the dominant performance against Rice as Stanford carried a shutout through 8 2/3 innings.
- » Scott earned the victory after tossing seven innings, allowing one run on three hits and two walks while striking out nine in his start to open Pac-12 play at Washington on March 8 ... the right-hander retired 10 straight batters from the first inning through two outs in the fourth, including a string of five consecutive strikeouts that began with the first out of the second inning ... Scott navigated the seven frames on 99 pitches, including 60 for strikes, with the only blemish coming on a solo homer in the bottom of the sixth.
- » Lim allowed just three hits and two walks while striking out a career-best 11 batters over 6 1/3 scoreless innings vs. Creighton on March 24 ... he retired 12 straight batters from the second out in the second inning through one out in the sixth and recorded eight of his first nine out via strikeout.
- » Including the one this year, Scott has now been named Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week twice in his career (March 27, 2023; March 11, 2024).

SINGLES GALORE

- » All 11 of Stanford's hits in a 6-3 victory over Creighton on March 25 were singles - the first time the Cardinal has posted 11 hits without an extra-base hit in a game since collecting 12 vs. Vanderbilt on March 2, 2016.
- » The Cardinal managed 26 hits in the three-game series against Creighton, with Malcolm Moore's ninth-inning solo homer on March 24 serving as the lone extra-base hit.
- » Prior to the series against Creighton, Stanford had recorded at least one extra-base hit in each of the first 18 games of the season, and has been held without an extra-base hit just five times this year.

EXTRA-BASE HIT PRODUCTION

- » Stanford has recorded 155 extra-base hits (97 doubles, seven triples, 51 home runs) in 48 games this season.
- » The extra-base hits account for 32% of Stanford's hit total of 477.
- » Jimmy Nati paces the squad with 28 extra-base hits (19 doubles, one triple, eight home runs), while Owen Cobb (14 doubles, two triples, seven home runs) has 23 ... Trevor Haskins (14 doubles, a triple, six home runs) has contributed 21 extra-base hits.

LONG BALLS NO LONGER LEADING THE WAY

- » Stanford connected for 117 homers last year to lead the Pac-12, including 15 from Malcolm Moore ... the 117 round-trippers ranked 10th in the nation, while the 1.83 homers per game ranked first in the Pac-12 and 15th nationally.
- » The Cardinal was +39 in home runs last year, having connected for 117 while allowing 78.
- » Stanford homered in all but 14 games in 2023 and totaled multiple homers in 34 of the 64 games.
- » The Cardinal clubbed 17 homers in the final 12 games, 22 in the last 15, 43 in the last 20, 56 in the last 25, 62 in the last 28, and 68 in the last 32 games overall.
- » Stanford twice hit six homers in a game last year - a 20-17 victory at Santa Clara on May 9 and a 21-20 loss to Arizona on May 14.
- » Stanford was 39-11 when hitting at least one home run in a game and 28-6 when hitting two or more this season.
- » Stanford's lineup featured 13 different players with a home run, including 11 with multiple and six with double-digit homers.
- » The Cardinal hit 15 homers in the postseason in 2023.
- » So far this season, Stanford has hit just 51 home runs in 48 games - 13 from Malcolm Moore, eight from Jimmy Nati, seven from Owen Cobb and Charlie Saum, six from Trevor Haskins, four from Brandon Larson, three from Cort MacDonald, two from Brady Reynolds, and one from Gabe Springer.
- » The Cardinal has connected for multiple home runs in a game just 14 times this season.
- » Stanford is -8 in home runs this year, having allowed 59 long balls.
- » Stanford had not homered in a season-high six consecutive games entering May 12's two-homer performance from Jimmy Nati.

BUT...APRIL SHOWERS BROUGHT CARDINAL POWERS

- » The Cardinal played 18 games in the month of April, batting .318 with 51 doubles, two triples and 29 home runs.
- » Stanford had hit just 20 home runs with 39 doubles in February and March combined - a span of 24 games.

FEELING RIGHT AT HOME IN TEXAS

- » Returning to his home state, sophomore Cort MacDonald hit .385 (5-for-13) with four runs scored, a walk, two stolen bases and four RBIs in a three-game series at Rice (March 1-3).
- » The native of Arlington, Texas posted multiple hits in the first two games at Rice, including going 2-for-4 with a pair of runs scored and three RBIs in an 8-2 game-two victory.
- » MacDonald continued his Texas tear in a pair of game at Texas Tech April 1-2, batting .300 (3-for-10) with two doubles, two runs scored and two RBIs.
- » A 2022 graduate of Pantego Christian Academy, MacDonald was a five-sport athlete in high school (baseball, football, basketball, track, golf), earned 2022 Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools Athlete of the Year, and was a three-time Pantego Athlete of the Year (2020-22).

FAMILY ON THE FARM

- » Stanford has a handful of players on this year's roster with ties back to The Farm.
- » Jaden Bruno's brother, Ryan was a teammate from 2021-23 before being drafted in the seventh round (No. 205) of the 2023 MLB Draft (Arizona Diamondbacks).
- » Trevor Moore's father, Tim, played baseball at Stanford in 1992 and was a fifth-round pick of the Chicago White Sox that season.
- » Ben Reimers' father, Tom, played baseball at Stanford from 1994-96 and helped the Cardinal to a conference title in 1994 and a trip to the College World Series in 1995 ... was drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 15th round of the 1996 MLB June Amateur Draft.

FAREWELL TO THE PAC-12

- » The 2024 season will be Stanford's final in the Pac-12 conference, as the Cardinal will join Bay Area rival California as new members of the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2025.
- » Stanford is one of the oldest members of the conference, joining the then Pacific Coast Conference, founded in 1915, for the 1918 season.
- » The Cardinal boasts 21 conference titles, with the first coming in 1924 and the most recent in 2023.

FREE PASSES HURT VS. PENN STATE

- » The Cardinal pitching staff issued 36 free passes over three games against Penn State from February 23-25, walking 28 batters and hitting eight more.
- » Stanford walked 17 batters in the series opener, two in game two, and nine more in the series finale.
- » While the walk was not a problem in game two of the series, the Cardinal did issue five hit by pitches in that contest.
- » The two teams combined to issue 58 free passes over the three games in the series with Penn State walking 15 and hitting seven.
- » Stanford pitching has walked 249 batters - second most in the Pac-12 behind Arizona State (277)
- » The Cardinal has issued double-digit walks three times in a game this season (17 vs. Penn State, February 23; 11 at Washington, March 10; 12 at No. 5 Oregon State, April 13)

THE FARM VS. THE LONE STAR STATE

- » In the David Esquer era, which began in 2018, Stanford has played eight teams from Texas - going a combined 26-11 in those contests.
- » With a weekend series sweep over Rice from March 1-3, Stanford is 10-0 against the Owls under Esquer.
- » The Cardinal wrapped up its regular-season games against Texas schools with a pair of losses at Texas Tech to open the month of April.
- » The Cardinal has met Texas the most over the span, posting an 8-3 record - including a 2-1 series victory in the 2023 Super Regional to advance to the College World Series.
- » The last three runs to Omaha have seen the Cardinal go head-to-head with a Texas-based squad, with Stanford defeating Texas Tech in a 2021 Super Regional on the road, Texas State in the 2022 Stanford Regional, and Texas A&M in the 2023 Stanford Regional before defeating the Longhorns in last year's Super Regional.
- » Under Esquer, Stanford is 1-0 vs. Baylor, 0-1 vs. Houston, 10-0 against Rice, 8-3 vs. Texas, 2-1 against Texas A&M, 2-1 vs. Texas State, 3-4 vs. Texas Tech and 0-1 against UTSA.

ALL-AMERICANS ON THE FARM

- » Sophomores Malcolm Moore and Matt Scott have each been tabbed Preseason All-Americans entering the 2024 season.
- » Moore earned a spot on Baseball America's Preseason All-America first team, while also landing on Perfect Game's second team.
- » Scott was also lauded by Baseball America, placing on its Preseason All-America third team squad.
- » Moore earned Freshman All-America honors from Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game and was listed on D1Baseball and NCBWA's Freshman All-America second team a year ago.
- » Scott also earned Perfect Game All-America honors in 2023, landing on the second team.
- » Moore, the 2023 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, started all 64 games as a freshman while batting .311 with 50 runs scored, 20 doubles, 15 homers and 63 RBIs ... the power-hitting backstop slugged .564 while compiling 23 multi-hit games and 17 multi-RBI contests ... in Pac-12 play, Moore batted .282 with 19 runs scored, eight doubles, five homers and 25 RBIs.
- » Scott went 5-5 with 62 strikeouts over 67 innings and 24 appearances, including 12 starts, in 2023 while converting one save ... the right-hander finished third in the Pac-12 in hits allowed per nine innings (7.93) and averaged 8.33 strikeouts per game while limiting opponents to a .227 average against.

OPENING WEEKEND NOTES

- » Since 1959, Stanford has opened the season with a three-game series against Cal State Fullerton 12 times (1994, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024) ... the Cardinal has won seven of the 12 series and has amassed a 21-15 record over the 36 games in those sets.
- » Including an 4-0 setback this year, Stanford is 49-16-1 overall on Opening Day since 1959, but has won five of its last nine games to open a season.
- » The shutout loss to open the season was the first for the Cardinal since being blanked 1-0 at No. 8 Cal State Fullerton on February 16, 2017.
- » Having dropped the opener at Fullerton 8-1 in 2023, Stanford has lost the season opener in back-to-back years for the first time since losing three straight from 2013-15.
- » The Cardinal has played 26 opening weekend series of three-or-more games since 1959 and is 18-9 in those series ... Stanford has compiled a 54-28 record over the 82 games in those sets.

CARDINAL TABBED SECOND IN PRESEASON POLL

- » Following back-to-back Pac-12 titles and three straight trips to the College World Series, Stanford was selected to finish second in the Pac-12 in 2024 following a poll of the Conference's head coaches.
- » Stanford garnered 86 points and two first-place votes, trailing only Oregon State with eight first-place votes and 95 total points.
- » After the Beavers and Cardinal, UCLA followed in third place with 82 points and one first-place vote, ahead of Oregon (74 points) and USC (64) to round out the top five.
- » Arizona State was slated to finish sixth after earning 50 points, followed by Washington (49), California (40), Arizona (31), Utah (20) and Washington State (15) to round out the poll.
- » In addition to the poll, the Pac-12 revealed the preseason all-conference team, also voted on by the league's coaches ... sophomores Malcolm Moore and Matt Scott were each selected Preseason All-Pac-12.

NEW LOOK CARDINAL IN 2024

- » Having lost a handful of key contributors, including nine to the MLB Draft a year ago, Stanford will rely heavily on new faces across the diamond in 2024.
- » Stanford returned 20 players who had spent at least one season on The Farm, but welcomed 13 total newcomers - including three transfers.
- » The Cardinal returned just seven pitchers who had appeared in game at Stanford entering this year, with those hurlers combining for 173 1/3 of Stanford's 577 innings (30%) from 2023.
- » Sophomores Matt Scott (67 innings) and Nick Dugan (61.2 innings) accounted for nearly 75% of the returning innings from a year ago.
- » Right-handers Nathan Fleischl (29 career innings) and Tommy O'Rourke (57 career innings) are both back after missing all of last year due to injury.
- » Ty Uber, who missed the bulk of last year due to injury, returned the most career innings of any pitcher on staff entering 2024 - totaling 69.2 innings entering his junior campaign.
- » Offensively, Stanford returned three position players with more than 15 starts from last year - Owen Cobb, Malcolm Moore and Jake Sapien.
- » The Cardinal returned only 769 of its 2,354 (33%) at bats from a year ago, and brought back just 27 of its 117 home runs (23%) from 2023.
- » Stanford lost 392 runs, 527 hits, 107 doubles, nine triples, 90 home runs and 377 RBIs from last year's squad as those eight non-returning hitters batted a combined .332 a year ago.
- » On the mound, Stanford lost 403 2/3 innings, 36 wins, 40 starts, 16 saves and 493 strikeouts from last year's squad.

REPRESENTING THE GOLDEN STATE & THE PAC-12

- » Stanford was the last Division I baseball team from California still competing in the NCAA Tournament at the start of super regionals a year ago.
- » The Cardinal were joined by Cal State Fullerton (Stanford Regional), San Jose State (Stanford Regional) and Santa Clara (Fayetteville Regional) in the tournament field.
- » Stanford was also the last team from California competing in 2021 and 2022 - the only team from California to reach a super regional in either season.
- » Oregon hosted Oral Roberts in a super regional last year, but was defeated in a winner-take-all game on Sunday - leaving Stanford as the lone Pac-12 school headed to Omaha.

HE'S GOLDEN

- » Considered one of the top players in the nation, sophomore Malcolm Moore has been named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- » The preseason list includes 55 players across high school and college baseball and features eight players who were named Golden Spikes Award semifinalists a season ago.
- » Overall, 41 schools and 16 conferences are represented on the 2024 Preseason Watch List.
- » The Pac-12 boasts four players on the Golden Spikes Award watch list, as Oregon State's Trevis Bazzana and California's Rodney Green Jr. and Caleb Lomavita join Moore.
- » LSU's Dylan Crews is the most recent winner of the Golden Spikes Award, earning the prestigious honor after helping lead the Tigers to a College World Series title in 2023 ... he joins an elite group of recent winners including Ivan Melendez (2022), Kevin Kopps (2021), Adley Rutschman (2019), Andrew Vaughn (2018), Brendan McKay (2017), Kyle Lewis (2016), Andrew Benintendi (2015), A.J. Reed (2014), Kris Bryant (2013), Mike Zunino (2012), Trevor Bauer (2011), Bryce Harper (2010), Stephen Strasburg (2009), Buster Posey (2008), and David Price (2007).
- » Fan voting will again play a part in the Golden Spikes Award in 2024 ... amateur baseball fans can vote for their favorite players on GoldenSpikesAward.com, beginning on May 20 with the naming of the semifinalists ... USA Baseball will announce the finalists for the award on June 5 before naming the winner on June 23.

SASAKI HEADED TO THE FARM

- » Rintaro Sasaki, the top-ranked high school baseball player in Japan, has signed a National Letter of Intent with Stanford and will join the Cardinal program for the 2025 season.
- » The power-hitting first baseman graduated from Hanamaki-Higashi High School in March, enrolled at Stanford for the spring quarter in April, and began practicing with the program upon his arrival.
- » While he will practice with the team during the 2024 campaign, Sasaki is not expected to play in a game for the Cardinal until the 2025 season.
- » "We are excited to welcome Rintaro into our Stanford family," David Esquer said following Sasaki's signing. "He may be the most high-profile international prospect to play college baseball in the United States in a long time. His power bat plays right into our style of play, and we look forward to him contributing immediately to help us achieve our goals of competing for and winning national titles."
- » Sasaki hit a Japanese high school record 140 home runs, and was projected to be selected first overall in the Nippon Professional Baseball Draft, but forewent the Draft to attend Stanford.
- » According to scouts, in addition to boasting elite raw power, Sasaki has also shown an advanced approach at the plate - walking twice as many times as he struck out
- » Training under his father, Hiroshi Sasaki, Sasaki posted an impressive slash line of .413/.514/.808 during his high school career.
- » Shohei Ohtani also starred for Hanamaki-Higashi (while being coached by the elder Sasaki) before signing with the Hokkaido Nippon-Ham Fighters.
- » Helping to blaze a trail for Japanese high school players looking to play in the United States, Sasaki chose to attend Stanford, which has made three consecutive trips to the College World Series, for the quality of education and to take steps toward achieving his dream of playing in Major League Baseball.

BATTLE TESTED IN THE POSTSEASON

- » Stanford won three consecutive elimination games, including defeating #25 Texas A&M twice, to advance out of the Stanford Regional last year.
- » 2023 marked the fourth consecutive regional that Stanford has played a winner-take-all game, advancing in all four (2019, 2021, 2022, 2023).
- » Once again playing with its back to the wall, Stanford dropped the opener of a super regional with Texas only to win the next two elimination games.
- » The Cardinal had a similar path in 2022, dropping the opener to Connecticut before winning the final two games to advance to Omaha.
- » Having won five elimination games in each of the last two seasons, Stanford has now won 14 straight postseason elimination games played at Sunken Diamond dating back to the 2019 regional and is 12-0 all-time in winner-take-all postseason games played at home.

REPEAT REGIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

- » Having guided Stanford back to Omaha for the third consecutive season last year, Clarke and Elizabeth Nelson Director of Baseball David Esquer was named ABCA West Region Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.
- » Esquer, the 2023 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, guided Stanford to a 44-20 overall record and a 23-7 mark in the Pac-12 en route to an appearance in the 2023 College World Series - the 19th in program history and third under his command.
- » The Cardinal also claimed the Pac-12 regular season title for the second consecutive season and third time with Esquer at the helm (2018, 2022-23).
- » Through six seasons at Stanford, Esquer has compiled a 226-92 overall record to post a .711 winning percentage - the highest percentage of any coach in Stanford baseball history.
- » Having completed his 24th season as a Division I head coach, Esquer carries a 751-559-2 career record.
- » Including a selection in each of the last two seasons, the region coach of the year honor is the third for Esquer after winning the award in 2011 while at California.

REPPING THE RED, WHITE AND BLUE

- » Malcolm Moore and Matt Scott were invited to participate in the 2023 Collegiate National Team Training Camp following the conclusion of the season a year ago.
- » Following the four-game intrasquad series played at the National Training Complex in Cary, North Carolina, Moore earned a spot on the U.S. roster.
- » Kathy Wolff Assistant Baseball Coach Thomas Eager also donned the Red, White and Blue, serving as the team's pitching coach.
- » Team USA concluded its CNT campaign with a 7-3 overall mark that included a five-game sweep of Chinese Taipei in the International Friendship Series.
- » Moore batted .188 with four runs scored and a double while playing in six games and starting four for the U.S.

2023 SEASON IN REVIEW

- » Stanford went 44-20 overall and 23-7 in the Pac-12 to win back-to-back conference regular season titles and punch a third consecutive ticket to the College World Series.
- » The Cardinal finished the season ranked No. 4 in the nation according to D1Baseball.
- » Stanford won five of the last eight games, 17 of the last 24, 20 of 28, 21 of 30, and 22 of 32 overall.
- » Stanford made its 19th College World Series appearance (38th postseason appearance overall), including its third consecutive trip to Omaha ... 19 appearances are seventh-most in the nation.
- » The Cardinal hosted a regional for the 21st time in program history this year and won a bracket featuring No. 25 Texas A&M, Cal State Fullerton and San Jose State to advance to the super regionals.
- » Stanford won three straight elimination games in the regional, including defeating #25 Texas A&M twice, before winning two more against Texas in the super regional to punch a ticket to Omaha ... also won five elimination games in 2022 to advance to Omaha.
- » The Cardinal hosted a super regional for the seventh time in program history and improved to 14-4 in super regional games played at Sunken Diamond while advancing to the College World Series in all seven seasons hosting a super regional.
- » The back-to-back Pac-12 crowns, running Stanford's overall total to 21 conference championships, were the first for Stanford since 2003 and 2004 ... Stanford is the first team to win consecutive Pac-12 titles since Oregon State in 2013 and 2014.
- » Stanford hit .316 as a team (first in Pac-12 and 10th nationally) and scored 8.36 runs per game to place second in the Pac-12 (17th nationally) ... ranked first in the conference and 10th nationally in home runs (117) and was second (10th nationally) in slugging percentage (.539) ... also led the Pac-12 in hits while ranking third in the nation (745) ... ranked second in the Pac-12 (32nd nationally) in on-base percentage (.403) and paced the Pac-12 (14th in the nation) in strikeouts per game (10.47) while registering a program-record 671 strikeouts to lead the Pac-12 and rank sixth in the nation.

CARDINAL CLEANS UP 2023 PAC-12 YEARLY AWARDS

- » Stanford captured four of the five major Pac-12 yearly awards in addition to the batting champion in 2023 - with David Esquer named Coach of the Year, Alberto Rios winning Player of the Year, Quinn Mathews winning Pitcher of the Year and Malcolm Moore taking home Freshman of the Year ... Tommy Troy won the batting title after hitting .404 in the regular season.
- » In addition to the yearly award winners, 12 Cardinal players earned All-Pac-12 honors.
- » Troy (3B) and Graham (1B) also found themselves on the Pac-12 All-Defensive team.
- » Rios was the first Pac-12 Player of the Year from Stanford since Jed Lowrie in 2004 ... it was the ninth selection in Stanford history.
- » Stanford has won three consecutive Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year awards, as Mathews follows Brendan Beck (2021) and Alex Williams (2022) ... the Cardinal has claimed 10 Pitcher of the Year selections in program history.
- » Moore became the sixth Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in program history, including the second consecutive after Braden Montgomery was lauded in 2022.
- » 2023 marked the third Coach of the Year selection for Esquer while at Stanford (2018, 2022) ... it was the 12th time in program history (Mark Marquess - nine times) ... Esquer had previously captured Pac-10 Coach of the Year while at California in 2001.

2023 SUPER REGIONAL RECAP

- » The Cardinal came back to win a three-game super regional over Texas to advance to the College World Series.
- » Stanford took a 5-2 lead into the ninth inning, but could not hold on and fell 7-5 to the Longhorns Saturday in the first game.
- » Making his final career home appearance from Sunken Diamond, senior Quinn Mathews struck out 16 Texas hitters in a complete game effort to guide Stanford to an 8-3 victory over Texas in a must-win game on Sunday to keep the season alive.
- » Mathews threw 156 pitches to finish what he started, allowing three runs on eight hits and just one walk to accompany the career-best 16 strikeouts.
- » The strikeout total eclipsed his previous career high of 13 set on April 6, 2023 at California ... the native of Aliso Viejo, Calif. struck out two in the first, two in the second, one in the third, the side in the fourth, two more in the fifth, one in the sixth, two in the seventh, two in the eighth and the first batter in the ninth - becoming the first Cardinal pitcher to strike out 16 since Jason Young on March 5, 1999 vs. Arizona State.
- » With two outs and the game knotted at 6-6 in the bottom of the ninth inning on Monday, junior Drew Bowser lifted a fly ball to right-center field that was lost in the lights and fell for a walk-off RBI single as Stanford punched a third consecutive ticket to the College World Series by way of a 7-6 victory over Texas in a winner-take-all super regional game.
- » Bowser homered in all three games against Texas, batting .308 with four runs scored and six RBIs.
- » Freshman catcher Malcolm Moore hit .500 (6-for-12) with four runs scored, two doubles, a homer and five RBIs. Braden Montgomery (.462, 2 R, 2B, 2 RBIs), Eddie Park (.385, R, 2 RBIs) and Temo Becerra (.375, 2 R, 2 2B, RBI) each contributed big hits offensively in the series.

2023 STANFORD REGIONAL WRAP

- » The Cardinal went 4-1 from the Stanford Regional, including winning three consecutive elimination games, to advance to the super regional round.
- » Stanford hit .331 in the regional, scoring 44 runs while compiling eight doubles, a triple, 11 homers and 43 RBIs.
- » The Cardinal opened the postseason with a 13-2 victory over San Jose State Friday before dropping the 1-0 game to #25 Texas A&M 8-5 on Saturday night.
- » Facing elimination and needing two wins on Sunday, Stanford rallied for 6-5 and 13-5 wins over Cal State Fullerton and Texas A&M, respectively.
- » Meeting the Aggies in a winner-take-all game on Monday night, the Cardinal turned in a complete effort en route to posting a 7-1 win.
- » Following the regional, six Cardinal players were named to the All-Stanford Regional Team - junior Tommy Troy was named the Most Valuable Player, while Quinn Mathews, Malcolm Moore, Braden Montgomery, Eddie Park and Nick Dugan all earned spots on the team.
- » Troy hit .571 (12-for-21) with seven runs scored, a double, three homers and 11 RBIs in the Stanford Regional.
- » Park batted .409 (9-for-22) with eight runs scored, a homer and four RBIs.
- » Montgomery connected for a pair of homers while batting .318 (7-for-22) with five runs scored, a double and four RBIs.
- » Moore also launched two home runs and added a double while driving in five.
- » Mathews made two appearances and earned a pair of victories while pitching to a 1.64 ERA with 12 strikeouts in 11 innings during the Stanford Regional.
- » Dugan pitched in both elimination games on Sunday, collecting a victory and a save while allowing just one run on seven hits with six strikeouts over 7 1/3 innings to post a 1.23 ERA.

PUT UP HISTORIC NUMBERS

- » Stanford hit 117 home runs through 64 games last year - an average of 1.83 per game.
- » The Cardinal fell one homer shy of the program record of 118 set in 2022.
- » Stanford's .316 team average was the best for the Cardinal in a single season since the 2004 squad hit .324.
- » Stanford also drove in the third-most runs in program history (511) while compiling the third-most total bases (1,269).
- » Tommy Troy's .394 average was the best for a Cardinal in a season since Jed Lowrie hit .399 during the 2004 season.
- » Stanford's 145 doubles were the most since the 2003 squad managed 156 ... Alberto Rios managed 24 doubles - the third-most in program history and the most since Chris Minaker had 25 in 2005.
- » The Cardinal boasted six players with 10 or more home runs a year (Rios - 18; Montgomery - 17; Troy - 17; Graham - 15; Moore - 15; Bowser - 14)
- » Stanford's 671 strikeouts were the most for a Cardinal pitching staff in program history, surpassing the 605 from 1999.
- » Quinn Mathews led the way on the hill, striking out 158 batters - second only to Jason Young's 178 from 1999 in program history.

BASEBALL COACHING ENDOWMENT CELEBRATES KATHY WOLFF

- » Thanks to a gift from an anonymous donor family, an endowed assistant coach position pays tribute to Kathy Wolff - a longtime administrative associate for more than two decades to Stanford's baseball and women's volleyball programs.
- » Thomas Eager was named the inaugural Kathy Wolff Assistant Baseball Coach prior to the start of the 2022 season.
- » Often considered the "heart and soul" of the baseball program, Wolff was hired as an administrative assistant in the marketing department in 1985 ... the native of Palo Alto began working with the baseball program in 1987, later adding administrative duties with the women's volleyball program.
- » Wolff, who saw the Cardinal win two national championships during her first two seasons with the program, helped coordinate 11 trips to the College World Series in Omaha ... the beloved member of the Stanford Baseball family was busy coordinating another College World Series trip when she passed away on June 11, 2008 ... the Cardinal honored Wolff that year by wearing "KW" patches on its sleeves throughout the College World Series run.
- » In addition to helping the program recruit and retain the best coaching staff, the endowed assistant coaching position recognizes the influence that Wolff still has on the athletics department today ... Stanford's Department of Athletics, Physical Education and Recreation (DAPER) annually recognizes a staff member with the Kathy Wolff Award for best exemplifying her spirit—a passion for Stanford and an ongoing desire to help and support his/her colleagues ... in the week leading up to baseball season every year, the athletics department celebrates Cake Week—a time when staff members are encouraged to continue Wolff's tradition of bringing in baked goods to enjoy together.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- » Often considered one of the most beautiful college baseball facilities in the country, Klein Field at Sunken Diamond is the home to Stanford baseball.
- » The "Sunken Diamond" name comes from the excavation to provide fill for the earthen berm within which Stanford Stadium was built in 1921, leaving a large, sunken field.
- » The fixed seating capacity of Klein Field at Sunken Diamond is 2,113 ... with the addition of disabled seating and general admission lawn seating, the total capacity of the facility is 4,000.
- » The original dimensions were 360 feet to left field, 350 to right, and 500 feet to center ... in 1978, a new seven-foot high fence was installed, bringing the dimensions to the current 335 to both left and right field, and 400 to center ... the outfield fence was increased to 10 feet in 1995.
- » Sunken Diamond features ample foul ground from first to third base, with home plate sitting approximately 70 feet from the backstop.

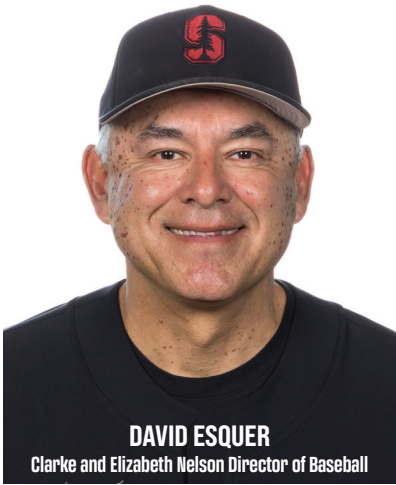

David Esquer '87 was named Stanford's Clarke and Elizabeth Nelson Director of Baseball on June 16, 2017, becoming the 21st head coach in program history.

Esquer succeeded Mark Marquess, who retired after 41 years at the helm of the program. Esquer played under Marquess on Stanford's 1987 national championship team, and served as an assistant on The Farm from 1991-96. Prior to taking over the reins at Stanford, Esquer spent the previous 18 seasons as the head coach at California, where he was the 2011 National Coach of the Year and led the Bears to five NCAA Regionals and the 2011 College World Series.

The 2024 season will be Esquer's seventh in charge of the program, having guided Stanford to the 2018, 2022 and 2023 Pac-12 Conference championships, the inaugural 2022 Pac-12 Conference Tournament championship, five NCAA Regional appearances, four NCAA Super Regional appearances, and three consecutive College World Series appearances in 2021, 2022 and 2023.

In six-plus seasons at the helm of Stanford, Esquer has amassed a 246-120 (.672) overall record - the highest winning percentage of any coach in Stanford baseball history. Esquer owns a career record of 771-587-2 through 24 seasons as a collegiate head coach. Included in the overall ledger is a 334-315 record in Pac-12 play, including a 116-57 mark while at Stanford.

Esquer has been named Pac-12 Coach of the Year four times in his career, earning the honor in 2018, 2022 and 2023 with Stanford, and in 2001 at California. The 2022 and 2023 ABCA West Region Coach of the Year won his 100th game as Stanford's head coach on March 4, 2021 as the Cardinal walked off with a 7-6 victory over San Francisco in 10 innings. His 300th career Pac-12 win came against USC on May 21, 2022 to claim sole possession of 2022 Pac-12 title, while his 700th career win came in a 5-4 triumph vs. Arizona on May 28, 2022 at the Pac-12 Tournament. Esquer added his 100th Pac-12 win at Stanford on May 7, 2023 as the Cardinal defeated No. 20 Arizona State 9-4 to sweep a three-game road series. In total as a head coach, Esquer has guided his teams to 10 postseason appearances and four College World Series berths.

Stanford made its third consecutive appearance in the College World Series in 2023, including its 19th in program history, finishing the year with a 44-20 overall record and a 23-7 mark in the Pac-12 to win the conference regular season championship for the second consecutive season. The Cardinal entered the postseason ranked No. 6 in the nation according to D1Baseball and won a regional featuring No. 25 Texas A&M, Cal State Fullerton and San Jose State to advance and host a super regional. The Cardinal won three consecutive elimination games in the regional, including defeating No. 25 Texas A&M twice, before winning two more against Texas in the super regional to punch a ticket to Omaha. The Cardinal hit .316 as a team (first in Pac-12 and 10th nationally) and averaged 8.36 runs per game while also leading the conference in home runs (117) and finishing second in slugging percentage (.539). On the pitching side, Stanford hurlers paced the Pac-12 in strikeouts per game (10.47) while registering a program-record 671 strikeouts to lead the Pac-12 and rank sixth in the nation. For the second consecutive season, Stanford cleaned up in the Pac-12 yearly award voting, capturing four of the five major Pac-12 yearly awards in addition to the batting champion in Tommy Troy. Esquer was named Coach of the Year, Alberto Rios won Player of the Year, Quinn Mathews earned Pitcher of the Year and Malcolm Moore took home Freshman of the Year. In addition to the yearly award winners, 12 Cardinal players earned All-Pac-12 honors, with Ryan Bruno, Carter Graham, Mathews, Braden Montgomery, Rios and Troy earning a spot on the first team. Five different Cardinal players earned All-America honors, including Bruno, Rios, Montgomery, Mathews and Troy, while Owen Cobb, Carter Graham and Eddie Park were named College Sports Communicators Academic All-Americans. Capping the stellar season, Esquer saw nine of his players drafted - headlined by Troy going 12th overall in the first round to the Arizona Diamondbacks.

Stanford went 47-18 overall and 21-9 in the Pac-12 to win both the Pac-12 regular season and inaugural Pac-12 Tournament championships en route to advancing to Omaha in 2022. The 47 wins were tied for eighth-most in program history. Stanford, which entered the College World Series ranked No. 1 in the nation according to Collegiate Baseball, finished the year ranked No. 5 in the D1Baseball poll. Stanford hosted a regional and won its bracket to advance to the super regionals where it defeated Connecticut - winning five elimination games during the regional and super regional rounds to advance to Omaha. Putting together one of the best runs of baseball in program history, Stanford posted a 17-game win streak from May 3 to June 3 - the longest unbeaten streak since beginning the 1998 season 16-0-1, and the longest win streak since winning a program-best 18 straight from April 16 - May 24, 1996. Just as it did in 2021, Stanford led all teams in postseason home runs, connecting for 23 of its program-record 118 long balls during the 10-game postseason run. The Cardinal ranked second in the Pac-12 in average (.309) and led the Conference in slugging (.536) and home runs (118) while hitting 71 in the last 27 games overall. On the pitching side, Stanford also led the Pac-12 in shutouts (9) - fifth-most in program history - and ranked third in ERA (4.23). Including Esquer's Pac-12 Coach of the Year selection, the Cardinal cleaned up in the Pac-12 postseason awards process, placing eight on All-Pac-12 teams and securing four of the five major Pac-12 yearly awards - with Alex Williams winning Pitcher of the Year, Adam Crampton winning Defensive Player of the Year and Braden Montgomery taking home Freshman of the Year. Williams was named a semifinalist for the 2022 College Baseball Hall of Fame National Pitcher of the Year Award and earned unanimous All-America honors, while Carter Graham and Brock Jones also earned All-America selections. Montgomery was a semifinalist for the 2022 John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year and earned Freshman All-America honors after connecting for a Stanford freshman record 18 home runs. Standouts on the field and in the classroom, Williams and Jones were named CoSIDA Academic All-Americans. Williams was also named the 2022 Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was selected as Stanford's 2021-22 Pac-12 Tom Hansen Conference Medal recipient. The Cardinal saw six players drafted in the 2022 MLB Draft - headlined by Jones being selected 65th overall in the second round by the Rays.

Stanford finished the historic 2021 season ranked No. 5 nationally according to Collegiate Baseball and in the NCBWA poll, No. 7 according to Baseball America and the USA Today Coaches poll, and No. 8 according to D1Baseball after going 39-17 and 17-10 in Pac-12 play to claim third place in the conference standings. Esquer's Cardinal dropped back-to-back games just once in 2021 and finished the year 12-1 in weekend series. Stanford won the Stanford Regional and swept a Super Regional at Texas Tech to earn the berth in Omaha. Brendan Beck was a unanimous All-American and was named 2021 Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year, while Brock Jones and Zach Grech also earned All-America honors. Eight Cardinal players claimed All-Conference recognition, while Grech also earned Pac-12 Scholar Athlete of the Year. The Cardinal's 85 home runs, including an NCAA-high 22 in the postseason, were the eighth-most in Stanford history, while the .979 fielding percentage was the third-best in program history. Three Cardinal were drafted following the 2021 season, headlined by Beck being selected 55th overall in the second round by the New York Yankees.

Stanford posted a 45-14 record in 2019 before registering a 5-11 mark in a 2020 season cut short by the COVID-19 global pandemic. The Cardinal's .763 win percentage in 2019 tied for the fifth-best in program history, while its 14 losses matched the third-fewest. Stanford finished 22-7 in Pac-12 play, claiming second place before earning its 11th Super Regional berth overall, and the first since 2014. Nine Cardinal were drafted following the 2019 season, and Maverick Handley was named Co-Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2018, his first season in charge of the program, Esquer guided Stanford to its first Pac-12 Conference title since 2004, matching a program record for fewest losses with 12 (minimum 50 games played) while picking up Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors. Stanford's 46 wins equaled the 10th-most in program history to that point, while the Cardinal's .793 winning percentage ranked second. Nine Cardinal were named All-Pac-12, and Stanford hosted an NCAA Regional for the 17th time.

Through 18 seasons at Cal, Esquer compiled a 525-467-2 (.529) overall record and mentored five MLB first-round selections. Conor Jackson was the first of the five first-round picks, selected by the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2003 before Brandon Morrow was selected fifth overall by the Seattle Mariners in 2006. David Cooper (Toronto Blue Jays, 2008) and Brett Jackson (Chicago Cubs, 2009) followed before right-hander Daulton Jefferies was drafted in 2016 by the Oakland A's.

During his time at the helm of the Cardinal program, Esquer has seen three more players selected in the first round of an MLB draft, running the total to eight in his career. Nico Hoerner was drafted 24th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 2018, while Kris Bubic was selected 40th overall by the Kansas City Royals in that same draft. Most recently, Tommy Troy was selected 12th overall by the Arizona Diamondbacks in the 2023 MLB draft.

Through 24 seasons as a collegiate head coach in the Pac-12, Esquer has seen 19 of his players garner All-America honors, 22 named All-Region, three claim Conference Player, Pitcher, and Freshman of the Year, and two more earn Conference Defensive Player of the Year.

A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, Esquer was a starter on the Cardinal's 1987 College World Series championship team. He earned all-tournament honors after hitting .350 with six RBIs in Omaha. He also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors as a senior, batting .318 with 41 RBIs and 16 stolen bases. Esquer went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore Orioles, California Angels and Milwaukee Brewers.

Following his playing career, Esquer spent six seasons as an assistant under Coach Marquess. His time as an assistant with the Cardinal included five NCAA Regional appearances and a fifth-place finish at the 1995 College World Series. In three seasons as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1997-99, Esquer was the program's chief recruiting coordinator as well as hitting instructor, infield coach and handler of the third base coaching duties.

Esquer was a three-sport star and class valedictorian at Palma High School in Salinas, Calif. He was tabbed the "Athlete of the Year" at Palma High School after being named team captain and MVP in baseball, football and basketball. Esquer earned a bachelor's degree in economics and a master's degree in sociology from Stanford in 1987. He and his wife, Lynn, have a daughter, Gabrielle, and son, Xavier.
