
2012 Cross Country Season in Review



The Stanford women's team captured third at the NCAA Championships, its highest finish in the meet since 2007.

Success and Promise

S TANFORD certainly had its share of success in cross country this season: its' best NCAA women's finish in five years, a Pac-12 individual champion in Kathy Kroeger, and an NCAA regional men's team victory.

But it's the future of the program that coach Chris Miltenberg, the Franklin P. Johnson Director of Track and Field, is most excited about.

For the Cardinal women, their third-place NCAA finish is simply another indication that they're "just beginning to scratch the surface of what they're capable," Miltenberg said. "It's a phenomenal sign of what's to come."

And for the men, team victories at the NCAA West Regional and high-caliber Wisconsin Invitational highlighted a season that finished in disappointing fashion, with a 16th place at nationals in Louis"Let's be the team that doesn't wait for things to be perfect. ville, Ky. But the season offered a heavy dose of promise, with only two seniors graduating from its top seven.

"The results at NCAAs aren't indicative of all the progress we made and all the things that we can take from the season that will make us better next year," Miltenberg said. "The biggest thing to remember is we were counting on some younger guys that are still getting experience."

If the season seemed like a whirlwind to Miltenberg, it's for good reason. Miltenberg, who

coached the Georgetown women to an NCAA team title in 2011, began coaching at Stanford the day after the team reported. The first meet took place only five days after he was hired.

"I feel like I came in here very late in the game," Miltenberg said. "I was jumping right into the fire."

His first goal was simply to observe – to watch, learn, and listen. Then, he tailored his coaching to the needs of each program.

For the men, "We had a bunch of young guys who had the luxury of being behind great leaders the last couple of years, guys like Chris Derrick, Elliott Heath and Jake Riley," Miltenberg said. "The guys had to learn how to be dependable and disciplined enough every day and not go along for the ride with the great guys that graduated before. That was a completely new

Continued, from previous page thing for them. It was taking responsibility for this team and taking ownership of it."

For the women, "It was really working on coming together as a team. We had a lot of great individuals, we had a lot of high goals, but we really got better throughout the season because by working together as a team. They learned how to train together and lift each other up, and you saw the result at NCAA's."

The individual highlight was the performance of Kroeger at the Pac-12 meet. After runner-up finishes the previous two years, Kroeger overcame a 10-second deficit during the late stages to run down the leaders during the final stretch, including Oregon runner-up Jordan Hasay, to win the 6-kilometer race in 20:06 at the Robinson Ranch Golf Course in Santa Clarita, Calif.

But Kroeger's performances in her next two races, though they weren't victories, were just as impressive to Miltenberg and served as a good lesson for the rest of the Cardinal. In both races, Kroeger exhibited the effort that the coach seeks from his athletes – a perseverance when things aren't going especially well.

Kroeger was on her own for much of the final stages of the regional – a difficult spot without the benefit of help from other runners – and pushed hard for third place, while helping her team to second.

At the NCAA meet, Kroeger was unable to maintain contact with the lead pack and fell off the pace. But in the midst of a difficult race, she continued to fight and finished 24th, close behind sophomore Aisling Cuffe in 21st and just in front of freshman Cayla Hatton (28th) and Jessica Tonn (43rd).

"The thing I was most proud of with Kathy is she ran a really solid race when things weren't going perfectly," Miltenberg said. "And that's been probably the biggest thing I've preached with both these

teams. Let's be the team that doesn't wait for things to be perfect. Let's be the team that embraces adversity.

"That's what separates the good ones from the great ones. Everyone can do well when they're going great and they feel great. What separates them is if they can go out and run really tough when they're not at their best."

Stanford was the only women's team to place its top four among the top 43 runners at NCAA's. The Cardinal got a boost from fourth-year junior Justine Fedronic, Stanford's 800-meter record-holder, who was fifth on the team in only the second cross-country meet of her collegiate career.

The strength of the men was its ability to run as a team. At the West Regional, the Cardinal's top six finished within 20 seconds of each other and all were among the first 13 finishers as the Cardinal scored 45 points and won its third regional title in four years.

Miltenberg challenged his young runners. Sophomore twins Joe and Jim Rosa took it to heart. Of the team's five main meets, Joe Rosa led the Cardinal in three of them, including placing fourth at regionals and sixth at Pac-12s.

Jim Rosa ran No. 1 at the Wisconsin Invitational and senior Benjamin Johnson led the Cardinal at NCAA's.

"I think about what I know about this group now compared to $2\frac{1}{2}$ months ago and it's a night and day difference," Miltenberg said. "I feel I've got a great handle on where we're at and a vision of where we're going to go. Now I've got a lot of work to do to help us get there."
