THE OPENING KICKOFF

- Stanford plays its second home game in as many weeks when it hosts Cal Poly on Saturday afternoon inside Stanford Stadium.
- The Cardinal opened the 2024 season on Aug. 30 against TCU, falling 34-27 to the Horned Frogs. That loss is the first Friday loss in three games in the Troy Taylor era for Stanford.
- Elic Ayomanor picked up right where he left off following a breakout 2023 season. He led Stanford in receiving in its Week 1 game against TCU, with seven receptions for 102 yards, his fourth 100-yard receiving game of his career (13 games). His 102 yards were the seventh most in the ACC in Week 1.
- Stanford's defense is starting to show signs of making big plays. Dating back to last season, the Cardinal defense has forced seven turnovers in its last three games, including a pair of forced fumbles in the season opener against TCU. During that same span, Stanford is +3 in the turnover battle.
- Another sign of improvement from the defense came against the run. Stanford limited TCU to just 104 yards on the ground, good for only 3.1 yards

- per carry. Those numbers contrast to the 2023 Card defense allowing 163.7 rushing yards per game in 2023 with 4.7 yards per carry.
- The Cardinal got off to a fast start against TCU, scoring a touchdown on its opening drive and holding a 17-10 lead at halftime. The opening drive touchdown was the team's first since its 2023 home opener against Sacramento State. The team's halftime lead was its first since Sept. 23, 2023 against Arizona.
- Saturday afternoon marks a pair of firsts for Stanford football: its first matchup against Cal Poly, and its first appearance on ACCNX. The Mustangs opened the season with a 27-21 loss to San Diego on Aug. 31. Despite returning a fumble for a touchdown, Mustangs quarterback Bo Kelly threw three interceptions, including two that were returned for touchdowns.
- Stanford is attempting to win its first home game under Troy Taylor. The team is 0-8 at home, with its most recent home win coming on Oct. 22, 2022 against Arizona State.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.

2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.

3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.

4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final

five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.

2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.

3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.

4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).

5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.

6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

GAME NOTES

THE MATCHUP

- Stanford and Cal Poly meet for the first time on Saturday afternoon.
- The Cardinal lost its most recent matchup against an FCS school, dropping a tilt to Sacramento State last season on Sept. 16 by a final score of 30-23. This snapped an unbeaten streak against FCS schools going back to 2005.
- By being at home for the second week in a row, Stanford concludes a stretch of nine out of 12 games at home, going back to last year's home opener against the Hornets.
- Among other notables, Stanford has not won a day game in the Troy Taylor era but will have a chance to do so on Saturday.
- Cal Poly will not see another FBS team on its schedule in 2024. The Mustangs have not won against an FBS opponent since Sept. 15, 2012 when they beat Wyoming 24-22.

THIS DATE IN STANFORD HISTORY...

...the Cardinal opened the 2013 season with a 34-13 win over San Jose State, kick-starting a season that saw Stanford win the Pac-12 and appear in the 2014 Rose Bowl Game, the 100th installment of the game. Tyler Gaffney led a strong ground game for Stanford, putting up 104 rushing yards and a pair of scores. Kevin Hogan threw for two touchdowns, while Trent Murphy helped lead the defense with two sacks. Murphy finished 2013 with 15 sacks, tied for the second most in a single season in Stanford history.

HEAD COACH TROY TAYLOR

Troy Taylor is in his second season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2024.

During his first season, the program improved in several key areas. The Stanford offense held onto the ball at a far greater rate, ranking top-40 in the NCAA in time of possession (31:17) while cutting down its turnover margin by nine. Explosive plays were much more common as well, with twice as many 40+-yard passing plays as 2022, the most for the team since 2019. The Cardinal went 3-2 on the road, posting its first winning record away from The Farm in a non-COVID season since 2018.

In his Stanford debut, Taylor became the 23rd head coach in program history to win his coaching debut, as the Cardinal defeated Hawai'i on the road 37-24. In the victory, the Stanford defense recorded six sacks for the first time since 2018.

The Cardinal also produced the largest comeback win in program history during his first season on The Farm, beating Colorado 46-43 in double overtime after trailing 29-0 at halftime. It is the fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history, the second-largest road comeback in Pac-12 history, and featured the most points (46) scored in a half in Stanford history. Elic Ayomanor set the Stanford single-game receiving record with 294

receiving yards in the victory. Two weeks later against No. 5 Washington, Ashton Daniels produced the second most yards in a single game by a Stanford quarterback (448) in program history.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

OFF THE COACHING CAROUSEL

It's rare to find collegiate staffs with complete continuity, but that is what Stanford has achieved heading into the 2024 season. With Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football Troy Taylor returning for his second season, the entire coaching staff is back for year two on The Farm. Stanford is one of seven programs in the country to return its entire staff, joining Utah, Liberty, Louisville, NC State, Wake Forest, and Florida State.

FIRST CAREER SCORES

The first two touchdowns of 2024 represented first-career scores by two Cardinal wide receivers. Jackson Harris capped off the first drive of the season with a three-yard touchdown reception on third and goal. In the second quarter, Ismael Cisse caught a two-yard dart from Justin Lamson on a fourth and goal for a touchdown. Not only was the Cisse touchdown his first career score, but it was also the first career passing touchdown by Justin Lamson.

DYNAMIC DUO

Stanford's receiving room came alive in 2023 thanks to the breakout performances from Elic Ayomanor and Tiger Bachmeier.

As the two primary receiving options for Stanford quarterbacks, Ayomanor and Bachmeier combined for 1,422 receiving yards in 2023. That mark was the most receiving yards by a freshman duo in the NCAA.

USING THE LEGS

We saw Stanford quarterbacks run a lot in 2023, and that trend looks like it will continue in 2024. Ashton Daniels was the team's leading rusher in Week 1, and put up some of the biggest rushing numbers by a quarterback.

Daniels finished the TCU game with 17 rushes for 87 yards, the fifth-most rushing yards in a game by a Stanford quarterback. Few FBS quarterbacks were as involved as Daniels running the football, as his 17 carries are tied for the ninth most by a quarterback and his 87 rushing yards are the seventh most by a quarterback this season.

Against the Horned Frogs, 19 of the team's 37 rushing attempts were by quarterbacks. Freshman running back Micah Ford had the most carries by a running back with 10.

ANCHORS OF THE DEFENSE

Stanford enters the 2024 season with some of the best experience at linebacker in the ACC. The Cardinal returns both starting middle linebackers from 2023 in Tristan Sinclair and Gaethan Bernadel, and both are expected to be near the top of the conference in tackles when the season ends.

Sinclair returns for his sixth season on The Farm. He was named All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention following a career year that saw Sinclair set career highs in tackles (71) and tackles for loss (5). Following the season, he was named the team's Al Masters Award recipient, given to the player who displays the highest degree of leadership and respect of his teammates.

Bernadel made an immediate impact after transferring from FIU. He paced the Cardinal in tackles with 87, a mark that ranked sixth in the Pac-12. He recorded at least 10 tackles in a game on four occasions, good enough to earn Third Team All-Pac-12 honors from Phil Steele following the year.

Both played big roles against TCU. Bernadel led the team with 10 tackles while Sinclair recorded the team's only sack.

RECENT DRAFT SUCCESS

The Cardinal has had 56 draft picks since 2010, second-most by a West Coast school behind only USC. Stanford is tied for 14th nationally with nine consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 21 Academic All-Americans in that span is the most among FBS schools.

Since 2000, the number of draft picks to come out of Stanford is fourth among current ACC schools with 86, trailing only Miami, Florida State, and Clemson. In the 2024 NFL Draft, the Cardinal saw Joshua Karty get drafted by the Los Angeles Rams in the sixth round. He became the 281st all-time player to be drafted out of Stanford, and the first specialist since Jake Bailey in 2019.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

THE COMEBACK AT COLORADO

Stanford turned in a comeback for the ages during its road game against the Colorado Buffaloes on Oct. 13. Down 29-0 at halftime, the Cardinal came roaring back to win 46-43 in double overtime.

Some notable facts about the historic road win by the Cardinal:

- Largest comeback win in Stanford football history.
- Biggest blown lead in Colorado football history.
- Largest halftime deficit overcome in a victory in Pac-12 history.
- Second-largest road comeback win in Pac-12 history.
- Fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history.

MIND YOUR (AYO)MANOR

No player had a more significant role in Stanford's dramatic come-from-behind win at Colorado on October 13 than sophomore wide receiver Elic Ayomanor. His performance was one for the record books, and it received a lot of attention on social media.

Ayomanor was held without a catch in the first half, but finished the game with 13 receptions for 294 yards and three touchdowns. All of those numbers were career-bests, and it lands Ayomanor at or near the top of the record book in several single-game categories:

- Most receiving yards in a game in Stanford history, surpassing the previous mark of 278 yards by Troy Walters on September 25, 1999.
- Tied for the second-most receptions in a game by a Cardinal receiver since 2000, trailing only Simi Fehoko's 16 catches on December 19, 2020.
- First game with three receiving touchdowns by a Card since Simi Fehoko on December 19, 2020, one shy of tying the Stanford single-game record.

GAME NOTES

FRESHMAN FLAVOR

2023 was a season of development for the Cardinal. 20 players made their collegiate debuts in 2023 and 18 made their first career starts.

Stanford had 2,112 snaps taken by freshmen in Coach Taylor's first season on The Farm, the seventh most freshmen snaps in the FBS. Four ACC teams were included on the list, including the top three teams: Clemson, South Carolina, and Miami.

That trend continued in Week 1 against TCU. Stanford started true freshman Micah Ford at running back and he saw 45 offensive snaps. In total, 142 offensive snaps were taken by Stanford freshmen against the Horned Frogs.

RETURNING PRODUCTION

While youth will be a theme of the Cardinal in 2024, returning experience is on its side heading into the new college football season.

Bill Connelly of ESPN put out a final list of returning production rankings in advance of the new season, measuring the percentage of offensive and defensive production each team in the country returns from 2023. Stanford ranks second in all of college football, returning roughly 85% of its production from last year. Only Iowa State (86%) ranks higher.

Stanford ranks fourth in the country in returning offensive production, bringing back 90% of its offense from 2023. Defensively, the Cardinal is eighth in the nation at 81% of its defensive production returning. This comes as a result of Stanford returning 19 of its 22 starters from a year ago, compared to losing 17 of its 22 starters prior to the start of Troy Taylor's first season.

DOUBLE BYE WEEKS

The Stanford football schedule features an oddity that has not existed in several seasons: two in-season bye weeks.

Over a 12-game regular season schedule, most teams have a bye week in-season and most schools have Week 0 off. While Stanford still has Week 0 off in 2024, it has multiple in-season bye weeks for the first time since 2019.

The Cardinal is off on Week 3 of the college football season, after opening the year against TCU and Cal Poly at home. The team's first bye week precedes consecutive road games at Syracuse and Clemson. Stanford's second bye week comes in Week 11 after its final East Coast game of the season at NC State.

In 2019, Stanford had in-season bye weeks in Week 7 and 10, but did not win the game following its bye week in either instance. Since 2017, Stanford is just 2-6 following an in-season bye week. Its most recent win after an in-season bye week was last year at Colorado.

GETTIN' DOWN ON THE FARM

By opening the 2024 season with home games against TCU and Cal Poly, Stanford is capping off a stretch of playing nine home games over a 12-game span, dating back to Week 3 of the 2023 season. Stanford closed out 2023 by playing seven of its final 10 games at home. By comparison, after two home games to open 2024, the Cardinal ends the season with six of its final 10 games on the road.

ROAD WARRIORS

During the first season under head coach Troy Taylor, Stanford found a lot of success when playing away from The Farm. The Cardinal finished the year 3-2 on the road, securing a winning record.

In two of the team's three road wins, Stanford was not leading entering the fourth quarter (trailing at Colorado, tied at Washington State). By winning both of those games, Stanford had a road winning streak in the middle of a season for the first time since 2020.

The last time Stanford had a winning record on the road in a non-COVID-19 shortened season came in 2018, when Stanford went 4-2 on the road.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

There is a rich tradition of Stanford success in the NFL, and that tradition is still alive entering the 2024 NFL season. There are actively 30 former Cardinal signed with NFL organizations, including a few prominent players. Notably, no Stanford players were cut heading into Week 1 of the NFL season.

Christian McCaffrey is at the top of the list. He has become one of the most valuable players in the league following his trade from the Carolina Panthers to the San Francisco 49ers in 2022. His performance reached new levels in 2023, leading the NFL in rushing yards (1,459) and scoring 21 touchdowns en route to winning the league's Offensive Player of the Year award.

During the season, McCaffrey tied a 60-year-old NFL record for the most consecutive games with a touchdown by scoring in 17 straight games, tying the mark that Lenny Moore set from 1963-64. McCaffrey reached Super Bowl LVIII with San Francisco and was in the conversation for Super Bowl MVP after compiling 160 yards from scrimmage and one touchdown.

One of the best tacklers in the league is a former Cardinal. Bobby Okereke joined the New York Giants last season and finished ninth in the NFL in total tackles with 149. He also set career highs in forced fumbles (4.5), sacks (2.5) and tied a career-best with two interceptions.

Paulson Adebo was one of the leaders of a solid New Orleans Saints defense last season, tying for seventh in the league with four interceptions. The third-year cornerback also set a career-high with 76 tackles and 18 passes defended, more than doubling his career numbers in that department.

Staying on the defensive side of the ball, Justin Reid became the 19th former Cardinal to appear in multiple Super Bowls by roaming the secondary for the Kansas City Chiefs in Super Bowl LVIII against McCaffrey and the 49ers. With the Chiefs win, he became the fourth Stanford alum to win back-to-back Super Bowls, joining John Elway, Darrien Gordon, and Ed McCaffrey, who all did it with the 1997-98 Denver Broncos.

Several former Card tight ends switched teams in the offseason. Zach Ertz joins the Washington Commanders in advance of his 12th season in the league. Another member of Tight End U, Austin Hooper, heads east and joins the New England Patriots. A third tight end swapped teams, with Colby Parkinson joining Joshua Karty with the Los Angeles Rams.

Andrus Peat (Las Vegas Raiders), Casey Toohill (Buffalo Bills), and Kendall Williamson (Buffalo Bills) all joined new squads in the offseason.

EATING UP THE CLOCK

One of the keys to success on the offensive side of the ball is time of possession, and Stanford excelled in that area under new head coach Troy Taylor. Stanford ranked 30th in the NCAA in average time of possession, holding onto the ball an average of 31:17 per game.

The only team in the Pac-12 that was better at staying on the field than the Cardinal was Utah, which led the country in time of possession. In eight of 12 games last season, Stanford won the time of possession battle, and the Card also did so in all three of its wins.

ALL ABOUT THE ACC

The ACC has seen a lot of recent success at the NFL level, and that success was on full display at the end of the 2023 NFL season. Lamar Jackson (Louisville QB 2015-17) was named the NFL's Most Valuable Player for the second time in his career. In doing so, Jackson became the first NFL player to win multiple MVP awards and the Heisman Trophy. The only athlete from the Big 4 (NFL, NBA, MLB, NHL) to win a collegiate Player of the Year award as a teenager and multiple MVP awards prior to turning 28 is Kareem Abdul-Jabbar.

On the same night, the Pro Football Hall of Fame announced its Class of 2024, and there is a heavy ACC flair. Of the seven inducted in August, four came from ACC schools. Devin Hester and Andre Johnson were both drafted out of Miami, Dwight Freeney from Syracuse, and Julius Peppers from North Carolina.

COAST TO COAST

Stanford is not unfamiliar with leaving the West Coast for games, with the program's first game on the East Coast coming in 1928. Trips outside of the West Coast will be more frequent with Stanford in the ACC moving forward.

Stanford's first game at least three time zones away came on December 1, 1928 when the Cardinal beat Army 26-0. Since that first "long-distance" game, Stanford is

21-36-2 all-time when playing with at least a three-hour time difference from the Bay Area. That breaks down to 17-35-2 in the Eastern Time Zone, 3-1 in Hawaii, and 1-0 in Australia.

Travel has not been a struggle for the Cardinal as of late, as Stanford is 8-4 over its last 12 games when playing with at least a three-hour time difference from home (dating back to 2010).

Stanford has never played more than three "long-distance" games in a season, which came during the 1976 season. With trips to Syracuse, Clemson, Notre Dame, and NC State in 2024, this will be the first time the Cardinal plays in the Eastern Time Zone four times in one year.

If all six road games are counted, the total mileage for Stanford football during the 2024 season would be 21,207 miles. This includes two local road games at California and San Jose State.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

There are several metrics used to determine strength of schedules around college football. No matter which way it's analyzed, Stanford's 2024 schedule leans on the tougher side.

In the final season of the Pac-12, Stanford played all five teams that were ranked inside the top-25 of the AP Poll in the Pac-12 and had six ranked teams on the schedule. That differs at the onset of the 2024 season, where the Cardinal play three teams that are ranked in the top-25 of the AP Preseason Poll.

Going off last season's win-loss records, Stanford has the 34th-most difficult schedule in college football in 2024. That figures to be the fifth-hardest in the ACC, trailing Miami, Boston College, Virginia, and Georgia Tech (most challenging). Last year, Stanford's schedule wound up being the 17th-hardest, and the third-hardest in the Pac-12.

All three of Stanford's currently ranked opponents come in road games: Sept. 28 at No. 14 Clemson, Oct. 12 at No. 7 Notre Dame, and Nov. 2 at No. 24 NC State.

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 28 states, plus Canada.

There are a total of 14 student-athletes from Texas, the largest representation of student-athletes from outside of California (31) on the team. Behind Texas is Georgia (8), Florida (7), and New Jersey (6).

Three student-athletes are from Canada (Elic Ayomanor, Brendan Delaney, Benedict Umeh).

GERHART'S GREATNESS

On January 8, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame announced Toby Gerhart as a member of the 2024 College Football Hall of Fame Class, becoming the 20th Cardinal to join the College Hall of Fame.

Arriving to The Farm in 2006, Gerhart burst onto the national scene in 2008 by setting the Stanford single-season rushing record with 1,136 yards, becoming the fifth running back in school history to eclipse 1,000 yards in a season. He also added 15 touchdowns, which were the second most in program history.

That was just a drop in the bucket for what the 2009 season had in store for Gerhart, as he rewrote the Stanford rushing records completely. He compiled 1,871 rushing yards and 28 rushing touchdowns, both of which led the FBS and became new Stanford single-season records.

His historic 2009 season came with a whole host of awards and accolades, including a runner-up finish in the 2009 Heisman Trophy voting. He was named the Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Year, a unanimous First Team All-American, and won the Archie Griffin Award, Jim Brown Trophy, Doak Walker Award, and the Tom Hansen Medal.

In his four seasons on The Farm, Gerhart amassed 3,522 rushing yards as a Cardinal, the second most by a Stanford rusher in program history at the time of his graduation (now ranks fifth). He ran in 44 touchdowns, all but one of which came in his final two seasons, which are still the most in Stanford history. He also remains the Stanford all-time leader in 100-yard rushing games with 20, 11 of which came during the 2009 season.

A 2010 graduate of Stanford with a bachelor's degree in management science and engineering, Gerhart came back to the Farm to earn his Master of Business Administration degree in 2020. He was twice named to the All-Pac-10 Academic Team and was awarded by the Stanford football program with the Al Masters Award, given annually to the player who attains the highest standards of performance, academics, and leadership.

Gerhart will be the second Cardinal in the last three seasons inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame, with Andrew Luck being inducted in 2022. Gerhart becomes the seventh back in Stanford history to earn an induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, joining Ernie Nevers, Bobby Grayson, Bones Hamilton, Hugh Gallarneau, Monk Monscrip, and Darrin Nelson.

TAYLOR JOINS STANFORD HOF

The Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame will welcome 10 former student-athletes later this fall, including the

leading rusher in Stanford history, Stepfán Taylor.

The Class of 2024 includes Nick Amuchastegui (wrestling), Maya DiRado Andrews (women's swimming and diving), Annika Dries (women's water polo), Matt Fuerbringer (men's volleyball), Teresa Noyola (women's soccer), Chinenye Ogwumike (women's basketball), Carlos Quentin (baseball), Patrick Rodgers (men's golf), Katerina Stefanidi (women's track and field) and Stepfán Taylor (football).

Taylor was a member of four bowl teams, highlighted by victories in the 2010 Orange Bowl and 2012 Rose Bowl Game. He is the school record holder in career rushing yards (4,300), rushing attempts (843) and total touchdowns (45). He was selected in the fifth round of the 2013 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals and spent four seasons in the league.

HISTORIC 2024 OLYMPICS

Stanford concluded the 2024 Paris Olympic Games with a school-record 39 medals, shattering its previous best while cementing its reputation on the world's biggest stage as the nation's top collegiate program.

Boasting a school-record 59 Olympians with Cardinal ties, Stanford surpassed its all-time medals benchmark (27 overall at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Games) while winning at least 20 medals for the sixth time in school history (2020, 2016, 2008, 1996, 1924). Additionally, Stanford has won 128 medals combined over the last five Summer Games.

Stanford's haul of 39 medals (12 gold, 14 silver, 13 bronze) is the most by any school at one Olympics. Counting medals won as part of the same relay, boat or team as one collective medal, Cardinal athletes accounted for 27 event medals at the 2024 Paris Games. If Stanford was a country, it would have finished tied with Canada for 11th place.

For the third consecutive edition of the Games, Stanford also totaled more Team USA selections (37) than any other school, accumulating 36 Team USA medals and reinforcing its status as the preeminent training ground for national team competition.

Stanford's affiliates have captured 335 overall medals (162 gold, 93 silver, 80 bronze) from 196 medalists. The Cardinal has produced at least one medalist in every Olympics in which the U.S. has competed since 1912.

The Cardinal's 59 Olympians (20 male, 39 female) represented 14 countries across 20 varsity sports. Included among Stanford's contingent were 14 current student-athletes, 44 former student-athletes and one other institutional affiliate.

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 48 academic years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), the longest streak in NCAA history. Stanford leads the NCAA with 136 team titles, including two

national team championships during the 2023-24 campaign - men's gymnastics and women's golf- increasing its overall total to 167.

Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.

From 1994-2021, Stanford won 25 straight Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cups. The Cardinal enters the 2024-25 year with 26 of the 30 total Directors' Cups, most recently capturing the elusive award during the 2022-23 season.

STANFORD SCORIGAMI

Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that has taken over social media in recent years. Scorigami tracks final scores that have never happened before, initially in the NFL, and now for Stanford football. Through Week 1 of the 2024 season, there have been 714 unique scores in Stanford football history. The following are the Stanford Scorigami results for the 2024 season:

- TCU 34, Stanford 27. No Scorigami. Cardinal lost to Boston College by this score in 2002.

NERD NATION

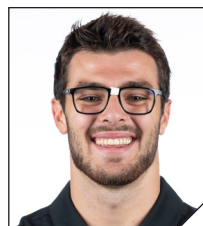
Stanford has long been regarded as one of the premier institutions in both athletics and academics, and the football team's tight end room exemplifies this on a yearly basis. Every tight end on the roster took his headshot with white tape in the middle of large black-rimmed glasses to signify "Nerd Nation," a movement that was created over a decade ago in 2013.

Following a 2013 win at Oregon, Shane Skov, Tyler Gaffney, and A.J. Tarpley showed up to the team's post-game press conference with those very same bulky glasses with tape over the bridge. Naturally, they were asked about it, they described it as embracing what it means to be a Stanford student-athlete. Skov explained, "It's Nerd Nation. We take pride in what we do."



One of the most prominent women's basketball alumni, Chiney Ogumike, helped start the movement during a basketball shoot-around. She heard the popular song *Rack City*, by Tyga, and thought, "What if we changed that to 'Nerd City'?" She wound up writing full lyrics for a Stanford version, and with the help of her sister Nneka, rapped it in front of her teammates in the locker room before a film session.

It caught on and a music video was eventually created, which brought "Nerd Nation" into a brand new light. According to Chiney, who now works at ESPN as a basketball analyst, the point of it all was "to show at Stanford you can be a student and an athlete and still be cool. You can redefine what 'nerd' means to you."

2024 ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

Four ACC teams were ranked in the Preseason Associated Press Top 25 Poll and the Preseason US LBM Coaches Poll.

- Florida State came in at No. 10, ahead of Clemson at No. 14 and Miami at No. 19, while NC State was ranked No. 24 in the preseason AP poll.
- Florida State came in at No. 10, ahead of Clemson at No. 14 and Miami at No. 19, while NC State was ranked No. 22 in the preseason coaches poll.
- Florida State was favored to repeat in the 2024 ACC Football Preseason Poll.
- Florida State led all teams with 2,708 points, while Clemson was second with 2,657 points. Miami placed third with 2,344 points, and NC State captured fourth with 2,318 points.

The ACC is the Conference of Quarterbacks, with the return of full-time starters Thomas Castellanos at Boston College, Cade Klubnik at Clemson, Haynes King at Georgia Tech, Preston Stone at SMU, and Kyron Drones at Virginia Tech, and transfers DJ Uiagalelei at Florida State, Maalik Murphy at Duke, Tyler Shough at Louisville, Cam Ward at Miami, Grayson McCall at NC State, and Kyle McCord at Syracuse among others.

- ACC had 13 quarterbacks named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award preseason watch list, the most of any conference.
- ACC had 10 quarterbacks named to the Maxwell Award preseason watch list, no other conference had more.
- ACC had eight quarterbacks named to the Davey O'Brien Award preseason watch list, no other conference had more.
- ACC has the top-ranked group of quarterback transfers in 2024 by CBS Sports.
- 13 QBs in the league enter the 2024 season with over 20 career touchdown passes and 3,500 career passing yards.
- Eight quarterbacks from ACC schools are projected to start Week 1 in the 2024 NFL season — 25 percent of NFL teams.
- Since 2018, the ACC has had at least one quarterback drafted in the first round in five different drafts — the only conference to do that.

The ACC's non-conference schedule continues to be the most challenging in the country.

- 27 games against Power 4 opponents, including Notre Dame, the most of any conference.
- Nine non-conference games against teams ranked in the final 2023 Associated Press Top 25 Poll, the most of any conference.
- 10 non-conference games against teams in ESPN's 2024 Way-Too-Early Top 25, the most of any conference.

ACC Features Elite Coaching Leadership

- Six ACC head coaches were named to the 2024 Dodd Trophy Preseason Watch List, as announced by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and the Peach Bowl, no other conference had more.
- Two of the three active coaches who have won national titles reside in the ACC - Dabo Swinney led Clemson to national titles in 2016 and 2018. North Carolina's Mack Brown won a national title at Texas in 2005.

Troy Taylor enters his second season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2023.

During his first season, the program improved in several key areas. The Stanford offense held onto the ball at a far greater rate, ranking top-40 in the NCAA in time of possession (31:17) while cutting down its turnover margin by nine. Explosive plays were much more common as well, with twice as many 40+-yard passing plays as 2022, the most for the team since 2019. The Cardinal went 3-2 on the road, posting its first winning record away from The Farm in a non-COVID season since 2018.

In his Stanford debut, Taylor became the 23rd head coach in program history to win his coaching debut, as the Cardinal defeated Hawai'i on the road 37-24. In the victory, the Stanford defense recorded six sacks for the first time since 2018. The Cardinal also produced the largest comeback win in program history during his first season on The Farm, beating Colorado 46-43 in double overtime after trailing 29-0 at halftime. It is the fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history, the second-largest road comeback in conference history, and featured the most points (46) scored in a half in Stanford history. Elic Ayomanor set the Stanford single game receiving record with 294 receiving yards in the victory. Two weeks later against No. 5 Washington, Ashton Daniels produced the second most yards in a single game by a Stanford quarterback (448) in program history.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor took over a Stanford program that has won 108 games since the start of the 2010 season - a total that ranks among the nation's top-20 - with 31 of those wins coming against top-25 opponents, tied for the eighth-best mark in the country in that span.

The Cardinal is 14th nationally with 50 draft picks since 2010, second-most in the Pac-12. Stanford is tied for eighth nationally with 10 consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 15 Academic All-Americans in that span is five more than any other school nationally.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff

appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

After opting not to play in the spring of the 2020-21 season, Taylor guided the Hornets to their second Big Sky Conference title in as many seasons in the fall of 2021. That year, Sacramento State posted an undefeated record of 8-0 in league games and earned another trip to the FCS Playoffs. Taylor was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year and was one of 17 finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award. Sacramento State finished ninth in total offense (463.9 ypg) and 22nd in total defense (329.7), while its scoring offense was 33rd (30.3) and scoring defense 15th (19.1).

In his first season with the Hornets, Taylor guided the team to a 9-4 overall record and a 7-1 league mark, which gave Sacramento State a share of the Big Sky Conference title for the first time in school history, and its first NCAA FCS Playoff berth. For those efforts, he was named the conference Coach of the Year and was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS national coach of the year).

Taylor was Utah's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for two seasons (2017-18), helping the Utes to their first Pac-12 South Division title in program history in 2018. Taylor's Utah offenses featured a balanced attack both seasons, with running back Zack Moss eclipsing the 1,000-yard mark on the ground in back-to-back seasons. At least 16 different players caught passes in both seasons.

Prior to joining the FBS ranks, Taylor was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Eastern Washington in 2016. That season, he directed the top passing offense in the FCS and set numerous national and school records. The Eagles averaged an FCS-best 401.0 passing yards per game, ranked second nationally with 529.6 yards per game and were third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg). EWU posted a 12-2 overall record and advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Under Taylor, sophomore Gage Gubrud set an NCAA FCS single-season record by passing for 5,160 yards while throwing 48 touchdown passes. Gubrud, the 2016 FCS Player of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, averaged 368.6 passing yards per game, which also led the nation. One of Gubrud's favorite targets was All-American Cooper Kupp, who caught 117 passes for 1,700 yards and 17 touchdowns before being selected by the Los Angeles Rams in the third round of the NFL Draft.

Taylor's success at Eastern Washington followed an illustrious run at Folsom High School, where he was co-head coach from 2012-15. The Bulldogs set numerous California state records, including the most points scored in a season. Folsom posted a 58-3 overall record, won the Sac-Joaquin Section title each season and claimed the 2014 CIF Division I championship with a 68-7 win over Oceanside. The team also set the California record for passing yards in four consecutive years.

Taylor was instrumental in the development of Jake Browning,

who would become the 2016 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year for Washington. Taylor coached Browning from fifth grade until he graduated as one of the most prolific passers in prep history. Browning set national records for touchdowns in a season (91 in 2014, tied) and career (229, in just three seasons), while establishing a number of California state high school records as well, including season (5,790) and career (16,775) passing yards.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

Taylor's first coaching job was at Casa Roble High School in Orangevale, Calif., in 1994. The following year, Taylor was a graduate assistant at Colorado, where he worked with the wide receivers. He returned to Cal in 1996 and remained at his alma mater through the 1999 season, where he had stints coaching receivers, quarterbacks and tight ends. Taylor also served as Cal's recruiting coordinator in 1999.

Taylor left Cal to become an assistant athletics director at Christian Brothers High School (2000-01) in Sacramento, where he also taught and was an assistant football coach for one season (2000). He spent 2003-04 at Folsom High School as the co-head coach. Taylor stepped away from coaching after the 2004 season but remained in football, serving as the radio analyst for Cal from 2005-11.

Taylor, 56, and his wife, Tracey, have three children: sons, Noah and Aaron, and daughter, Ella.
