

THE OPENING KICKOFF

- Stanford returns to the East Coast for the second time in as many weeks with an ACC tilt against No. 21 Clemson. Saturday's kickoff is scheduled for 4:00 pm PT on ESPN.
- The Cardinal is coming off its first-ever ACC win by beating Syracuse 26-24 on the road last Friday night, handing the Orange its first loss of 2024. Stanford led for a majority of the game but needed a 39-yard field goal from Emmet Kenney as time expired to escape with the victory.
- The Cardinal has been great away from The Farm since Troy Taylor took over in 2023. The Cardinal is 4-2 in road games since the start of last season, with three of those wins coming in conference play. In all three of those conference wins, Stanford has trailed in the fourth quarter.
- Defensively against the Orange, the Cardinal were aided by a pair of interceptions from quarterback Kyle McCord. The first was returned by Mitch Leigber 71 yards for a touchdown, the first pick-six by a Cardinal since Kyu Blu Kelly against USC on Sept. 11, 2021.

- Not only did Leigber provide a huge spark, but he also made Stanford history by scoring a defensive touchdown. Leigber was forced to play running back in 2022 due to injuries to the running back room and wound up scoring twice. Now with a defensive touchdown on his résumé, he becomes the first Cardinal since Owen Marecic (2007-10) to score an offensive and defensive touchdown in his career.
- Defense has been the reason for the strong start to the 2024 campaign. Last year, the Cardinal defense allowed 461.7 yards per game, the most in program history. This season, they are limiting opponents to just 350.3 yards per game, and have recorded five turnovers.
- A theme of Stanford in wins under Coach Taylor has been the Card's ability to stop the run. Stanford is allowing an average of just 36.4 rushing yards per game to opponents in wins since the start of the 2023 season, or 182 yards in five games. Through four weeks of the 2024 season, Stanford's run defense ranks third in FBS and leads the ACC, allowing just 51.7 rushing yards per game.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

- 1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.
- 2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.
- 3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.
- 4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

- 1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.
- 2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.
- 3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.
- 4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).
- 5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.
- 6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

THE MATCHUP

- Stanford and Clemson meet for the second time, and the first with both teams in the ACC.
- The only other time these teams have played came in the 1986 Gator Bowl, where the Tigers won 27-21.
- Despite the loss, Stanford's Brad Muster was named Co-Player of the Game with Clemson's Rodney Williams. Muster scored three touchdowns in the second half after the Cardinal was blanked in the first half. Two of Muster's scores were receiving touchdowns from quarterback Greg Ennis.
- The only time Stanford made a bowl game under then-head coach Jack Elway, it was Stanford's first bowl game since the 1978 Bluebonnet Bowl.
- Stanford's Gator Bowl appearance in 1986 still remains the only time a Pac-10 or Pac-12 school has played in the bowl. The Gator Bowl is the sixth-oldest college bowl game.

THIS DATE IN STANFORD HISTORY...

...the Cardinal took down Oregon State 31-28 in a road Pac-12 game in 2019. In a game full of NFL talent on the Cardinal side, Davis Mills threw three touchdowns to give Stanford a 21-0 lead midway through the third quarter. The Beavers came storming back to tie the game with 1:55 left before Stanford marched the down the field and set up Jet Toner for the game-winning 39-yard field goal with one second on the clock. Mills also caught a touchdown in the game from current Los Angeles Rams tight end Colby Parkinson. Other current NFL players to score were Michael Wilson (Cardinals) and Brycen Tremayne (Commanders).

HEAD COACH TROY TAYLOR

Troy Taylor is in his second season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2024

During his first season, the program improved in several key areas. The Stanford offense held onto the ball at a far greater rate, ranking top-40 in the NCAA in time of possession (31:17) while cutting down its turnover margin by nine. Explosive plays were much more common as well, with twice as many 40+-yard passing plays as 2022, the most for the team since 2019. The Cardinal went 3-2 on the road, posting its first winning record away from The Farm in a non-COVID season since 2018.

In his Stanford debut, Taylor became the 23rd head coach in program history to win his coaching debut, as the Cardinal defeated Hawai'i on the road 37-24. In the victory, the Stanford defense recorded six sacks for the first time since 2018.

The Cardinal also produced the largest comeback win in program history during his first season on The Farm, beating Colorado 46-43 in double overtime after trailing 29-0 at halftime. It is the fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history, the second-largest road comeback in Pac-12 history, and featured the most points (46) scored in a half in Stanford history. Elic Ayomanor set

the Stanford single-game receiving record with 294 receiving yards in the victory. Two weeks later against No. 5 Washington, Ashton Daniels produced the second most yards in a single game by a Stanford quarterback (448) in program history.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

OFF THE COACHING CAROUSEL

It's rare to find collegiate staffs with complete continuity, but that is what Stanford has achieved heading into the 2024 season. With Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football Troy Taylor returning for his second season, the entire coaching staff is back for year two on The Farm. Stanford is one of seven programs in the country to return its entire staff, joining Utah, Liberty, Louisville, NC State, Wake Forest, and Florida State.

LEAVE IT TO LEIGBER

One of the biggest plays in Stanford's thrilling win over Syracuse was the interception return for a touchdown by Mitch Leigber. At the time putting Stanford up 20-10, Leigber made Stanford history in the process.

Taking the interception 71 yards to the house, Leigber scored the first defensive touchdown for the Cardinal in over three years, with Kyu Blu Kelly's pick-six against USC on Sept. 11, 2021 as the last defensive score. It goes in the books as the longest interception return for Stanford since Wopamo Osaisai in 2006, and is tied for the sixth-longest in Stanford history.

Not only did Leigber provide a huge spark, but he also made Stanford history by scoring a defensive touchdown. Leigber was forced to play running back in 2022 due to injuries to the running back room and wound up scoring twice. Now with a defensive touchdown on his résumé, he becomes the first Cardinal since Owen Marecic (2007-10) to score an offensive and defensive touchdown in his career.

RUN STOPPERS

Success on The Farm has directly correlated with the Cardinal defense being able to stop opposing teams on the ground. Early in 2024, the defense has been one of the best in the country at preventing teams from gaining yards via the run game.

When Stanford has won under head coach Troy Taylor and defensive coordinator Bobby April, the defense has been elite against the run. Since 2023, Stanford is allowing just 36.4 yards per game on the ground to opponents when the Cardinal wins. In the team's victory over Syracuse last Friday, Stanford limited the Orange to just 26 rushing yards.

Through Week 4, Stanford's defense ranks third in the country in rush defense at 51.7 yards per game and leads the ACC. No team in the NCAA has allowed fewer rushing yards in the first half of games than Stanford's defense (17) or fewer total rushing yards since Sept. 7 (51).

FROM KARTY TO KENNEY

There was some question to how Stanford's kicking game would look in 2024 after losing Joshua Karty to the NFL Draft. After sitting behind Karty for three years, Emmet Kenney has taken over without skipping a beat.

In his first three games as the Cardinal's starting kicker, Kenney is a perfect 8-8 on field goals and has not missed an extra point. Kenney went 4-4 in the win over Syracuse, including the game-winning 39-yard field goal as time expired. He also drilled a 51-yard field goal in the first half, the longest of his career.

With eight made field goals without a miss, Kenney is tied for seventh in the country in made field goals and second among those without a miss. He is one of 22 kickers in FBS without a missed field goal.

Two days later, former Cardinal kicker Joshua Karty hit the game-winning field goal for the Los Angeles Rams, beating the San Francisco 49ers 27-24. It marks the first time in Stanford history that a current and former kicker have hit a game-winning field goal in the same weekend.

THE KIDS ARE MAKING PLAYS

One of the youngest positions the Cardinal fields on a weekly basis is the wide receiver group, but that has not stopped them from making plays. Stanford has had a plethora of young pass catchers on the season, proving this position can be a strength for years to come.

The three leading receivers on the team are all underclassmen, with Elic Ayomanor (R-So.) leading the way at 234 yards. As a matter of fact, only two upperclassmen (Sam Roush, Mudia Reuben) have caught passes this season. 85.6% of Stanford's receiving yards have come from either sophomores or freshman, by far the highest percentage in the country.

Ismael Cisse's 19 receptions are the most by a freshman in the country this season, with Kam Shanks of UAB next closest at 15 receptions. Overall, Cisse ranks 31st in FBS in catches.

ACC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Stanford football has earned its first two ACC Players of the Week, as announced by the conference on Monday morning. Outside linebacker David Bailey has been named the conference's Linebacker of the Week, and kicker Emmet Kenney has been named the Specialist of the Week.

For Bailey, this is the second time in his career that he takes home a conference Player of the Week award (Pac-12 Week 1, 2023). Bailey was a game-wrecker in the first half against Syracuse, putting up his secondcareer multi-sack game. He also forced a fumble and recorded five total pressures.

Kenney went 4-4 on field goals, including a career-long 51-yard field goal in the first half and the game-winning 39-yard field goal as time expired. In his first season as Stanford's starting place kicker, Kenney is a perfect 8-8 on field goals and has yet to miss an extra point.

With multiple players of the week, Stanford accomplishes this feat for the first time since Oct. 17, 2022 (Jonathan McGill, Joshua Karty).

SPECIAL TEAMS, SPECIAL PLAYERS

Through three games, Stanford's special teams unit has been on point, highlighted by momentum-changing plays against Cal Poly.

On Sept. 7, Aristotle Taylor blocked a field goal, Tristan Sinclair ran for a first down on a successfully executed fake punt, and Tiger Bachmeier returned a punt for a

2024 is the second consecutive year that Stanford has

blocked a field goal, but the punt return for a score had not happened since Christian McCaffrey did so in the 2016 Rose Bowl Game against Iowa.

Focusing on the kicking game, Emmet Kenney is 8-8 on field goal attempts through three games and has not missed an extra point. Aidan Flintoft is averaging 43.4 yards per punt, a new career high.

TIGER TAKES IT BACK

That 90-yard punt return for a touchdown by Tiger Bachmeier sparked Stanford in the second half against Cal Poly. It was the first points scored by the Cardinal in a second half where it eventually outscored the Mustangs 27-0.

Not only is it the first punt return for a touchdown by a Cardinal since the 2016 Rose Bowl Game, but it is tied for the second-longest in Stanford history. The only punt return for a score that was longer came from Thomas Henley in 1986 vs. Oregon (92 yards). His 90-yard return is tied with Parker Kingston of BYU for the longest this season.

SWITCHING UP THE LOOK

The traditional Stanford Cardinal uniform has largely been untouched for the better part of 130 years. White helmets, a Cardinal jersey at home and all white on the road has been a staple. Through three games in 2024, Stanford has worn three different uniform combinations, and only one of them has been "traditional."

In Week 1 vs. TCU, Stanford broke out the Cardinal pants for just the fifth time in program history and the first time since 2011. In Week 4 at Syracuse, Stanford wore a Cardinal helmet for just the second time, and the first time with the block S logo on the side.

In 2023, Stanford wore five unique combinations, including wearing its black uniforms twice with different helmets, and the debut of the Cardinal-colored helmet.

ACC HISTORY

The Cardinal went on the road in its ACC debut and took down Syracuse 26-24. It was the first time since 1919 that Stanford played a conference game as a new member.

Stanford joins seven other full-time schools - Duke, North Carolina, Maryland, Florida State, Miami, Louisville and Virginia Tech, as well as Notre Dame (2020) - in winning its first conference game as a member of the ACC. Only Duke's and Maryland's wins also came on the road, both in 1953.

USING THE LEGS

We saw Stanford quarterbacks run a lot in 2023, and that trend is continuing in 2024. Ashton Daniels is the team's leading rusher through three games and has put up some of the biggest rushing numbers by a quarterback in the nation.

Daniels finished the TCU game with 17 rushes for 87 yards, the fifth-most rushing yards in a game by a Stanford quarterback. Few FBS quarterbacks are as involved as Daniels running the football, as his 39 carries are the ninth most by a quarterback and his 163 rushing yards are the 14th most by a quarterback this season.

In 2024, 49 of the team's 101 rushing attempts are by quarterbacks. Freshman running back Micah Ford has the most carries by a running back with 21.

COAST TO COAST

Stanford is not unfamiliar with leaving the West Coast for games, with the program's first game on the East Coast coming in 1928. Trips outside of the West Coast will be more frequent with Stanford in the ACC moving forward

Stanford's first game at least three time zones away came on December 1, 1928 when the Cardinal beat Army 26-0. Since that first "long-distance" game, Stanford is 23-36-2 all-time when playing with at least a three-hour time difference from the Bay Area. That breaks down to 18-35-2 in the Eastern Time Zone, 3-1 in Hawaii, and 2-0 abroad (Japan and Australia).

Travel has not been a struggle for the Cardinal as of late, as Stanford is 9-4 over its last 13 games when playing with at least a three-hour time difference from home (dating back to 2010).

Stanford has never played more than three "long-distance" games in a season, which came during the 1976 season. With trips to Syracuse, Clemson, Notre Dame, and NC State in 2024, this is the first time the Cardinal plays in the Eastern Time Zone four times in one year.

If all six road games are counted, the total mileage for Stanford football during the 2024 season would be 21,207 miles. This includes two local road games at California and San Jose State.

ROAD WARRIORS

Stanford has been resilient away from The Farm under Troy Taylor. In the Cardinal's first six road games with Taylor at the helm, Stanford is 4-2, including a 3-2 mark in 2023.

What has been most impressive about the team's performance on the road is that Stanford has trailed in the fourth quarter in three of the team's four wins (Colorado and Washington State in 2023, Syracuse in 2024). Two of those wins came on game-winning field goals on the final play.

By finishing last year with a winning record on the road, the Cardinal accomplished this feat in a non-COVID-19 shortened season for the first time since 2018, when Stanford went 4-2 on the road.

MIND YOUR (AYO)MANOR

Continuing to build on a breakout 2023 season, Elic Ayomanor is one of the most dangerous receivers in the ACC and has shown his big-play ability through the first three games of his redshirt sophomore season. Ayomanor ranks tenth in the ACC in receiving yards per game at 78.0 and is tied for 11th in receptions with 17. Twice this season he has made one-handed catches, including his only touchdown of the year, which opened the scoring at Syracuse. His 234 yards are tied for fourth in FBS among underclassmen receivers in 2024.

Last season, Ayomanor became the first Cardinal since J.J. Arcega-Whiteside in 2018 to pile up over 1,000 receiving yards in a season. He also recorded the most receiving yards in a game in Stanford history with 294 at Colorado, surpassing the previous record of 278 yards by Troy Walters on September 25, 1999.

FRESHMAN FLAVOR

2023 was a season of development for the Cardinal. 20 players made their collegiate debuts in 2023 and 18 made their first career starts.

Stanford had 2,112 snaps taken by freshmen in Coach Taylor's first season on The Farm, the seventh most freshmen snaps in the FBS. Four ACC teams were included on the list, including the top three teams: Clemson, South Carolina, and Miami.

So far in 2024, 579 snaps have been taken by Stanford freshmen. This puts the Cardinal on pace for more snaps by freshmen in 2024 than a season ago.

RETURNING PRODUCTION

While youth will be a theme of the Cardinal in 2024, returning experience is on its side heading into the new college football season.

Bill Connelly of ESPN put out a final list of returning production rankings in advance of the new season, measuring the percentage of offensive and defensive production each team in the country returns from 2023. Stanford ranks second in all of college football, returning roughly 85% of its production from last year. Only Iowa State (86%) ranks higher.

Stanford ranks fourth in the country in returning offensive production, bringing back 90% of its offense from 2023. Defensively, the Cardinal is eighth in the nation at 81% of its defensive production returning. This comes as a result of Stanford returning 19 of its 22 starters from a year ago, compared to losing 17 of its 22 starters prior to the start of Troy Taylor's first season.

RECENT DRAFT SUCCESS

The Cardinal has had 56 draft picks since 2010, second-most by a West Coast school behind only USC. Stanford is tied for 14th nationally with nine consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 21 Academic All-Americans in that span is the most among FBS schools.

Since 2000, the number of draft picks to come out of Stanford is fourth among current ACC schools with 86, trailing only Miami, Florida State, and Clemson. In the 2024 NFL Draft, the Cardinal saw Joshua Karty get drafted by the Los Angeles Rams in the sixth round. He became the 281st all-time player to be drafted out of Stanford, and the first specialist since Jake Bailey in 2019.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

There is a rich tradition of Stanford success in the NFL, and that tradition is still alive in the 2024 NFL season. There is actively 27 former Cardinal signed with NFL organizations.

The most recent member of #StanfordNFL is Joshua Karty, selected by the Los Angeles Rams in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft. Karty has been excellent for the Rams through three weeks, going 5-5 on field goals and 6-6 on extra points. He nailed a gamewinning 37-yard field goal against the 49ers in Week 3, his first professional game-winning field goal.

Multiple Arizona Cardinals who are former Cardinal have found the end zone early in 2024. Michael Wilson scored the first touchdown of the year for Arizona and his teammate Elijah Higgins scored a touchdown in a Week 2 win over the Rams.

Defensively, Paulson Adebo picked off Dak Prescott in Week 2 and returned it 49 yards, the longest interception return of the season so far. He also ranks tied for fifth in the league with four passes defended. Bobby Okereke has 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery through three games for the New York Giants. Justin Reid is second on the Kansas City Chiefs with 21 tackles, helping the two-time champions to a 2-0 start.

On the defensive line, Harrison Phillips received a contract extension from the Minnesota Vikings following the team's Week 1 win over the Giants. Minnesota is 3-0 and in first place in the NFC North. 2023 NFL Man of the Year nominee Solomon Thomas has 1.5 sacks and a pass breakup thus far for the 2-1 New York Jets.

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 28 states, plus Canada.

There are a total of 14 student-athletes from Texas, the largest representation of student-athletes from outside of California (31) on the team. Behind Texas is Georgia (8), Florida (7), and New Jersey (6). Three student-athletes are from Canada (Elic Ayomanor, Brendan Delaney, Benedict Umeh).

GERHART'S GREATNESS

On January 8, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame announced Toby Gerhart as a member of the 2024 College Football Hall of Fame Class, becoming the 20th Cardinal to join the College Hall of Fame.

Arriving to The Farm in 2006, Gerhart burst onto the national scene in 2008 by setting the Stanford single-season rushing record with 1,136 yards, becoming the fifth running back in school history to eclipse 1,000 yards in a season. He also added 15 touchdowns, which were the second most in program history.

That was just a drop in the bucket for what the 2009 season had in store for Gerhart, as he rewrote the Stanford rushing records completely. He compiled 1,871 rushing yards and 28 rushing touchdowns, both of which led the FBS and became new Stanford single-season records.

His historic 2009 season came with a whole host of awards and accolades, including a runner-up finish in the 2009 Heisman Trophy voting. He was named the Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Year, a unanimous First Team All-American, and won the Archie Griffin Award, Jim Brown Trophy, Doak Walker Award, and the Tom Hansen Medal.

In his four seasons on The Farm, Gerhart amassed 3,522 rushing yards as a Cardinal, the second most by a Stanford rusher in program history at the time of his graduation (now ranks fifth). He ran in 44 touchdowns, all but one of which came in his final two seasons, which are still the most in Stanford history. He also remains the Stanford all-time leader in 100-yard rushing games with 20, 11 of which came during the 2009 season.

A 2010 graduate of Stanford with a bachelor's degree in management science and engineering, Gerhart came back to the Farm to earn his Master of Business Administration degree in 2020. He was twice named to the All-Pac-10 Academic Team and was awarded by the Stanford football program with the Al Masters Award, given annually to the player who attains the highest standards of performance, academics, and leadership.

Gerhart will be the second Cardinal in the last three seasons inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame, with Andrew Luck being inducted in 2022. Gerhart becomes the seventh back in Stanford history to earn an induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, joining Ernie Nevers, Bobby Grayson, Bones Hamilton, Hugh Gallarneau, Monk Monscrip, and Darrin Nelson

STEPFÁN JOINS STANFORD HOF

The Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame will welcome 10 former student-athletes later this fall, including the

leading rusher in Stanford history, Stepfán Taylor.

The Class of 2024 includes Nick Amuchastegui (wrestling), Maya DiRado Andrews (women's swimming and diving), Annika Dries (women's water polo), Matt Fuerbringer (men's volleyball), Teresa Noyola (women's soccer), Chinenye Ogwumike (women's basketball), Carlos Quentin (baseball), Patrick Rodgers (men's golf), Katerina Stefanidi (women's track and field) and Stepfán Taylor (football).

Taylor was a member of four bowl teams, highlighted by victories in the 2010 Orange Bowl and 2012 Rose Bowl Game. He is the school record holder in career rushing yards (4,300), rushing attempts (843) and total touchdowns (45). He was selected in the fifth round of the 2013 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals and spent four seasons in the league.

HISTORIC 2024 OLYMPICS

Stanford concluded the 2024 Paris Olympic Games with a school-record 39 medals, shattering its previous best while cementing its reputation on the world's biggest stage as the nation's top collegiate program.

Boasting a school-record 59 Olympians with Cardinal ties, Stanford surpassed its all-time medals benchmark (27 overall at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Games) while winning at least 20 medals for the sixth time in school history (2020, 2016, 2008, 1996, 1924). Additionally, Stanford has won 128 medals combined over the last five Summer Games.

Stanford's haul of 39 medals (12 gold, 14 silver, 13 bronze) is the most by any school at one Olympics. Counting medals won as part of the same relay, boat or team as one collective medal, Cardinal athletes accounted for 27 event medals at the 2024 Paris Games. If Stanford was a country, it would have finished tied with Canada for 11th place.

For the third consecutive edition of the Games, Stanford also totaled more Team USA selections (37) than any other school, accumulating 36 Team USA medals.

Stanford's affiliates have captured 335 overall medals (162 gold, 93 silver, 80 bronze) from 196 medalists. The Cardinal has produced at least one medalist in every Olympics in which the U.S. has competed since 1912.

The Cardinal's 59 Olympians (20 male, 39 female) represented 14 countries across 20 varsity sports. Included among Stanford's contingent were 14 current student-athletes, 44 former student-athletes and one other institutional affiliate.

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 48 academic years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), the longest streak in NCAA history. Stanford leads the NCAA with 136 team titles, including two national team championships during the 2023-24 campaign - men's gymnastics and women's golf-

Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.

From 1994-2021, Stanford won 25 straight Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cups. The Cardinal enters the 2024-25 year with 26 of the 30 total Directors' Cups, most recently capturing the elusive award during the 2022-23 season.

STANFORD SCORIGAMI

Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that has taken over social media in recent years. Scorigami tracks final scores that have never happened before, initially in the NFL, and now for Stanford football. Through Week 4 of the 2024 season, there have been 715 unique scores in Stanford football history. The following are the Stanford Scorigami results for the 2024 season:

- TCU 34, Stanford 27. No Scorigami. Cardinal lost to Boston College by this score in 2002.
- Stanford 41, Cal Poly 7. No Scorigami. Cardinal beat Oregon by this score in 1986.
- Stanford 26, Syracuse 24. That's a Scorigami! This is the 715th unique score in Stanford football history.

NERD NATION

Stanford has long been regarded as one of the premier institutions in both athletics and academics, and the football team's tight end room exemplifies this on a yearly basis. Every tight end on the roster took his headshot with white tape in the middle of large black-rimmed glasses to signify "Nerd Nation," a movement that was created over a decade ago in 2013.

Following a 2013 win at Oregon, Shane Skov, Tyler Gaffney, and A.J. Tarpley showed up to the team's post-game press conference with those very same bulky glasses with tape over the bridge. Naturally, they were asked about it, they described it as embracing what it means to be a Stanford student-athlete. Skov explained, "It's Nerd Nation. We take pride in what we do."



One of the most prominent women's basketball alumni, Chiney Ogwumike, helped start the movement during a basketball shoot-around. She heard the popular song *Rack City*, by Tyga, and thought, "What if we changed that to 'Nerd City'?" She wound up writing full lyrics for a Stanford version, and with the help of her sister Nneka, rapped it in front of her teammates in the locker room before a film session.

It caught on and a music video was eventually created, which brought "Nerd Nation" into a brand new light. According to Chiney, who now works at ESPN as a basketball analyst, the point of it all was "to show at Stanford you can be a student and an athlete and still be cool. You can redefine what 'nerd" means to you."

- Six quarterbacks are ranked in the top 20 of FBS in passing yards per game tied for the most of any conference.
- Five quarterbacks are ranked in the top 20 of FBS in total yards per game tied for the most of any conference.
- Nine different ACC quarterbacks have thrown for at least 300 yards in a game this year.
 - Three QBs have done it in every game they have played Cam Ward (Miami), Eli Holstein (Pitt) and Kyle McCord (Syracuse).
 - Ward is the first Miami quarterback to begin a season with three consecutive 300-yard passing games.
 - Holstein is the first freshman (redshirt or true) in Pitt history to throw for 300-plus yards in three consecutive games.
 - McCord is the first quarterback in Syracuse history to throw for 300 yards or more in consecutive games, doing it in his
 first two starts for the Orange.
- ACC had the most of any conferences on the following QB preseason watch lists: Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (13); Maxwell Award preseason watch list (10); and Davey O'Brien Award (8).
- The ACC has the top-ranked group of quarterback transfers in 2024 by CBS Sports.
- 13 QBs in the league enter the 2024 season with over 20 career touchdown passes and 3,500 career passing yards.
- Since 2018, the ACC has had at least one quarterback drafted in the first round in five different drafts the only conference to do that
- The ACC has the FBS leader in interceptions Nohl Williams (Cal) with four interceptions.
- The ACC has three of the top four sacks leaders in FBS Jahvaree Ritzie (UNC) with 5.0 sacks, Tyler Baron (Miami) and Antwaun Powell-Ryland (Virginia Tech) with 4.5 sacks.
 - Four of the top 11 NCAA leaders in sacks per game this season in all of FBS are in the ACC.
 - ACC has six of the top 25 in tackles-for-loss per game this season.
 - Syracuse's Fadil Diggs leads the nation in tackles-for-loss per game with 3.0.
 - Miami's Tyler Baron is tied for second in the nation in tackles-for-loss per game with 2.3.
 - Pitt's Rasheem Biles is tied for ninth in the nation in tackles-for-loss per game with 1.8.
 - ACC has three of the top seven punt returns in all of FBS in punt return average.
 - Stanford's Tiger Bachmeier leads the nation with 34.0 yards per punt return this year.
 - ACC has four of the top 10 punters in all of FBS in yards per punt average.
 - Florida State's Alex Mastromanno leads the nation with an average of 49.8 yards per punt this year.

The ACC's non-conference schedule continues to be the most challenging in the country:

- 26 games against Power 4 opponents, including Notre Dame, the most of any conference.
- Nine non-conference games against teams ranked in the final 2023 Associated Press Top 25 Poll, the most of any conference.
- 10 non-conference games against teams in ESPN's 2024 Way-Too-Early Top 25, the most of any conference.

ACC Features Elite Coaching Leadership:

- Six ACC head coaches named to the 2024 Dodd Trophy Preseason Watch List no conference has more.
- Two of the three active coaches in the country who have won a national title reside in the ACC (Mack Brown and Dabo Swinney).
- Four current ACC head coaches have recorded over 100 career wins at the collegiate level (only 26 active FBS coaches have reached this mark).
- Proven veterans and dynamic young coaches.

ACC in the CFP:

- ACC has won the second-most national titles.
- One of only two conferences to have a 500 or better winning percentage.
- Three different teams have reached the CFP in Clemson (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020), Florida State (2014), and Notre Dame (2020, played as a full ACC member).
- Second-best record overall in the CFP by conference (ACC is 6-6 overall and only behind SEC).
- In the final CFP top 25 rankings over the last four years there are only seven programs that have been in each Clemson and NC State are included from the ACC.
 - No conference has more than two teams that can state that claim.
- The ACC is the only conference to have every team ranked at least once in the first 10 years of the CFP rankings (2014-2023).
- 16 of the 17 current ACC programs have been ranked in the CFP rankings over the first 10 years (2014-2023).

During his first season, the program improved in several key areas. The Stanford offense held onto the ball at a far greater rate, ranking top-40 in the NCAA in time of possession (31:17) while cutting down its turnover margin by nine. Explosive plays were much more common as well, with twice as many 40+-yard passing plays as 2022, the most for the team since 2019. The Cardinal went 3-2 on the road, posting its first winning record away from The Farm in a non-COVID season since 2018.

In his Stanford debut, Taylor became the 23rd head coach in program history to win his coaching debut, as the Cardinal defeated Hawai'i on the road 37-24. In the victory, the Stanford defense recorded six sacks for the first time since 2018. The Cardinal also produced the largest comeback win in program history during his first season on The Farm, beating Colorado 46-43 in double overtime after trailing 29-0 at halftime. It is the fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history, the second-largest road comeback in conference history, and featured the most points (46) scored in a half in Stanford history. Elic Ayomanor set the Stanford single game receiving record with 294 receiving yards in the victory. Two weeks later against No. 5 Washington, Ashton Daniels produced the second most yards in a single game by a Stanford quarterback (448) in program history.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor took over a Stanford program that has won 108 games since the start of the 2010 season - a total that ranks among the nation's top-20 - with 31 of those wins coming against top-25 opponents, tied for the eighth-best mark in the country in that span.

The Cardinal is 14th nationally with 50 draft picks since 2010, second-most in the Pac-12. Stanford is tied for eighth nationally with 10 consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 15 Academic All-Americans in that span is five more than any other school nationally.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff: Taylor was instrumental in the development of Jake Browning,

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

After opting not to play in the spring of the 2020-21 season, Taylor guided the Hornets to their second Big Sky Conference title in as many seasons in the fall of 2021. That year, Sacramento State posted an undefeated record of 8-0 in league games and earned another trip to the FCS Playoffs. Taylor was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year and was one of 17 finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award. Sacramento State finished ninth in total offense (463.9 ypg) and 22nd in total defense (329.7), while its scoring offense was 33rd (30.3) and scoring defense 15th (19.1).

In his first season with the Hornets, Taylor guided the team to a 9-4 overall record and a 7-1 league mark, which gave Sacramento State a share of the Big Sky Conference title for the first time in school history, and its first NCAA FCS Playoff berth. For those efforts, he was named the conference Coach of the Year and was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS national coach of the year).

Taylor was Utah's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for two seasons (2017-18), helping the Utes to their first Pac-12 South Division title in program history in 2018. Taylor's Utah offenses featured a balanced attack both seasons, with running back Zack Moss eclipsing the 1,000-yard mark on the ground in back-to-back seasons. At least 16 different players caught passes in both seasons.

Prior to joining the FBS ranks, Taylor was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Eastern Washington in 2016. That season, he directed the top passing offense in the FCS and set numerous national and school records. The Eagles averaged an FCS-best 401.0 passing yards per game, ranked second nationally with 529.6 yards per game and were third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg). EWU posted a 12-2 overall record and advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Under Taylor, sophomore Gage Gubrud set an NCAA FCS singleseason record by passing for 5,160 yards while throwing 48 touchdown passes. Gubrud, the 2016 FCS Player of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, averaged 368.6 passing yards per game, which also led the nation. One of Gubrud's favorite targets was All-American Cooper Kupp, who caught 117 passes for 1,700 yards and 17 touchdowns before being selected by the Los Angeles Rams in the third round of the NFL Draft.

Taylor's success at Eastern Washington followed an illustrious run at Folsom High School, where he was co-head coach from 2012-15. The Bulldogs set numerous California state records, including the most points scored in a season. Folsom posted a 58-3 overall record, won the Sac-Joaquin Section title each season and claimed the 2014 CIF Division I championship with a 68-7 win over Oceanside. The team also set the California record for passing yards in four consecutive years.

who would become the 2016 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year for Washington. Taylor coached Browning from fifth grade until he graduated as one of the most prolific passers in prep history. Browning set national records for touchdowns in a season (91 in 2014, tied) and career (229, in just three seasons), while establishing a number of California state high school records as well, including season (5,790) and career (16,775) passing yards.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

Taylor's first coaching job was at Casa Roble High School in Orangevale, Calif., in 1994. The following year, Taylor was a graduate assistant at Colorado, where he worked with the wide receivers. He returned to Cal in 1996 and remained at his alma mater through the 1999 season, where he had stints coaching receivers, quarterbacks and tight ends. Taylor also served as Cal's recruiting coordinator in 1999.

Taylor left Cal to become an assistant athletics director at Christian Brothers High School (2000-01) in Sacramento, where he also taught and was an assistant football coach for one season (2000). He spent 2003-04 at Folsom High School as the co-head coach. Taylor stepped away from coaching after the 2004 season but remained in football, serving as the radio analyst for Cal from 2005-

Taylor, 56, and his wife, Tracey, have three children: sons, Noah and Aaron, and daughter, Élla.
