THE OPENING KICKOFF

- For the fourth time in the last seven weeks, Stanford plays in the Eastern Time Zone this Saturday as the Cardinal takes on the NC State Wolfpack in Raleigh at 12 p.m. ET (9 a.m. PT).
- Following Saturday's game at Carter-Finley Stadium, Stanford will spend the final four weeks of the season in the Bay Area with a bye week, one home game, and road games at California and San Jose State.
- Stanford is looking to snap a five-game losing streak, with four of those losses coming in ACC play. The last win for the Cardinal was its inaugural ACC game at Syracuse on Sept. 20.
- The Stanford defense has been significantly better at forcing defenses into mistakes in year two under Willie Shaw Director of Defense Bobby April. The Cardinal has forced 12 turnovers through eight games, compared to just 11 during the entire 2023 season. Stanford also has two defensive touchdowns in 2024, the first time since 2019 that Stanford's defense has recorded multiple defensive touchdowns in a season.
- This year's Cardinal team is one of the most aggressive in the country. Stanford has gone for it on fourth down 25 times, tied for the fifth most in FBS.

- The 13 successful fourth-down conversions are tied for ninth-most in the country.
- Stanford has struggled early in recent ACC games. In the last four conference contests, Stanford has trailed 17-0 (at No. 17 Clemson), 21-0 (Virginia Tech and No. 21 SMU) and 14-0 (Wake Forest). Despite the early struggles, Stanford scored 17 points in the first half against Wake Forest, tied for the most the Cardinal has put up in the first half of a game this year.
 - Young players have been making an impact for the Cardinal all season long. Two freshman running backs have over 260 yards (Micah Ford and Chris Davis Jr.). 80.7% of the team's receiving yards are from underclassmen, the highest mark in college football. Redshirt sophomore Elic Ayomanor is the team's leading receiver with 42 receptions for 484 yards and four touchdowns.
 - Continuing on the theme of youth, 14 different Cardinal have made their first collegiate starts in 2024. That is tied for the eighth most in FBS and leads the ACC.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.

2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.

3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.

4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.

2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.

3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.

4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).

5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.

6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

GAME NOTES

THE MATCHUP

- Stanford and NC State meet for the first time in program history on Saturday.
- This is the fourth time in the last seven weeks that Stanford plays in the Eastern Time Zone. That is the most times Stanford has played in the Eastern Time Zone in a single season in program history.
- The last time Stanford played a game that kicked off prior to 12:00 pm PT was the 2018 Sun Bowl against Pittsburgh, the team's most recent appearance in a bowl game. That game kicked off at 11:00 am PT. The last time Stanford kicked off at noon local time or earlier was also in 2018, a home game against UC Davis that began at 11:00 am PT.
- Saturday is the second game in a row for NC State against Bay Area schools. Prior to NC State's bye week, they played at California and won 24-23 after the Golden Bears missed a game-winning field goal in the final two minutes of the game.

THIS DATE IN STANFORD HISTORY...

...the Cardinal beat UCLA on the road 21-20 in 1996. This win came at a time when Stanford was just 2-5, but it began a four-game winning streak to close out the regular season, which made Stanford bowl-eligible. The Cardinal would wind up facing Michigan State in the 1996 Sun Bowl, extending that winning streak with a 38-0 thumping of the Spartans. Youth was a theme of that win for Stanford, as redshirt freshman QB Chad Hutchinson tossed the game-winning touchdown pass and redshirt freshman Troy Walters had eight catches for 144 yards and a touchdown.

HEAD COACH TROY TAYLOR

Troy Taylor is in his second season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2024.

During his first season, the program improved in several key areas. The Stanford offense held onto the ball at a far greater rate, ranking top-40 in the NCAA in time of possession (31:17) while cutting down its turnover margin by nine. Explosive plays were much more common as well, with twice as many 40+-yard passing plays as 2022, the most for the team since 2019. The Cardinal went 3-2 on the road, posting its first winning record away from The Farm in a non-COVID season since 2018.

In his Stanford debut, Taylor became the 23rd head coach in program history to win his coaching debut, as the Cardinal defeated Hawai'i on the road 37-24. In the victory, the Stanford defense recorded six sacks for the first time since 2018.

The Cardinal also produced the largest comeback win in program history during his first season on The Farm, beating Colorado 46-43 in double overtime after trailing 29-0 at halftime. It is the fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history, the second-largest road comeback in Pac-12 history, and featured the most points (46) scored in a half in Stanford history. Elic Ayomanor set

the Stanford single-game receiving record with 294 receiving yards in the victory. Two weeks later against No. 5 Washington, Ashton Daniels produced the second most yards in a single game by a Stanford quarterback (448) in program history.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

OFF THE COACHING CAROUSEL

It's rare to find collegiate staffs with complete continuity, but that is what Stanford has achieved heading into the 2024 season. With Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football Troy Taylor returning for his second season, the entire coaching staff is back for year two on The Farm. Stanford is one of seven programs in the country to return its entire staff, joining Utah, Liberty, Louisville, NC State, Wake Forest, and Florida State.

CRANKING UP THE PRESSURE

Stanford's defense has started wreaking havoc on opposing offenses in recent weeks, with big plays becoming a regular occurrence.

Over the last two games, the Cardinal has recorded seven sacks and that helped them force five turnovers. With three sacks against SMU and four more against Wake Forest, Stanford has three or more sacks in consecutive games for the first time since its games against Colorado and UCLA last October.

Against Wake Forest, Stanford had multiple players record at least 1.5 sacks. Tobin Phillips was a game wrecker at defensive tackle, with a career-high 2.5 sacks, a season-high for any Stanford player. Tevarua Tafiti also posted a career-high in sacks with 1.5

In the first six games of the season, Stanford was only able to generate nine sacks, nearly doubling its total in the final two games of October.

SCOOP 'N SCORE

An early momentum-changer against Wake Forest came from Tevarua Tafiti. The edge rusher recorded a strip-sack of Hank Bachmeier, picked up the loose ball and ran it back 44 yards for a Stanford touchdown, tying the game 14-14 in the second quarter.

Tafiti's defensive touchdown is the first of his career and the second of the season for Stanford's defense. It is the first fumble recovery for a touchdown by the Cardinal since Jonathan McGill did so at No. 17 UCF on Sept. 14, 2019.

GIVE ME THAT!

Stanford has shown a knack for taking the ball away from the opposition in 2024. With two more turnovers forced against Wake Forest, Stanford's defense has 12 turnovers in eight games after producing just 11 during the entire 2023 season. Tied for 44th in the country in turnovers forced, Stanford also is tied for 18th in fumbles recovered with six.

Not only have they forced turnovers, but Stanford has scored two defensive touchdowns this season. It is the first time Stanford has had multiple defensive touchdowns since 2019 and the first time with both a

fumble and interception return for a touchdown in the same season since 2016.

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE COIN

Despite the defense creating more turnovers, the offense has struggled to take care of the football. Stanford has a -4 turnover margin with 16 turnovers lost on the season. Only six teams in the country have turned the ball over more times than Stanford.

RARE FRESHMAN AIR

Stanford has seen a freshman start at virtually every position on offense in 2024. Some program history was made last Saturday against Wake Forest with Elijah Brown starting under center at quarterback.

Only one other team in the nation has started a true freshman at both quarterback and running back in the same game. In Week 8, Florida started DJ Lagway at quarterback and Jaden Baugh at running back, becoming the first team to start a true freshman at both positions.

The last time a true freshman started at quarterback for the Cardinal was Ari Patu in 2021 against Oregon State. Brown joins Patu and John Paye (1983) as the only true freshmen to start at quarterback in the history of Stanford football. Paye is the only true freshman quarterback to win a game for the Cardinal.

FRESHMAN FLAVOR

2023 was a season of development for the Cardinal. 20 players made their collegiate debuts in 2023 and 18 made their first career starts.

Stanford had 2,112 snaps taken by freshmen in Coach Taylor's first season on The Farm, the seventh most freshmen snaps in the FBS. Four ACC teams were included on the list, including the top three teams: Clemson, South Carolina, and Miami.

So far in 2024, 2,165 snaps have been taken by Stanford freshmen, already more than a season ago. 15 true freshmen have made their collegiate debuts in 2024.

This puts Stanford among one of the youngest teams in 2024. 14 different players have made their first collegiate starts this season for the Cardinal, which is tied for eighth in the country among first-time starters and is the most in the ACC.

RESTED OUT WEST

In the first year of the new ACC scheduling model, bye weeks play a prominent role for the two West Coast schools heading east, and for East Coast schools heading west. That is apparent in Stanford's 2024 schedule, with five of the Cardinal's 12 opponents coming off a bye week prior to facing Stanford.

Syracuse, Notre Dame, SMU, NC State, and Louisville all have bye weeks prior to games against Stanford. Stanford's bye weeks match up with two of those opponents (Syracuse, Louisville).

GAME NOTES

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

In its first season in the ACC, the Cardinal has had a brutal schedule that has been one of the toughest in the country. Despite only having faced three ranked teams, Stanford's strength of schedule is the seventh-hardest in college football. Five of the six teams ahead of Stanford are SEC teams. Florida State ranks 15th in strength of schedule, the closest ACC team to the Cardinal.

With just four games remaining in 2024, Stanford's strength of schedule will likely drop. Stanford has already played four teams in the top-30 of ESPN's FPI Power Rankings. Only one such game remains in 2024 (Louisville on Nov. 16).

ALWAYS AGGRESSIVE

It's well known that Troy Taylor likes to make aggressive calls and that is on full display this season. Stanford ranks second in the country in fourth-down attempts, having gone for it on fourth down 25 times in eight games, tied for the fifth most in the country.

With 13 fourth-down conversions, Stanford is tied for ninth in the NCAA. Twice in the Troy Taylor era, the Cardinal has converted three fourth downs in a game, which is tied for the most fourth-down conversions in a single game in Stanford history.

THERE CAN ONLY BE ONE

As the calendar turns to November, Stanford has only scored via the ground game four times. All four rushing touchdowns have come from quarterback Justin Lamson. The Cardinal is one of two teams in the FBS to only have one player record a rushing touchdown (San Diego State) and is the only team to have that one player be a quarterback.

THE KIDS ARE MAKING PLAYS

One of the youngest positions the Cardinal fields on a weekly basis is the wide receiver group, but that has not stopped them from making plays. Stanford has had a plethora of young pass catchers during the season, proving that this position can be a strength for years to come.

Only two upperclassmen (Sam Roush, Mudia Reuben) have caught passes this season. 80.7% of Stanford's receiving yards have come from either sophomores or freshmen, by far the highest percentage in the country.

SHUFFLING THE LINES

Despite having a large number of returning offensive linemen from a season ago, Stanford's offensive line has been a work in progress during the season. With Connor McLaughlin drawing the start at right tackle against Wake Forest, it produced the sixth different starting offensive line combination by Stanford in 2024.

Stanford trails only Florida State and Middle Tennessee in different offensive line combinations through the month of October. Both Florida State and Middle Tennessee have used seven unique combinations, while Stanford joins three other teams with six.

MIND YOUR (AYO)MANOR

Continuing to build on a breakout 2023 season, Elic Ayomanor is one of the most dangerous receivers in the ACC and has shown his big-play ability through the first eight games of his redshirt sophomore season.

Ayomanor scored a touchdown in three consecutive games to begin ACC play, the longest such streak of his career. He became the first Cardinal with touchdown receptions in three-or-more games in a row since Brycen Tremayne did so in the first five games of 2021. He actively ranks seventh in the ACC in receptions and tenth in receiving yards.

Last season, Ayomanor became the first Cardinal since J.J. Arcega-Whiteside in 2018 to pile up over 1,000 receiving yards in a season. He also recorded the most receiving yards in a game in Stanford history with 294 at Colorado, surpassing the previous record of 278 yards by Troy Walters on September 25, 1999.

COAST TO COAST

Stanford is not unfamiliar with leaving the West Coast for games, with the program's first game on the East Coast coming in 1928. Trips outside of the West Coast will be more frequent with Stanford in the ACC moving forward.

Stanford's first game at least three time zones away came on December 1, 1928 when the Cardinal beat Army 26-0. Since that first "long-distance" game, Stanford is 23-38-2 all-time when playing with at least a three-hour time difference from the Bay Area. That breaks down to 18-37-2 in the Eastern Time Zone, 3-1 in Hawaii, and 2-0 abroad (Japan and Australia).

Travel has not been a struggle for the Cardinal as of late, as Stanford is 9-6 over its last 15 games when playing with at least a three-hour time difference from home (dating back to 2010).

Stanford has never played more than three "long-distance" games in a season, which came during the 1976 season. With trips to Syracuse, Clemson, Notre Dame, and NC State in 2024, this is the first time the Cardinal plays in the Eastern Time Zone four times in one year.

If all six road games are counted, the total mileage for Stanford football during the 2024 season would be 21,207 miles. This includes two local road games at California and San Jose State.

BUILT FORD TOUGH

Freshman running back Micah Ford had his first breakout game on Sept. 28 against No. 17 Clemson and it was one of the best freshman running back performances by a Cardinal in several years.

Ford led the Stanford backfield with 15 carries for 122 yards in Death Valley, the first 100-yard rushing performance since Casey Filkins against No. 18 Washington on Sept. 24, 2022. While it was certainly

an impressive performance by recent running back standards at Stanford, it was even better when stacked up against freshmen from years past. Ford became the first freshman running back at Stanford to eclipse 100 rushing yards since Kenneth Tolon did so against Notre Dame on Nov. 24, 2001.

With 124 total scrimmage yards against the Tigers, Ford compiled the most by a freshman running back at Stanford since Bryce Love's 143 vs. Central Florida on Sept. 12, 2015.

Following his Week 5 performance, Ford was named the ACC's Rookie of the Week. He became the third Cardinal to win a weekly award from the ACC in 2024.

LEAVE IT TO LEIGBER

One of the biggest plays in Stanford's thrilling win over Syracuse was the interception return for a touchdown by Mitch Leigber. At the time putting Stanford up 20-10, Leigber made Stanford history in the process.

Taking the interception 71 yards to the house, Leigber scored the first defensive touchdown for the Cardinal in over three years, with Kyu Blu Kelly's pick-six against USC on Sept. 11, 2021 as the last defensive score. It goes in the books as the longest interception return for Stanford since Wopamo Osaisai in 2006, and is tied for the sixth-longest in Stanford history. Leigber is tied for the team lead with two interceptions this season.

Not only did Leigber provide a huge spark, but he also made Stanford history by scoring a defensive touchdown. Leigber was forced to play running back in 2022 due to injuries to the running back room and wound up scoring twice. Now with a defensive touchdown on his résumé, he becomes the first Cardinal since Owen Marecic (2007-10) to score an offensive and defensive touchdown in his career.

BLOCK PARTY

Standing at 6'7", Aristotle Taylor is built for blocking kicks. That is exactly what Stanford has used him for in 2024 and it is paying dividends through two-thirds of the season.

Taylor blocked a field goal against Cal Poly on Sept. 7 and then blocked an extra point at No. 17 Clemson on Sept. 28. He is one of eight players in the FBS to record multiple blocked kicks.

ACC HISTORY

The Cardinal went on the road in its ACC debut and took down Syracuse 26-24. It was the first time since 1919 that Stanford played a conference game as a new member.

Stanford joined seven other full-time schools - Duke, North Carolina, Maryland, Florida State, Miami, Louisville and Virginia Tech, as well as Notre Dame (2020) - in winning its first conference game as a member of the ACC. SMU became the ninth team to do so when it won its first ACC game on Sept. 28. Only

Duke's and Maryland's wins also came on the road, both in 1953.

RECENT DRAFT SUCCESS

The Cardinal has had 56 draft picks since 2010, second-most by a West Coast school behind only USC. Stanford is tied for 14th nationally with nine consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 21 Academic All-Americans in that span is the most among FBS schools.

Since 2000, the number of draft picks to come out of Stanford is fourth among current ACC schools with 86, trailing only Miami, Florida State, and Clemson. In the 2024 NFL Draft, the Cardinal saw Joshua Karty get drafted by the Los Angeles Rams in the sixth round. He became the 281st all-time player to be drafted out of Stanford, and the first specialist since Jake Bailey in 2019.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

There is a rich tradition of Stanford success in the NFL, and that tradition is still alive in the 2024 NFL season. There is actively 27 former Cardinal signed with NFL organizations.

The two-time defending Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs are led in the secondary by Justin Reid. The Chiefs are the only unbeaten team in the league and Reid has 39 tackles with an interception against San Francisco to help keep them undefeated.

On the defensive line, Harrison Phillips received a contract extension from the Minnesota Vikings following the team's Week 1 win over the Giants. Phillips already has a pair of sacks and passes defended and is one sack shy of a career high.

Multiple Arizona Cardinals who are former Cardinal have found the end zone early in 2024. Michael Wilson scored the first touchdown of the year for Arizona and ranks second on the team in receptions (27) and receiving touchdowns (3), with his touchdown total tying a career-best. His teammate Elijah Higgins has two touchdowns through eight games, including a crucial score in a Week 5 win over San Francisco.

Sticking on the tight end theme, five tight ends have started games this season. Zach Ertz has been the hottest of late, with 15 catches for 185 yards and a touchdown over the last three games for the 6-2 Washington Commanders.

The most recent member of #StanfordNFL is Joshua Karty, selected by the Los Angeles Rams in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft. Karty has been solid for the Rams through seven games, going 9-11 on field goals and 13-15 on extra points. He nailed a game-winning 37-yard field goal against the 49ers in Week 3, his first professional game-winning field goal.

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 28 states, plus Canada.

There are a total of 14 student-athletes from Texas, the largest representation of student-athletes from outside of California (31) on the team. Behind Texas is Georgia (8), Florida (7), and New Jersey (6). Three student-athletes are from Canada (Elic Ayomanor, Brendan Delaney, Benedict Umeh).

GERHART'S GREATNESS

On January 8, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame announced Toby Gerhart as a member of the 2024 College Football Hall of Fame Class, becoming the 20th Cardinal to join the College Hall of Fame.

Arriving to The Farm in 2006, Gerhart burst onto the national scene in 2008 by setting the Stanford single-season rushing record with 1,136 yards, becoming the fifth running back in school history to eclipse 1,000 yards in a season. He also added 15 touchdowns, which were the second most in program history.

That was just a drop in the bucket for what the 2009 season had in store for Gerhart, as he rewrote the Stanford rushing records completely. He compiled 1,871 rushing yards and 28 rushing touchdowns, both of which led the FBS and became new Stanford single-season records.

His historic 2009 season came with a whole host of awards and accolades, including a runner-up finish in the 2009 Heisman Trophy voting. He was named the Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Year, a unanimous First Team All-American, and won the Archie Griffin Award, Jim Brown Trophy, Doak Walker Award, and the Tom Hansen Medal.

In his four seasons on The Farm, Gerhart amassed 3,522 rushing yards as a Cardinal, the second most by a Stanford rusher in program history at the time of his graduation (now ranks fifth). He ran in 44 touchdowns, all but one of which came in his final two seasons, which are still the most in Stanford history. He also remains the Stanford all-time leader in 100-yard rushing games with 20, 11 of which came during the 2009 season.

A 2010 graduate of Stanford with a bachelor's degree in management science and engineering, Gerhart came back to the Farm to earn his Master of Business Administration degree in 2020. He was twice named to the All-Pac-10 Academic Team and was awarded by the Stanford football program with the Al Masters Award,

given annually to the player who attains the highest standards of performance, academics, and leadership.

Gerhart will be the second Cardinal in the last three seasons inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame, with Andrew Luck being inducted in 2022. Gerhart becomes the seventh back in Stanford history to earn an induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, joining Ernie Nevers, Bobby Grayson, Bones Hamilton, Hugh Gallarneau, Monk Moscrip, and Darrin Nelson.

STEPFÁN JOINS STANFORD HOF

The Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame welcomed 10 former student-athletes Oct. 19, including the leading rusher in Stanford history, Stepfán Taylor.

The Class of 2024 included Nick Amuchastegui (wrestling), Maya DiRado Andrews (women's swimming and diving), Annika Dries (women's water polo), Matt Fuerbringer (men's volleyball), Teresa Noyola (women's soccer), Chinenye Ogwumike (women's basketball), Carlos Quentin (baseball), Patrick Rodgers (men's golf), Katerina Stefanidi (women's track and field) and Stepfán Taylor (football).

Taylor was a member of four bowl teams, highlighted by victories in the 2010 Orange Bowl and 2012 Rose Bowl Game. He is the school record holder in career rushing yards (4,300), rushing attempts (843) and total touchdowns (45). He was selected in the fifth round of the 2013 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals and spent four seasons in the league.

HISTORIC 2024 OLYMPICS

Stanford concluded the 2024 Paris Olympic Games with a school-record 39 medals, shattering its previous best while cementing its reputation on the world's biggest stage as the nation's top collegiate program.

Boasting a school-record 59 Olympians with Cardinal ties, Stanford surpassed its all-time medals benchmark (27 overall at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Games) while winning at least 20 medals for the sixth time in school history (2020, 2016, 2008, 1996, 1924). Additionally, Stanford has won 128 medals combined over the last five Summer Games.

Stanford's haul of 39 medals (12 gold, 14 silver, 13 bronze) is the most by any school at one Olympics. Counting medals won as part of the same relay, boat or team as one collective medal, Cardinal athletes accounted for 27 event medals at the 2024 Paris Games. If Stanford was a country, it would have finished tied with Canada for 11th place.

For the third consecutive edition of the Games, Stanford also totaled more Team USA selections (37) than any other school, accumulating 36 Team USA medals.

Stanford's affiliates have captured 335 overall medals (162 gold, 93 silver, 80 bronze) from 196 medalists. The Cardinal has produced at least one medalist in every

Olympics in which the U.S. has competed since 1912.

The Cardinal's 59 Olympians (20 male, 39 female) represented 14 countries across 20 varsity sports. Included among Stanford's contingent were 14 current student-athletes, 44 former student-athletes and one other institutional affiliate.

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 48 academic years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), the longest streak in NCAA history. Stanford leads the NCAA with 136 team titles, including two national team championships during the 2023-24 campaign - men's gymnastics and women's golf- increasing its overall total to 167.

Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.

From 1994-2021, Stanford won 25 straight Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cups. The Cardinal enters the 2024-25 year with 26 of the 30 total Directors' Cups, most recently capturing the elusive award during the 2022-23 season.

STANFORD SCORIGAMI

Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that has taken over social media in recent years. Scorigami tracks final scores that have never happened before, initially in the NFL, and now for Stanford football. Through Week 9 of the 2024 season, there have been 718 unique results in Stanford football history. The following are the Stanford Scorigami results for the 2024 season:

- *TCU 34, Stanford 27.* No Scorigami. Cardinal lost to Boston College by this score in 2002.
- *Stanford 41, Cal Poly 7.* No Scorigami. Cardinal beat Oregon by this score in 1986.
- *Stanford 26, Syracuse 24.* That's a Scorigami! This is the 715th unique result in Stanford football history.
- *No. 17 Clemson 40, Stanford 14.* That's a Scorigami! This is the 716th unique result in Stanford football history.
- *Virginia Tech 31, Stanford 7.* No Scorigami. Cardinal lost to No. 9 Notre Dame by this score in 2002.
- *No. 11 Notre Dame 49, Stanford 7.* That's a Scorigami! This is the 717th unique result in Stanford football history.
- *No. 21 SMU 40, Stanford 10.* That's a Scorigami! This is the 717th unique result in Stanford football history.
- *Wake Forest 27, Stanford 24.* No Scorigami. Cardinal lost to No. 11 Arizona by this score in 1993.

NERD NATION

Stanford has long been regarded as one of the premier institutions in both athletics and academics, and the football team's tight end room exemplifies this on a yearly basis. Every tight end on the roster took his headshot with white tape in the middle of large black-rimmed glasses to signify "Nerd Nation," a movement that was created over a decade ago in 2013.

Following a 2013 win at Oregon, Shane Skov, Tyler Gaffney, and A.J. Tarpley showed up to the team's post-game press conference with those very same bulky glasses with tape over the bridge. Naturally, they were asked about it, they described it as embracing what it means to be a Stanford student-athlete. Skov explained, "It's Nerd Nation. We take pride in what we do."



One of the most prominent women's basketball alumni, Chiney Ogwumike, helped start the movement during a basketball shoot-around. She heard the popular song *Rack City*, by Tyga, and thought, "What if we changed that to 'Nerd City'?" She wound up writing full lyrics for a Stanford version, and with the help of her sister Nneka, rapped it in front of her teammates in the locker room before a film session.

It caught on and a music video was eventually created, which brought "Nerd Nation" into a brand new light. According to Chiney, who now works at ESPN as a basketball analyst, the point of it all was "to show at Stanford you can be a student and an athlete and still be cool. You can redefine what 'nerd' means to you."

2024 ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

Through Week 9 of the 2024 season:

- Two of the eight remaining undefeated teams in all of FBS hail from the ACC – Miami (8-0) and Pitt (7-0).
- ACC has five bowl-eligible teams – Miami, Pitt, Clemson, SMU and Duke – tied for the second-most among all FBS conferences heading into Week 10.
- The ACC is 43-15 overall in non-conference play and has played more non-conference games against P4 opponents, including Notre Dame, than any of the other Power 4 leagues.
- The 43 non-conference wins are the most among all FBS conferences.
- The ACC has eight non-conference wins versus fellow Power 4 foes.
- The ACC had 73 league games decided by eight points or less over the last three years (2021-23).
- This year, 20 of the 38 ACC league games to date have been decided by less than eight points (52.6 percent).

This Week in Week 10

- Four teams are ranked in the AP Top 25 Poll this week for the fourth consecutive week – Miami (No. 5), Clemson (No. 11), Pitt (No. 18) and SMU (No. 20).
- Four teams are ranked in the Coaches Top 25 Poll this week for the fourth consecutive week – Miami (No. 5), Clemson (No. 8), Pitt (No. 17) and SMU (No. 20).
- Duke, Louisville and Virginia Tech also received votes this week.
- The ACC is one of three conferences with two teams ranked in the top 10 of the Coaches Top 25 poll.
- Week 10 consists of six ACC games on Saturday, November 9, highlighted by a top-25 matchup between No. 18 Pitt and No. 20 SMU at 8 p.m. ET on ACC Network.

The ACC is the Conference of Quarterbacks (QBs) once again this season:

- The ACC is the only conference with multiple quarterbacks ranked in the top five nationally in total yards per game, passing yards per game, passing touchdowns, and Total QBR on the season.
- Six QBs were named to the 2024 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Top 25 watch list – tied for the most of any conference.
- Seven QBs are ranked in the top 25 of FBS in passing efficiency – the most of any conference.
- Six QBs are ranked in the top 26 of FBS in total yards per game – the most of any conference.
- ACC has two of the top four players nationally in total yards of offense per game.
- Cam Ward (Miami) is second nationally with 366.5 total yards of offense per game.
- Kyle McCord (Syracuse) is fourth nationally at 348.1 total yards of offense per game.
- Six QBs, including two of the top three players nationally, are ranked in the top 26 of FBS in passing yards per game – the most of any conference.
- Kyle McCord (Syracuse) is second nationally with an average of 354.4 passing yards per game.
- Cam Ward (Miami) is third nationally with an average of 343.3 passing yards per game.
- Seven QBs have thrown 15 touchdown passes or more this season – tied for the most of any conference.
- Four QBs rank in the top 10 nationally in passing touchdowns – Cam Ward (Miami) – 24; Tyler Shough (Louisville) – 20; Cade Klubnik (Clemson) – 20; and Kyle McCord (Syracuse) – 19.
- Five QBs are ranked in the top 25 of FBS in completion percentage – the second-most of any conference.
- Five QBs are ranked in the top 25 of FBS in points responsible for – the second-most of any conference.
- Cam Ward (Miami) is second nationally with 172 points responsible for this season.
- Five QBs, including four in the top 15, are ranked in the top 30 of FBS in total passing yards – tied for the second-most of any conference.
- Cam Ward (Miami) – 2,746; Kyle McCord (Syracuse) – 2,481; Tyler Shough (Louisville) – 2,348; and Fernando Mendoza (Cal) – 2,095 all rank in the top 15.
- Kyle McCord (Syracuse) is the only quarterback in all of FBS to throw for at least 300 yards in every game he has played this season.
- Four QBs are ranked in the top 30 of ESPN's Total QBR, including two in the top five.
- Cam Ward (Miami) – 91.0 and Cade Klubnik (87.4) rank in the top five nationally.
- Fourteen different ACC quarterbacks have thrown for at least 300 yards in a game this year.
- Three quarterbacks – Jacolby Criswell (North Carolina), Cam Ward (Miami) and Hank Bachmeier (Wake Forest) – have recorded at least one game of over 400 passing yards this season, with Ward posting two 400-plus yard passing games this year.
- Jacolby Criswell's 475 passing yards in Week 4 versus James Madison are the most by a quarterback in a single game this season.
- Three quarterbacks caught a touchdown pass in Week 9 of the season – Kyron Drones (Virginia Tech), Fernando Mendoza (Cal) and Cam Ward (Miami).
- Miami quarterback Cam Ward has thrown for over 15,000 yards passing in his career, making him the 13th player recognized by the NCAA to have reached that milestone.
- ACC had the most of any conferences on the following QB preseason watch lists: Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (13); Maxwell Award preseason watch list (10); and Davey O'Brien Award (8).
- The ACC had the top-ranked group of quarterback transfers in 2024 by CBS Sports.
- Since 2018, the ACC has had at least one quarterback drafted in the first round in five different drafts – the only conference to do that.

Troy Taylor enters his second season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football, Andrew Luck Director of Offense and Kevin M. Hogan Quarterbacks Coach in 2023.

During his first season, the program improved in several key areas. The Stanford offense held onto the ball at a far greater rate, ranking top-40 in the NCAA in time of possession (31:17) while cutting down its turnover margin by nine. Explosive plays were much more common as well, with twice as many 40+-yard passing plays as 2022, the most for the team since 2019. The Cardinal went 3-2 on the road, posting its first winning record away from The Farm in a non-COVID season since 2018.

In his Stanford debut, Taylor became the 23rd head coach in program history to win his coaching debut, as the Cardinal defeated Hawai'i on the road 37-24. In the victory, the Stanford defense recorded six sacks for the first time since 2018. The Cardinal also produced the largest comeback win in program history during his first season on The Farm, beating Colorado 46-43 in double overtime after trailing 29-0 at halftime. It is the fourth-largest comeback win in Pac-12 history, the second-largest road comeback in conference history, and featured the most points (46) scored in a half in Stanford history. Elic Ayomanor set the Stanford single game receiving record with 294 receiving yards in the victory. Two weeks later against No. 5 Washington, Ashton Daniels produced the second most yards in a single game by a Stanford quarterback (448) in program history.

Taylor, the 35th head coach in program history, was hired on Dec. 10, 2022, by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir. At Sacramento State, Taylor guided the Hornets to a 30-8 mark in four seasons and a berth in the FCS quarterfinals for the first time in school history. Prior to the 2022 season, Sacramento State had never won an FCS Playoff game in its program history.

Taylor led a high-powered Sacramento State team to a 12-1 record in 2022, with the Hornets ranking fourth nationally in scoring offense (42.9 ppg), fourth in total offense (499.8 ypg) and seventh in rushing offense (243.3 ypg). Sacramento State is the only FCS program that averaged at least 240 yards passing and 240 yards rushing per game, averaging 256.5 yards per game through the air and 243.3 on the ground.

Taylor took over a Stanford program that has won 108 games since the start of the 2010 season - a total that ranks among the nation's top-20 - with 31 of those wins coming against top-25 opponents, tied for the eighth-best mark in the country in that span.

The Cardinal is 14th nationally with 50 draft picks since 2010, second-most in the Pac-12. Stanford is tied for eighth nationally with 10 consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 15 Academic All-Americans in that span is five more than any other school nationally.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl and a Fiesta Bowl.

Taylor was hired as head coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 17, 2018, inheriting a program that had compiled three two-win seasons in the prior four-year stretch. Taylor immediately turned the Hornets into nine-game winners in his first season, guiding the program to its first three Big Sky championships (the program opted out of the 2021 spring season) and its first FCS Playoff

appearances in school history, despite competing at the FCS level since 1994 and in the Big Sky Conference since 1996.

In 2022, Taylor's Hornets set the school record for victories in a season. Running back Cameron Skattebo was named Big Sky Offensive MVP, nickelback Marte Mapu was the Defensive MVP and Taylor was Co-Coach of the Year. Overall, 17 players were honored by the Big Sky, as Taylor was also named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year. Sacramento State's season came to a close with a 66-63 defeat in the FCS Quarterfinals.

After opting not to play in the spring of the 2020-21 season, Taylor guided the Hornets to their second Big Sky Conference title in as many seasons in the fall of 2021. That year, Sacramento State posted an undefeated record of 8-0 in league games and earned another trip to the FCS Playoffs. Taylor was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year and was one of 17 finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award. Sacramento State finished ninth in total offense (463.9 ypg) and 22nd in total defense (329.7), while its scoring offense was 33rd (30.3) and scoring defense 15th (19.1).

In his first season with the Hornets, Taylor guided the team to a 9-4 overall record and a 7-1 league mark, which gave Sacramento State a share of the Big Sky Conference title for the first time in school history, and its first NCAA FCS Playoff berth. For those efforts, he was named the conference Coach of the Year and was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS national coach of the year).

Taylor was Utah's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for two seasons (2017-18), helping the Utes to their first Pac-12 South Division title in program history in 2018. Taylor's Utah offenses featured a balanced attack both seasons, with running back Zack Moss eclipsing the 1,000-yard mark on the ground in back-to-back seasons. At least 16 different players caught passes in both seasons.

Prior to joining the FBS ranks, Taylor was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Eastern Washington in 2016. That season, he directed the top passing offense in the FCS and set numerous national and school records. The Eagles averaged an FCS-best 401.0 passing yards per game, ranked second nationally with 529.6 yards per game and were third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg). EWU posted a 12-2 overall record and advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Under Taylor, sophomore Gage Gubrud set an NCAA FCS single-season record by passing for 5,160 yards while throwing 48 touchdown passes. Gubrud, the 2016 FCS Player of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, averaged 368.6 passing yards per game, which also led the nation. One of Gubrud's favorite targets was All-American Cooper Kupp, who caught 117 passes for 1,700 yards and 17 touchdowns before being selected by the Los Angeles Rams in the third round of the NFL Draft.

Taylor's success at Eastern Washington followed an illustrious run at Folsom High School, where he was co-head coach from 2012-15. The Bulldogs set numerous California state records, including the most points scored in a season. Folsom posted a 58-3 overall record, won the Sac-Joaquin Section title each season and claimed the 2014 CIF Division I championship with a 68-7 win over Oceanside. The team also set the California record for passing yards in four consecutive years.

Taylor was instrumental in the development of Jake Browning,

who would become the 2016 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year for Washington. Taylor coached Browning from fifth grade until he graduated as one of the most prolific passers in prep history. Browning set national records for touchdowns in a season (91 in 2014, tied) and career (229, in just three seasons), while establishing a number of California state high school records as well, including season (5,790) and career (16,775) passing yards.

As a player, Taylor guided Cordova High School to a 14-0 record and a section championship while being named the Northern California Player of the Year in 1985. Taylor continued his career at Cal, where he was the starting quarterback for the Golden Bears from 1986-89. Taylor led the Pac-10 in total offense as a senior and left Cal as the all-time leading passer with 8,126 yards. He was drafted by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 1990 NFL Draft.

Taylor's first coaching job was at Casa Roble High School in Orangevale, Calif., in 1994. The following year, Taylor was a graduate assistant at Colorado, where he worked with the wide receivers. He returned to Cal in 1996 and remained at his alma mater through the 1999 season, where he had stints coaching receivers, quarterbacks and tight ends. Taylor also served as Cal's recruiting coordinator in 1999.

Taylor left Cal to become an assistant athletics director at Christian Brothers High School (2000-01) in Sacramento, where he also taught and was an assistant football coach for one season (2000). He spent 2003-04 at Folsom High School as the co-head coach. Taylor stepped away from coaching after the 2004 season but remained in football, serving as the radio analyst for Cal from 2005-11.

Taylor, 56, and his wife, Tracey, have three children: sons, Noah and Aaron, and daughter, Ella.
