## Opening Draw

- Stanford faced tough opposition in its last outing, falling at home to undefeated and reigning national champions Boston College, 17-9, in what was the first loss at Cagan since 2023. Having fallen behind early in the first quarter, Stanford battled hard throughout the entirety of the game, cutting the deficit to four goals in the second quarter before a run by BC stretched the lead to a game-high 11. However, Stanford outscored the Eagles 4-1 in the final quarter as both Aliya Polisky and Ava Arceri secured multi-goal outings in the eventual 17-9 loss. In defeat, Stanford capped its nearly three-season long home winning streak at 20 games while the 1,177 fans was the largest attended match at Cagan since 2012.
- Heading into Wednesday, Stanford ranks inside the top-10 in all three women's lacrosse polls for fourth-straight week, earning a program high in the IWLCA Poll having been slotted in at No. 4. Stanford, which entered the season having never been slotted higher than No. 6 in any poll (regular season or postseason), ranked fifth in last week's IWLCA and ILWomen.com rankings and placed fourth in the USA Lacrosse Magazine Top 20, all three of which were program highs. Prior to this season, Stanford's highest ranking came in the 2012 preseason poll where the Cardinal was ranked sixth while Stanford's No. 4 ranking is the highest ranking of any West Coast program since 2017 (No. 3 USC, IWLCA Week One Poll, Feb. 20, 2017).
- With a 9-2 start to the campaign, Stanford is enjoying its best start to a season since 2021 where the Cardinal went a perfect 11-0 in the regular season before falling in the NCAA Tournament to Denver (15-13). Prior to 2021, Stanford had only been undefeated through the first eight games once in program history, starting the 2011 season 8-0 before finishing 16-3 with an NCAA Tournament bid and MPSF Tournament championship. Stanford has also secured four ranked wins this season which is the most in a single season since the 2022 campaign.
- Aliya Polisky continues to pace the Cardinal this season in goals (36) and points (43) after earning a three-point outing against the Eagles last Saturday via a 2-1-3 line. Polisky has tallied at least a point in every contest this season and has scored in all but one (3/7/2025 v. Syracuse). The Tennessee native has grabbed nine hat tricks this season which is one shy from her freshman year total after banking two of them in the 2-0 weekend against Virginia Tech and then-No. 4 Yale. Polisky has also tied her single-season record in game-winning goals, tallying three this season which stands tied for the current team lead with Ava Arceri.
- Elsewhere offensively, Stanford has two players slotted inside the top 10 in the conference in assists with Elise Murphy and Martha Oakey placing sixth and eighth, respectively, entering the week. Murphy leads

## Coaching Staff

### Danielle Spencer - Paul A. Violich Women's Lacrosse Head Coach



- Danielle Spencer enters her sixth season as Stanford's Paul A. Violich Women's Lacrosse Head Coach in 2025. Spencer was appointed the seventh head coach in program history on June 12, 2019.
- Under Spencer's guidance, Stanford swept the Pac-12 regular-season and tournament titles in three of the last four seasons (2021-22, 2024) while making three NCAA Tournament appearances. In six seasons on The Farm, Spencer has compiled a 58-26 overall record.
- Spencer has produced six All-Americans during her tenure on The Farm: Ali Baiocco (2021 IWLCA Second Team), Ashley Humphrey (2022 IWLCA Third Team), Annabel Frist (2024 USA Lacrosse Third Team), Aliya Polisky (2024 USA Lacrosse Honorable Mention), Madison McPherson (2024 ILWomen Honorable Mention) and Lucy Pearson (2024 ILWomen Honorable Mention).
- Since Spencer's arrival, multiple players have earned the following major conference awards: Pac-12 Attacker of the Year (2), Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year (1), Pac-12 Draw Specialist of the Year (2), Pac-12 Goalkeeper of the Year (3) and Pac-12 Freshman of the Year (2).
- A three-time conference coach of the year recipient, Spencer owns a 78-44 career overall record in eight seasons as a head coach, which includes a three-year stint at Dartmouth (29-19 overall).
- After the 2020 campaign was shortened due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, Spencer completed her first full season on The Farm in 2021. Spencer guided Stanford to its best win percentage in school history (.916) and the Cardinal won the Pac-12 regular season and tournament titles in the same year for the first time in program history. Stanford, which enjoyed the best start to a season (11-0) in program history, won its first Pac-12 regular season title since the league's inception in 2018 and finished the year ranked No. 16 in the IWLCA Coaches Poll. Senior Ali Baiocco was named to the IWLCA All-America second team - the first Cardinal All-American since 2018 and 11th in program history.
- In 2022, Stanford (12-7, 8-2 Pac-12) swept the conference championships, winning both the Pac-12 regular season and Pac-12 Tournament titles. Ashley Humphrey burst onto the scene as a redshirt freshman, setting program, conference and NCAA records for assists in a season with 88. She was named an IWLCA All-American and Pac-12 Freshman of the Year while Baiocco repeated as Pac-12 Attacker of the Year and Kara Rahaim claimed the Pac-12 Goalkeeper of the Year award. The Cardinal finished the season ranked No. 19 in the IWLCA Coaches Poll.
- Spencer, who served as an assistant at Stanford in 2012, returned to The Farm after she turned around the Dartmouth program in just three years and earned Ivy League Coach of the Year honors in each of her final two seasons (2018-19). Spencer inherited a program coming off three consecutive losing campaigns, but the Big Green won 11 games in her second year and captured an Ivy League regular season title in her third season.
- In 2019, Spencer guided Dartmouth to its first Ivy title since 2011, tying Princeton for the top spot in the conference standings. The Big Green earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, a first for the program since 2013.
- The Brighton, New York, native was named a member of the US Lacrosse Greater Rochester Hall of Fame Induction Class of 2018. Spencer graduated from Northwestern in 2010 with a degree in social policy.

### Grace Gavin Kennedy - Werdegar Family Assistant Women's Lacrosse Coach



- Grace Kennedy was promoted to Assistant Coach of Stanford Lacrosse in July, 2023 after serving as Volunteer Assistant Coach during the 2022-23 season. A 2011 graduate of Loyola University of Maryland, Kennedy helped lead the Greyhounds to a 17-3 overall record, a Big East Conference Championship, an NCAA Tournament appearance, and a no. 5 national ranking by her graduation in 2011.
- Kennedy played a pivotal role in the progress of Loyola University of Maryland's lacrosse program, helping the team improve dramatically from a 2-14 record in 2006 to a top-five nationally ranked squad by her senior year.
- Kennedy earned significant individual accolades during her playing career as well. She was named a Tewaaron finalist, a Honda Sports Award finalist, and a two-time IWLCA All-American during her four years as a Greyhound. Kennedy consistently earned recognition at the regional and conference level as well, being named a four-time Regional IWLCA All-American, a two-time Big East Attacker of the Year, a four-time All-Big East selection, and a two-time Big East All-Tournament selection.
- Kennedy holds Loyola's career record for goals (229), season records in points (98) and goals (71), and scored at least one point in 70 of her 71 career games, including a goal in 68 career contests. During her career with the Greyhounds, Kennedy led the team in goals and points in each of her four years.

### Kelsey Howard - Assistant Coach



- Kelsey Howard enters her second season on The Farm in 2024-25.
- Most recently, Howard has worked with Colby College Women's Lacrosse, serving as Assistant Head Coach since 2021 and previously as an assistant coach since 2018. While at Colby, Howard has led the offensive unit, taking control of play calling duties and developing scouting reports while also assisting in recruiting.
- Howard also spent time at Bentley University as a Volunteer Assistant Coach and with MaineIax Lacrosse Club where she led 20 players to collegiate rosters. Howard has worked closely with the IWLCA, serving as the organization's treasurer and Division III Coaches Poll Master.
- Howard is a two-time graduate of Bentley University, where she earned her Master's Degree in 2017 and her Bachelor's Degree in 2015. Howard played lacrosse and field hockey at Bentley, an NCAA Division II athletics program.
- Howard earned Intercollegiate Lacrosse Coaches Association All-Region honors, was a Northeast-10 Conference all-league selection, and earned conference all-academic honors during her time at Bentley. She was Bentley's NCAA Woman of the Year nominee and a captain for both teams.

### Nicole Beardsley - Assistant Coach



- Nicole Beardsley enters her first season on The Farm in 2024-25, having been hired in July 2024.
- Beardsley, who most recently served as Assistant Coach at Colorado, helped lead the Buffs to the Pac-12 Tournament Championship game in 2023 and 2024. Also the director of recruiting, draw controls, and offensive coordinator in Colorado, Beardsley helped generate the second-best scoring offense in the Pac-12 over the last two seasons and coached three USA Lacrosse Magazine All-Americans.
- Prior to her time in Boulder, Beardsley was an assistant coach, working with offense and goalkeepers at the University of Massachusetts. She has also spent time as the director of operations with Northwestern University Women's Lacrosse.
- A starting attack player in her collegiate career at Northwestern, Beardsley led the Wildcats to two NCAA final four appearances and was named a Big Ten All-Tournament Team selection in 2017.
- Beardsley graduated from Northwestern with her bachelor of science in Education and Social Policy with a focus on Human Development and Psychological Services and a Minor in Psychology in 2018. She also earned her master of science in Sport and Performance Psychology from the University of Western States in 2021.

## On Army West Point

- Army West Point (6-2, 2-1 Patriot League) heads into Wednesday's contest winners of three of their last four games including a 19-8 win on the road against Lehigh last Friday. On the strength of seven first quarter goals, the Black Knights cruised to their sixth win of the season, outscoring the Mountain Hawks 12-7 across the remaining three quarters to take the eventual win. Having started the year 3-0 thanks to a season-opening win over Rutgers, Army has only fallen twice during the campaign with one of those losses coming at the hands of No. 15 Loyola (Md.) while the other being a 12-6 loss on the road to Colorado. This season, Army is 6-0 when scoring 10 or more goals and has four double-digit victories.
- The Black Knights are led in points by Allison Reilly, who holds the lead in assists with 21 helpers on the season while tallying 22 goals, accumulating 43 points so far in eight games. Brigid Duffy is second on the squad with 40 points, courtesy of 11 assists and her team leading 29 goals. Elsewhere, Chloe Garrett and Geneva Milch Cesoni sit third and fourth in points with 18 and 14, respectively, as Milch Cesoni has tallied all 14 of her points via goals. Army averages 13.75 goals per game which sits fifth in the Patriot League, while on the draw, the Black Knights are fifth in the conference at 52%, headlined by Duffy's 44 draw controls this year.
- Defensively, the Black Knights hold the top honors in the Patriot League in scoring defense, limiting opponents to 9.00 goals per game which is ninth best in the nation. In cage, Lindsey Serafine leads the charge with 8 starts this season, accumulating an 8.84 goals-against average coupled with a .432 save percentage as her goals-against average sits second in the conference and ninth in the nation. Army is third in the Patriot League in caused turnovers per game at 9.63 while averaging 15.63 ground balls per game.
- On the sideline, Michelle Tumolo leads Army in her fourth season with the program, amassing a 29-13 record at West Point and a 42-20 record across a seven-year coaching career. Having previously served as the bench boss at Wagner, Tumolo led the Black Knights to an NCAA Tournament at-large berth in 2023, grabbing a program-record 15 wins during the historic season that also saw the program reach the Patriot League Championship title game for the first time. During Tumolo's three seasons at West Point, Army has yet to have a losing record and has grabbed nine wins or more in each of the last three campaigns.
- This week's matchup marks the second all-time meeting between the two programs after the two sides met up on The Farm in early March last year in what was a 17-8 win for the Cardinal. After the Black Knights came back to trim the halftime deficit to one goal, Stanford rattled off nine of the last 10 goals of the game - including four in a fourth quarter shutout - to clinch the 17-8 win.

## Team Notes

- the Cardinal with 22 helpers on the year which is 26th nationally and sixth in the ACC while Oakey's 17 assists placed her 43rd in the nation and eighth in the conference. On the draw, Dakota Uy and Jordyn Case are tied for the team lead with 38 this season while Ava Arceri and Amanda Lawson sit third and fourth on the squad with 30 and 28 draw controls, respectively.
- The Cardinal continues to keep pace with the nation's best defensively, securing the fourth-best scoring defense in the conference and 17th in the nation (9.36). Junior Lucy Pearson ranks inside the top 10 in the conference in saves (83), save percentage (45.1%) and goals-against average (9.53). Pearson claimed ACC and IWFLCA Defensive Player of the Week last weekend after a 17-save weekend against the Hokies and Bulldogs, stopping a career-high 15 saves in the win over Yale before a solid day against BC on Saturday, grabbing 11 saves on 41 shots faced.
- The defensive corps for Stanford still ranks highly entering week eight of the season, sitting sixth in the ACC in caused turnovers per game (9.27) and first in the conference in ground balls per game (19.55). The Cardinal also ranks 10th in the nation in scoring margin at +5.45. Olivia Rose and Lucy Pearson bookend the top three placements in the conference in ground balls per game at 2.91 and 2.73 per game, respectively. Rylee Bouvier is just outside the top 10 in the ACC in caused turnovers per game at 1.45.

## Team Notes (CTND)

### CARD AT CAGAN

- Following the 17-9 loss to No. 1 Boston College, Stanford's nearly three-season long win streak was capped at 20 games (which was the longest in DI at the time). With a win against Pitt on February 27, Stanford broke its home win-streak record at Cagan Stadium set from the 2010-11 seasons which was originally 16-consecutive wins. Until the loss to Boston College, Stanford had not lost at Cagan since the 2023 season-opener against Virginia (11-14) with the Cardinal grabbing 20-straight wins across the three-season stretch. During that span, Stanford had outscored its opponents 336-185 (+151).

### STINGY STANFORD

- Stanford currently holds a +24 scoring differential in the fourth quarter and +38 differential in the second half after 11 games this season.
- Versus Virginia Tech, the Cardinal allowed one goal in the final 51:58 of game action and held the Hokies scoreless for 46:36 of game action between the first and fourth quarters.
- Against Cornell, Stanford allowed just one goal in the second half, holding the Big Red to its only goal of the half with 37 seconds left in regulation. It was the second time this season that the Cardinal have limited the opposition to one goal in a single half.
- Stanford's 7-1 route in the third quarter against Pitt helped the Cardinal to its second ACC win on the season and first-ever at home. However, Pitt became the first team to outscore the Cardinal in the fourth-quarter this season, outscoring Stanford 6-3 in the frame.
- Having allowed the opening goal of the second half against UVA, Stanford held strong, allowing one goal in the final 28:14 of game action, outscoring the Cavaliers 7-2 during the second half.
- Against the Aggies, Stanford held UC Davis without a goal in two quarters and did not allow a goal in the final 24:50 of game action.
- The Cardinal, which limited Colorado to just one goal in the final frame, clamped down defensively against the Buffs in the second half, eventually outscoring CU 10-2 to earn the comeback win.
- Against USC, the Cardinal held The Trojans without a goal in the final 19:59 of game action en route to a 9-2 run in the second half.

### TENNESSEE DON'T MIND

- For her efforts against USC, Tennessee native Aliya Polisky was named the USA Lacrosse Magazine DI Women's Player of the Week on Feb. 11 after her eight-point appearance. Polisky's five-goal first quarter is the most she has scored in a single quarter in her career.

- Having accumulated 17 saves across the weekend, including a career-high 15 in the win over the No. 4 Bulldogs, Lucy Pearson earned Stanford's first weekly defensive honor, claiming both the IWLCA National- and ACC Defensive Player of the Week nods. Pearson grabbed her 15 saves on 34 shots faced in the affair against Yale while also spearheading a defense that held Virginia Tech to one goal in the final 53:42 of game action, including a shutout run of 46:36 between the first and fourth quarter.

### **OKAY OAKEY**

- Freshman - and Charlottesville, Va., native - Martha Oakey enters Saturday after a stellar outing in the season-opening win over USC with a goal and four assists in her first collegiate game. Oakey assisted on Polisky's season-opening mark before accumulating her first collegiate goal in the third quarter as part of a string of three-unanswered Cardinal tallies in the frame.
- Oakey is second on the team in assists heading into the week, having grabbed her 17th of the season in the win over Yale. Oakey has amassed 26 points so far this season and leads the team in freshman scoring.

### **SOARIN' WITH ARCERI**

- Ava Arceri had her breakout game in the 20-3 win over UC Davis as the sophomore grabbed a career-high five goals in the win. Having only scored four goals in 14 appearances last season, Arceri has scored in each of Stanford's 11 games this season and has already quadrupled her single-season goal scoring mark from 2024 with 29 on the campaign.
- Arceri also sits third on the team in draw controls (30) and earned a single-game high in draw controls in the win over UC Davis, tallying six on her tab.

### **NOTES ON THE FARM**

- Stanford finished the 2024 campaign near the top in the nation in multiple defensive categories including scoring defense (11th, 9.00), caused turnovers per game (8th, 10.56), save percentage (12, 47.4%) and ground balls per game (5th, 21.00).
- The Cardinal, which has swept the Pac-12 regular-season and tournament titles in three of the last four seasons (2021-22, 24), transitions to the ACC in 2025, a storied lacrosse league that boasts eight NCAA championships among its current membership and 19 overall.
- Stanford was picked fifth in the 2025 ACC Women's Lacrosse Preseason Coaches' Poll, as announced by the conference on Tuesday. The Cardinal boasts two players on the conference's All-ACC Team with Annabel Frist being named as the conference's draw control specialist while Aliya Polisky earned an At-Large bid.
- Three Cardinal were tabbed to Preseason All-America lists including senior midfielder Annabel Frist, junior goalkeeper Lucy Pearson and sophomore attacker Aliya Polisky. Pearson was named a USA Lacrosse All-America Honorable Mention, while Frist and Polisky earned Second Team and Third Team honors, respectively. Polisky and Frist were also named to InsideLacrosse.com's Nike Lacrosse Women's DI Media All-American list with Polisky garnering Second Team honors and Frisk earning Third Team recognition.
- The Cardinal's five losses in the 2024 campaign was the lowest total since the one-loss campaign in 2021 in which the Cardinal took home the Pac-12 regular season and postseason championships in the same season for the first time in program history. In the five losses, all but one were decided by one goal or less, including three to ranked opponents (2/11 at #16 Virginia, 4/25 at #13 Stony Brook and 5/10 vs. #12 Denver).

- Stanford is well positioned to produce a strong ACC debut, returning its top two offensive threats in Aliya Polisky (53 goals, 18 assists, 120 shots) and Jordyn Case (48 goals, 14 assists, 114 shots). Rylee Bouvier (20 goals, 9 assists) and Annabel Frist (19 goals, 19 draw controls) were also among the Cardinal's top seven goal scorers overall while goalkeeper Lucy Pearson (132 saves) anchors the defense.
- Senior Annabel Frist, junior Lucy Pearson and sophomore Aliya Polisky continue to rake in the preseason praise having been named to the 2025 Tewaaron Award Watch List which was announced by the Tewaaron Foundation. The trio is part of a list of 50 players for the award that recognizes the sport's top player.
- The Cardinal landed three players among the InsideLacrosse.com Top 50 Players For 2025 list, with Aliya Polisky (19), Annabel Frist (46) and Lucy Pearson (50) earning preseason recognition. Stanford's total of three top-50 selections ranks tied for fourth in the country, behind only defending NCAA champion Boston College (6), Northwestern (5) and Michigan (5). North Carolina also was recognized with three picks.
