**SETTING THE SCENE**  
Stanford men's basketball posted a successful first season under the leadership of Kyle Smith, winning the program's most games since 2014-15 (21) and matching a program record for wins on its home court (17). The 2025-26 campaign will mark the program's second in the Atlantic Coast Conference, after Stanford finished seventh in its maiden season.

- TL; DR**
- Stanford's young roster holds an exciting mix of returning players, transfers and freshmen. Stanford returns two starters and six of the top nine in its rotation while adding in a pair of highly-touted transfers and a strong freshman class.
  - Kyle Smith enters his second season as Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball. The 2024 Pac-12 Coach of the Year led Stanford to 21 wins in its first ACC campaign, the program's most since 2014-15.
  - Smith is also the second head coach in program history to win 20 or more games in his first season, while his seven-win improvement from the previous season matched a program record for a first-year head coach.
  - The Cardinal was postseason bound for the first time since 2018, appearing in the NIT. The postseason appearance was the fourth in a row for a Smith-coached program.
  - Maxime Raynaud graduated from Stanford after posting one of the top seasons in program history, and the All-American was drafted by the Sacramento Kings in June.

**CONTINUITY AT STANFORD**  
Stanford returns 52 percent of its minutes played from a year ago and 11 of the Cardinal's players (nine scholarship) are back in 2025-26. The Cardinal is the only program in the ACC with more than 50 percent of its minutes returning, and one of only two with 40 percent or more returning (Notre Dame), while it also brings back 37.4 percent of its scoring, which ranks fourth in the ACC. Stanford joins only Marquette and Houston among power conference programs to bring back nine scholarship student-athletes.

## FARM SYSTEM

Stanford returns nine of its 13 scholarship players from a year ago, and 11 total players, accounting for 52.0 percent of the team's minutes and 37.4 percent of the team's scoring in 2024-25. A versatile chess piece for Kyle Smith, Ryan Agarwal is the leading returning scoring scorer at 7.3 points per game, while he also ranked second on the team in rebounds (4.9) and assists (2.1) per game. Agarwal's 29 returning starts leads the Cardinal, while Donavin Young (16) and Aidan Cammann (14) were also consistent presences in the starting unit. Young was one of the most efficient low-usage players in the ACC, while Cammann was a versatile option at each of the frontcourt positions.

The top two bench performers for Stanford in 2024-25 are primed for larger roles this coming season. Benny Gealer averaged 6.0 points and 2.0 assists per game as the backup point guard to Jaylen Blakes, who graduated after posting 13.1 points per game a year ago, while Chisom Okpara ranked fifth on the team with 6.5 points per game while posting shooting splits of 50.3 percent from the field and 46.2 percent from beyond the arc.

Stanford's other returners include wings Evan Stinson and Jaylen Thompson, guard Anthony Batson, Jr., and center Tallis Toure. Thompson was a four-star signee in 2022, while Stinson, Batson and Toure will look for larger roles in their second seasons at Stanford.

## KING RAYNAUD

Maxime Raynaud was the nation's premier center last season, averaging 20.1 points and 10.6 rebounds per game, ranking 14th and ninth nationally, while also ranking second in the country in double-doubles (25). His 21st double-double, coming against Boston College on Feb. 26, set a new Stanford single-season record, passing Adam Keefe (1991-92), while Raynaud was the only player in the country to average at least 20 points and 10 rebounds. He ranked first in the ACC in rebounding and second in scoring while setting a new Stanford single-season record with 371 rebounds, and he finished fourth all-time with 707 points in a season. Raynaud graduated as the third Stanford player to record at least 1,600 points and 900 rebounds in program history, joining Adam Keefe and Kim Belton.

Raynaud was drafted in the second round of the 2025 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings, and he gave the Cardinal an NBA Draft selection for the fourth time in seven years, making Stanford one of four teams in the ACC to accomplish the feat, joining Duke, North Carolina and Florida State.

## NEW FACES AT STANFORD

The Cardinal signed a promising quartet of freshmen in the class of 2025 while adding a pair of accomplished transfers. Ebuka Okorie is a four-star point guard from On3 and the 247 composite rankings, arriving at Stanford after starring at Brewster Academy in New Hampshire. Okorie was the 2024-25 Gatorade Player of the Year in New Hampshire, and he led Brewster to a semifinal appearance at the Chipotle High School Basketball National Championships. Additionally, Myles Jones, a three-star signee from the 2026 class, reclassified to join the Cardinal in 2025. A dynamic guard and elite shooter, Jones was a two-time all-conference honoree at Modesto Christian.

Kristers Skrinda (Latvia) and Oskar Giltay (Belgium) arrive from Europe, looking to grow and develop in the mold of Raynaud. Both players were among the European leaders at FIBA U18 Eurobasket in 2024, with Skrinda ranking 10th in the event in scoring and second in rebounding while leading the tournament in double-doubles, and Giltay paced the event in blocks. Skrinda, who signed in November, is rated a four-star recruit from On3, while Giltay signed in May.

Stanford has added a graduate transfer for the fourth consecutive season, joining Michael Jones (2023-24), Jared Bynum (2024) and Jaylen Blakes (2025). Jeremy Dent-Smith arrives after a record-breaking career at Division II Cal-State Dominguez Hills, where he was a two-time first team All-American and the CSUDH single-season scoring leader. Dent-Smith averaged 19.2 points, 4.6 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game in 2024-25, leading the Toros to the national championship game and runner-up finish. AJ Rohosy joins after an All-American and Academic All-American campaign at Division III Claremont-Mudd-Scripps, where he averaged 21.3 points and 10.5 rebounds per game while breaking the program's record for field goal percentage (64.8%). Rohosy began his career at Washington State as a walk-on under Kyle Smith.

## MATCH MY NUMBERS

- Benny Gealer is one of two high major players returning nationally who averaged at least six points and two assists per game with at least a 3.6-to-1 assist to turnover ratio (min. 50% games played). The only other player to qualify is Florida's Boogie Fland (via Arkansas).

- Ryan Agarwal is one of six major conference returners to match or exceed his per game averages in points (7.3), rebounds (4.9) and assists (2.1) while making at least 42 3-pointers. The other players are Alex Karaban (UConn), John Blackwell (Wisconsin), Tomislav Ivisic (Illinois), Darrion Williams (NC State, via Texas Tech) and Keyshawn Hall (Auburn, via UCF).

- Aidan Cammann is one of two returners in the ACC to meet his 2024-25 totals in points (90), rebounds (94), assists (34) and blocks (21). The only other qualifying ACC returner is Georgia Tech's Baye Ndongo.

- Chisom Okpara is one of six returners in the ACC that posted at least 6.5 points and 2.0 rebounds per game with an effective field goal percentage of at least 55.9 percent. Okpara joins Isaac McKeeley (Louisville, via Virginia), J'Vonne Hadley (Louisville), Tobi Lawal (Virginia Tech), Cameron Corhen (Pittsburgh) and Ven-Allen Lubin (NC State, via North Carolina).

## PROGRAM STANDARDS

Stanford broke a trio of single-season program records as a team last season, in free throw percentage, 3-pointers made and turnovers per game. Stanford ended the year at 78.9 percent from the stripe as a team, which bested the previous program record of 76.3 percent, set by the 2005-06 team. Stanford ranked 13th nationally in free throw percentage and led the ACC in league play at 83.6 percent.

Stanford gave up only 10.5 turnovers per night, its lowest mark on record. The previous record was 10.8 per game, accomplished by the 2014-15 team. Finally, the Cardinal made 294 3-pointers, breaking the program record for the third consecutive season.

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Stanford finished the 2024-25 regular season with the ACC's second-best home record, and it went 17-3 overall, including a 9-1 mark in the ACC. Duke went 10-0 in the ACC at home, while the Cardinal were one of three one-loss teams at home in conference play, along with Clemson and Louisville. Stanford outscored all opponents at home by 11.0 points per night in ACC play. The Cardinal matched its program record, along with the 2011-12 team, with 17 home wins.

## SWEEP CAL

Stanford earned its third victory of the 2024-25 season over rival California, 78-73, in the second round of the ACC Tournament. The three-game sweep of Cal is the first for the program since 1962, as Stanford improved to 4-3 all-time against the Golden Bears in a conference tournament. The regular season sweep was Stanford's first over California since 2021, and Stanford went unbeaten against Cal for the first time since 2015.

The Cardinal has won five straight games versus the Bears, marking the first 5-0 stretch since winning six in a row from March 8, 2003-Jan. 13, 2006. The meeting was the fourth against Cal in a conference tournament game in the past six seasons, with Stanford ending the Cal season in each of the last two years.

## PRO CARD

The Cardinal is set to have five players on NBA rosters this season in Brook Lopez (LA Clippers), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks), Ziaire Williams (Brooklyn Nets), Spencer Jones (Denver Nuggets) and 2025 draft pick Maxime Raynaud (Sacramento Kings), in addition to a plethora of successful players in leagues around the world. Two years removed from leading the Association in blocks, Brook Lopez ranked third in the category in 2024-25 (1.9/game) to go along with averages of 13.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. Powell, who helped lead the Mavericks to the 2024 NBA Finals - the first Cardinal player to appear since Lopez in 2021 - averaged 2.1 points and 2.1 rebounds per game last season.

In his fourth NBA campaign, Williams averaged career-bests of 10.0 points, and 4.6 rebounds per game for the Nets, starting 45 of 63 games, while Spencer Jones made 20 appearances for the Nuggets in his rookie season, scoring 1.3 points per game. Raynaud's dazzling performances continued into NBA Summer League with the Kings, who finished in second place as Raynaud averaged 12.8 points and 6.0 rebounds per night.



# KYLE SMITH

ANNE AND TONY JOSEPH DIRECTOR OF MEN'S BASKETBALL  
SECOND SEASON AT STANFORD

Kyle Smith was announced as the Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball on March 25, 2024, and he begins his second season at Stanford in 2025-26.

In its first season in the ACC, and the first under Smith, the Cardinal finished the 2024-25 season at 21-14 overall, marking its most total victories since 2014-15 while matching a program record with 17 wins at Maples Pavilion. Stanford went 9-1 at home in the ACC, while Smith is just the second coach in program history to win 20 or more games in his first season. Additionally, the seven-win improvement year-to-year matches a program record for a first-year head coach. Smith saw numerous players have career-best seasons, led by All-American and ACC first team honoree and Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Maxime Raynaud.

Smith landed at The Farm following a successful five-year stint at Washington State, where he went 94-71 overall, including a 25-10 mark and second-place finish in the Pac-12 in 2023-24. Smith holds a 279-207 career record across 15 seasons as a head coach, including six seasons at Columbia and three at San Francisco. Additionally, he spent 18 years as an assistant coach with stretches at Saint Mary's (2001-10), Air Force (2000-01) and San Diego (1992-2000).

The 2024 John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year, Smith led the Cougars to a No. 7 seed in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the round of 32 with a victory over Drake in the opening round, while the postseason event was the seventh for Smith as a head coach and third with Washington State. The Cougars also reached the NIT semifinals in 2022 and earned a bid for a second consecutive season in 2023.

Smith was the first coach in Washington State history to post a .500 or better record in each of his first four seasons, doing so after taking over a program that was under .500 in each of the previous seven campaigns.

A talented coach known for expertise in analytics and player development, Smith's tutelage has included three NBA Draft selections in CJ Elleby (2020), Mouhamed Gueye (2023) and Jaylen Wells (2024), as well as Pac-12 Freshman of the Year Myles Rice (2024), while three Cougars earned All-Pac-12 recognition in 2024. Smith also coached San Francisco's Jamaree Bouyea, who made his NBA debut in 2023, and mentored a series of professional athletes as an assistant coach, including NBA players Matthew Dellavedova and Patty Mills at Saint Mary's.

Smith has also seen success on the recruiting trail, landing two top-60 classes, the highest for Washington State in over a decade. He signed a top-100 prospect to Pullman in the class of 2022, the first for the program since Klay Thompson in 2008.

Prior to Smith's tenure at Washington State, he led San Francisco to a 63-40 record, including 20 wins or more in each season and two postseason appearances. His three straight 20-win seasons marked just the fourth time in school history that a USF coach accomplished the feat and the first time in nearly 40 years. Smith produced seven All-WCC picks, paced by two-time All-WCC first team selection Frankie Ferrari.

Preceding his time in the Bay Area, he served as the head coach at Columbia where he put together a 101-82 overall mark, including a CIT Championship in his final season. Smith mentored 10 All-Ivy League selections over his six seasons at Columbia, led by Maodo Lo, a two-time first team honoree and the second-leading scorer in school history.

Smith played an integral role in building the Gaels' program into a perennial championship contender in the West Coast Conference under head coach Randy Bennett. In his nine seasons in Moraga, the Gaels made three NCAA Tournament (2005, '08, '10) appearances and earned one NIT bid (2009). Saint Mary's averaged 23 wins over Smith's last six seasons on the staff, including an 81-20 record over his final three seasons. The 2009-10 team finished with a 28-6 record, advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship and was ranked 19th nationally in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

During his one season at Air Force, Smith served as the Falcons' offensive and recruiting coordinator and took a lead role with player development and scouting. He was instrumental in the recruitment of 2003-04 Mountain West Conference Player of the Year Nick Welch along with all-conference players Antoine Hood and A.J. Kuhle.

Before joining the Falcons, Smith served eight seasons as an assistant coach at San Diego from 1992-2000 under Hank Egan and Brad Holland. During his time at San Diego, Smith helped lead the Toreros to their second-highest win total in school history (20 in 1999-2000) and as associate head coach, orchestrated a defense that allowed the lowest opponent scoring average (62.6) in the West Coast Conference (62.6 in 1999-2000).

Born in El Paso, Texas, Smith graduated in 1992 from Hamilton College with a degree in English literature. He also played basketball and helped lead the Continentals to a 26-1 record and the No. 1 ranking in the nation for NCAA Division III as a junior. He shot a school-record 51.3 percent from three-point range and helped Hamilton to an Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) championship.

Smith earned a master's degree in educational leadership from the University of San Diego, where he began his coaching career.

Kyle and his wife, Katie, have three sons, Rocco, Bo, and Luke.
