THE OPENING KICKOFF

- Stanford football is back on the road for the third time in four games as it takes on Virginia in Week 4. Kickoff at Scott Stadium on Sept. 20 is at 4:30 pm PT on ACC Network.
- The Cardinal won its home opener by beating Boston College 30-20 in Week 3, winning its conference opener for the second time in as many seasons. The last time Stanford won consecutive conference openers came in 2015-16.
- Big plays helped ignite the Stanford offense in the win over Boston College. The Cardinal had three offensive plays of at least 40 yards, the team's first three plays of 40 or more yards in 2025. The longest was a 75-yard rush from Micah Ford.
- · Staying with the sophomore running back, Ford set a new career-high with 157 rushing yards in the Cardinal win over the Eagles. He racked up the most rushing yards by a Cardinal in a single game since Bryce Love ran for 166 yards on Nov. 10, 2017 against Washington. Through three weeks, Ford ranks third in the ACC in rushing yards. He was named ACC Running Back of the Week following the performance.

- One of the turning points against Boston College was a 69-yard catch-and-run by Sam Roush for Stanford's first touchdown of the game, and the team's longest passing play of the season. It was the longest play of Roush's career and the longest touchdown by a Stanford tight end since Colby Parkinson's 75-yard score against Oregon State on Nov. 10, 2018.
- Through three weeks, Stanford's defense ranks near the top of the NCAA in many defensive categories. Stanford is one of seven teams with multiple defensive touchdowns after Collin Wright took an interception back for a touchdown against Boston College. Stanford is also tied for 16th in sacks (9) and ranks 24th in opponents' red zone touchdown percentage (35.7%).
- · Against Boston College, Stanford's defense forced three turnovers. Following each turnover, Stanford scored a touchdown. It was the first time Stanford recorded 21 points off turnovers since Nov. 12, 2016 against Oregon State.
- Stanford welcomed 17 transfers to the program in 2025, the most in a single season in program history and more than all other seasons combined.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

- 1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.
- 2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.
- 3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.
- 4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

- 1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.
- 2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.
- 3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.
- 4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).
- 5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.
- 6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

THE MATCHUP

- · Stanford and Virginia meet for the first time on Saturday night in Charlottesville.
- It is the fourth time since Stanford joined the ACC that the Cardinal plays a team for the first time. In 2024, Stanford played Syracuse, NC State, and Louisville in their first-ever meetings.
- Virginia is playing its second game against an ACC team in 2025, but it will be the first conference game for the Cavaliers. In Week 2, Virginia played NC State in a non-conference game, won by the Wolfpack.
- Stanford is looking to open conference play 2-0 for the first time since 2018, when Stanford started 2-0 in the Pac-12 before finishing the season 9-4 and beating current ACC-rival Pittsburgh in the Sun Bowl.
- The Cavaliers own the eighth-best offense in college football in terms of total yards per game (556.0) and rushing yards per game (266.7). Meanwhile, Stanford's defense is allowing its fewest total yards per game since 2014 and its fewest rushing yards per game allowed since 2013.

ON THIS DAY IN STANFORD HISTORY...

...Stanford beat San Jose State 63-21 to open the 1969 season behind starting quarterback Jim Plunkett, this week's honorary game captain. Plunkett turned in an efficient opener, finishing 13-15 for 221 passing yards and two touchdowns as Stanford raced out of the gates in its season opener. Demea Washington caught two touchdowns in the win, Howie Williams ran in three scores, and Stanford put up 634 yards of total offense. Stanford finished the season 7-2-1 in the precursor to Plunkett's Heisman Trophy-winning campaign in 1970.

HEAD COACH FRANK REICH

Frank Reich was named Stanford's interim head football coach on March 31, 2025, by Stanford Football General Manager Andrew Luck. The 36th head coach in program history, Reich will serve as interim head coach for the 2025 campaign.

Reich is one of the sport's most well-respected offensive minds thanks to over 30 years in professional football, combining a 14-year playing career as an NFL quarterback with 18 seasons in various coaching roles. Reich was a member of six Super Bowl teams overall, four as a player with the Buffalo Bills (1991-94), and twice as a coach.

Highly regarded in NFL circles with a knack for building lasting relationships, Reich's six-year head coaching tenure included five seasons with the Indianapolis Colts (2018-22) before his final stop at the helm of the Carolina Panthers (2023). Reich's NFL resume also includes four years as an offensive coordinator, including two seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles (2016-17), the second of which resulted in the franchise's first Super Bowl title in Super Bowl LII (2018).

Reich's first season as Indianapolis head coach in 2018 coincided with the final season of Luck's playing career. Despite a 1-5 start, Reich guided the Colts to a 10-6 overall record and an appearance in the Divisional Round of the NFL Playoffs during a season that was highlighted by Luck earning Pro Bowl honors while being named the NFL Comeback Player of the Year.

Reich's coaching career also includes two seasons as the offensive coordinator of the San Diego Chargers (2014-15), following stints as quarterbacks coach, wide receivers coach, and offensive coaching staff assistant with Indianapolis and Arizona. A coaching staff member of two Super Bowl-winning franchises, Reich also served as an offensive staff assistant when Indianapolis won Super Bowl XLI (2007).

Selected in the third round (57th overall) of the 1985 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills, Reich's NFL career spanned 14 seasons and four organizations, with his last four years split between the Carolina Panthers (1995), New York Jets (1996), and Detroit Lions (1997-98). Reich threw for 40 touchdowns and passed for 6,075 yards, making 20 starts over a 118-game career.

A native of Lebanon, Pennsylvania, Reich spent his first nine seasons in Buffalo, mostly serving in a backup role to Pro Football Hall of Famer Jim Kelly. Reich's trademark dependability and willingness to stay ready were among his most notable strengths as a player, resulting in one of the most memorable moments in NFL playoff history. In a wild card round game on Jan. 3, 1993, host Buffalo overcame a 35-3 third-quarter deficit to defeat the Houston Oilers 41-38 in overtime to set a record for the largest comeback in NFL history at the time. Starting in place of Kelly, who sustained an injury one week earlier, Reich engineered the historic comeback and completed 21 of 34 passes for 289 yards and four touchdowns.

Before authoring what still stands as the largest comeback in NFL postseason history, Reich was also responsible for the then-largest comeback in NCAA history. Reich, who played collegiately at Maryland from 1980-84 and spent his first three seasons backing up Boomer Esiason, rallied the Terrapins from a 31-0 halftime deficit to a 42-40 victory over the defending national champion Miami Hurricanes at the Miami Orange Bowl on Nov. 10, 1984. Reich finished 108-for-169 and threw for 1,446 yards and nine touchdowns as a senior in 1984, with his six touchdowns against the Hurricanes remaining the school's single-game record.

Reich was a three-sport athlete in football, basketball, and baseball at Cedar Crest High School in Lebanon, Pennsylvania. The team's starting quarterback over his final two seasons, Reich participated in the 1980 edition of the Big 33 Football Classic, an annual allstar game comprising the top high-school players in Pennsylvania.

DEFENSE KEEPS IMPROVING

The defense has been carrying the Cardinal through three weeks of the 2025 season. The unit has shown a knack for making game-changing plays while continuing to show improvements across the board in all statistical categories.

In 2023, Stanford was historically bad defensively, allowing 461.7 yards per game. Last year, opposing yards per game dropped to 413.5, the best mark by a Stanford defense since 2018. Albeit a small sample size, through three games in 2025, Stanford is allowing just 342.3 yards per game to its opponents. The last time a Stanford defense was that effective was 2014 (282.4 yards per game).

Already in 2025, Stanford has two defensive touchdowns, after Collin Wright's pick-six against Dylan Lonergan of Boston College. Stanford is one of just seven teams with multiple defensive touchdowns this season.

Getting to the quarterback has been a point of emphasis for the Cardinal, and the team has done a great job making life difficult for opposing gunslingers. Stanford has nine sacks through three games, ranking third in the ACC and tied for 16th in college football. Six different Cardinal have at least one sack, with Clay Patterson (3) and Hunter Barth (2) leading the team.

The defense has also been great at preventing touchdowns when in the red zone. Stanford has allowed just five touchdowns on 14 red zone trips. The opponents' success rate of 35.7% is 24th in FBS.

OLD GUYS RULE

There are 35 players in FBS that have played at least seven years of college football. Clay Patterson is one of them, and he has gotten off to a fast start in 2025.

Patterson, who began his collegiate career at Yale in 2019, recorded a strip-sack on the first defensive play of the season for Stanford. It was part of a two-sack performance in the opener for Patterson at Hawai'i, his first multi-sack game on The Farm.

Patterson added another sack against BYU, giving him sacks in consecutive games for the first time since a five-game span in 2022-23 when he was at Yale. He ranks third in the ACC in sacks.

Another veteran making his presence early in the season is Bryce Farrell. A sixth-year wide receiver, who walked away from football after last season, returned to help lead a new receiver room in 2025. After being held without a catch in Week 0, Farrell has piled up ten catches over the last two games. He leads Stanford in receiving yards with 140 through three games.

ROSE IS BLOOMING

Taking over as one of the starting inside linebackers in 2025, Matt Rose began to bloom in the first game of his senior season. He logged 13 tackles to lead all players, and added a pair of tackles-for-loss and his first career sack. His 13 tackles were the most by a Stanford player since Malik Antoine recorded 14 against UCLA on Dec. 19, 2020. It was the most tackles in a single game by a Stanford linebacker since Bobby Okereke in the 121st Big Game vs. California in 2018.

Through three games, Rose leads the ACC in total tackles (30) and ranks second in the country in solo tackles (21). He has at least seven total tackles in every game and at least ten tackles in two games.

AGE LEADS TO EXPERIENCE

Stanford's defense has a lot of returning experience in 2025, with the defensive line bringing back some of the most experienced Cardinal on the roster.

Anthony Franklin (37) and Clay Patterson (33) both have over 30 career starts. They join Jahmeer Carter (46) and Daniel Rickert (36) of Virginia as the only defensive line duo in the ACC with at least 30 career starts.

Four additional players on Stanford's defense could get to 30 career starts by the end of the season: Scotty Edwards, Mitch Leigber, Tevarua Tafiti, and Collin Wright.

FIRE UP MY FORD

It was expected that Stanford would use a heavy rotation of running backs, with a very deep and talented room figuring to be a strength of the team. Through three games, Micah Ford has risen to the top of the running back room as one of the best backs in the ACC.

Ford has put together multiple 100-yard rushing games in 2025, including a 157-yard performance in Stanford's Week 3 win over Boston College. He became the first Stanford rusher with at least 150 yards on the ground since Cam Scarlett in 2019. His 157 rushing yards were the most since Bryce Love's 166 against Washington on Nov. 10, 2017. With 291 rushing yards, Ford trails only Demon June (400) and Hollywood Smothers (380) in rushing yards by ACC backs.

Ford also has shown breakaway speed this season, in addition to his physical style of rushing. He's broken loose for multiple runs of at least 30 yards, including a 75-yard run against Boston College. That was the longest run by a Cardinal since an 87-yard scamper by E.J. Smith against Colgate in 2022. His 23 broken tackles through three games are the most in the ACC and fourth best in FBS.

Following the game, Ford was named ACC Running Back of the Week. It is the first time he has taken home the weekly award, after earning Rookie of the Year honors last year after Week 5.

TURNOVERS LEAD TO POINTS

Stanford has forced four turnovers in 2025 and has scored touchdowns off all four.

Clay Patterson recorded a strip-sack that was recovered in the end zone by Wilfredo Aybar on the first defensive snap of 2025, in Week 0 at Hawai'i. Stanford is one of four teams this year to record its first touchdown of the season via a defensive touchdown, and only Florida and Stanford did it with a fumble recovery.

Against Boston College, Stanford recorded 21 points

off Eagles turnovers. The last time Stanford had 21 points off turnovers in a game came at Oregon on Nov. 12, 2016.

TIGHT END U MAKES A NICE RETURN

After a quiet start to the season for Stanford's star tight end Sam Roush, the Nashville, Tenn. native broke out in a big way against Boston College in Week 3.

Roush helped flip the script of the game in the second quarter with a catch-and-run of 69 yards for a touchdown. The catch is the longest of his career and the longest pass play of the season for Stanford. It was the longest scoring reception by a Stanford tight end since Colby Parkinson scored on a 75-yard pass against Oregon State on Nov. 10, 2018, part of a four-touchdown game for the current Los Angeles Rams tight end.

CARDINAL CRISSCROSS

With existing non-conference clashes on the schedule before the transition to the ACC, the 2025 Stanford football schedule is one of the more unique schedules in the NCAA. Stanford is the only FBS program to play in five time zones in 2025. The Cardinal played at Hawai'i (Hawaii-Aleutian Time Zone) and will play at BYU (Mountain Time Zone), at SMU (Central Time Zone), three games in the Eastern Time Zone, and all six home games will be played in the Pacific Time Zone.

Nine other FBS programs are playing in four different time zones in 2025: BYU, Houston, Iowa State, Middle Tennessee State, Nevada, Sam Houston State, TCU, Utah, and West Virginia.

When taking the distance from each road opponent's stadium to Stanford Stadium, the Cardinal will travel 23,503 miles to its opponents in 2025.

In the ACC, the next closest school in terms of 2025 travel miles is Syracuse at 10,578 miles.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

Multiple Cardinal student-athletes received preseason recognition in advance of the 2025 season. Not only is it for their work on the field, but for their leadership off the field and in the classroom.

Tight end Sam Roush landed on multiple preseason watch lists: John Mackey Award, Allstate Wuerffel Trophy, and the Reese's Senior Bowl Top 300. He was also the team's nominee for the William V. Campbell Trophy.

Joining Roush on the Reese's Senior Bowl Top 300 Watch List were Collin Wright and Jay Green.

Additional preseason watch list honorees for Stanford include the Polynesian Player of the Year (Simione Pale, Tevarua Tafiti) and the Doak Walker Award (Sedrick Irvin).

TRANSFER TALK

One year after having the second fewest transfers in

FBS behind Clemson, Stanford has made a splash in the transfer portal. The Cardinal welcomed 17 transfers for the 2025 season, more than all previous transfers in program history combined (14). Six of those transfers came in during the winter quarter, giving Stanford nine winter enrollees (including three freshmen), also the most the program has ever seen in one winter.

Stanford made significant upgrades on the offensive side of the ball, bringing in nine transfers. Four of the nine transfers are at wide receiver, helping make up for the loss of Elic Ayomanor in the NFL Draft. Offensive line has also been an area of need for the Cardinal, and the team addressed that by bringing in four offensive linemen. Stanford added three defensive backs and two linebackers to help solidify a defense that in 2024 forced the most turnovers by a Stanford defense since 2018.

From 2024 to 2025, Stanford added 13 more transfers from the prior season. That is the seventh-largest increase in transfers taken in by an FBS program.

ACC HISTORY

The Cardinal went on the road in its ACC debut and took down Syracuse 26-24 on Sept. 20, 2024. It was the first time since 1919 that Stanford played a conference game as a new member.

Stanford joined seven other full-time schools - Duke, North Carolina, Maryland, Florida State, Miami, Louisville, and Virginia Tech, as well as Notre Dame (2020) - in winning its first conference game as a member of the ACC. SMU became the ninth team to do so when it won its first ACC game on Sept. 28. Only Duke's and Maryland's wins also came on the road, both in 1953.

The Cardinal beat Boston College in Week 3 this season to start ACC play 1-0 for the second consecutive season. The last time Stanford began conference play 1-0 in back-to-back seasons came in 2015-16 when Stanford was in the Pac-12.

Stanford will continue to square off as ACC rivals against a number of new foes, facing Virginia, Florida State, and Miami in 2025 for the first time in program history. Additional conference games against Boston College, Pittsburgh, and North Carolina will be the first as ACC opponents.

After the 2025 season, Stanford will have played every ACC team except Georgia Tech and Duke. Both are on the schedule for 2026.

RECENT DRAFT SUCCESS

The Cardinal has had 57 draft picks since 2010, fourth among ACC schools, behind only Miami, Florida State, and Clemson. Stanford has nine consensus All-Americans since 2010, and its 22 Academic All-Americans in that span are the most among FBS schools.

In the 2025 NFL Draft, the Cardinal saw Elic Ayomanor get drafted by the Tennessee Titans in the fourth round. He became the 282nd all-time player to be drafted out of Stanford, and the fifth wide receiver since 2019.

Since 2010, Stanford has appeared in nine bowl games, including three Rose Bowl Games, an Orange Bowl, and a Fiesta Bowl.

NEW QB1

Winning the starting quarterback battle this season is redshirt senior Ben Gulbranson, who enters his final season of eligibility in 2025 with the most experience of anyone in the Cardinal quarterback room.

Gulbranson appeared in 18 games at Oregon State during his first five collegiate seasons, making 11 starts. He completed 61.8% of his passes for 2,648 yards and 15 touchdowns, adding six touchdowns on the ground.

Notably, Gulbranson was the MVP of the SRS Distribution Las Vegas Bowl in 2022, capping off a fantastic run for the Beavers, where he went 7-1 in eight starts and scored 14 total touchdowns. Despite not being a prolific scrambler, he joined eventual No. 1 overall pick Caleb Williams as the only quarterbacks in the Pac-12 to have a rushing touchdown in four straight games.

Gulbranson is a product of Newbury Park High School, where he played two years of varsity football and three years of varsity basketball. He has four siblings, including a twin-sister, Abby, and wants to attend medical school after his football career is finished. Some have nicknamed him "Dr. Ben"

LEFTIES ARE RARE

Left-footed kickers are rare in football, and it's even more uncommon to have both a left-footed placekicker and punter. Stanford has one in freshman London Bironas, who is the team's backup kicker and punter. Mississippi State is the only other team that can claim a kicker and a punter who is left-footed.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

There is a rich tradition of Stanford success in the NFL, and that tradition is still alive in the 2025 NFL season. There are currently 29 former Cardinal signed with NFL organizations and 27 on active rosters.

Three former Cardinal found the end zone in Week 2 of the NFL season. Zach Ertz did so for the Washington Commanders on Thursday Night Football, his second touchdown in as many weeks. Michael Wilson got his first touchdown of 2025 in Arizona's win over the Carolina Panthers on an 11-yard strike.

The newest Cardinal in the NFL, Elic Ayomanor, scored as well. He drew the start in his debut with the Tennessee Titans in Week 1 against the Denver Broncos and scored his first NFL touchdown in Week 2 against Denver on a nine-yard pass from No. 1 overall

: pick and former Miami quarterback Cam Ward.

Early-season surprises came from the Las Vegas Raiders, who saw two former Cardinal start on defense in Week 1. Kyu Blu Kelly started at cornerback for the Raiders and set a new career-high in tackles with nine. Thomas Booker, who was traded to the Raiders from Philadelphia, started at defensive tackle as well.

Doing what he does best, New York Giants linebacker Bobby Okereke is leading the NFL in tackles through two games with 26, including 16 in Week 1 against Washington. Okereke has finished inside the top-10 in the NFL in tackles twice in his career (2022-23).

Returning from multiple injuries in 2024 is Christian McCaffrey. The 2023 AP Offensive Player of the Year appeared in just four games last year for the San Francisco 49ers after missing time with Achilles and knee issues, but is healthy in 2025. Through two games, he has 249 scrimmage yards and scored his first touchdown of 2025 in a Week 2 win at New Orleans.

EPITOME OF A STANFORD MAN

Stanford student-athletes go on to achieve great things at the professional level, both on the field and off. During the 2024 NFL season, both Curtis Robinson (San Francisco 49ers) and Solomon Thomas (New York Jets) were nominees for the Walter Payton Man of the Year award. Stanford was one of four FBS programs to have multiple nominees for the award, joining Baylor, California, and Notre Dame.

Widely regarded as the league's most prestigious honor, it was renamed in 1999 after the late Hall of Fame running back, Walter Payton. Each team nominates one player who has had a significant positive impact on their community.

Curtis Robinson focuses on education in his community efforts, inspired by his mother's dedicated career as a college professor. He participates regularly with the 49ers' EDU stadium classroom and Social Justice Player Committees, as well as coaching over 400 youth in flag football events. Solomon Thomas continued to champion mental health awareness with impactful public appearances and community efforts, using each opportunity to empower others with tools to recognize signs of struggle and foster supportive environments.

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 30 states, plus Canada.

There is a total of 13 student-athletes from Texas, the largest representation of student-athletes from outside of California (29) on the team. Behind Texas is Georgia (6), while Florida, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Tennessee all have five. Two student-athletes are from Canada (Brendan Delaney and Benedict Umeh).

ANDREW LUCK RETURNS

One day after the 2024 season came to a close, Stanford announced Andrew Luck's return to the program as the Football General Manager, a newly created position that oversees all aspects of the Cardinal Football program. One of the most transformative student-athletes in school history, Luck produced a record-setting collegiate career while leading the Cardinal to national prominence. A 2012 graduate with a bachelor's degree in architectural design who returned to Stanford to finish his master's degree in education in 2023, Luck led the Cardinal to a 31-7 overall record from 2009-11 after redshirting the 2008 campaign. Luck was a two-time Heisman Trophy runner-up (2010-11) and concluded the 2011 season as the recipient of the Maxwell Award, Walter Camp Foundation Player of the Year Award, and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award.

In his new role, Luck will be tasked with overseeing the Cardinal Football program, including working with Coach Reich on recruiting and roster management, and with athletics and university leadership on fundraising, alumni relations, sponsorships, student-athlete support, and stadium experience.

Luck was selected as the No. 1 overall pick of the Indianapolis Colts in the 2012 NFL Draft, competing for seven seasons from 2012-18. Earning Pro Bowl honors in each of his first three seasons and four overall, Luck led the NFL in passing touchdowns (40) in 2014 and was named the league's Comeback Player of the Year in 2018.

Luck's commitment in the classroom was equally impressive as a 2011 First-Team Academic All-American and Academic All-America of the Year. He was also a three-time first-team conference academic honoree and member of the NFF Hampshire Honor Society. In June 2024, Luck was named to the College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-America Hall of Fame, becoming Stanford's first honoree and joining his father, Oliver, a 2000 inductee, as the organization's first father-son duo.

Since he retired from the NFL, Luck and his wife, Nicole, a former Cardinal gymnast who also graduated in 2012, have been consistently involved in both university and athletic department initiatives. The couple has two daughters, Lucy and Penelope.

TWO ADDITIONS TO STANFORD HOF

The Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame will welcome 10 former student-athletes Sept. 27, including former football greats David DeCastro and Tank Williams.

The Class of 2025 includes Sarah Beeson Anderson (softball), Erin Burdette (women's tennis), David DeCastro (football), Ryan Garko (baseball), Dan Gill (men's gymnastics), Kiley Neushul (women's water polo), Kelley O'Hara (women's soccer), Jeanette Pohlen (women's basketball), Chasson Randle (men's basketball) and Tank Williams (football).

DeCastro is recognized as the best guard in program history, starting all 39 games he played in, helping lead Stanford to three bowl games, including a win in the 2011 Orange Bowl. A 2011 unanimous First Team All-America selection, DeCastro was selected No. 24 overall by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 2012 NFL Draft and spent nine seasons with the Steelers, making six Pro Bowls while being named All-Pro three times.

Williams was the first Stanford defensive back to earn First Team All-America honors (2001), capping off a terrific career that saw him record nine interceptions, including five as a senior. He was a member of two bowl teams, including the 2000 Rose Bowl Game. He was drafted in the second round (No. 45 overall) by the Tennessee Titans in the 2002 NFL Draft and spent seven seasons in the league, finishing fourth in the 2002 AP Defensive Rookie of the Year voting.

SOFTBALL AND...ROCK AND ROLL?

No stranger to hosting premier events, Stanford Stadium added two first-time events in 2025. Stanford softball called Stanford Stadium its home during the 2025 season as construction of a new, state-of-the-art softball stadium is underway. Following the conclusion of the season, Stanford Stadium transitioned to hosting British rock band Coldplay in the first North American shows of the 2025 portion of its Music Of The Spheres World Tour.

The football stadium turned into one of the most unique softball stadiums in the country for the 2025 season. Home plate was nestled into the southwest corner of the stadium, creating picturesque views of the stadium from behind the backstop, with the stadium's arches looking down upon the playing surface from left field. It was a banner year for Stanford softball, as the Cardinal went 22-4 at home and set the NCAA softball single-game attendance record with a crowd of 13,207 against Cal during Big Swing on April 19.

Following softball season, Stanford Stadium turned into one of the biggest rock-n-roll venues in the Bay Area when it hosted Coldplay's Music Of The Spheres World Tour for shows on May 31 and June 1. These shows kicked off the North American leg of the 2025 portion of Coldplay's tour, which also featured performances in Las Vegas, Denver, Boston, Nashville, and Miami, among other shows in the United States. It was the band's first appearance in the United States during the Music Of The Spheres Tour since Oct. 1, 2023, when it played at the Rose Bowl.

Stanford Stadium's rich history includes the 1928 moment when Herbert Hoover, a former Stanford football student manager, delivered his acceptance speech as the Republican presidential candidate. In 1962, amidst the Cold War tensions, track coach Payton Jordan brought the USA-USSR dual meet to the stadium. The stadium also witnessed Super Bowl XIX between the San Francisco 49ers and Miami Dolphins and hosted six soccer matches during the 1994 World Cup.

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 49 years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), the longest streak in NCAA history. Stanford leads the NCAA with 137 team titles, including two national team championships during the 2024-25 campaign - women's water polo and women's rowing, increasing its overall total to 173.

Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball, and men's basketball, and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.

From 1995-2019, Stanford won 25 straight Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cups. The Cardinal enters the 2025-26 year with 26 of the 31 total Directors' Cups, most recently capturing the elusive award during the 2022-23 season.

STANFORD SCORIGAMI

Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that has taken over social media in recent years. Scorigami tracks final scores that have never happened before, initially in the NFL, and now for Stanford football. Through Week 3 of the 2025 season, there have been 721 unique results in Stanford football history. The following are the Stanford Scorigami results for the 2025 season:

- Hawai'i 23, Stanford 20. No Scorigami. Stanford lost to UCLA by that score in 2008.
- BYU 27, Stanford 3. No Scorigami. Stanford lost to California by that score in 2005.
- Stanford 30, Boston College 20. That's a Scorigami! It is the 721st unique result in Stanford football history.

NERD NATION

Stanford has long been regarded as one of the premier institutions in both athletics and academics, and the football team's tight end room exemplifies this on a yearly basis. Every tight end on the roster took his headshot with white tape in the middle of large, black-rimmed glasses to signify "Nerd Nation," a movement that was created over a decade ago in 2013.

Following a 2013 win at Oregon, Shane Skov, Tyler Gaffney, and A.J. Tarpley showed up to the team's post-game press conference with those very same bulky glasses with tape over the bridge. Naturally, they were asked about it, and they described it as embracing what it means to be a Stanford student-athlete. Skov explained, "It's Nerd Nation. We take pride in what we do."



One of the most prominent women's basketball alumni, Chiney Ogwumike, helped start the movement during a basketball shoot-around. She heard the popular song Rack City, by Tyga, and thought, "What if we changed that to 'Nerd City'?" She wound up writing full lyrics for a Stanford version, and with the help of her sister Nneka, rapped it in front of her teammates in the locker room before a film session.

It caught on, and a music video was eventually created, which brought "Nerd Nation" into a brand new light. According to Chiney, who now works at ESPN as a basketball analyst, the point of it all was "to show at Stanford you can be a student and an athlete and still be cool. You can redefine what 'nerd' means to you."

INTERIM HEAD COACH
1ST SEASON AT STANFORD
6 SEASONS AS NFL HEAD COACH
(2018-2022 INDIANAPOLIS, 2023 CAROLINA)

Frank Reich was named Stanford's interim head football coach March 31, 2025 by Stanford Football General Manager Andrew Luck.

The 36th head coach in program history, Reich will serve as interim head coach for the 2025 campaign.

"I could not be more excited for our coaches, staff and players to have Frank as our head football coach for the 2025 season," said Luck, who was named to his newly-created post on Nov. 30, 2024. "I have experienced first-hand the incredible impact Frank has demonstrated as a leader and have full confidence he is the perfect steward for this season of Stanford Football. Frank is a teacher, a winner and a coach of the highest caliber. Frank's values align seamlessly with our vision for this program and I firmly believe in his ability to maximize the on-field potential of our student-athletes while serving as a role model in all aspects of their personal growth."

Reich is one of the sport's most well-respected offensive minds thanks to over 30 years in professional football, combining a 14-year playing career as an NFL quarterback with 18 seasons in various coaching roles. Reich was a member of six Super Bowl teams overall, four as a player with the Buffalo Bills (1991-94), and twice as a coach.

Highly regarded in NFL circles with a knack for building lasting relationships, Reich's six-year head coaching tenure included five seasons with the Indianapolis Colts (2018-22) before his final stop at the helm of the Carolina Panthers (2023). Reich's NFL resume also includes four years as an offensive coordinator, including two seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles (2016-17), the second of which resulted in the franchise's first Super Bowl title in Super Bowl LII (2018).

Reich's first season as Indianapolis head coach in 2018 coincided with the final season of Luck's playing career. Despite a 1-5 start, Reich guided the Colts to a 10-6 overall record and an appearance in the Divisional Round of the NFL Playoffs during a season that was highlighted by Luck earning Pro Bowl honors while being named the NFL Comeback Player of the Year.

"I am thrilled to be working with Andrew again to help take an important step in establishing his vision for the Stanford Football program," said Reich. "Andrew is an elite leader and competitor, and those traits, along with his genuine passion for this university, resonated in every way and inspired me to accept this role. The unique responsibility to mentor the best student-athletes in the world, to be the absolute best in what they aspire to do, is an opportunity I will fully embrace."

Reich's coaching career also includes two seasons as the offensive coordinator of the San Diego Chargers (2014-15), following stints as quarterbacks coach, wide receivers coach and offensive coaching staff assistant with Indianapolis and Arizona. A coaching staff member of two Super Bowl winning franchises, Reich also served as an offensive staff assistant when Indianapolis won Super Bowl XLI (2007).

Selected in the third round (57th overall) of the 1985 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills, Reich's NFL career spanned 14 seasons and four organizations, with his last four years split between the Carolina Panthers (1995), New York Jets (1996) and Detroit Lions (1997-98). Reich threw for 40 touchdowns and passed for 6,075 yards, making 20 starts over a 118-game career.

A native of Lebanon, Pennsylvania, Reich spent his first nine seasons in Buffalo, mostly serving in a backup role to Pro Football Hall of Famer Jim Kelly. Reich's trademark dependability and willingness to stay ready were among his most notable strengths as a player, resulting in one of the most memorable moments in NFL playoff history. In a wild card round game on Jan. 3, 1993, host Buffalo overcame a 35-3 third-quarter deficit to defeat the Houston Oilers 41-38 in overtime to set a record for the largest comeback in NFL history at the time. Starting in place of Kelly, who sustained an injury one week earlier, Reich engineered the historic comeback and completed 21 of 34 passes for 289 yards and four touchdowns.

Prior to authoring what still stands as the largest comeback in NFL postseason history, Reich was also responsible for the then-largest comeback in NCAA history. Reich, who played collegiately at Maryland from 1980-84 and spent his first three seasons backing up Boomer Esiason, rallied the Terrapins from a 31-0 halftime deficit to a 42-40 victory over the defending national champion Miami Hurricanes at the Miami Orange Bowl on Nov. 10, 1984. Reich finished 108-for-169 and threw for 1,446 yards and nine touchdowns as a senior in 1984, with his six touchdowns against the Hurricanes remaining the school's single-game record.

Reich was a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and baseball at Cedar Crest High School in Lebanon, Pennsylvania. The team's starting quarterback over his final two seasons, Reich participated in the 1980 edition of the Big 33 Football Classic, an annual all-star game comprising the top high-school players in Pennsylvania.

Reich's father, Frank Sr., played collegiately at Penn State and was drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles in the 14th round of the 1956 NFL Draft.

Reich, 63, and his wife, Linda, have three daughters, Lia, Aviry and Hannah, and four grandchildren.
