The Power of a Network


New ideas and connections are the basis for creativity and innovation. If we want to continue to evolve and create schools that meet the needs of all learners, educators need to connect with diverse people in business, their community, other schools, and districts to build networks that inspire new ideas...In education, we pride ourselves on being about learning and growing people, serving others but not ourselves. Many educators characterize business as being about sales and individual rewards, and, thus doing what is the norm in business is shunned in many educator circles... Networking has had this connotation as being part of a business that is self-serving and unnecessary for educators... I too saw the world of business and education as opposite until I read To Sell Is Human by Daniel Pink. The book helped me see that, whether our "offer" comprises ideas or products, we are all in the business of sales. Pink notes that, "The ability to move others to exchange what they have for what we have is crucial to our survival and our happiness... When we build a network and create connections with people who offer divergent ideas, we have more opportunities to learn and evolve in our practice. We improve when we open ourselves up to learning from others, share our ideas, and work together to create something better. And when we improve, our students benefit.
