The data in this report is a summary of our commitment to sustainability, which continues to grow through the development of our Master Plan, expansion of our research centers and accelerators, and our continued outreach to community partnerships in Brooklyn and beyond. As the President of Pratt Institute, I am especially proud of our accomplishments, and I am dedicated to continuing to grow our commitment to sustainability in a comprehensive and cohesive manner as a top priority throughout the institution.
