On behalf of the University of Minnesota Duluth (UMD), I am pleased to verify the submission from our campus to the Sustainability Tracking and Rating System (STARS) Program. Our submission reflects an ongoing commitment and a dedication to future progress on sustainability issues at our campus. The campus commitment to sustainability started long ago; our campus location near Lake Superior, the largest of the Great Lakes, and the north woods of Minnesota has provided additional background motivation for our efforts to save resources and to reduce pollution.

Although the commitment to sustainability has always been present on our campus, UMD has entered a new era in implementation. Our new campus [Strategic Plan](#), which was approved last spring, lists sustainability as a Core Value and incorporates sustainability principles into many of our Goals and Action Steps. We have identified short-term [Action Steps](#) that will help improve our physical campus and operations, increase our diversity and promote an inclusive campus culture, and increase sustainability concepts into our academic programs.
