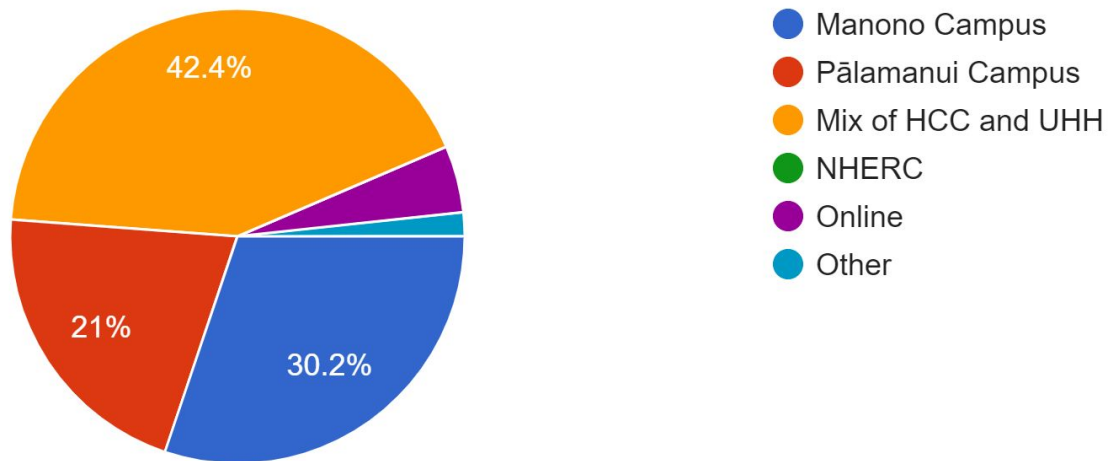
# Overview

- Results similar to faculty/staff poll at the all college meeting

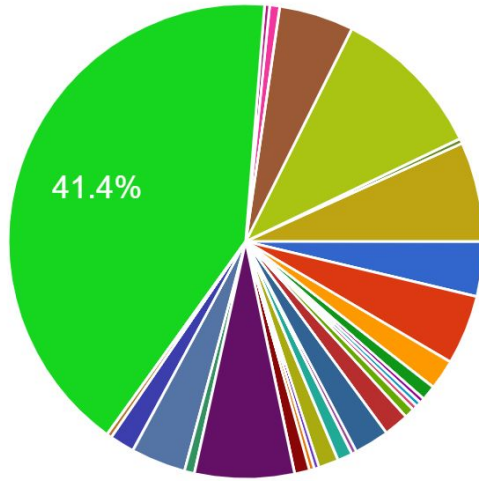
## What campus do you attend most often?

# What is your program of study?

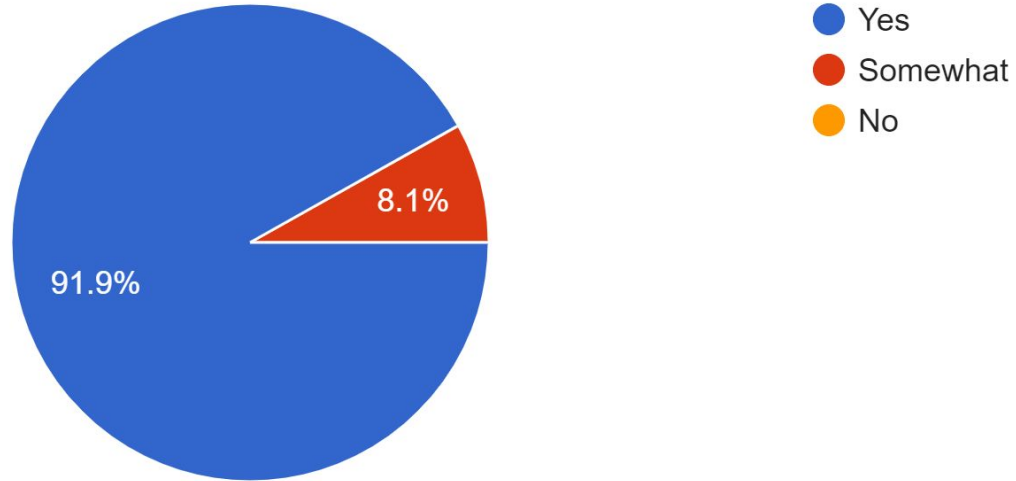

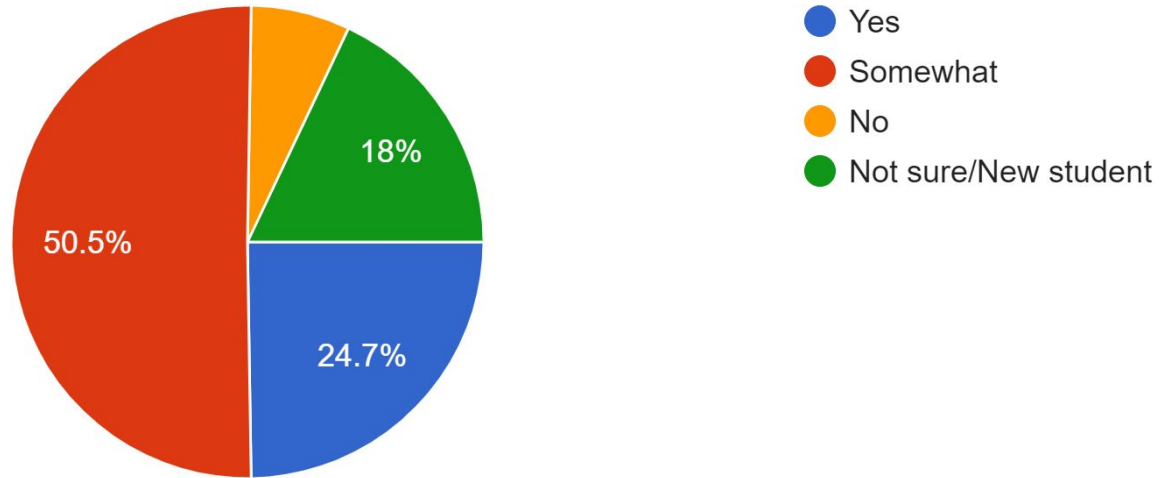
# Do you think sustainability is important?

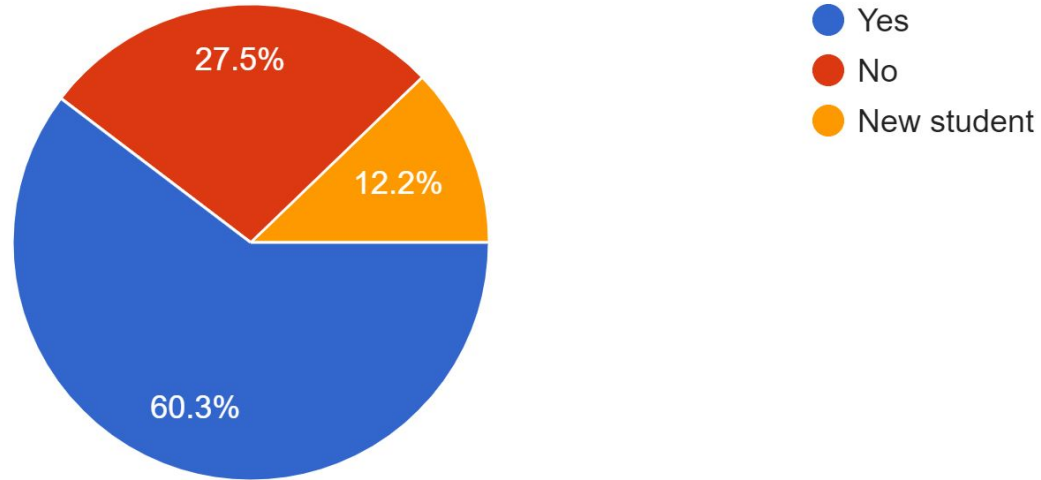
# Do you think sustainability is promoted on campus?

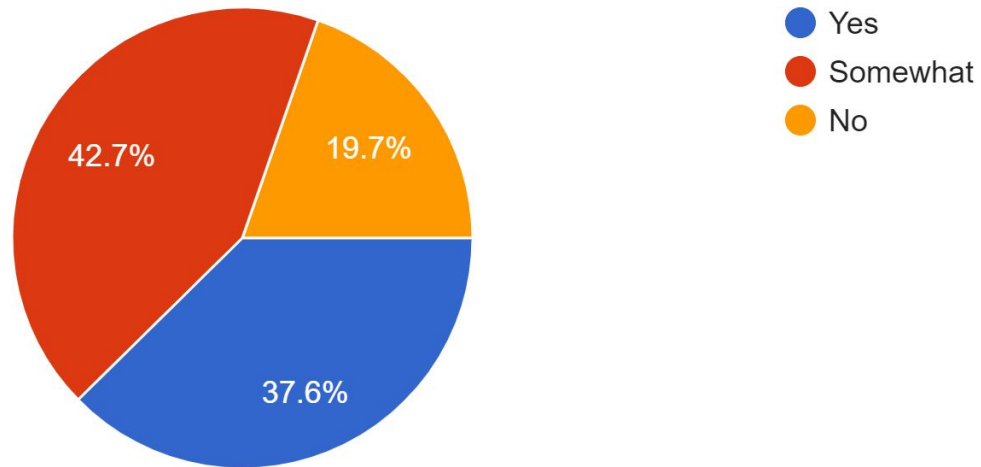
# Have you ever discussed sustainability/climate change in any of your classes at HawCC?
