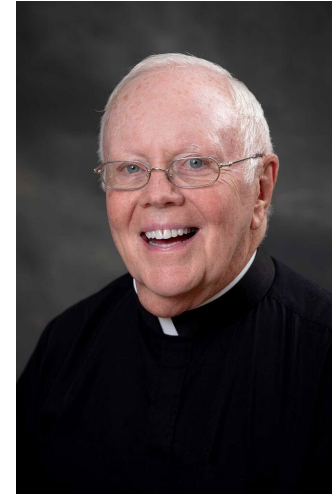

McAuley Institute *for* Mercy Education: *Voices of Mercy Luncheon Speaker Series*



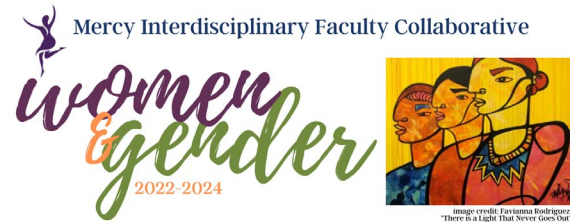
Our stories matter. Our mission matters. This speaker series seeks to provide opportunities for the Salve Regina community to gather and share together around our stories, core values, and mission.

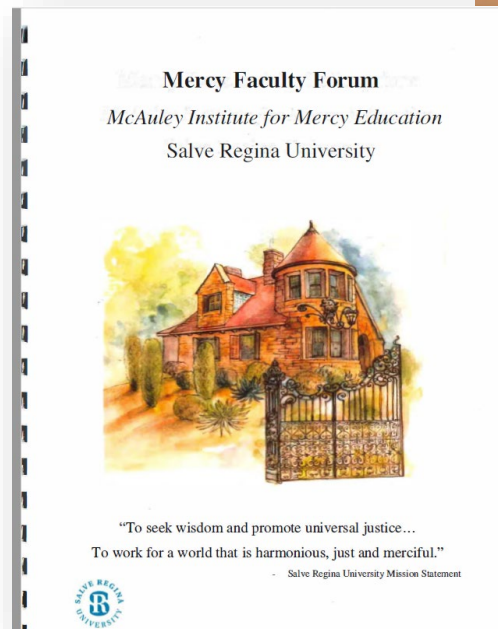

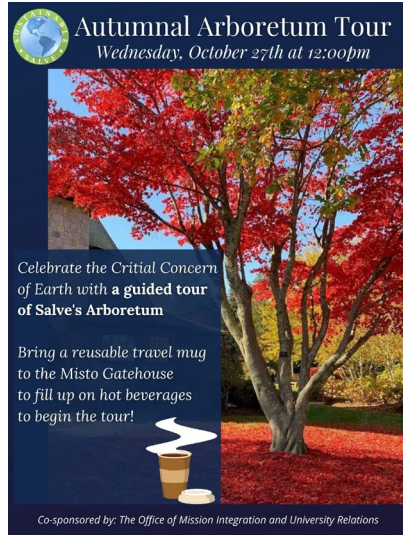


McAuley Institute *for* Mercy Education: *Mercy Faculty Forum & Mercy Leadership Colloquium*
