Access and Participation Plan 2021

The University of Sydney's Access and Participation Plan 2021 outlines the University's strategic and practical commitment to increasing access to and participation in higher education for people from traditionally underrepresented backgrounds.

The Plan draws upon the collective work of Domestic Recruitment and Access (Sydney Future Students), the Pro Vice-Chancellor Educational Innovation (DVC Education) and significant collaboration with the Office of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor Indigenous Strategy and Services (DVC ISS).

Underpinning this collaborative work in 2021 is a commitment to:

- Develop and implement cross-institutional initiatives that support underrepresented cohorts and align with institutional strategy;
- Support equity and diversity by expanding pathways to the University, extending partnership networks that benefit identified communities, and aligning scholarship offerings to institutional preferences;
- Provide formal recognition of student involvement in the University's widening participation schemes as part of students' application to enrol;
- Promote cross-divisional collaboration to implement cohesive offering to students from traditionally underrepresented cohorts.
