- 2018 participants: 89 (two dropped out after already paying the farmer)
 - 75 received reimbursement for completing all food education events. Total of \$6800 for reimbursements
 - \$510 for Oneota classes
 - \$499.69 for on campus classes.

 - Demographic information:
 - 50 responses (Response rate of 56%)

 - Income: 20% \$20k-\$40k, 44% \$41-60k, 22% \$61-80k
 - Years purchasing a CSA share: 32% 6+ years, 38% 4-5 years
 - Participating in the Luther program: 12% first time, 88% not first time
 - Buying a CSA share without financial assistance from Luther: 14% yes, 46% no, 40% maybe
 - 100% said they would participate next year if Luther offered this program again
 - 94% stated financial incentive is important to them
 - Avg vegetables per day during CSA season: 4-5 52%, 2-3 40%, 6+ 8%
 - 88% said their families/their vegetable consumption increased, 12% stayed the same
 - 68% said their home cooking increased, 32% stayed the same
 - 46% saw the primary benefit as affordable access to fresh, local foods. 28% a regular supply of high quality, fresh veggies. 18% supporting local farmers, 6% connections to local food.
 - 70% tried a new vegetable this year!
 - 80% learned a new cooking skill
 - 94% attended both food education events.
 - General comments from the open section:
 - "I love the CSA program. I would never eat this many good vegetables on my own."
 - "Thank you! This program is one of my favorite benefits as a staff member. The reimbursement is what made me decide to sign up, and I never would have without the reimbursement. The benefits are far beyond this and include access to local, organic vegetables, beneficial relationship with a local farmer, etc."
