Sustainability Committee End of Year Report 2020 - 2021

The Sustainability Committee met on a monthly basis to discuss and provide feedback and approval for initiatives of the several subcommittees. Below are the individual subcommittee reports.

- The Assessment Subcommittee developed a survey instrument for S-Designated courses with questions gaging student understanding of University of Hawaii Office of Sustainability (UHOS) core concepts, subject relevance, and interest in the Academic Subject Certificate (ASC).
- S-Designated courses listed in Banner for Fall 2020 were identified and members collaborated with HCC Institutional Research (IR) to distribute it. Individual instructors were provided with a summary via email and course-level copies. <u>Fall 2020 S Designation Course</u> <u>Survey Summary Results</u>.
- Based on lessons learned in Fall, conducted Spring 2021 survey, ensuring students taught in Early College S designation classes were also surveyed.
- The instrument was shared with the UH System via the System Sustainability Curriculum Consortium Council in the Spring.
- In addition to the end of the semester survey for S-designated courses, tracking sustainability outcomes for the Academic Subject Certificate is in the inception stage of incorporation into the eLumen Assessment platform and the Subcommittee should pursue mapping course outcomes to the certificate in the future.

 - Sustainability awards and accolades links to page that lists awards received by the college related to sustainability

- Undertook substantive revision of website layout and design to be more visually appealing, user friendly and easy to navigate. Website now based on tabs dividing information into: Sustainability courses; What We Do/What You Can Do; Degrees/Programs/Professions in Sustainability; Indigenous Wisdom; Strategic Plans and Policies.
- Revisions included addition of new content, several images and use of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i throughout.

- Chartered student organizations hosted events with recycled and/or repurposed materials such as: Graduation Photo Day, Chinese New Year, St. Patrick's Day, and Girls Day/Women's Month. For example the Chinese New Year decor usually used to decorate public spaces was sent to students for them to use to decorate their own homes in celebration.
- The student leaders also allocated \$5000 in student fees to award to students for Food Insecurity in the form of \$50 gift cards to Foodland for groceries.
