


## 8. How important do you think sustainability is?


## 9. How important do you think the economy is to sustainability?


10. How important do you think the environment is to sustainability?


## 11. How important do you think social equity is to sustainability?





12. On a scale of 1-10, how important do you think it is for San Diego State University to incorporate sustainability in its planning and initiatives?




### 13. How important is it for you to incorporate sustainability in your everyday life?


14. How important do you think it is for San Diego State University to add more sustainability-related courses?




## 27. Which of these campus student groups are you aware of?


28. Would you be interested in accessing a low-cost bike sharing program?


29. During your time at San Diego State University, how many courses have you taken that address topics presented in this survey?



30. Which of the following are core components of sustainability? (Check all that apply)










37. If straws were put behind counters at Aztec Shops, and you had to ask to get one, how would you feel?


38. If there were options to purchase reusable straws or utensils on campus, would you purchase one (or many)?




40. How would you feel about having paper straws instead of plastic straws?


41. If the SDSU Red & Black Shuttle expanded it's evening route off campus to a few surrounding neighborhoods for transportation, would you utilize this service?






42. What days would you utilize the shuttle? (Check all that apply)


43. Would you utilize if it was provided on the weekend?




#### 44. What times would you prefer to utilize the shuttle?


45. Would you be willing to pay to ride the shuttle if it was expanded? (If yes, please put the highest you would be willing to pay)
